

- 1. In accordance with reference (a), subject chronology is hereby submitted. Enclosure (1) provides the organization of the Division, names of unit commanders and staff officers, and other pertinent data. A detailed chronology of significant events/activities is contained in enclosure (2). Subordinate unit chronologies, enclosures (3) through (14), are forwarded in amplification of the narrative summary below and in enclosures (1) and (2). 1st and 11th Marines Command Chronologies were submitted to 3d Marine Division, and so are not herewith enclosed.
- 2. During the period of this report, the Division intensified efforts for preparation of entry into Vietnam. Liaison visits to III MAF were increased, with many of the visiting personnel converting TAD into permanent deployment by remaining in Chu Lai. As the month neared an end, the Division Commander's flag was flying over the Division CP in Chu Lai and the long wait was over.
- WEST PAC DEPLOYMENTS. Deployment of Division units from Okinawa to Vietnam were conducted throughout the period. 3d Amilrac Bn and a Detachment, 1st Motor Transport Bn sailed in early March. In mid-March. BLT 3/h departed Okinawa and rejoined 3d MarDiv at Phu Bai late in CALLASSIFIED month. The Division Headquarters and separate battalions embarked during

the second and third weeks (except for 1st Motor Transport Bn which exbarked near the end of March and was to arrive in-country in early April) had closed in Chm Lai and were engaged in operations against the Viet Cong at the close of the period.

- b. <u>RASTPAC DEPLOYMENTS</u>. The remaining EASTPAC units of the Division closed in Chinava, with 2d Bm, 11th Mar, Co C (-), 1st Tank Bm, and Sub-Unit #2 of Hq Bm arriving on Chinava in early March. BLT 3/5 arrived on Chinava near the end of the period, the last 1st Marine Division unit to arrive in the Far East.
- c. 9th MARTHE AMPHIBIOUS BRIGADE. With the entry into Vietnam of lat Marine Division, 9th MAB was activated to meet the contingency requirements of SEVENTH Fleet. BGen STILES, Division ADC was assigned TAD as CG, 9th MAB until the arrival of BGen P. M. RYAN, at which time the ADC will rejoin the Division in-country. The Division was also tasked to provide a portion of the Brigade staff.
- d. ARRIVAL IN-COUNTRY. Many of the Special Staff arrived in Chn Lei in mid-March while the bulk of the Headquarters personnel and equipment arrived in USS GEORGE CLYMER on 23 March. The Chief of Staff arrived on 21 March, the principal staff officers on 27 March, and the Commanding General on 29 March. On his arrival, MajGen FIELDS assumed operational control of all U.S. Marine Corps ground forces in Chn Lei TACE, South Vietnam, commanded by CG 3d MarDiv and accepted the area of responsibility which encompasses Quang Tin and Quang Mgai Provinces. CG, let MarDiv was designated the Chu Lei Installation Coordinator over all organizations and facilities contained in the TACE. CG, let Marine Division reported to CG, III MAF for operational control at 291200H and was assigned the responsibilities above effective 291500H.
- e. OPERATIONS. Operation INDIANA conducted south of the TACR by 3d Mar Div and under the tactical command of Task Ferce DELTA (BGen ENGLISH, ADC, 3d Mar Div) was in progress as the 1st Marine Division assumed the responsibilities listed in sub-paragraph d. above. CG, TF DELTA remained in tactical command of the operation, but reported to CG, 1st MarDiv. Operation INDIANA was initiated 281400H, involved 1st Ma, 7th Mar (minus Co D), 2d Bn, 7th Mar (minus Co F), and Btrys I and C, 11th Mar, and terminated at 301415H Mar. The three-day operation resulted in: 69 VC KIA, 160 VC KIA (possible), one VCC, five VCS and 19 weapons (including two 12.5mm AA guns) captured. Marine casualties were: 11 KIA and 45 VIA. Situation reports, hereto appended, report Operation INDIANA and the Division's small unit actions during the period 29-31 March in greater detail.

The above strengths represent only those units that were ADCON to the 1st Marine Division (Rein) on the specified date. The drop in strength that occurred during the month of March 1966 was primarily caused by the redeployment of BIM 3/4 and shift of ADCON to the 3d Marine Division; activation of RIM 5 and shift of ADCON to the 9th MAB; and shift of ADCON of the 1st Service Battalion to the Force Logistical Command.

