PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

SUPPLY SUPPORT

During the reporting period, Sub Unit One, Chu Lai provided Class V, Shipping and Receiving, Laundry and 3rd Echelon Maintenance Support to 9th Engineer Battalion, 1st Combined Action Group and Marine Air Group's 12 and 13. Sub Unit One participated in Class I support to Chu Lai Marine Units from the 1st to the 13th of January. Effective 14 January 1970, the Class I support mission was assumed by the Supply Battalion, Force Logistic Command, Danang. Supplies which previously had been stored on the Shipping and Receiving Lot, Sub Unit One, Chu Lai, were disposed of through proper channels. An estimated 25,000 pounds of scrap metal was invoiced to the Army Property Disposal Officer at Chu Lai.

During the month, Logistic Support Units at Hill 55, An Hoa, and LZ Baldy continued to support the 1st, 5th, and 7th Marine Regiments respectively.

During the latter part of the month, Supply Company was tasked with establishing a Disposal/Redistribution Collection Point for all Group excesses. This special project was designated as "Sub-Account 15" and is fully operational.

MAINTENANCE SUPPORT

During the month of January 1970, Sub Unit One continued Third Echelon Maintenance Support for the 9th Engineer Battalion and Marine Air Groups 12 and 13 and both 2nd and 3rd echelon support for 1st Combined Action Group.

The Ordnance Section of Maintenance Company conducted a series of contact teams at the Stack Arms Center at China Beach to inspect M-16 rifles of the First Marine Division. The purpose of the inspection was to check exfoliation of the aluminum alloys and for urethane foam corrosion.

On 29 January 1970, the Inter-Group flow of maintenance changed so that the Logistic Support Units now pass all fourth echelon and overflow third echelon repair work directly to Maintenance Battalion, First Force Service Regiment.

MOTOR TRANSPORT SUPPORT

During the month of January 1970, Truck Company continued to provide internal support of this command and additional support to Force Logistic Command whenever requested.

Throughout the month the repairing of all excess motor transport equipment was conducted and redistributed as directed.

Rough Rider convoys were sent and returned from Force Logistic Support Group Bravo on an average of twice a week for the reporting period.

CIVIL AFFAIRS

During the reporting period, the S-5 Section of Force Logistic Support Group Bravo made forty-two (42) contacts with Chanh Huong hamlet and forty-three (43) contacts with Chanh Phuoc hamlet.

The Battalion Aid Station performed a total of four (4) MEDCAPS in each hamlet during which 645 civilians were treated.

The S-5 employs 123 local national civilians on appropriated funds and twenty-nine (29) on non-appropriated funds.

Eight (8) truck loads of scrap wood were distributed to Chanh Huong and Chanh Phuoc hamlets. Twenty (20) gallons of white paint and twelve (12) bags of cement were also distributed to each hamlet for pagoda repair. The pagodas in each hamlet have been completed and are now being used for religious ceremonies. Eight (8) General WALT Scholarships of \$500^p (VN piasters) each were awarded.
