

INTELLIGENCE

1. GENERAL: During this period, the section has maintained continuity in collecting, processing and disseminating required intelligence. Flexibility of operations was a definite requirement. The major operation conducted by the Division (Operation Kansas) required assignment of Combat Intelligence and Counterintelligence personnel to assist in activation of a separate Task Force. This operation's concept was also recommaissance by surveillance and by fire. As a consequence, additional responsibility was held by the G-2 in required coordination and assignment of Recommaissance Unit objectives during the operation.

Subsections within the G-2 Section have not only maintained their normal operational requirements but have increased their capabilities. The Interrogator-Translator Team and the Interpreter Team have gained considerably in their tactics and procedures because of experience gained during the past two and a half months of combat operations. Contact by liaison has been maintained with US Advisory Units and ARVN Forces in our areas of responsibility. Direct contact with Special Forces Camps have also been initiated and will continue to meet contingency intelligence requirements.

- 2. Intelligence support, in additional to normal dissemination of required information, was furnished by an attachment of sub-teams, capable of technical aspects, to the Task Force commander for certain operations. These operations are listed below:

- 1 June Task Force X-Ray activated for planning effective 010800H Jun66.
- 1 June CG, Task Force X-Ray informed CG, III MAF of the boundary requirements for Operation WASHINGTON, including the boundary between 1st Marine Division forces and 1st Air Cavalry Division forces. See the Task Force X-Ray Chronology for a detailed account of the area.
- 1 June CG, III MAF informed CG, 1st MarDiv that the 3d Bn, 1st Marines would be returning to the CHU LAI TAOR on approximately 15 June.

 3/1 had been moved to DANANG during a period of political unrest in DANANG City. The move was to be temporary; therefore, a rear echelon was left within the CHU LAI Combat Base.
- June lat Bn, 5th Mar and 2d Bn, 5th Mar reported OPCON/ADCON to 5th Mar, effective 031200H Jun66. Both Battalions had previously been assigned OPCON/ADCON lat Marines.
- 6 June The 9th Engr Bn arrived at CHU LAI and debarked from the USS OGDEN (LPD-5). The Bn will remain OPCON CG, III MAF, ADCON is with CG, 1st MarDiv. Provision of support is primarily to tactical requests by CG, 1st MarDiv.
- 6 June CG, 1st MarDiv directed execution of the movement to DANANG by
 Hq, 1st Mar and Hq, 1st Bn, 11th Mar, in accordance with orders
 received from CG, III MAF. Both units were scheduled for the
 move north on the first available amphibious shipping.
- 6 June CG, I FFORCEV notified CG, lst Air Cav Div that Air Cav representation was required at a conference to be conducted at CHU LAI at 070930H Jun66. Subject of the conference was Operation WASHINGTON.
- 7 June CO, 1st Mar reported OPCON to CG, 3d MarDiv effective 070930H Jun66.
- 7 June Operation WASHINGTON conference was held at CHU LAI. Attendees included: MajGen FIELDS, USMC; BGen STILES, USMC; BGen JONES, USMC; BGen DEANE, USA; ADC of 1st Air Cav Div; ACofS, G-3, III MAF; ACofS, G-2, III MAF.
- 8 June CG, 1st MarDiv requested that CG, III MAF provide a CH-46 aircraft for use in an operational test conducted by CO, 11th Mar, at CHU LAI. The purpose of the test was to develop a methodology of providing artillery support for contingency plans in support of certain Civilian Irregular Defense Group (CIDG) camps within the 12th Division Tactical Area (DTA). The tests were conducted and their worth was proven with the successful helilift of two 105mm Howitzers into the TIEN PHUOC CIDG camp. This lift was conducted to provide additional artillery coverage for operations conducted in support of Operation KANSAS.