Although the Commanding General of the 1st Marine Division assumed OPCON of units in the Chu Lai Combat Base, formerly OPCON to the 3d Marine Division, at 291500H March 1966, ADCON of these units did not shift until 1 April 1966.

Personnel for BLT 3/A

Replacement personnel for BLM 3/4 continued to arrive Okinawa. As of 8 March 1966, the BLM was only 6 officers and 5 enlisted short of full manning level. 1/ Deploying approximately 10 March 1966, the BLM chopped ADCON to the 3d Marine Division on 14 March 1966.

Basic Training Program

On 8 March 1966, a final report 2/ was submitted to CG, FMFPAC on former Basic Marines who were now qualified in a primary MOS and available for transfer. Included in this report were 9 Basic Marines who were not deployable because of administrative or medical reasons. The Basic Training Program conducted by the 1st Marine Division for the past five months was terminated.

Early Rotation of Enlisted Personnel

On the 16 March 1966 quotas 3/ for the early rotation of enlisted personnel were received. Selections and all administrative procedures had to be completed by 25 March 1966. Quotas received listed 459 personnel with an august Rotation Tour Date who would rotate during the month of July. A quota of 1588 was assigned for September rotatees to rotate in august. Quotas established by the Commanding General, FMFPAC were based on the EAR published by DPI #3 dated 25 February 1966.

Since quotas assigned to the 1st Marine Division were based on the EAR of 25 February, it was determined that nominations for early rotation also had to be based on this report. This presented some problems because 3 of the 4 infantry battalions listed in the EAR for the 1st Marine Division were now ADCON 3d Marine Division. The same situation prevailed with Combat Service and Support Organizations as each of the infantry battalions were organized as BIT's when they left the 1st Marine Division.





If only those personnel currently ADCON were considered, the lat Marine Division would have fallen far short (est. 75%) of their assigned quota. This unfilled portion of the quota would probably have been passed to the 3d Marine Division to fill. Because of the time element and the imposed deadline of 25 March 1966, it was determined that the most logical approach was to select nominees from the EAR by RUC regardless of current ADCON status.

The Data Processing Officer, FMFPAC IMAC/fwd was appraised of the procedures that the 1st Marine Division intended to employ. This officer was in full agreement with the plan and in order to coordinate the efforts of the 1st and 3d Marine Divisions issued appropriate instructions. 4/

Nominations were selected by name and RUC from the EAR of 25 February 1966. Personnel selected were in units located on Okinawa, enroute to and in Vietnam. No problems were encountered in verifying selections from units located on Okinawa. With regard to those units enroute to and in Vietnam, a team consisting of one officer and one enlisted was dispatched to DPI #16 on 20 March 1966. This team carried lists of selectees by RUC. Each name was verified using the master personnel deck at DPI #16. Appropriate corrections were made. After verification and with the cooperation of the 3d Marine Division, lists by RUC were distributed to units located in Vietnam. Fortunately, all units enroute to Vietnam at the start of the program were now in-country. All units were instructed to make the required Unit Diary entries.


Card decks and rosters of early rotatees were air mailed 5/ from DPI #16, III MAF to CMC Code DE, Hq, FMFPAC and DPI #3, MCB, Camp Pendleton on 25 March 1966.

Post Exchange

On 31 March 1966, the 1st Marine Division opened its first Post Exchange in the Chu Lai Combat Base. This exchange was opened in the 1st Marines area. Gross sales for the day amounted to \$300.00. At the close of the period the Division Exchange Officer was busily engaged in planning and in the purchase of stock to open branch exchanges throughout the areas occupied by organizations of the 1st Marine Division.

First Marine Division Club System

During the period 14-18 March 1966, the 1st Marine Division Clubs Officer visited all 1st Marine Division Organizations in the Chu Lai Combat Base to determine anticipated club needs. Calls were also made on PACEX officials to alert them to the overall beverage and equipment needs of the Division. In this connection, it is estimated that a total of 29 branch clubs (enl, SNCO & off) would be established in the Chu Lai Combat Base to support the 1st Marine Division and FLSG-B.




