PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. From 1 May through 31 May 1968, the Company CP remained at grid (AT995723) providing logistic and administrative support for all plateons.
- 2. During the reporting period the planned rotation of the 1st and 3rd Platoons was completed. On 2 May, Tractor 16 arrived at the Bridge Ramp, grid (AT 033762) from the Cua Viet. This vehicle was temporarily deadlined for tube replacement on arrival. On 9 May, Tractor 11 arrived at the Bridge Ramp and was positioned in the Company CP. On 13 May, Tractors 13 and 14 arrived at the Bridge Ramp and were positioned at the 3rd 8-inch Howitzer Battery position, grid (AT 921799) and Hill 47, grid (AT 974703), respectively. The rotation of the 1st Platoon was completed upon the arrival of Tractors 12 and 15 at the Bridge Ramp on 20 May 1968. From 1 May through 19 May 1968, elements of the 1st Platoon, at the Cua Viet, were OPCON to the 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines; priority of fires remained with the 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion. On 17 May, one section (Tractors 11 and 16) of WTH6A1s from the 1st Platoon and one LWTP5A1 (CMD) displaced from the Company CP to the vicinity of Hill 65, grid (AT 878577) for Operation MAMEIUKE THRUST (See Part III, paragraph 4). On 22 May, one section of LWTH6A1s (Tractors 12 and 13) displaced to grid (AT 902662) for OPERATION MAME LUKE THRUST (See Part III, paragraph 4).
- 3. On 1 May 1968, one INTH6A1 section (Tractors 23 and 25) from the 2nd Platoon plus one INTP5A1 (CMD) displaced from the Company CP to Hill 55, grid (AT 968616) for further movement to Hill 52 in support of an anticipated operation. On 2 May, Tractors 21, 22, and 24 departed the Company CP for Hoi An as part of the planned rotation of the 2nd and 3rd Platoons. With the cancellation of the anticipated operation, Tractors 23 and 25 displaced from Hill 55 and joined the remainder of the 2nd Platoon at Hoi An on 2 May. From 2 May through 31 May, the 2nd Platoon remained at the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade CP near Hoi An, grid (BT 110581) with the assigned tactical mission of direct support of the Brigade; with one section being located at Dien Ban in direct support of the 6th Battery, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines, 2nd ROK Marine Brigade.
- 4. On 2 May 1968, the 3rd Platoon displaced from Hoi An to the DaNang area as part of the planned rotation of platoons. The tractors of the 3rd Platoon were distributed between the Company CP, Hill 47, and 3rd 8-inch Howitzer position. On 4 May, Tractors 32 and 33, plus one INTP5A1 (CMD) displaced to the 2nd Battalion, 27th Marines CP for an anticipated operation in the Go Noi Island area. With the cancellation of this operation, on 5 May, these tractors returned to the Company CP. On 5 May, Tractors 31 and 33 embarked at the Bridge Ramp for the Cua Viet position; followed by Tractors 32 and 35 on 11 May and Tractors 34 and 36 on 18 May 1968.

SEQUENTIAL LISTINGS OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. During the reporting period, the Company's personnel readiness rating of C1 was maintained. A new manning level was received during May. According to this new manning level the authorized strength has been decreased from 244 to 234 enlisted. This decrease in personnel could create a problem considering the Company's present operational commitments. This Company now rates a total of 15 SNCOs; but only has 8 chargeable. The critical area is the shortage of 1831 SNCOs and SCTs. The Company is presently short two Liaison Officers.

- (6) Promotions: 2 1stLt, 13 Cpl, 6 Lcpl (7) Awards: 2 Purple Hearts
- 2. TRAINING. Due to the numerous operational committments during the month, GMS training was at a minimum. Indoctrination of newly arrived personnel and familiarization firing was continued.
- 3. IOGISTICS. This Company is still awaiting the arrival of two of the four INTEl Suspension components, due in December 1967. The nemerous failures of the INTEl roadwheel tires was the subject of a VER dated 28 May 1968. Due to these failures 86 roadwheel tires were placed on a priority 02 requisition on 29 April, and 100 tires were placed on priority 02 requisition on 17 May. The total of 186 roadwheel tires were placed on "Red Ball" on 4 June. Since this Company has depleted its assets of these tires, any additional failures can not be corrected and vehicles will be forced to run on unserviceable tires or without roadwheels. The Company is beginning to experience difficulties with the IWTH6A1 recoil mechanism. With the present FSR "In Country" assets of recoil replacement parts becoming depleted, future difficulties will lead to longer gun "down-time."

4. OPERATIONS

- a. Operation MAMEIUKE THRUST. On 17 May 1968, Tractors 11, 16 and 02 displaced from the Company CP for Operation MAMELUKE THRUST. The mission of these tractors was to provide direct fire support for the fire base established by Kilo Battery, 4th Battalion, 11th Marines.
- (1) 170900H May 1968. Tractors departed Company CP in route to Hill 65, grid (AT 878571).
- (2) 1717500H May 1968. Tractors arrived at Hill 65 and set in to provide direct fire support of perimeter.
- (3) 181400H May 1968. Tractors left Hill 65 for Hill 52, grid (ZC 213554). Met little resistance in route.
- (4) 182000H May 1968. Tractors arrived at Hill 52. Set up on top of hill for night. Several mortar rounds landed in CP at approximately 2200. No casualties or damage to tractors.
- (5) 191400H May 1968. Fired 19 rounds HE, 3 rounds HEPT, direct fire, at a mortar position. No damage assessment.
- (6) 201330H May 1968. Fired 50 rounds HE and 1 round WP at suspected mortar position. Several mortar rounds landed in CP as soon as tractors started firing. Mortar position was silenced.

- (7) 211100H May 1968. Fired 5 rounds HE with CP fuze, direct fire, at what appeared to be a rock bunker. Two direct hits good coverage of target.
- (8) 221430H May 1968. Took 3 rounds of incoming mortar fire. Two hit in water. One round hit ramp cable on Tractor 01, killing or wounding all FDC personnel inside tractor. Only minor damage to tradtor. Returned direct fire at mortar position. Fired 26 rounds HE, 4 WP, and 50 caliber MG. Mortars silenced.
- (9) 221530H May 1968. Position received incoming mortar fire. Had two WIA(Evac). Returned fire. Fired 31 rounds HE, 1 round WP and 1 round Beehive. Mortars silenced.
- (10) 241130H May 1968. Fired 24 rounds HE at tree line and mountain side. Good target coverage.
- (11) 250715H May 1968. Received approximately 25 to 30 incoming mortar rounds. No casualties or damage to tractors.
- (12) 250745H May 1968. Fired 5 rounds HE at a bunker. Bunker was destroyed.
- (13) <u>252000H May 1968</u>. Received 20 rounds of incoming mortar fire. Returned fire with 16 rounds HE and 3 rounds WP. No damage assessment.
- (14) 260550H May 1968. Fired 40 rounds HE as preparation fires.
- (15) <u>271130H May 1968.</u> Tractor 16 moved out with convoy in route to Thuong Duc airstrip, grid (ZC 151541). Tractor 11 was left behind with half of CP group remaining.
- (16) 271330H May 1968. Tractor 16 arrived at new position and and started back to Hill 52 for Tractor 11.
- (17) 271600H May 1968. Tractor 16 towed 11 to new position on airstrip.
- (18) 28 May 1968. No incidents.
- (19) 290245H May 1968. Tractor 02 took two hits from RPG(B40 rockets). One hit amdship and one on starboard side of ramp. There were 4 WIAs from FDC personnel inside. Damage to tractor was minor.
- (20) 30 May 1968. No incidents.
