PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the period 1-30 April 1968, the battery continued to improve the position area and defensive fire plans. Numerous ammunition bunkers, perimeter bunkers, fighting holes, and interior bunkers. Additional defensive perimeter wire was constructed during this period. As a part of the battery's overall security measures, 30 listening posts were established and 5 patrols run during the period 1 - 30 April 1968.

On 8 April 1968, a platoon of guns was displaced to a position on the Western PHU BAI perimeter (YD 8736 1265). Since that time the platoon has continued to improve its position area and defensive plans. The displacement has proved valuable both in terms of potential area of coverage and dispersion of artillery weapons. Fires can be, and have been effectively massed from the platoon position and the battery area.

B. Intelligence. The battery mans one of the PHU BAI perimeter FLASH OP towers and aids in rocket/mortar target acquisition. For other intelligence and target acquisition the battery depends on the S-2, 1st FAG.

C. Organization and Operations.

(1) The battery participated in no operations during the month of April 1968.

D. Training. During the period 1 - 30 April 1968, the battery scheduled and held seven (7) hours of formal classes in general military subjects. Average attendance at the formal classes was 70%. In addition, a minimum of ten (10) hours of MOS training was accomplished by each section in the battery. Two (2) hours of gun drill and two (2) hours of FDC chart drill was also conducted daily.

E. Logistics, Equipment and Supply. At the end of this reporting period, the five (5) guns possessed by this battery were all operative. During the month of April, one (1) gun, 155mm M-53 was nominated for R & E. The overall supply picture is satisfactory. Major items on loan to other units are:

F. Civic Action/Civil Affairs. The battery is responsible for the Civic Action Program in the village of Loc Bon (YD 926104). The battery's Civic Action Officer and members of the battery visited the village two (2) times weekly during the month of April. Programs were begun to construct wells and a market place for the village, as well as repairs to the school house damaged during the TET Offensive. In addition, 16,800 piasters were donated to the TUOY LOUNG Catholic Orphanage by members of this command.

G. Psychological Operations. None

H. Combined Action Program. During the month of April, the battery provided one (1) meal weekly to the Combined Action Platoon assigned to the village of Loc Bon (FY 926104).