G-3 CHRONOLOGY 1 March-31 March 1966

- 1. The Phase II deployment of the 1st Marine Division (Rein) to Vietnam continued throughout the month with all units having departed Okinawa by 29 March 1966.
- 2. During the reporting period this section's efforts were concentrated on final development of plans and SOP's for future operations within and in the vicinity of the CHU LAI Combat Base.
- 3. On 29 April at 1500H, the Division assumed command of all ground forces within the CHU LAI TAOR and the responsibility for coordination and control of the ground defense efforts on all units located therein. Advance liaison and preparation of facilities and communications paid instant dividends as assumption of Command occurred while a major operation, "OPERATION INDIANA" was in progress. Control of the operation was passed from the ADC Command Group to the Division Combat Operations Center effortlessly. The operation terminated at 1415H on 30 March, after inflicting losses of 63 KIA's on NVA/VC forces.
- 4. The CHU LAI Defense Command, the concept for which was developed on Okinawa (See Tab A), was activated on 31 March at 1400H. Upon activation the Defense Command assumed the mission of coordinating the defenses of the Combat Base vital areas.
- 5. On 31 March, the remaining two rifle companies of the 1st Battalion, 4th Marines were dropped to the 3rd Marine Division, thereby leaving only five infantry battalions within the TAOR with which to pursue the enemy. Upon arrival of the 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines and ROK Brigade in mid-April our capability to seek out, fix and destroy the NVA/VC forces will be enhanced immeasurably.
- 6. At the close of the reporting period, in addition to normal G-3 functions the following facilities were functioning under the staff cognizance of this section:
 - a. Combat Operations Center
 - b. Command Center





G-4 NARRATIVE SUMMARY



Psychological Operations Narrative Summation of Significant Events

- 1. Organizational Data
 - (a) Location: Chu Lai, Republic of Viet Nam
 - (b) Period covered: 1-31 March 1966
 - (c) Psychological Operations Officer: First Lieutenant M. D. WYLY 084251/0302 USMC

2. Narrative Summary:

a. 1-29 March - During the period from 1 March until the First Marine Division was established in the Republic of Viet Nam on 29 March, the Psychological Operations Officer was TAD to the Third Marine Division. Psychological operations were conducted for Task Force Delta, Third Marine Division during Operations Double Eagle II, Utah, and Texas. During these operations leaflet drops were conducted, aerial broadcasts were made, and ground loudspeaker teams were utilized. Intelligence requirements were submitted to Sub Unit One, Third ITT, and U. S. Army civic action intelligence personnel attached to the MACV advisory team to Quang Tin Sector. These sources provided feedback indicative of local reactions to psychological operations employed. Five new leaflets and ten new texts for aerial broadcasts were developed and forwarded to the 244th Psychological Operations Company for production. The leaflets that were developed are shown in Appendix B. A procedure for psychological operations to be employed in large scale search and destroy and reaction operations was established for incorporation into the First Marine Division Psychological Operations SOP. Liaison was effected and ground work laid, for future First Marine Division Operations, with the 244th Psychological Operations Company and MACV Advisory Team Two.

b. 29-31 March - When the First Division was established in the Republic of Viet Nam. the Psychological Operations Officer reverted to the Division G-5 Section. Final drafts were completed of the following documents: Psychological Operations Annex to Division General Operation Order; Psychological Operations Annex to Division Order for GOLDEN FLEECE Operations. The Division Psychological Operations Officer contacted the Commanding Officer, 244th Psychological Operations Company and Psychological Operations Officers of the First and Seventh Marines, to commence planning for future GOLDEN FLEECE Operations.







CEO NARRATIVE SUMMARY

9 March COMMUNICATION SECURITY EQUIPMENT


A report was submitted to CG FMFPac summarizing communication security equipment and circuit requirements for Division units and certain other Okinawa based FMF units.

29 March DEPLOYMENT OF 1ST MARDIV HEADQUARTERS




1. SUPPLY

a. General

- (1) This plan prescribes logistics and personnel instructions in support of 1st Marine Division Operation Plan 201-66. It is applicable to subordinate task groupments consisting of the SLF and those RLT/BLT elements which may be deployed in support of assigned contingency operations.
- (2) The 1st Marine Division provides logistic support and/or coordination for all Division units and attachments. Subordinate Commanders are responsible for the logistical readiness of their commands to include:
 - (a) Execution of established policies and procedures in accordance with general directives issued by this Headquarters.
 - (b) Computation and requisitioning of mount—out supplies and allowances as prescribed in reference (a).
 - (c) Packaging, marking and storage of those Class II mount—out supplies authorized at the using/ supporting unit levels, as prescribed in reference (b).
 - (d) Prompt reporting to higher Headquarters of any situation which affects the logistical readiness of the Command.
 - (e) Preparation of appropriate plans to support requirements set forth in this order.

