1. Narrative Summary.

During this reporting period Helicopter Support Teams (HST's) were provided for Operations Swift and Shelbyville.

OPCON of Company "B" remained with the 5th Marine Regiment.

First Shore Party Battalion provided material handling equipment in support of the 1st Marine Division units. Minor construction projects assigned from the Division Engineer were continued.

The Med-Cap treated approximately eighty (80) Vietnamese during this period. The Civic Action Program is providing materials for the construction of a Buddist Pagoda and a Maternity Hospital.
