NARRATIVE SUMMARY

SUPPLY SUPPORT

During the reporting period, Sub Unit One, Chu Lai provided Class V, Shipping and Receiving, Laundry and 3rd Echelon Maintenance Support to 9th Engineer Battalion, 1st Combined Action Group and Marine Air Groups 12 and 13.

During the month, Logistic Support Units at Hill 55, An Hoa, and LZ Baldy continued to support the 1st, 5th and 7th Marine Regiments respectively.

As of 1 February 1970, Supply Company's "Sub Account #15" was in full operation, handling all redistribution and excess vehicles for Force Logistic Support Group Bravo. This special project was tasked with receiving all excesses, and to see that all excesses had been LTI'd and that needed maintenance was completed before redistribution. After a month of operation, 929 pieces of equipment has been received by "Sub Account #15" and the special project is still in full operation. No major problems are anticipated in the operation of the Redistribution Point.

MAINTENANCE SUPPORT

During the month of February 1970, Sub Unit One continued Third Echelon Maintenance Support for the 9th Engineer Battalion and Marine Air Groups 12 and 13 and both 2nd and 3rd echelon support for 1st Combined Action Group.

Electronics Platoon continued to LTI and repair for Condition E or better the equipment from "Sub Account #15".

Ordnance Platoon, aside from performing its normal work of repairing incoming weapons, have also assumed the responsibility of repair and distribution of "Green Tag" equipment.

Engineer Platoon maintained a satisfactory output of completions while sending numerous Contact Teams to the LSU's. Engineer Platoon also provided some of their larger forklifts for the restoration of An Hoa's Ammunition Dump and the rest to the LSU at Hill 55 for the evacuation.

Motor Transport Platoon also took in a considerable amount of equipment destined for "Sub Account #15".

MOTOR TRANSPORT SUPPORT

During the month of February 1970 Truck Company continued to provide the internal support of FLSG-B and additional support to Force Logistic Command and to III MAF Headquarters for purpose of relocating III MAF Headquarters.

Throughout the month the repairing of all excess motor transport equipment was conducted and redistributed as directed.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

During this reporting period the S-5 Section of FLSG-Bravo has made twenty-six (26) contacts with Chanh Huong and twenty-seven (27) contacts with Chanh Phuoc.

The Group B.A.S. held a total of three (3) MEDCAPS in each Hamlet in which three hundred and forty-two (342) civilians were treated.

During the month of February Dr. Fergerson, U.S. Army, of the 172nd Preventive Medicine Bn. went to both of the Hamlets and obtained skin samples from dogs, which were believed to have the mange. A formula was prepared and the Vietnamese were instructed in the proper method of application so they could treat their dogs. Dr. Fergerson also took water samples from the wells to determine how much bacteria is in the water. The results from the water samples proved that the water does contain bacteria and that the water should be boiled before drinking. During our welfare discussions information revealed the names of six VC Hamlets, and two VC leaders in the An Hoa area. Eight (8) General Walt Scholarships of (500\$VN) piasters each were awarded.