- (1) Unless otherwise directed, upon deployment of the 1st Marine Division or elements thereof, units will embark with all initial allowances of Class II equipment, repair parts, and on-hand operating stocks of all classes.
- (2) Upon deployment of the SLF or any contingency BLT/RLT, supplies to be initially embarked will be as set forth in the Appendices to Annex B (Instructions For Mount Out) as follows:

Surface BLT - Appendix 1

Airlift BLT - Appendix 2

Surface RLT - Appendix 3

RLT Headquarters Airlift w/air echelon and seatail -

Appendix 4

- (3) Total Mount-Out Supplies available to support deployment of 1st Marine Division or any portion thereof is as follows:
 - (a) Class I 30 days: Combination of MCI and Operational "B":
 - (b) Class II 30 days. Initial allowance in hands of units. 30 days replenishment as C/A rate based on initial allowances. 30 days individual clothing required items first 30 days of combat only. 30 days dry cell batteries. 30 days 1st and 2nd echelon repair parts in hands of using units. 30 days 3rd echelon all commodity groups and 4th echelon Comm-Elect repair parts. 30 days medical supplies.
 - (c) Class III 30 days of packaged/drummed/bulk in accordance with quantity and type shipping available.
 - (d) Class IV 30 days fortification materiels. Special Equipment as directed by this Headquarters in consonance with mission and objective area.



c. Control and Distribution

- (1) Organic Division units will hold mount-out Class II, type 1 rolling stock; Class II, type 2 T/A and Non T/A combat essential items and 1st and 2nd echelon maintenance repair parts, except as modified below.
- (2) Mount-out allowance for 1st and 2nd echelon repair parts will be maintained by Headquarters elements only.
- (3) 3rd Force Service Regiment holds Classes I, III, IV and V and other Class II material for Division units. Three BLT Mount-out blocks including 1st and 2nd echelon repair parts, will be maintained by 3rd FSR.

(4) <u>Delivery Responsibility</u>

- (a) G-4 will initiate all requests for release of mount-out supplies.
- (b) Units will pick up mount-out Class II, IV and Basic Allowance Class V from the holding organization.
- (c) In the event time factors preclude delivery and pick up as scheduled, G-4 will coordinate responsibilities and delivery as required.

(5) Mount-Out Blocks

- (a) Mount-out supply blocks will be maintained by cognizant organizations to support task organizations as specified in 1st Marine Division Operation Order 201-66, Annex A (Task Organization).
- (b) Blocks will be palletized, marked and stored to permit rapid vehicle loading. Inventories will be maintained to ensure sufficient availability and proper condition of supplies, pallets, marking and strapping. Blocks will be rotated as required to ensure serviceability upon issue.
- (c) Airlift blocks will be stored in chalk configurations, separated from other mount-out supplies and arranged in such a manner as to permit rapid

loading in preplanned tactical sequence.
Blocks will be split into two lifts of
15 days each. The first 15 days to be airlifted as follows: 5 days initially with
airlifted units and two subsequent air lifts
of 5 days each. The remaining 15 days will
be included in follow-on shipping.

(d) Surface lift blocks will be maintained in two sections of 15 days each. Blocks will be palletized to the maximum extent possible.

(6) Resupply

- (a) Air upon assignment of mission, resupply plans will be developed as required by the extent of committment and objective area.
- (b) Surface remainder of 30 days mount-out supplies not embarked in assault shipping will arrive in follow-on shipping arranged by this Headquarters. The mission and objective area of the deployed unit will dictate support required from other than organic resources.

2. EVACUATION AND HOSPITALIZATION

- a. The health of all embarked personnel is the responsibility of the ship's Medical Officer.
- b. In the assault phase, casualties occurring in landing craft, amphibious vehicles or helicopter transports remain in craft for return to the casualty receiving ship.
- c. In operations ashore, casualties will be evacuated via landing craft, amphibious vehicle: or helicopter to the casualty receiving ship.
- d. Evacuation policy will be announced after establishment of medical facilities ashore.

