All companies are within the Da Nang TAOR. The 1st Tank Battalion retains administrative control of all companies.

The 1st Tank Battalion is currently in category 0-1 with a chargeable strength of 37 Marine Officers, 569 Marine Enlisted, 2 Navy Officers and 15 Navy Enlisted.

During the month of October, the Battalion joined 1 Marine Officer, 17 Marine Enlisted and 1 Navy Officer (Chaplain) and 1 Navy Enlisted. During the same period 7 Marine Officers and 14 Marine Enlisted were transferred. It is anticipated that this Battalion will lose a total of 56 personnel during the month of November due to normal rotation attrition.

Eleven requests for extension were submitted during October. This brings the total requests for the year to 88. The total man months gained by these extensions are 486.

Critical personnel shortages exist in MOS's 2002, 2025, 1316, 2311, 2841, 2861, 3091, 3371, 3516, and 3531.

Due to operational commitments fostered by increased responsibilities within the Southern Sector Defense Command, 1611 MOS personnel have been diverted into security units, which would result in a critical shortage of tank crewmen if Tank TE deficiencies were received.

The R&R program continues to be the major morale building factor in the Battalion. Motion pictures are the one recreational facility that is enjoyed by more personnel than any other form of recreation.

Post Exchange facilities are small and limited, but adequate. The personnel of this Battalion have access to numerous large and well stocked post exchange facilities and scheduled runs to these P.X.'s are made available.

During the month of October this Battalion sustained 3 casualties, all of which were treated in the field and returned to duty.

During the same period there were 8 non-hostile casualties, 3 of which required medical evacuation.

Administrative and personnel accounting continue without significant difficulty. The Battalion has switched over to the new 395 day computation for RTD. The only difficulty envisioned in this new system is the lack of time (in some instances) for preparation of orders and checking out of the Marine departing. We have however continued to process departing Marines without difficulties. It is anticipated that as the new rotation accounting

system gets better established, any difficulties that were encountered this first month will soon resolve themselves.

On the job training in the O1 field is the primary source of obtaining qualified personnel in the administrative field, however one afternoon per week has been set aside for formal O141 schooling. All company and battalion clerks attend this course of instruction. The course is designed to further their knowledge of personnel administration. When it is noticed that a particular subject such as fitness reports, record of emergency data or pertinent subjects seem to be causing difficulty, a class in that subject is immediately scheduled and the subject is covered in detail.

There were no courts-martial in this Battalion during the month of October. There were 13 instances of punishment under article 15 UCMJ.

INTELLIGENCE

Weather. Temperatures during October ranged from a high 84° to a low of 70°. Precipitation totaling 20.86 inches fell during the month. Humidity remained at the mean level of 81%. Approximately 5 inches of rain fell on the 8th causing flooding and hampering trafficability.

Intelligence. During October the 1st Tank Battalion did not participate in any major operations. Four mine incidents were recorded during October bringing the Battalion total to 104 for the year. Company C continues to bear the brunt of mine incidents, the majority being in the 3d Battalion 1st Marines AOR. There were 23 minor incidents during the month. Of the total incidents 12 were VC initiated. The 1st Tank Battalion was credited with 8 enemy KIA (confirmed), 8 enemy KIA (probable), 1 enemy WIA, 6 enemy captured, and 1 suspect captured.

Within the Southern Sector Defense Command there were five minor contacts, two VC initiated. The increased threat of rocket attack and increase in the possibility of a VC attack to gain a propaganda victory during the Presidential Inauguration and National Holiday resulted in 827 tenant activities, thereby denying the enemy the opportunity to set-up an area from which to fire.

There were no major operations in which 1st Tank Battalion had a direct role. Companies "A", "B", and "C" conducted normal armored patrols, participated in numerous small unit sweeps, escorted convoys, provided on call and H&I fire, employed their tanks as parts of various bridge securities, and maintained their tanks as part of reaction forces throughout the month.

Company "A" (-) returned to the Tank Battalion CP from the Que Son area when the 5th Marines were withdrawn and the area turned over to Army units. Company "A" (-) was given the responsibility for the Cau Do and Tuy Loan Bridges located in the SSDC during the month.