- 8 June CG, III MAF provided CG, 1st MarDiv with a planning directive which called for III MAF operations in the II Corps Tactical Zone. CG, 1st MarDiv is to develop a contingency plan which will deploy a reinforced regiment to northern BINH DINH province. Mission for the force is to destroy VC/NVA forces in the designated area of operations.
- 9 June Operation APACHE commenced at 090700H Jun66. See 5th Marines Chronology.
- 9 June CG, III MAF informed CG, 1st MarDiv that OPCON/ADCON of the Construction Company, 7th Comm Bn was passed to CG, 1st MarDiv, effective 6Jun66. Further, upon arrival of Hq, 7th Comm Bn, OPCON/ADCON of the Bn will pass to CG, 1st MarDiv.
- 9 June CG, 1st MarDiv requested that CG, III MAF expand the area of operations for Operation WASHINGTON. The request was subsequently approved. See Task Force X-Ray Chronology.
- 9 June CG, III MAF informed CG, 1st MarDiv of the decision to retain the 3d Bn, 1st Mar at DANANG. However, the Battalion was placed on 12-hour alert during the period 15-30 June, for deployment to the 1st MarDiv area in event it would be required during Operation WASHINGTON. CG, 1st MarDiv was requested to move the rear echelon of the 3d Bn, 1st Mar to the DANANG area.
- 9 June CG, 1st MarDiv directed CO, 11th Mar and CO, 1st Engr Bn to take appropriate action regarding certain discrepancies noted on the NUC WPNS TRNG EQUIP inspection which was conducted 23-27 May 1966 at Camp HAGUE, Okinawa.

- 11 June CG, III MAF directed CG, lst MarDiv to deploy one 105mm HOW Btry, one AT Co, one MT Co (-), one Tank Co (-), and one Engr Co (-)(Rein) to the 3d MarDiv area and pass OPCON to 3d MarDiv as the units either complete embarkation or enter the 3d MarDiv area of responsibility, as appropriate. These units were required at DANANG as normal support for 3d Bn, lst Mar.
- 12 June Operation APACHE secured at 122000H Jun66.

- 13 June CG, Task Force X-Ray informed CG, 1st MarDiv that Task Force X-Ray Headquarters activated for operations, effective 130800H Jun66.
- 13 June CG, III MAF directed CO, 1st Force Recon Co to CHOP one additional platoon of the 1st Force Recon Co to CG, 1st MarDiv, for an indefinite period. The platoon arrived at CHU LAI on 14 June 1966.
- 13 June CC, III MAF established a new criteria for reporting VC casualties. Effective 13 June the term "Possible" was deleted. In its place, the term "Probable" will be used to describe certain VC casualties, i.e. use the terminology " 5 VC Probably Wounded" vice "5 VC Possibly Wounded".

- 14 June CG, 1st MarDiv received Change #4 to CG, III MAF LOI 1-66, which authorized CG, 1st MarDiv to commit up to a reinforced battalion outside the TAOR, under certain circumstances, without prior authorization by CG, III MAF.
- 14 June 1st MarDiv Op Plan 303-66, a plan which provides for the relief of certain besieged CIDG camps within the 1st MarDiv area of responsibility, was published.
- 16 June CG, III MAF established a temporary boundary between 1st MarDiv/
 3d MarDiv, to the north of the QUANG NAM/QUANG TIN provincial
 boundary, in order to allow for flexible action during Operation
 KANSAS. The boundary became effective 160800H Jun66.
- 16 June CG, 3d MarDiv issued orders for certain units to move south in support of Operation KANSAS. 3d Bn, 1st Mar (-) moved by convoy. - 22 June CG, Task Force X-Ray issued Frag 0 4-66 which provided for a covered retraction of recon elements. See Task Force X-Ray Chronology.
- June CG, III MAF directed termination of Operation KANSAS. The 1st MarDiv was to return 3d Bn (-)(Rein), 1st Mar and Det, 4th Bn, 12th Mar to CG, 3d MarDiv on 23 June 1966. Operation KANSAS terminated 221800H Jun66.
- 23 June CG, 1st MarDiv was informed of the planned itinerary for CG, FMFPAC's visit to WESTPAC during July 1966.






TRAINING


POPULAR FORCES PROGRAM

Combined operations consisting of PF/USMC forces continued through—out the CHU LAI TAOR. In general, the program proceeded satisfactorily; however, the shortage of qualified interpreters hampered progress. During June, the 1st Marines, 5th Marines, 7th Marines and CHU LAI Defense Command conducted combined operations which consisted of patrols, ambushes, MEDCAP, and population control measures. Marines continued to provide instruction in military subjects; with particular emphasis on marksmanship and patrolling. During June, the CHU LAI Defense Command conducted combined PF/USMC operations, for the first time. No major problems were encountered and it was noted that the PF's knowledge of the terrain and the people proved to be a definite asset.