3. TRANSPORTATION

a. Air and/or Sea. See Embarkation Order 201-66 (to be issued).

b. <u>Motor Transport</u>

(1) Coordination and direct assignment by Division Motor Transport Officer in accordance with reference (c)

4. SERVICE

a. Force Service Regiment

(1) Airlift

(a) Upon request, deliver 5 DOA Class V to the departure air terminal. Remaining 10 DOA to be held pending disposition instructions.

(2) Airlift with Sea Echelon

- (a) Deliver 5 DOA Class V to the departure air terminal.
- (b) Issue Basic Allowance to units from ASP.
- (c) Deliver remainder of 15 day block to staging area. Be prepared to deliver second 15 day block to staging area if requested.

(3) Surface Lift

- (a) Issue Basic Allowance Class V to units from ASP.
- (b) Deliver remainder of 15 day block to staging area. Be prepared to deliver second 15 day block to staging area if requested.

b. Regiment

- (1) Furnish labor augmentation as required by subordinate units. Additional labor requirements to this Headquarters (G-4).
- (2) Be prepared to provide vehicles within capabilities for use of subordinate units within local areas and for transportation to air terminals or POE's as required.
- (3) Upon request, provide public address systems at embark/enplanement points and staging areas.
- c. Shore Party Detachment. Provide essential services, equipment and personnel for establishment and operation of staging areas at designated ports or air terminals.

d. Logistic Support Group

(1) Deliver mount—out supplies to locations as requested by deploying units.

- (2) Upon request, provide essential enplaning/ embarkation data on mount-out supplies to units requiring same.
- (3) Provide required dunnage and load spreaders.
- e. Engineer Company. Be prepared to furnish floodlight units for use at staging areas, ports or air terminals as required.
- f. Motor Transport Company. Provide motor transport as directed by Division Motor Transport Officer.
- g. <u>Division Communication-Electronics Officer</u>. Be prepared to provide communications between this headquarters, units being deployed and staging areas as required.
- h. <u>Division Ordnance Officer</u>. Maintain pre-prepared Class V requisitions and submit to 3d FSR upon order from G-4. Coordinate issues and movement of Class V from holding units to embarking units.
- i. <u>Division Embarkation Officer</u>. Coordinate embarkation of units as required. Maintain liaison between this Head-quarters and embarking units, staging areas, ports and air terminals as required.
- j. Division Provost Marshal
 - (1) Establish liaison with and coordinate movements as requested by embarking units.
 - (2) Maintain liaison with other on-island armed services and civilian law enforcement and traffic agencies to ensure uninterrupted traffic flow during embarkation of organic units.
 - (3) Provide necessary Military Police personnel to assist in convoy and traffic control.
- 5. PERSONNEL. Annex A (Personnel).
- 6. MISCELLANEOUS
 - a. <u>Marshalling/Staging Areas</u>. See Embarkation Order 201-66 (to be issued).
 - b. Rear Echelon
 - (1) As directed by parent units and this Headquarters.





- (2) Supplies and equipment not embarked will be prepared for follow-on shipping.
- (3) Storage of Personal Effects. See reference (d).
- c. <u>Uniform and Equipment for Embarkation</u>
 - (1) Normal arms and equipment.
 - (2) Transport pack with air mattress.
 - (3) Uniform as prescribed by Commanding Officers.
 - (4) Baggage.

GENERAL

- Personnel procedures will be in accordance with references (a) and (k) and the provisions of this Annex.
- The general provisions of this order also apply to the MAB, RLT's and logistics elements when formed.

2. STRENGTH

- A BLT assigned to either the afloat or airlift contingencies will include all units of the designated battalion and those reinforcing elements from other 1st Marine Division organizations as set forth in the activation order. A Beachmaster unit is also included in the task organization of the BLT assigned to the Amphibious Ready Group.
- All units will form a rear echelon. b.
- No transfers or assignments into or out of the BLT will be made after the BLT is activated for operations, except for personnel who will not be embarked due to unauthorized absence, hospitalization, emergency leave, disciplinary cases or security risks.

