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From 1 - 31 January 1968, the battery continued to improve its position and defensive fire plans. Construction was completed on 7 perimeter fighting holes and 11 interior positions designed to provide rapid protection against mortar and/or rocket attacks. Interior positions bolster the secondary line of defense within the compound. In addition, 2 gun pits and 1 ammunition bunker were constructed. As a part of the battery's overall security measures, 5 patrols were run and 7 listening posts were established during the month of January.

On 26 January, 1968, the battery received an estimated 60-80 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. During the attack, 10 WIA's were sustained, 5 of which were from the 8" HOWITZER Platoon.

On 29 January, 1968, 2 155mm GUNS (SP), M-53, were signed over on temporary loan to the 5th 155mm GUN BTRY (SP) at Camp Evans, RVN (YD53453153) for deployment with the 1st Air Cavalry Division, USA.