The 2nd Platoon, Company "A" remained attached to Company "B" and in direct support of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines at An Hoa.

Company "B" (Rein) remained in direct support of 7th Marines. Trafficability in their area of operations is deteriorating rapidly with the coming of the monsoon and will all but eliminate combined tank/infantry operations.

Company "C" remained in direct support of the 5th Marines in the Marble Mountain area. This terrain is mostly sand, therefore the tanks can operate better than in the paddy areas.

The locations of the gun companies and their supported units were as follows:

Company "A" (-) - 1st Tank Battalion (Danang)
 2nd Platoon, Company "A" - D/S 2nd Bn, 5th Marines (An Hoa)
 Company "B" (Rein) - D/S 7th Marines (Danang)
 Company "C" - D/S 5th Marines (Danang)

In the various activities which the tanks of 1st Tank Battalion participated in during October, they accomplished their mission with the following results. There were 8 VC KIA Confirmed, 8 VC KIA Probable, and 1 VC WIA, 6 VC captured, and 1 WOS.

During the month of October the 1st Tank Battalion M-67A2 flame tanks expended a total of 3,000 gallons of diesel fuel and/or napalm mix on assigned missions throughout the 1st Marine Division TACR.

Antitank activities decreased during October from previous months. There were 4 mine incidents involving tanks. Three tanks required organizational maintenance repair and 1 required field maintenance repair. The mined vehicles were under repair for an average of 10 days, the longest time period being 22 days and the shortest being 1 day. Personnel casualties included 1 WIA (non-evac). There were no recoilless rifle, RPG, or AP incidents during the month of October.

Training for the month was centered on weapons safety, field fortifications, mines and booby traps, and first aid. Representatives from the S-2 and S-3 sections attended a demonstration of hole hunting techniques on 23 October given by the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. The officer and staff school continues to meet each Friday night. The subjects presented during October included the M17 protective mask, the Claymore mine, and Viet Cong tactics. A weekly briefing summarizing the activities within the Battalion was included by the respective Section Heads. New officers and Staff NCOs were briefed on an individual basis by the Battalion Commander and staff section.

The Combat Operations Center of the 1st Tank Battalion continued to initiate, control and direct defensive activities within the Southern Sector. During the month 827 tenant unit activities were conducted. The 1st Tank Battalion conducted 155 patrols and ambushes and responded with 2 special activities varying from squad to platoon size.

Four significant events occurred in the Southern Sector during October. On 042058H, the lead man in a 3rd LVT squad sized patrol tripped a wire detonating a booby trap at AT994715 which resulted in one USMC WIA. At 201204H, the Southern Sector Defense Command assumed responsibility for the Song Cau Do bridge (AT997706) and the Song Tuy Loan bridge (AT946707). Company "A" (-) was assigned the defense and traffic control for these bridges. The 3rd Platoon Company "A" assumed control of the Song Cau Do bridge and the 1st Platoon Company "A" assumed control of the Song Tuy Loan bridge. On 270115H, a member of a 7th Bulk Fuel Company fire team patrol was accidentally shot and killed by another member of the patrol at AT993731. The casualty was brought out by the patrol and pronounced dead by a corpsman on the scene. At 301405H, the welder of Company "A", 1st Tank Battalion was seriously injured while cutting open a 55 gallon gasoline drum at AT945707. The drum exploded striking the man in the leg and severely burning him. He was priority medevaced at 301440H.

As of 31 October 1967, the following 15 major end items of equipment were T/E deficiencies: One M-51 recovery vehicle, six M48A3 tanks, two M38A1 utility trucks, one M37 cargo truck, two M5 mixing and transfer units, one test set AN/GRM-55, one trailer mounted steam cleaner and one PU-482 30KW generator. The M-51 recovery vehicle and a M67A2 flame tank were dropped from the supply account this month, but the flame tank was replaced by FLC immediately. Ref: 1st Tank Battalion Logistics Summary Report 4/SF/tjo over 4000 dated 1 November 1967.