CONFIDENTIAL

- d. The following personnel are not eligible for assignment to the BLT. Those persons who:
 - (1) Have requested either dependency, hardship or humanitarian transfer or discharge; or is awaiting a discharge other than honorable.
 - (2) Have been twice wounded in the Republic of Vietnam.
 - (3) Are due for rotation to CONUS during the estimated time of deployment.
 - (4) Have a PULHES "T" suffix; or a basic MOS.
 - (5) Will not have reached 18 years of age at time of embarkation or are sole surviving sons except as indicated in MCO 1300.11C.
- e. Those units providing the attachments for BLT's activated for planning will provide the BLT with a roster of those personnel being so assigned.
- f. BLT's activated for operation will report the actual Troop List strength by message to this Headquarters within 8 hours after notification of activation.
- g. Tactical embarkation rosters will be submitted in accordance with reference (a). Corrections must be timely. After embarkation, changes will be submitted by message.
- h. Staffing of MAB Headquarters will be in accordance with Annex A (Task Organization) to 1st Marine Division Operation Order 201-66.
- 3. REPLACEMENTS. As required and as available.

4. DISCIPLINE, LAW AND ORDER

a. <u>Discipline</u>

- (1) Military Justice will be administered in accordance with references (b) through (f).
- (2) Ship's brigs may be utilized while afloat if required. Coordinate use with the Commanding Officer of the ship.
- (3) The place of confinement for prisoners sentenced to be confined in excess of 30 days will be Camp Butler.


 Normally, if a BCD is not involved, confinement in excess of 15 days while aboard ship



and all confinement while ashore will be suspended for 6 months and the individual returned to duty when the BLT is in, or expected to participate in, a combat mission. Confinement will not be such that personnel may utilize same to shirk their duties in a combat area. The provisions of BUPERS Instruction 1640.5D, the Brig Manual, and reference (f) will be followed regarding confinement of repeated offenders.

b. Law

- (1) The Commanding Officer of Troops (within meaning of paragraph 128, of reference (c)) in ships of the Amphibious Ready Group will exercise disciplinary action under Article 15 of reference (d), over embarked personnel of the BLT. Authority for exercise of disciplinary action under Article 15 in the case of an "Officer in Charge" for the Rear Echelon based on paragraph 0101 JAG Manual and reference (b) must be requested from Commanding General, 1st Marine Division. General Courts-Martial jurisdiction remains with the Commanding General, 1st Marine Division.
- (2) The authority to convene courts-martial is that enumerated in Articles 0306 and 1401, of reference (b).
- (3) Legal Assistance will be conducted in accordance with SECNAV Instruction 5801.1 and reference (f). Legal Assistance Officers are available at 1st Marine Division, 3d Marine Division, 1st Marine Air Wing, COMNAVFORJAPAN, COMNAVPHIL, and Taiwan Defense Command.
- (4) Commanding Officers will familiarize themselves with and be guided by the provisions of COMSEVENTHELT Instruction 5800.1 with regard to matters of military justice. Each BLT Commander will submit a report containing the information required in paragraph 4b of the above instruction at the conclusion of the afloat phase even though the inclusive dates do not correspond to the regular quarterly reporting period.
- (5) Special instructions pertaining to legal matters will be issued by separate directives.
- (6) Requests for repair and replacement of the Gray Audograph recording machine will be directed to the 1st Marine Division Legal Office.

c. Order

- (1) Personnel are directed to conduct themselves in an exemplary manner at all times so as to reflect credit to the U.S. Marine Corps and the United States.
- (2) Report any serious incident involving foreign personnel immediately.
- d. <u>Stragglers</u>. RLT/BLT's are responsible for stragglers within their zone of action.
- e. <u>Prisoners of War</u>. Prisoners of War will be handled in accordance with references (1) and (m).

5. CASUALTY REPORTING AND GRAVES REGISTRATION

- a. Casualty Reporting
 - (1) Non-battle casualties will be reported in accordance with reference (a) and any supplemental instructions that may be issued.
 - (2) Inherent in any casualty reporting is the accuracy of each individual's Record of Emergency Data. Prior to deployment, and as a constant administrative check, all personnel should be queried as to the accuracy of this document.
- b. <u>Graves Registration</u>. Disposition of remains and personal effects will be conducted as prescribed in reference (k).

