

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the first half of Fiscal Year 1971 the 1st Shore Party Battalion participated in a number of ship debarkations to include six LST's, two LSD's and two LPD's. These operations were in conjunction with KEYSTONE ROBIN, a program directing the Brigade's cognizance over the return, debarkation, and re-assignment of units from Vietnam.

A two week MOS training program was provided for the 4th Shore Party Battalion, USMGR, during the month of August. The agenda covered aspects of the Shore Party's organization, mission and included sufficient on the job training to ensure a comprehensive training program. On 19 October 1970 landing procedures and beach operations were reviewed for the Battalion's Officers and Staff NCO's during a week of formal training presented by a team from the Landing Force Training Command, Pacific.

On 21 December 1970, the 1st Shore Party Battalion published a bulletin directing the establishment at battalion level of a training and manpower management system. The administrative consolidation was in response to a projected decrease in manpower during the Third Quarter, FY-71. The Battalion's intent was to conserve personnel, continue reporting procedures in at least as effective a manner, and to reduce requirements on subordinate unit commanders.

Training in helicopter support operations continued for Brigade units as required during scheduled exercised.

1. Purpose. To promulgate 5th MEB host unit assignments for Organized Marine Corps Reserve Units participating in Annual Training Duty 1970 at Camp Pendleton.

2. Background. Designated units of Organized Marine Corps Reserve will conduct ATD-70 at Camp Pendleton during the period 13 June to 23 August 1970, with the majority of units on station during the period 8 to 23 August 1970. 1. SITUATION

a. Enemy Forces. (Omitted)b. Friendly Forces

(1) Brigade Embarkation Officer, 5th MAB, will coordinate and provide the additional equipment, motor transport, personnel and shipping required for the offloading operation.

c. Attachments and Detachments

(1) ~~A 110 man~~ detail from Brigade Embarkation will be attached to provide ship and shore working parties.

(2) Naval Beach Group No. 1 will provide 6 LCU's, 8 LCM's and a beachmaster Unit to facilitate the moving of personnel and equipment from ship to shore.

(3) 1st Tank Battalion, 5th MAB, will provide a 50 man detail to act as tank drivers, crew, and machanics.

(4) Select personnel and equipment from various 5th MAB organizations will be committed by Brigade Embarkation Officer. See paragraph 4. Logistics.

2. MISSION

Commencing at 230600, Co A (Rein), 1st SPBn(-)(Rein), with attachments, will offload the USS DENVER, (LPD-9) and the USS MONTICELLO, (LSD-35) at the Del Mar Boat Basin.

3. EXECUTION

- a. Concept of Operation. On the morning of 23 September 1970, the USS DENVER and USS MONTICELLO will anchor off the Del Mar Boat Basin. Commencing at 0600, the 1st SPBn(-)(Rein), augmented by 5th MAB personnel and equipment, and naval shipping, will begin offloading operation. The operation will continue on an around-the-clock basis until both ships are unloaded.
- b. Co A (Rein), 1st SPBn(-)(Rein)
 - (1) Assume control of the beach and operational control of all attached Marine and Navy units.
 - (2) Coordinate and supervise the offloading of ships, utilizing all attachments as required.
- c. Co B (-)(Rein), 3d SPBn. Provide support as required by Co A (Rein), 1st SPBn(-)(Rein) throughout the duration of the operation.
- d. HE/MT Plt, H&S Co, 1st SPBn(-)(Rein). Provide support as required by Co A (Rein), 1st SPBn(-)(Rein) throughout the duration of the operation.
- e. Det, Comm Plt, H&S Co, 1st SPBn(-)(Rein). Provide support as required by Co A (Rein), 1st SPBn(-)(Rein) throughout the duration of the operation.
- f. Coordinating Instructions
 - (1) All units will muster at the Sand Ramp, Del Mar Boat Basin at 0500 on 23 September 1970.
 - (2) The USS DENVER (LPD-9) will anchor at 0600, 23 September 1970.
 - (3) The USS MONTICELLO (LSD-35) will anchor at 1200, 23 September 1970.
 - (4) At approximately 0800, the C.G., 5th MAB will greet troops disembarking from the USS DENVER.



1. Purpose. To promulgate instructions and guidance for the administration of training records and training management with the consolidation of these functions at the Battalion level.