Most training continued to be OJT. FF's assisted Marines at the AN TAN Bridge by checking Vietnamese identities for about six hours per day. FF's assisted the 2dBn, 5th Marines during Operation APACHE.


During June it was noted that the FF's on KY XUAN island showed a definite lack of interest and no desire to participate in the program. This was in direct contrast with the FF's on neighboring KY HOA island. This problem is now being resolved and an increase in participation by the FF on KY XUAN has been noted.

All FF platoons with the exception of one in KY CHANH have been integrated with USMC forces. KY CHANH will be integrated when the area becomes pacified.



CLOSE COMBAT

One of the more significant actions involving lst MarDiv forces during June occured on the night of 15-16 June 1966, when a lst Recon Bn observation post came under heavy attack in the vicinity of coord BT 131250. The team was eventually extracted with a company of the lst Bn, 5th Mar providing the covering force. For details, see the 5th Mar, lst Recon Bn, and Task Force X-Ray Chronologies. Also, see letter and voice tape forwarded by CG, lst MarDiv to CMC shortly after the action. The tape contains the Recon patrol leader's personal account of the action.

COMMUNICATION-RIECTRONICS OFFICE CHRONOLOGY

1. 1st MarDiv/Chu lei Installation Facilities

- a. Telephone Cable System. The program of improving and expanding the Telephone Cable System continued throughout the period. Wire teams of Radio Relay and Construction Company, 7th Communication Battalion, FMF were assigned to emplace additional pole line required by the expansion of the Division TACR. Poles for this additional construction were fabricated by MCB 4 by welding together expended 105mm Howitzer cannisters.
- b. <u>Telephone Directory</u>. (See Appendix A) Distribution of a comprehensive 1st Marine Division and Chu Lai Installation Telephone Directory on 5 June provided telephone local and trunking directory information for all units in the Chu Lai Combat Base. Interested external commands were included in the directory distribution.
- c. <u>Communication Center</u>. On 4 June, recommendations were made to CG, III MAF regarding a support concept, including technical personnel, for fixed communication center installations such as the Division Communication Center.

2. Operational Communications

- a. Communication Security Aids. Command attention to the requirement for employment of low-level codes to enhance security of transmissions over voice radio and telephone circuits and command guidance issued 20 June gave increased impetus to efforts of this office to reproduce, where necessary, and to insure distribution from higher authority, where available, low-level operations and numeral codes and authentication systems.
- b. Task Force XRAY. This Office provided the CEO, Comm Chief and Clerk to CG, Task Force XRAY from 1-28 June for planning Operations WASHINGTON and KANSAS and Contingency Operations in the II CTZ of Northern Binh Dinh Provinces.

c. Communications Support for Division Operations


- (1) Operational and equipment support was coordinated for Division units participating in Operations KANSAS and OAKLAND.
- (2) Special communication liaison arrangements were made with Special Forces camps in the Division ACR.
- (3) A liaison communication circuit was established with ARG/SLF aboard USS PRINCETON in anticipation of possible commitment of the SLF to Division operations.
- d. Radio Retransmission. Lessons learned in previous operations and requirements of planned operations precipitated testing to determine the

most appropriate techniques of hill-top and aerial radio manual and automatic retransmission. Testing included use of various types of aircraft. Testing will continue to determine compatibility of various VHF-FM equipments available. Automatic Airborne Retransmission has also been recommended as a matter of priority study to higher headquarters, based in part on requirements stated frequently by this Office.

