PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. From 1 January through 25 January 1968, the First Platoon(-) was located at the Company CP, grid (AT 995723), with the assigned tactical mission of general support. The platoon provided a section of INTH6s for Hill 47 OP, grid (AT 974703); a section being rotated every two weeks from the Company CP. Although in general support of the 11th Marines, this section has a priority mission of direct fire into the rocket belt. In fulfilling this mission, the section fired a total of 108 rounds, 105mm direct fire on active enemy rocket positions on 3 January 1968. (See Part III, paragraph 4a). On 9 January 1968, the second section displaced to the 3rd 8-inch Howitzer Battery position, grid (AT 921799). The first section embarked for the Cua Viet on 25 January 1968, as part of the planned rotation of platoons. The second section displaced from the 3rd 8-inch Howitzer Battery position to the Bridge Ramp, DaNang, on 29 January. On 30 Jan, the second section assisted the ARVN 4th Armored Regiment in a sweep in the vicinity of the Bridge Ramp. (See Part III, paragraph 4b). The second section embarked from the Bridge Ramp for the Cua Viet at approximately 1500 on 30 January and arrived on 31 January. On 31 January, the first section was committed to support M Company, 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines in an attack on Thon Mai Xa Thi, grid (YD 286672). (See Part III, paragraph 4c).
- 2. The Second Platoon (-) remained at the mouth of the Cua Viet River, grid (YD 348698), with the tactical mission of general support reinforcing of the 12th Marines, with priority of fires to the 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion. On 26 January, the 1st section was relieved by the 1st section, 1st Platoon, and embarked for DaNang; arriving at the Company CP on 27 January and being positioned at the 3rd 8-inch Hewitzer Battery position on 28 January. The second section was relieved by the 2nd section, 1st Platoon, on 31 January and embarked for the DaNang area.
- 3. From 1 January to 16 January 1968, the 3rd Platoon (-) was located at the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines CP, grid (AT 984675), with the assigned tactical mission of general support reinforcing. From 1 January to 9 January, the 1st section was located at the 3rd 8-inch Howitzer Battery, 11th Marines position. On 9 January, the 1st section displaced to the Company CP for 2nd echelon maintenance in preparation for the move to Hoi An. On 13 January, the 1st section displaced to Hoi An, grid (AT 110581) in support of the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade. The remainder of the platoon (minus one LWTH6) displaced to Hoi An on 16 January. The third platoon was assigned the tactical mission of direct support of the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade. From 29-31 January, the platoon participated in a sweep operation in support of the brigade. (See Part III, paragraph 4d).

- 2. TRAINING. No significant changes from last report.
- 3. <u>LOGISTICS</u>. This Company is still awaiting the arrival of two of the four LVTE1 suspension components to effect complete conversion of the current LVTP5Al suspension system. The Company is presently operating without four (4) direct fire sights which have been placed on "Red Ball."

4. SPECIAL OPERATIONS

- a. Counterrocket Fire (3 January 1968)
- (1) 030406H Jan68. Section of LVTH6s on Hill 47 sighted the initial volleys of enemy rockets launched against the DaNang complex on an initial azimuth of 215 degrees magnetic. Rockets appeared to be launched in clusters of three or four. Attack was immediately reported to the 1st Tank Battalion and 1st Armored Amphibian Company and clearance to fire was requested.
- (2) 030410H Jan68. Clearance to fire was given by the 1st Tank Battalion in coordination with 1st Battalion, 7th Marines.
- (3) <u>030411H Jan68</u>. Commenced firing at a range of 3000 to 3400 meters on the direct fire sight.
- (4) 030421H Jan68. Ceased firing. Fired a total of 86 HE, 14 WP and 8 HEPT rounds. Surveillance: 10 to 15 secondary explosions were sighted and section was credited with 4 confirmed KIAs.
 - b. 2nd Section, 1st Platoon (Bridge Ramp)
- (1) Approx. 300900H Jan68. CO, lst Armored Amphibian Company visited the second section staged for embark at the Bridge Ramp, DaNang, grid (AT 033762). ARVN air and ground forces were engaged in sweep operations in vicinity of I Corps compound and APBA village and appeared to require additional fire support. The section was volunteered to the I Corps G-3 advisor for use in the sweep.
- (2) Approx. 300930H Jan68. The section moved out in support of the ARVN 4th Armored Regiment. Direct 105mm fire was delivered against VC forces in the vicinity of grids 027755, 033749 and 037744. Twelve rounds of HE/PD and approximately 1500 rounds of .50 caliber were fired. There were no friendly casualties or damage. No estimate of enemy casualties.

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- (3) Approx. 301330H Jan68. Section secured from the operation and returned to the Bridge Ramp.
- c. <u>lst Section</u>, <u>lst Platoon (Unnamed Operation)</u>. On 31 January 1968, the lst section, lst Platoon was committed to support M Company, 3rd Battalion, lst Marines in an attack on Thon Mai Xa Thi, grid (YD 286673).
- (1) Attack commenced on the morning of 31 January. Enemy strength unknown. First contact met with heavy resistance from well emplaced bunkers and trench lines.
- (2) 312100H Jan68. Village was approximately 80% secured. Received sporadic light to heavy artillery and small arms fire. Suffered two minor WIANE from RPG hit on tractor 11. Only minor damage to vehicle. Fired a total of 300 rounds of 105mm HE. No surveillance available.
- d. 3rd Platoon (Unnamed Operation). On 29 January, the Third Platoon was committed to a sweep operation in support of elements of the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade.
- (1) 281730H Jan68. Displaced to grid (BT 158605), azimuth of fire 4800 mils (grid).
- (2) 291700H Jan68. Displaced to grid (BT 220534), azimuth of fire 3200 mils (grid).
- (3) 301600H Jan68. Displaced to grid (BT 178593), azimuth of fire 3200 mils (grid).