2. Background. Reference (a) is the Standing Operating Procedure for training within this organization and all provisions of reference (a) will remain in effect, except as modified by this directive. Reference (a) will be revised to reflect the changes contained herein after a reasonable period of time and the most effective and efficient means of training management have been determined.

3. Information. The intent of the consolidation of training records and management at the Battalion level is to conserve personnel, continue reporting procedures in at least as an effective manner, and reduce the requirements placed on Company Commanders and Section Heads. The development of this system will include detailed information provided to subordinates; however, the utilization of the proper chain of command is a necessity which will be maintained. The goals of the training management system are shown below:

a. CheckIn/Out Procedures. All personnel joining the Battalion or being transferred under PCS/TAD orders will be processed through the S-3 Section utilizing the form shown on enclosure (1).

b. Reports to Higher Headquarters. All reports to higher headquarters will be prepared by the S-3.

c. Military Correspondence Courses. Once initial accurate facts are obtained on MCI/MCES courses the S-3 Section will promulgate reports to Companies/Sections on all of their personnel enrolled, what their lesson status is and when future lessons are due. Company Commanders and Section heads that have personnel delinquent in lesson submissions will be advised by form letter. All MCI/MCES lessons will be submitted directly to the S-3 for mailing and all final exams will administered by the Battalion S-3.

d. Mandatory Training Requirements. Mandatory training requirements (Rifle Range, Essential Subjects Testing, Physical Fitness Testing, ect) will all be conducted at the Battalion level in accordance with weekly training schedules and individual results will be promulgated by the S-3 Section to the Company Commanders/Section Heads on a timely basis to assist in evaluating the individuals overall performance as well as providing a guide on who remains to be trained.

e. Formal/Informal Schools Quotas. School quotas will be handled as they have been in the past with the initial screening conducted by Section Heads, secondary screening by the Company Commander, to include the SRB, and final screening by the S-3. Transportation and orders will be requested by the S-3 to the appropriate section. Company Commanders will be responsible for ensuring pay and mail are delivered to personnel in school and the S-3 will provide updated rosters to each Company Commander on which personnel are in school.

f. Weight Control Program. The S-3 will provide current rosters to Company Commanders/Section Heads of those personnel on the Weight Control Program and after initial interview by the Battalion Surgeon all weekly weigh-in's will be done in the S-3 office. Upon checking into the Battalion an individual may be placed on the weight control program; however, Company Commanders/Section Heads may direct any individual be placed on the Weight Control Program and the S-3 will prepare the necessary paperwork. No individual will be taken off the weight control program without the approval of the Commanding Officer based upon recommendations from the Section Head, Company Commander, and S-3 Officer.

g. Failures on PFT and EST. When an individual fails to attain a passing score on the PFT or EST the Section Head/Company Commander will be advised and make-up instructors will be in accordance with the weekly training schedule and although attendance records will be kept by the S-3, disciplinary action of absentees will be the responsibility of the Section Head/Company Commanders.

4. Action. The below listed action is directed:

Company Commanders: All Company Commanders are responsible:

- (1) For the implementation of the policies and instructions contained in references (a), as modified by this bulletin.


(2) For the consolidation and review of the reports required as shown in paragraph 5. below.

3. EXECUTION

a. Concept. On 21 September 1970, commence movement of tanks of the 1st Tank Battalion (-) by rail for the railhead at BAGDAD, CALIFORNIA. During the period 24 Sep - 5 Oct 1970, subject battalions move by administrative motor march from planning phase command posts to field command posts at CAMP WILSON, MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS. From 6-28 October 1970, each battalion conducts field training, live firing exercises and tactical testing to accomplish training objectives designated in references (b) and (c). Subject battalions will deactivate field command posts during the period 29-30 October 1970, and will return to MCB, CAMP PENDLETON, by administrative motor march not later than 2 November 1970.

b. 1st Battalion (-)(Rein), 12th Marines

- (1) Commencing 1 October 1970, advance party motor marches to MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS, and establishes a base area at CAMP WILSON.

