## UNCLASSIFIED NARRATIVE SUMMARY

# 1. Commander's Narrative Summary of Significant Events

The 1st Platoon remains at mouth of Cua Viet River (YD 348696) supporting 12th Marine Regiment by both indirect and direct fire

missions.

The 2nd Platoon moved on 3 February 1967 to coordinates AT 98416748

where they became OPCON to 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. They occuppied this indirect fire position for the remainder of the month.

The 3rd Platoon moved to coordinate AT 997723 in general support, reinforcing of 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines. The 3rd Platoon utilized four LVTH6's on one direct fire mission in support of 1st Marine Regiment on 4 February 1967. On 7 February 1967 an LVTP5A1, while participating in this same direct fire mission, was destroyed by a land mine. (See Part III, paragraph 1h) The table below summarizes indirect and direct firing activities of this Company for the month of February.

### PART III

### SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

### 1. Sequential listing of significant events

a. <u>Personnel</u>. Enlisted personnel losses for this period were 4 battle casualties (medevac), 2 battle casualties (not evacuated), 1 non-battle casualty (hospitalized during entire period and transferred), 2 on rotation to CONUS, and 2 transferred to other Regiment units. This unit joined 1 officer and 3 enlisted during this reporting period. Promotions were 1 to Staff Sergeant and 2 to Private First Class. Five enlisted were awarded Purple Hearts. Morale and personal services included R&R (in country and out of country), postal services, religious facilities, and access to exchanges. This unit captured no POW's.

- b. Administration. This period was used to carry out routine administration and to improve administration facilities and procedures. The command section continued to maintain administrative and disciplinary control over its deployed platoons. Certain difficulties were encountered in processing of 3 court martial of members of the 1st Platoon due to the distance involved between the Command Post and 1st Platoon.
  - c. <u>Intelligence</u>. Nothing significant to report.
- d. Training. All elements of this Company continued on a planned program of GMSP subject classes and On the Job Training.
  - e. Logistics. No significant problem areas.
  - f. Special Operations. None
- g. Command and Control. As of 28 February 1967 the 1st Armored Amphibian Company CP was located at coordinates AT 997723, the 1st Platoon at coordinates YD 348696 (Direction of Fire: Az 4899), the 2nd Platoon at coordinates AT 984674 (Direction of Fire: Az 3999), and the 3rd Platoon at coordinates AT 997724 (Direction of Fire: Az 5699).

### h. Close Combat.

- (1) On 5 February 1967 two LVTH6's, while in direct support of 3rd Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment, fired 80 rounds, direct fire, into river-bank emplacements at coordinates AT 034654 killing 4 VC (CONF) and materially aiding in the subsequent capture of 13 POW's. One U.S. Marine WIA (medevac) resulted during the action of gunshot wounds to the right, upper arm. It should be noted that this WIA was wearing a flak-vest and the round, thought to be .30 caliber, was deflected from this Marines chest by the upper right plate of the flak-vest.
- (2) On 7 February 1967 an LVTP5A1 belonging to this Company struck a land mine at coordinates AT 109584 (approximately). The vehicle caught fire immediately and was completely destroyed. This LVTP5A1 was leading two LVTH6's through a channelized area at the time of the explosion. Four WIA's resulted from this action.
  - i. Fire Support. Nothing significant to report.
  - j. Air Defense. Not applicable.
  - k. Combat Air Support. Not applicable.
  - 1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action. Nothing significant to report.
- m. <u>Nuclear</u>, <u>Biological</u>, <u>Chemical or other Special Warfare</u>. Not applicable.