- 3. Planning. Planning for operating and billeting areas, and to determine the most feasible method of employing the unit, preceded the arrival of the 7th Communication Battalion, FMF on 1 July. Having been assigned OPCON/ADCON to the 1st Marine Division, final missions have yet to be resolved, but include the extent to which 7th Communication Battalion may assume responsibility for certain fixed base installations, including the requirement to sustain the Chu Lai Installation Communication System in the event operations dictate the Division be deployed from the Chu Lai Combat Base at some future time.
- 4. Training. The communication-electronics training program consisted primarily of on-the-job and unit training. Plans were formulated for an exchange training program for cryptographic operators and technicians and a proposal was forwarded to CG, III MAF on 24 June recommending establishment of the FMF Mobile Command Circuit with NavComSta Phil on a bi-monthly basts.
- 5. Armed Forces Radio Station. Chu Lai. Recommendations were made to Ot, III MAF on 20 June relative to improving the quality of AFRS broadcasts currently carried to the Chu Lai Base transmitter over multichannel tropo-scatter equipment.





LOGISTICS

- 1. The major logistic activity during this reporting period was directed toward the smooth absorption of units into the Chu Lai Combat Base and the support of combat operations. Organic supply accounts continued to absorb the supplies and records of subordinate elements which have rejoined their parent organizations.
- 2. Planning continued on an SOP for ISA Operations, and Division Admin Plan 303-66 concerning logistic support of potentially besieged Special Forces Camps was published. A Chu Lai Base Development Board meeting was held 3 June 1966, and construction priorities throughout the Chu Lai Combat Base were re-evaluated. Priority for construction was given to covered storage and maintenance facilities to enhance completion of these structures prior to the arrival of the coming monsoon season.
- 3. Significant developments in the Supply field:
- a. A CMC Logistical Support Evaluation Team headed by Major General YOUNGDALE concluded a visit to this Division on 3 June 1966.
- b. On 9 June 1966, a unit reconciliation with Third Force Service Regiment and FSA-A2 clothing issue was completed and forwarded to FLSG-B.
- c. FSAO-4 Inspection Team completed inspections of selected Division units and departed the Chu Lai Combat Base on 9 June 1966.
- 4. This Division began testing and evaluating the following equipment:
- a. Disposable mess gear plastic covered plates and cups, plastic knives, forks and spoons.
- b. Towelettes individually wrapped moist paper towels to be issued with each MCI or Packet, subsistence, long range patrol.
- c. Bamboo-prong proof leggings canvas leggings containing 20 gauge steel wire mesh designed to protect the legs from bamboo and steel spike traps.
- 5. Polaroid cameras (T/A number 30265) proved unsuitable for the climate and patrolling conditions encountered in Vietnam. The 35mm Nikonos all weather camera, which is available on the open market, has been recommended as a suitable replacement item. Procurement is currently underway.

NCL ASSIFIED 6. Commanding Conbral, First Marine Division message 040757Z (C) June placed all CNTCS on Administrative Deadline until breech mechanisms were inspected for serviceability by qualified Ordnance Technicians. This action was taken as the result of an accidental discharge of an CNTOS mounted 106mm Rifle. Subsequent to the inspection, one hundred eighty-two rifles were repaired, most of these having marginal worn parts replaced. All ONTOS were removed from Administrative Deadline on 19 June 1966.

- 7. Four of six M-55 self-propelled 8 inch Howitzers are deadlined because of M-100 Panoramic Telescope problems. A combination of climatic conditions and continuous firing of propellent charge 7 is causing the bonding material which holds the telescope prisms in place to break down. As a result, the prisms fall out of position and the telescope is rendered useless. This problem has also occurred to a lesser degree in the M-53 155mm self-propelled gun. Two M-100 telescopes were placed on Red Ball 28 June 1966. Six more are on priority 02 requisition but do not meet Red Ball criteria as yet.
- The M-34A2 sight unit utilized on the 81mm mortar, 4.2 inch mortar, and 107mm Howtar has required a high percentage of repairs. 84 sight units have been repaired since 1 January 1966 although there are only 52 sight units in this Division. Seven sight units had to be evacuated from Vietnam for higher echelon maintenance.
- 9. The 1st and 7th Motor Transport Battalions combined carried 9,655 people and 5,481 tons of cargo a total of 141,927 miles during June 1966.
- 10. Division Embarkation coordinated the offloading of the 9th Engineer Battalion and Radio Relay and Construction Company, 7th Communication Battalion at the Chu Lai Combat Base during June. Division Embarkation also coordinated the movement of the following units to Danang during June 1966:

Headquarters, 1st Marines 3d Battalion, 1st Marines

Headquarters and Battery "C", 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines

Battery "K", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. Narrative Summary

a. 1-30 June 1966

Civic Action coverage within the Chu Lai TAOR continued to grow during the month. The expansion of the TAOR added ten villages, 37 hamlets, and approximately 40,000 people to the civic action field. Many of the added hamlets are being worked in. Increased emphasis was placed on working through GVN officials and encouraging them to take a more active interest and part in the program to improve their communities in respect to education,

agriculture, health, and general welfare of the people.