1. GENERAL

- a. References (a) and (b) provide information and instructions for an artillery and tank FIREX (DEFEX 3-70) at MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS, CALIFORNIA, during the period 1 Oct - 1 Nov 1970. TAB H (Vehicle Requirements) to Appendix 3 (Surface Movement) and TAB A (Major Items of Equipment) to Appendix 4 (Equipment and Supplies), both to Annex D (Administration/Logistics) of reference (c) establish vehicle and driver support requirements for the Civil Disturbance Regiment. These aforementioned requirements are cancelled for 1st Bn (-)(Rein), 12th Marines, and 1st Tank Bn (-) during DEFEX 3-70. The Brigade Motor Transport Officer will be prepared to draw these vehicle requirements from other Brigade units, as required. In addition, the 1st Bn, 12th Marines, will be relieved of the requirement to provide 1 officer/29 enlisted to augment the 3d CD Regiment as noted on T/O line number 95 of Appendix 3 (Table of Organization, Hq Co, CD Regiment) to Annex A (Task Organization) to reference (c).
- b. This annex, therefore, addresses itself to reference (d), as it will be the only contingency plan 1st Bn (-)(Rein), 12th Marines, and 1st Tank Bn (-) will be prepared to support during DEFEX 3-70.

2. EXECUTION

- a. Concept. Upon receiving word from higher authority that mount-out by surface or air lift is required by units of this Brigade, in accordance with 5th MEB Operation Plan 303-68 to support contingency operations, the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, or if directed by appropriate authority, the Command Duty Officer, will immediately telephone the Commanding Officers, 1st Bn (-)(Rein), 12th Marines, and 1st Tank Bn (-) to alert them that Phase I of the 303-Plan has been ordered executed. This will be confirmed by message, precedence IMMEDIATE, setting forth pertinent, available information and/or additional requirements. 1st Tank Bn (-) and 1st Bn (-)(Rein), 12th Marines, will then reorganize and be prepared to return by motorized convoy to CAMP PENDLETON within six hours of alert. It is anticipated that both organizations would

be returned to CAMP PENDLETON within 12 hours of original notification. Unit commanders and key personnel will be prepared to depart TWENTYNINE PALMS by designated aircraft within one hour of Phase I alert for return to CAMP PENDLETON.

b. 1st Battalion (-)(Rein), 12th Marines

- (1) Prior to departure for TWENTYNINE PALMS, ensure artillery battery and reinforcing personnel necessary to support ready BLT ALFA by air or surface lift, as required by reference (e), are fully identified and equipment/supplies prepared for mount-out.
- (2) Prepare necessary plans to reorganize personnel at TWENTYNINE PALMS in order that the battalion can be ready to return by motorized convoy within 6 hours of Phase I alert.
- (3) Designate key personnel to return by aircraft to CAMP PENDLETON within one hour of the above alert.
- (4) Establish procedures for the recall of rear echelon personnel remaining at CAMP PENDLETON during DESFEX 3-70.
- (5) On order, carry out the provisions of Annex D (Alert Procedures and Instructions) to reference (d), and be prepared to execute Operation Plan 303-68.
- (6) Direct a liaison officer to report to CO, 3d Marines (-)(Rein), as soon as possible following alert notification.

c. 1st Tank Battalion (-)

- (1) Prior to departure for TWENTYNINE PALMS, ensure that the tank company and reinforcing personnel necessary to support ready BLT or RLT by sea lift, as required by reference (e), are fully identified and equipment/supplies prepared for mount-out.
- (2) Prepare necessary plans to reorganize personnel at TWENTYNINE PALMS in order that the battalion can be ready to return by motorized convoy within 6 hours of Phase I alert.
- (3) Designate key personnel to return by aircraft to CAMP PENDLETON within one hour of the above alert.
- (4) Establish procedures for the recall of rear echelon personnel remaining at CAMP PENDLETON during DESFEX 3-70.
- (5) On order, carry out the provisions of Annex D (Alert Procedures and Instructions) to reference (d), and be prepared to execute Operation Plan 303-68.



- (6) Direct a liaison officer to report to CO, 3d Marines (-)(Rein), as soon as possible following alert notification.

d. Coordinating Instructions

- (1) Direct liaison authorized ALCON.
- (2) For both 1st Bn (-)(Rein), 12th Marines, and 1st Tank Bn (-), prior to departure from TWENTYNINE PALMS, ensure receipt of alert message sent by this Headquarters.
- (3) Ensure return convoy control procedures/measures are thoroughly coordinated with PMO's MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS and MCB, CAMP PENDLETON. Strict compliance with road safety measures is mandatory.
- (4) Report by phone to this Headquarters upon departure MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS, and arrival at CAMP PENDLETON.

