NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. The 1st Platoon departed from its position at the mouth of the Cue Viet River (YD 348698) on 7 June 1967. They arrived at the Command Post (AT 995723) on 9 June 1967 after experiencing difficulties in getting from the Bridge Pier to the Command Post due to a read from coordinates 002723 to 028733 being closed to tracked vehicles. They have remained in the CP except for two vehicles that supported the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines for two days.
- 2. The 2nd Platoen continues to be located at coordinates (AT 98416748) where they are OPCON to the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. During the month, they remained in position except for participating in operations ARIZONA and BROWN from 13-20 June 1967.
- 3. The 3rd Platoen left the Command P st, coordinates (AT 995723), on 6 June 1967 and arrived at the 1st Plateon's eld position at the mouth of the Cua Viet River (YD 348698) on 7 June 1967. They have performed the mission of General Support Reinfercing for the entire period. The 3rd Platoon received heavy artillery and mortar fire on 12 June 1967 resulting in five WIAs. Three members of the platoon distinguished themselves and were recommended for awards.

- a. <u>Personnel and Administration</u>. The Company has 66% of its personnel due for rotation during the months of October and November of this year. Routine administration was conducted normally without any significant problems or unusual occurrences. Below are listed the significant personnel changes during the month:

b. Training. This Company continued on a planned program of GMSP subject classes and on the job training. Officer and Staff school is conducted on a weekly basis. Special emphasis was placed on instruction of the M-16 rifle to include care, cleaning and familiarization firing. Test firing and familiarization firing of individual and crew served weapons continued as required.

c. Special Operations

(1) Operation ARIZONA. From 13-20 June 1967, the 2nd Plateen was involved in a multi-battalien operation south of DaNang. On 12 June 1967, one section from the 2nd Plateon moved to coordinates 870480 to provide direct fire for the 2nd Battalien, 7th Marines. On 14 June 1967 the remainder of the 2nd Plateon moved to Hill 65 (coordinates 882581). At approximately 1800 on 15 June 1967, an LVTH-6 vehicle #22, received a direct hit in the radiator from a 57mm redoilless rifle. Consequently, the engine froze, In Operation ARIZONA/ One man was KIA and two men were WIA and evacuated. On 17 June 1967, one section secured from the operation and returned to their command post at 1st Battalien, 11th Marines. Another section went to Hill 55 (coordinates 970627) for indirect fire in support

of Operation NROWN and secured on 20 June 1967. There were no confirmed enemy casualties from a ither operation. The plateon expended 2,366.50 caliber rounds, 1,400.30 caliber rounds, 750 7.62mm rounds and 250 rounds of 5.56mm ammunition.

(2) Operation with G Company. 2nd Battalien. 7th Marines. On 27 June 1967, two LVTH-6s and one LVTP5 from the 1st Plateon moved to Hill 190, (coordinates 895822), in support of G Company, 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines. They assumed a defensive role and fired indirect fire until 30 June 1967, at which time they secured from the operation and returned to the CP.