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon repaired four mine damaged tanks during October. The lull in operations permitted them to completely LTI and repair 12 "A" Company vehicles that returned to the Battalion CP after several months in the field. Seven power packs are currently at FSR for repair (5 transmissions, 3 engines). Ref: 1st Tank Battalion Logistics Summary Report 4/SF/tjo over 4000 dated 1 November 1967.

On 10 October 1967, one M48A3 with dozer blade belonging to "C" Company was submerged while on a recovery mission. This tank was recovered on 13 Oct 1967 and found to be in excellent condition with no residual effects. Due to the shortage of tanks, it has been requested that the submerged vehicle be retained in this Battalion and the answer is pending.

On 25 October 1967, Mr. SHULTZ and Mr. DEROCK from the Department of the Army visited the Battalion CP to discuss the maintenance and utilization of the tank mounted Xenon light. On that same day the Battalion Commanding Officer and the S-4 Officer attended a conference with the Division Supply Officer and the Division Ordnance Officer concerning an interservice supply support agreement with the U.S. Army for critical tank spare parts. Further conferences will be required. Ref: S-4 Journal, 25 Oct 1967, Entries 4 and 5.

General maintenance of the Battalion cantonment has been satisfactory. Preparations for the monsoons as well as improvements of defensive bunkers and wire are continuing. All major buildings within the cantonment were recently inspected by the Navy Public Works Personnel. The estimated cost of renovation is \$278.20, but no date of commencement has been provided. Ref: 1st Tank Battalion Logistics Summary Report 4/SF/tjo over 4000 dated 1 November 1967.

Battalion Supply notes supply response in general has increased during the month of October. Some repair parts for track vehicles were received, but not in sufficient quantity. Ten road wheels and one left hand torsion bar were the only suspension parts received. Twenty-five rolls of wire, WD 1/TT, were received to alleviate a critical shortage of this item.

During the month of October, the First Tank Battalion assumed the security for the Song Cau Da and Song Tuy Loan bridges increasing the FM radio and wire equipment commitments of the Battalion to 100%. The Wire Section completed the installation of a new pole line within the contonement, for the purpose of overheading all contonement lines. An SB-86 switchboard was obtained on temporary loan to improve battalion telephone communications. Forty-two drops are being used. Seven miles of wire was installed locally to provide wire communications to the Song Tuy Loan Bridge security elements. An additional pair of lines in the division cable were obtained to improve telephone communications to the Ammunition Supply Point. Two and one-half miles of five pair cable was buried to eliminate reoccurring cutages of Hoa Cam lines resulting from flares and traffic over wire lines. A three day tab on the battalion switchboard indicates that the daily average of calls is 265 local and 230 trunk.

Presently the Tank Battalion Communications Center is operating as Southern Sector Communications Center and handles communications and Crypto guard for eight tenant units.

The Communications Maintenance Section performed normal repairs and quarterly services on all communications equipment. An approximate 95% operational capability was maintained during the month. Two additional radio modification kits were installed, bringing the modification program to 98% completion.

Plans for the month of November includes the installation of a new internal telephone and contonement defense wire system utilizing the newly completed pole line and the completion of the radio modification program.

Military sick call for October totalled 787. Of these, 21 were referred to hospital facilities for consultations. Eleven Marines were injured during the month, three as a result of hostile action. Of the eight non-hostile injuries two required hospitalization. Fifteen men were hospitalized during October. As a result of hospitalization, 74 days lost time were incurred.

MEDCAP continues to be held 5 days a week in Phong Bac and the Hoa Cam Dependents Camp. A total of 834 Vietnamese civilians were treated. Two Vietnamese nurses assist a Battalion corpsman in MEDCAP activities.

Veneral disease cases for October totalled seven. Three cases were contacted out-of-country.

Sanitation programs during the month of October were chiefly concerned with control of an inordinately increased fly population throughout the 1st Tank Battalion contonement. A vigorous spray program was instituted, but little headway gained. On the advice of the Preventive Medicine Section of the Division Surgeon's Office, the Battalion S-4 office took steps to destroy breeding sites in a Vietnamese owned dump adjacent to the contonement. Permission has been received from the Hoa Vang District Chief to cover the dump. Engineer support will be requested from the 1st Marine Division to do this.