1. SUPPLY

a. General

(1) Supply Sources. The supply and maintenance support for the 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment and the 1st Tank Battalion (-) during DESFEX3-70 is as directed herein. In general, each battalion will deploy with repair parts and sufficient supplies to operate for 30 days. Prior to movement to TWENTYNINE PALMS each battalion will ensure that sufficient household supplies are on hand to sustain the deployment period. In addition, each battalion will maintain a supply rear echelon at CAMP PENDLETON for the purpose of processing requisitions that cannot be filled at TWENTYNINE PALMS as outlined in this annex. Non-organic supply and maintenance support will be provided to deployed units by detachments from Provisional Service Battalion, FSR and from logistics elements at TWENTYNINE PALMS.

(2) Prescribed Loads

a All M-107 water trailers will travel empty.

b Two canteens full - per man.

c Water supply point - CAMP WILSON.

(b) Class II

1 All T/E equipment and adequate E/G for billeting.

1 Fuel

a All vehicles traveling over roads will have fuel tanks filled to capacity (this includes expeditionary cans).

b Resupply will be by tanker at BANNING rest stop.

d Vehicles, equipment and tanks shipped via railway car or lowbed are to be three-quarters full upon loading.

2 Lubricants

a One (1) five gallon can of oil per five 1/4 ton vehicles.

(e) Class V - None

b. Supplies and Equipment Available

(1) Class I - as determined by each battalion.

 - (4) Class IV - as determined by each battalion.
 - (5) Class V - See Appendix 1 (Class V)

 - (8) Class VIII - each battalion is to deploy sufficient medical supplies and equipment to operate a battalion aid station at CAMP WILSON for a period of 30 days.
 - (9) Class IX
 - (a) 30 day operational stock (second echelon).
 - (b) Third echelon repair will be carried by attached service support detachments.
 - (c) Mount out - 30 days will remain at CAMP PENDLETON.
 - (d) Fourth echelon repair parts will be provided by MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS.
 - (10) Class X - None
 - (11) Special Services - each battalion ensure that adequate recreational equipment is on hand for use at CAMP WILSON.
- c. Control and Distribution. Other than as modified in this annex, normal supply procedures as outlined in reference (d) will continue.
- d. Resupply
- (1) If the supply accounts within the deployed battalions and the Provisional Service Battalion detachment are unable to fill a requisition, the document will be processed through TWENTYNINE PALMS stock account on a walk through fill or

kill basis. Documents which remain outstanding will be passed by battalion supply to the appropriate rear echelon at CAMP PENDLETON. Filled requisitions will be delivered to CAMP WILSON on a daily basis.

(2) POL will be provided by MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS.

2. EVACUATION AND HOSPITALIZATION

a. Evacuation

- (1) Front Line. Company/battery aid men after administering emergency treatment evacuate patient to BAS.
- (2) Battalion Aid Station. Medical officer supervises the functioning of the BAS. Evacuation of patients will be via ambulance or helicopter to MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS Hospital or USAF Hospital, MARCH AFB.

b. Hospitalization

- (1) BAS at CAMP WILSON for minor injuries, sickness or emergency treatment prior to evacuation to one of the below listed hospitals.
- (2) Hospital, MCB, TWENTYNINE PALMS.
- (3) USAF Hospital, MARCH AFB.
- (4) USNH, MCB, CAMP PENDLETON.
- (5) The TWENTYNINE PALMS Base Hospital has a limited capacity and capability. The determination as to who shall be evacuated to the USAF Hospital, MARCH AFB, will be made by a medical officer at the TWENTYNINE PALMS Hospital.

3. TRANSPORTATION. See Appendix (2) (Movement Schedule).

4. SERVICE

a. Functions

- (1) Construction. Minimum essential to the accomplishment of mission of the exercise.
- (2) Maintenance. Maximum use of logistic support unit capabilities for 3rd and 4th echelon maintenance.

(3) Salvage. In accordance with reference (d).

b. Assignment of Responsibilities

(1) DET, 5th FSR - Attached

- (a) Provide ordnance contact team and spare parts van for support of Operation Order 3-70.
- (b) Report to CO, 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment when directed.
- (c) Proceed with main body 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marines on or about 5 October 1970 to TWENTYNINE PALMS.
- (d) Detached upon return to CAMP PENDLETON on or about 31 October 1970.

