On 25 June, 1967, the plateon of 155 Howstzers (SP), from L Battery, 4th Battalion, 12th Marines was released from OPCON of the 155mm Gum plateon at GIA LE.

On 29 Julius, 1967, the platoon of 155mm Guns was moved from its position at GIA LE, 3rd Engineers compound at (YD 829153) and took up a position at (YD 716106) in continued support of Operation CUMBERLAND.

During the month of June, the battery continued to improve its defensive positions and defensive counter-attack plans. Two bunkers were rebuilt and numerous fighting holes were added. The battery's extensive wire laying effort has continued with resulting thicknesses in many areas approaching 70 ft. Other wire has been laid to better channelize the enemy into predesigned killing zones. Extensive perimeter white lighting has also been erected with a range of 500 meters.

As part of the battery's overall security measures the battery ran 7 patrols and put out 13 listening posts.