During the month of October the newly completed Buddhist Association School in Phong Bao was dedicated. In attendance were General LANUE, Colonel BECKINGTON, Lt. Col. TAYLOR and members of his staff, and several local Vietnamese Officials.

A fire in Phong Bao resulted in the destruction of two houses and damage to an additional two houses. Members of the C.A. Team assisted the villagers in fighting the blaze and later the Civic Action Section provided the materials to help rebuild the houses.

The Tank Battalion pig farm continues to be a success. Eight piglets were born on the 17th at farm 5. Five piglets survived and appear to be healthy. During the month two pigs died. The veterinarian examined the remaining animals and began administering antibiotics over a six day period.

During October the reward's program showed continued success. Several items of strategic materials were turned in, the most significant being a 43 pound cratering charge.

PSYOPS continued in the Southern Sector through the use of bulletin boards, leaflets, and PSYOPS movies. The weekly movies were seen by approximately 1300 people.

During October, materials were distributed in the following quantities: 60 1x12's, 25 bags of cement, 3 blackboards, and 3 gallons of paint to the Buddhist School.

60 articles of childrens' clothing.

2 truckloads of lumber to rebuild burned houses.

8 2x12's to pig farms to build farrowing pens.

15 bags of rice to people whose crops were destroyed by a fire.

1 October 1967: At 011555H, while escorting LVTs, a Company "C" tank hit a mine estimated at 50 pounds at (BT118619). Damage to the tank was moderate. There were no casualties. Ref: S-3 Journal, 1Oct67, Entry 7

2 October 1967: At 020800H while on a road march with 1st Battalion, 5th Marines, a Company "A" tank hit a mine estimated at 30 pounds at (BT127438). Damage to the tank was light. There were no casualties. Ref: S-3 Journal, 2Oct67, Entry 4

At 021214H while on patrol with Company "C", 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines enroute to Co Luu (2), a Company "C" tank hit a mine, estimated at 30 pounds at (BT083602). Damage to the tank was moderate. There were no casualties. Ref: S-3 Journal, 2Oct67, Entry 7

5 October 1967: At 062200H a Company "B" tank spotted a sampan at (AT941541). The tank fired 1 round of 90mm HE, sinking the sampan. Enemy casualties are unknown. Ref: S-3 Journal, 6Oct67, Entry 4

10 October 1967: At 100843H a tank from Company "C" attempted to maneuver on the wet rice paddies at (BT044654) and became submerged. The tank was retrieved two days later. Ref: S-3 Journal, 10Oct67, Entry 1

12 October 1967: At 120955H a tank from Company "C" hit a mine at (BT09679) while leaving the CP. Damage to the tank was moderate. There was one USMC WIA (non-evac). Ref: S-3 Journal, 12Oct67, Entry 5

18 October 1967: At 181900H 6 VC in utilities and carrying weapons were sighted at (AT929504). Two Company "B" tanks fired 9 rounds 90mm HE and 1 round 90mm WP killing 5 VC (Confirmed). Ref: S-3 Journal, 18Oct67, Entry 5

19 October 1967: At 191130H a Company "B" patrol spotted 2 VC in a field at (AT969598). A Company "B" tank fired 2 90mm WP rounds and 1 90mm HE. A search resulted in 2 VC captured. Ref: S-3 Journal, 19Oct67, Entry 4

At 192145H a Company "B" patrol received 20 to 35 rounds of small arms fire and saw 8 VC moving from a treeline at (AT957604) and (AT955605). One tank returned fire with 2 rounds 90mm HE, .30 cal and .50 cal fire resulting in 2 VC KIA (Probable). Ref: S-3 Journal, 19Oct67, Entry 5

20 October 1967: At 201000H a patrol from Company "K", 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines came under heavy small arms fire at (AT945605). A Company "B" tank fired 3 rounds 90mm HE at treeline. A search resulted in 3 VC KIA (Confirmed) and 3 VC Captured. Ref: S-3 Journal, 20Oct67, Entry 6
