NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. The 1st Platoon remained at the mouth of the Cua Viet River (YD 348698) supporting the 12th Marine Regiment in both direct and indirect fire missions. Two LVTH-6's from the 1st Platoon were located near the DMZ (YD 190730) providing direct support to the 1st Bn, 4th Marines in support of foliage clearing operations. (see Special Operations)
- 2. The 2nd Platoon continues to be located at coordinates (AT 98416748) where they are OPCON to the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. They remained in position for the entire period with the exception of 28-31 May 1967, when two LVTH-6's and one LVTP-5Al participated in an operation with B and D Companies of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. (see Special Operations)
- 3. The 3rd Platoon remained at the Command Post coordinates (AT 995723). They performed the mission of General Support Reinforcing for the entire period with the exception of 21-25 May 1967, when they participated in Operation DUVAL. (see Special Operations)

b. <u>Training</u>. This Company continued on a planned program of GMSP subject classes and On The Job Training. Special emphasis was placed on instruction of the M-16 rifle to include familiarization firing. Test firing and familiarization firing of individual and crewserved weapons continued as required.

c. Special Operations

(1) Operation FIREBREAK. From 1-27 May 1967, two LVTH-6's from the 1st Platoon were in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines in conjunction with foliage clearing operations located near the DMZ at Con Thien (YD 190730). At 1630 on 12 May 1967, their position came under a heavy mortar attack and LVTH-6 USMC # 105424 received a direct hit behind the turret. As the result of the explosion, we received one KIA and two WIA's who were medevacted. On 21 May 1967, this same vehicle was mined enroute from Con Thien to the 1st Platoon's position at the mouth of the Cua Viet River. One man was WIANE. The vehicle sustained hull and track damage, however, sufficient repairs were made to enable the LVTH-6 to return to the 1st Platoon's position under its' own power. The vehicle

was coded X by FISG and was replaced by another LVTH-6 from the maintenance float. During their stay at Con Thien the two LVTH-6's came under intense fire on several occasions. Through the use of the beehive round in one instance, the section was able to thwart an enemy attack and were credited with 75 confirmed enemy KIA's.

- (2) Operation DUVAL. On 21 May 1967, the 3rd Platoon moved to coordinates (BT 823858) in order to perform the mission of Direct Support for the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. Primary mission was indirect fire. All missions were H&I except for one indirect fire mission. No rounds were fired in Direct Fire and no contact was made with the enemy. A total of 146 HE rounds were fired.
- (3) Operation with B and D Companies 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. On 28 May 1967, two LVTH-6's from the 2nd Platoon and one LVTP-5Al moved to coordinates (BT 163539) in support of B and D Companies of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. The section was assigned the mission of Direct Fire. One enemy KIA was confirmed to include a secondary explosion in the small boat the KIA was negotiating. The two LVTH-6's were very effective in the suppression of enemy sniper fire. A total of 108, 105mm Howitzer projectiles were fired. The section returned to position on 31 May 1967.