6. MORALE AND PERSONNEL SERVICES

a. <u>Liberty</u>. Liberty will be granted by Unit Commanders in accordance with existing instructions.

b. Postal Services

- (1) The BLT Postal Officer will consult with the Division Postal Officer on postal matters when the BLT is activated for planning.
- (2) A postal section consisting of one NCO, Assistant Marine Corps Postal Clerk (MOS 0161), will be assigned to the BLT by the Division Postal Officer.
- (3) The mailing address for personnel of the infantry battalion of the BLT will be as follows:


(4) Personnel of supporting elements will use the mailing address as follows:

Rank, Full Name, Serial No., Service 2d Battalion, 1st Marines 2d Plt, Co A, 1st Tank Bn. FPO, San Francisco, 96602

- (5) The use of a geographical location or ships name and hull number in a mailing address is strictly prohibited.
- (6) The BLT Commander will ensure that the Division Postal Officer and the Marine Corps Postal Liaison located at Subic Bay, FPO, San Francisco, 96650, is informed of all movements or transhipment of the BLT. Embarkation rosters and changes thereto will be promptly furnished to the Division Postal Officer.
- (7) When a BLT Commander has a postal finance unit assigned, he will, upon notification by this Headquarters, conduct a monthly audit in accordance with reference (r).
- c. Exchange Services. Exchange supplies will not normally be embarked. Commanding Officers will ensure that personnel have adequate consumable supplies on debarkation.

d. <u>Informational Services</u>

- (1) Battalions will issue all news releases and accompanying photographs through the nearest Naval Activity (PIO, COMSEVENTHELT in accordance with instructions contained in Annex V to COMSEVENTHELT OpOrd 201-64). Copies of approved releases should be forwarded by message to 1st Marine Division with photographs following via air mail for dissemination to Okinawa news media. Releases concerning the BLT prior to leaving Okinawa and following its return are the responsibility of the Division Information Services Section.
- (2) Unit Technical Informational Services Contact Officers (TISCO) of afloat battalions will report to the

Division Informational Services Officer prior to embarkation for a briefing on the ISO function. When ISO Personnel are not available to accompany deploying units, the battalion TISCO will be responsible for copy produced during the period afloat.

- (3) TISCO's will cause each man to complete a Fleet Home Town News Center Release Form (NAVEXOS 4365), Available forms together with a cover story will be submitted to the Division Informational Services Officer prior to the BLT's departure.
- (4) The attention of the BLT Commander and BLT TISCO is invited to CINCPAC Instruction 5720.4, CINCPAC Instruction 005720.5 and Annex V to COMSEVENTHFLT Operation Order 201-64, for guidance in preparation of informational material and releases.
- (5) One of the functions of the photographer assigned to the BLT is the coverage of newsworthy events. Coordination of the employment of the photographer is a function of the BLT S-3.

e. Special Services

- (1) BLT Commanders will ensure that recreation property adequate to satisfy contemplated needs accompanies the BLT upon embarkation. Sufficient equipment must be on hand to sustain a Special Services program for a minimum period of 30 days.
- (2) See paragraph 801 of reference (s) for mount-out requirements.

f. Religious Activities

- (1) As prescribed by Marine Corps Directives, U.S. Navy Regulations and 1st Marine Division SOP's.
- (2) The Division Chaplain will consult with the Chaplain assigned to Task Organized Units in order to ensure proper denominational coverage for the troops and ship's company.

g. Decorations and Awards

(1) In accordance with references (n) and (q).



Liaison With the Amphibious Group. Liaison concerning morale and personnel services should be made with the amphibious group prior to embarkation to determine any special requirements in the area.

7. CIVIC ACTION

- a. The Civic Action Program is aimed at winning over the people while at the same time tactical operations are conducted to defeat the enemy on the field of battle. Such a program demands that the individual Marine have the cold-blooded courage to do battle, then the warm-hearted kindness to comfort the victims caught up in the nightmare of conflict.
- b. It is absolutely essential that our forces establish the reputation of being able to move at will throughout the combat area and defeat any enemy force encountered. The reputation for invincibility will produce unnumerable psychological benefits and hasten the end of the war. On the other hand, these same forces must constantly demonstrate their concern for the safety of non-combatants, their compassion for the injured, their willingness to aid and assist the sick, the hungry and the dispossessed.
- c. All Regiment, Battalion and separate units will ensure that a Civic Action Officer is appointed, and that he carries out the responsibilities of his office. It is further necessary that each individual have a knowledge of his role in civic actions and the importance of the Civic Action Program.
- d. All personnel will be instructed to respect all religions and cultural structures. Neither these structures nor any artifice therein will be violated. Care must be exercised during tactical operations to ensure the safety of these structures according to the situation.
- e. The civil and criminal jurisdiction of foreign government over U.S. personnel while visiting in ports of such foreign countries and the responsibilities of the U.S. authorities concerned therewith will be the subject of directives issued by higher authorities.



