PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. From 1 September to 1 October 1968, the Company Headquarters remained at grid (AT 995723); providing logistical and administrative support for all platoons.
- 2. From 1 September to 3 September 1968, the 1st Platoon remained in the DaNang area. On 3 September, the 1st Platoon displaced to the 2nd Korean Marine Brigade area to replace the 2nd Platoon. While in the DaNang area, the 1st Platoon was assigned the tactical mission of general support of the 1st Marine Division, with one section on OP HAWK, grid (AT 974703), with priority of fires into the "Rocket Belt". Upon arrival of the 1st Platoon in the 2nd Korean Marine Brigade area, it assumed the tactical mission of general support of the brigade.
- 3. From 1 September to 3 September 1968, the 2nd Platoon remained in the 2nd Korean Marine Brigade area near Hoi An. On 3 September 1968, the 2nd Platoon displaced to the DaNang area and replaced the 1st Platoon. Upon arrival in the DaNang area, the 2nd Platoon was assigned the tactical mission of general support. One section was positioned on OP HAWK; one section at the Northern Artillery Cantonment, grid (AT 921799); and one section at the Company CP. On 20 September 1968, the 2nd Platoon commenced movement, by section, to the Cua Viet area where it was to replace the 3rd Platoon. This movement was completed on 21 September with the arrival of the last section at the Cua Viet River position. Upon arrival at the Cua Viet, the 2nd Platoon became OPCON to the 12th Marines.
- 4. From 1 September to 13 September 1968, the 3rd Platoon remained at the Cua Viet River position, grid (YD 348698). On 13 September 1968, the 3rd Platoon began displacement, by section, to the DaNang area. This displacement was completed on 22 September with the arrival of the last section. The section that was originally emplaced at the Northern Artillery Cantonment displaced to the 11th Marines CP on 22 September in order to provide indirect fire support for the Northern Artillery Cantonment against an anticipated enemy offensive in the vicinity. This section returned to the Company CP on 30 September after the offensive failed to materialize. On 26 September 1968, the section from the 3rd Platoon positioned on OP HAWK fired 65 rounds of 105mm HE, direct fire, in support of an ARVN unit from the HOA CAM Training Center, who claimed to be in contact with a large enemy force. No surveillance was obtained.
