## 9. FIRE DIRECTION

Due to increased emphasis on the firing of sensor targets, an increase in the expendature of ICM projectiles has occured. This has been done to preclude damage to sensors by direct hits or near misses by high explosive point detonating projectiles. As a result, the battery has been unable to maintain an acceptable level of ICM projectiles on hand. Efforts are being made to correct this situation.