8. PERSONNEL PROCEDURES

- a. Personnel accounting in accordance with reference (k).
- Personnel administration in accordance with references (a) and (k).
- c. Upon activation for planning, all units will ensure that personnel have required clothing and equipment, immunization, identification tags and cards and that personnel and medical records are audited.
 - (1) Units attaching personnel to task organizations will ensure that required clothing and equipment, identification cards and tags, immunization cards, and personnel and medical records accompany such personnel upon reporting to supported unit.
 - (2) Identification tags and cards, Geneva Convention Cards, Emergency Data Forms (NAVMC 10526-PD) and Immunization Certificates (DD-737) will be current for all personnel prior to embarkation.
- d. Personnel should complete such matters as wills, powers of attorney, etc., prior to embarkation.
- e. Unit diaries will be prepared in accordance with reference (f).
 - (1) Diaries will be submitted via AIR MAIL when off-island.
 - (2) Distribution of Unit Diaries will be in accordance with current directives.
 - (3) Reporting Unit Code numbers will be requested for the rear echelon from this Headquarters.
- f. Normal allowances of publications will be taken.
 The Division Adjutant (S&C Files) will provide each
 unit activated for operation with six copies of the
 Operation Order, Administrative Order and Embarkation
 Order.
- Embark with full cryptographic and non-cryptographic allowances, including three months ROB. Notify RPIO Honolulu by message of each change in geographical location in accordance with Article 631, RPS 4F.
- h. Embark with COMTAC publications allowance authorized by OPNAVINST P05605.19_.

- 1. GENERAL. Information herein will assist commanders in accomplishment of necessary logistics planning prior to embarkation.
- 2. PLANNING. Commanding Officers of units furnishing supporting attachments will provide the task organization commander the following information ASAP after activation for planning:
 - a. List of all Class II and IV items requiring repair parts.
 - b. List of technical and supply publications pertaining to items peculiar to attached elements or detachments.
 - c. List of fuel consuming vehicles and equipment, together with fuel consumption data.
 - d. UP&T Tables.
 - e. Vehicle Summary and Priority Table.
 - f. Cargo Analysis.
 - g. Personnel roster.

3. SUPPLY RESTRICTIONS


a. <u>Mount-Out Supplies</u>. Mount-Out supplies issued to deploying units will not be utilized without authorization from this Headquarters unless the unit is actually committed.

b. Operating Supplies

- (1) Surface lifted units deploy with and utilize Operating Supplies for training/operations and equipment maintenance.
- (2) Air lifted echelons of units deploy with Mount-Out Supplies. All Operating Supplies to be transported with corresponding unit seatails.

4. PRESCRIBED LOADS

- a. Prescribed loads of supplies and equipment to be embarked, all classes of supply, for task organized units are as follows:
 - (1) SLF and Surface BLT Appendix 1
 - (2) Airlift BLT Appendix 2
 - (3) Surface RLT Appendix 3
 - (4) Surface and Airlift RLT Hq Appendix 4
- 5. <u>ALLOWANCES PROVIDED BY SUPPORT ELEMENTS</u>. Commanding Officers of organizations furnishing supporting attachments to task organized units will provide them with the following, based on troop and equipment strength:
 - a. Prescribed Class II allowances.
 - b. Mount-Out Supplies as follows:
 - (1) Consumables and repair parts 30 days.
 - (2) Replenishment of expendable items to include individual equipment 30 days.
 - (3) Class III lubricants for equipment embarked if of special nature; otherwise state requirements to attaching unit 30 days.

6. MEDICAL

AND DESCRIPTION OF THE PERSON NAMED IN

- a. All Medical personnel to carry individual Medical and Surgical Supply Kits.
- b. All personnel to be immunized against known prevalent diseases in accordance with BUMED Inst 6230.1, based on objective area. In addition, all personnel to be immunized against Yellow Fever and Plague. All immunizations to be given prior to embarkation.
- c. Medical Officers requisition desired special items of medical material 3 weeks prior to embarkation for BLT afloat and upon activation for deployment in other cases.






