# NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the reporting period, the Company Headquarters remained at grid (AT 995723); providing logistical and administrative support for all platoons/sections. On 27 April 1969, the Company CP moved to OP HAWK, grid (AT 974703), due to a number of large explosions at ASP-1, grid (AT 9873). (See Part III, section 2, paragraph d).
- 2. From 1 April 1969 to 20 April 1969, the 1st Platoon (-) remained on Hill 52, grid (ZC 215554), in direct support of Operation Oklahoma Hills. (See Part III, section 2, paragraph a). One section remained at Hill 47, grid (AT 974703), and one section was located at the Northern Artillery Cantonment, grid (AT 921799). The section at Hill 47 observed two (2) enemy rocket launchings during the month. (See Part III, section 2, paragraph b).
- 3. From 1 April 1969 to 30 April 1969, the 2nd Platoon remained in the Cua Viet River position, grid (YD 348698), OPCON to the 12th Marines. The Platoon's primary mission was direct support of the 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion. In connection with this mission, the 2nd Platoon displaced one section of guns to C-4, grid (YD 302796). The Fire Direction Center continued to be provided by the 12th Marines. On 30 April 1969, the 12th Marines dropped OPCON of the 2nd Platoon to the 11th Marines. (See Part III, section 2, paragraph e).
- h. During the month of April 1969, the 3rd Platoon (-) remained in general support of the 2rd Korean Marine Brigade. One section (Rein) was positioned in the Brigade's Artillery Battalien Cantonment at grid (BT 109582). One section was positioned at Dien Ban, grid (BT 066585), with a primary mission of direct fire for the Korean Cantonment. The Company's Organic Fire Direction Center is located with the Platoon's Headquarters at the Artillery Battalian Cantonment. In addition to providing direct and indirect fire support for the Korean Marines, the 3rd Platoen (-) fires missions for ANGLICO, Civic Action Platoons and ARVN units within the Hoi An area. On 1 April 1969, in relation to this mission, the 3rd Platoon (-) fired a mission for an Aerial Observer at grid (BT 043560). (See Part III, section 2, paragraph c).

#### 1. PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATION

a. With two LVTH6Al platoens not being under direct Company control, the personnel readiness category has been rated as C-4. Due to the cadre of the Company the projected readiness category during May 1969 will remain as a C-4 rating.

#### 2. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATIONS

- a. OPERATION OKLAHOMA HILLS 20 April 1969. From 29 March 1969 to 20 April 1969, the 1st Platoon (-) provided general support for Operation Oklahoma Hills.
- (1) 191300H April 1969. The 1st Platoon (-) received orders to depart Hill 52, grid (2C 215554), en 20 April 1969.
- (2) 201200H April 1969. The 1st Platoon (-) departed Hill 52 enroute to Company CP.
- (3) 201700H April 1969. The 1st Platoon (-) set in a night defensive position on Hill 65, grid (AT 878576).
- (4) 211000H April 1969. The 1st Plateon (-) departed Hill 65 enroute to Company CP.
- (5) 211200H April 1969. The 1st Platoon (-) arrived at their destination, the Company CP.
- b. Rocket Launchings Observed by OP HAWK 24 April 1969. During the reporting period, OP HAWK observed two (2) separate enemy recket launchings.

- (1) 202050H April 1969. OF HAMK, grid (AT 974703), reported rockets being launched at an azimuth of 2160 and a range of 9000 meters to the 11th Marines! FDC.
- (2) 240120H April 1969. OF HAMK ebserved a velley of 4 to 6 rockets being launched at grid (AT 953683). Due to U. S. Marines near the recket site, the guns on OP HAMK were unable to direct counterrocket fire.
- c. Fire Support Delivered by 3rd Platoon (-) 1 April 1969.
  On 1 April 1969, the 3rd Platoon (-) delivered over forty (40) HE rounds in support of an Aerial Observer.
- (1) Oll7hOH April 1969. An Aerial Observer called a fire mission on VC in sampans at grid (BT Oh3560).
- (2) Oll745H April 1969. The 3rd Platoon's FDC received clearance to fire on the target area.
- (3) 011800H April 1969. After expending 48 HE rounds, the 3rd Platoon received an end of mission.
  - (h) Surveillance:
    - I Confirmed KIA
    - 1 Sampan Destreyed
    - 1 Sampan Damaged
- d. Evacuation of Company CP 27 April 1969. Due to numerous large explosions at ASP-1, grid (AT 9873), the Company, plus all equipment, were moved to OP HAMK.
- (1) 270930H April 1969. The Company Headquarters received word that ASP-1 had a small fire in their grade three ammunition.
- (2) 271415H April 1969. The fire at ASP-1 had become uncontrollable spreading throughout the summittion dump.
- (3) 271425H April 1969. The Company CP reported large pieces of shrapnel landing in the CP area.
- (4) 271430H April 1969. Major HARMS gave the order to move all personnel and equipment to OP HAWK.
- (5) 271140H April 1969. The Company with all equipment completed the move to OP HAM.

- (6) 271945H April 1969. Major HARMS, along with ten (10) other Marines, returned to the Cempany CP for damage assessment. Approximately ninety per cent of the structures in the CP had serious damage.
- (7) 280800H April 1969. The remainder of the Cempany returned to the CP in order to initiate reconstruction of damaged structures.
- e. OPCON of 2nd Platoen changed 30 April 1969. On 30 April 1969, the 12th Marines released the 2nd Platoen to the 11th Marines.
- (1) 301600H April 1969. Due to the cadre of the Company, the 2nd Platoon was ordered to return to the Company CP.
- (2) 301600H April 1969. The 2nd Platoon reported all personnel and gear safely aboard LST 1150 at the Cua Viet River position.
- (3) 011300H May 1969. All vehicles and personnel from the 2nd Plateon had completed their move to the Company CP.