(2) DET, Provisional Service Battalion - Attached

- (a) Provide 3rd echelon maintenance support for a 30 day period.
- (b) Provide senior SNCO to serve as NCOIC of Logistics Support Unit made up of a detachment from 5th FSR, 1st Shore Party Battalion and Provisional Service Battalion.
- (c) Report to Commanding Officer, 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment when directed.
- (d) Proceed with main body 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marines on or about 5 October 1970 to TWENTYNINE PALMS.
- (e) Detached upon return to CAMP PENDLETON on or about 31 October 1970.

(3) DET, 1st Shore Party Battalion - Attached

- (a) Provide one (1) HST for support of DESFEX 3-70.

5. PERSONNEL

- d. Public Information. Joint Public Affairs Office to furnish sufficient personnel for coverage of exercise. All releases will be coordinated by the Joint Public Affairs Officer, MCB, CAMP PENDLETON.
- e. Leave and Liberty. In accordance with Brigade Order 1050.1A.
- f. Decorations and Awards. In accordance with Brigade Order 1650.2.
- g. Personnel Procedures. In accordance with Brigade Order P5000.1.

6. MISCELLANEOUS

- a. Rear echelon
 - (1) As designated by the parent unit commander(s).
 - (2) Provide positive security for all government property remaining with the rear echelon at MCB, CAMP PENDLETON.

- b. Ordnance Security. Security of small arms, crew served weapons and optical equipment will be in accordance with references (d) and (e).
- c. Reports. Battalions will continue to submit normal MARES/FORSTAT report.
- d. Uniforms and Equipment
- (1) Minimum issue of field uniforms will be taken.
 - (2) Utilities will be worn at all times (except when on Liberty), trousers bloused, helmets brown side out.
 - (3) Normal equipment will be taken including air mattresses and sleeping bags.
- e. Recall
- (1) During DESFEX 3-70, deployed battalions will maintain a combat state of readiness to insure compliance with designated 5th Marine Amphibious Brigade contingency plans. At a minimum the following requirements will be met:
 - (a) Be prepared to return all wheeled vehicles, equipment, supplies and personnel to CAMP PENDLETON within twelve (12) hours. However, sufficient personnel will remain at TWENTYNINE PALMS to move the tracked vehicles to the entraining/truck loading point and to deactivate CAMP WILSON.
 - (b) All supplies will be retained in mount out boxes to facilitate rapid redeployment.
 - (c) Rear echelon personnel at CAMP PENDLETON will be capable of initiating the required contingency actions until the return of the Battalion Commander and his staff.
 - (d) Battalions deploying to TWENTYNINE PALMS will prepare instructions for return to CAMP PENDLETON if recalled by this headquarters.
 - (e) Requirements for bus transportation will be requested from Brigade G-4.
 - (2) Brigade G-4 will be prepared to request bus

transportation for return of deployed personnel upon determination of total requirements.

h. Fiscal Instructions

- (1) Generators. Operation of two KW60 Generators for the base camp will be funded by a Request for Performance of Work (RPW) placed at Marine Corps Base, TWENTYNINE PALMS, by the Brigade Comptroller. Requisitional authority for DSSC for the 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment and 1st Tank Battalion (-) will be reduced by \$670.00 to cover the charges.
- (2) Ice. The cost of ice provided by contract (28,000 pounds each unit) arranged by Marine Corps Base, TWENTYNINE PALMS, will be funded by an RPW placed at Marine Corps Base, TWENTYNINE PALMS, by the Brigade Comptroller. Requisitional authority for DSSC for 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment and 1st Tank Battalion (-) will be reduced by \$330.00 to cover the charges.
- (3) POL and DSSC Requirements. Existing credit plates for POL and DSSC held by both 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 12th Marine Regiment and 1st Tank Battalion (-) will be honored by Marine Corps Base, TWENTYNINE PALMS. In the event the existing credit plates are not mechanically compatible with the stamping devices, new plates will be issued by the Base Comptroller, TWENTYNINE PALMS.
- (4) Priority 6 NORS Requisitions and Other Emergency Requirements. Requisitions for these requirements will be submitted to the supply source at Marine Corps Base, TWENTYNINE PALMS, on a fill or kill basis. Standard unit JON's will be used on the requisitions. A copy of the requisitions which are filled will be sent to the Brigade Fiscal Officer for obligation.