The medical and dental assistance program continued to be the most popular project and provided the greatest number of contacts with the general populace. Orthopedic and general surgeons from the 1st Medical Battalion visited the Quang Ngai Provincial Hospital on a weekly basis to augment the hospital's surgical capability. A 1st Medical Battalion anesthetist assisted in training a Vietnamese anesthetist working at the hospital. Approximately thirty units of blood were furnished to the hospital along with other surgical supplies. A dermatome machine for skin grafting was obtained by the 1st Medical Battalion and donated to the hospital. It was used extensively by the visiting surgeons. The hospital staff, the patients, and Provincial Officials were very appreciative of the assistance received.

The effectiveness of the agricultural improvement program was enhanced during the month by the receipt of a supply of fertilizer. For the past two years fertilizer deliveries to Quang Tin and Quang Ngai Provinces have fallen far short of requirements. During the month of June a program was initiated to deliver fertilizer to Chu Lai by commercial shipping for distribution throughout the two provinces. The first shipload of approximately 1,400 tons arrived during the month. It was unloaded and distributed under a civilian contract. Considerable assistance was rendered by the 1st Marine Division and the Naval Support Facility to make the program a success. Ly Tin District held its monthly farmers and fishermen forum. This forum is quite popular with all concerned. It is very beneficial in assisting the farmers and fishermen and provides for closer relationships between the people and the GVN officials.

The Commanding General, 1st Marine Division hosted a community relations luncheon for the Province Chiefs of Quang Tin and Quang Ngai and their senior U.S. military and civilian advisors, the District Chiefs of Tam Ky, Ly Tin, Binh Son and Son Tinh with their senior U.S. military advisors, the Commanding General, I Corps and the Chief of Staff, 2d ARVN Division with their senior U.S. military advisors.


The Chief of Binh Son District visited the 7th Marines to express his appreciation for Marine Corps assistance in the fight against communism. He presented plaques to the Regimental Commander and to the Commanding Officers of 1/7 and 2/7.

A joint conference was held at Quang Ngai Province Headquarters to coordinate the pacification effort, the use of PF and RF, and the conduct of civic action work in Binh Son District. A few days later the Chief of Quang Ngai Province,

members of his staff, Chief of Binh Son District and his U.S. military advisor, the Commanding Officer, 7th Marines, and the 1st Marine Division G-5 toured portions of the TACR in Binh Son District to observe pacification progress, the work of Revolutionary Development Teams, and to meet village and hamlet officials. Helicopter transportation was provided by MAG-36.

The 4th and 6th Platoons (AA) of the 29th Civil Affairs Company, U.S. Army came under the OPCON of this Division and were attached to the 5th and 7th Marines respectively.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

- 1. Operation APACHE (2nd Bn 5th Marines 9-10 June): This operation was supported by a U-10 aircraft which dropped leaflets and conducted broadcasts. People in the area were instructed not to run from Marines and not to harbor VC in their homes. When fire was received by Marine helicopters, a broadcast warned the people that fire received by aircraft from their hamlets would result in airstrikes against the VC in the hamlets. When ground fire continued, airstrikes were called.
- 2. Operation KANSAS (Task Force Kray 16-22 June): Operation KANSAS was supported by aerial broadcasts and leaflet drops directed primarily at North Vietnamese troops in Northern Quang Tin Province. Psychological warfare continued in the area after the operation. B52 strikes were followed up with Chieu Hoi leaflets and safe conduct passes. A special leaflet was developed for use in the area and printed by the Division Reproduction Section. This leaflet warned that bombing and artillery fire would intensify, offered medical care, food, and shelter for Chieu Hoi's and instructed soldiers of the First VC, and 21st and 3rd North Vietnamese Regiments to turn themselves in to Tien Phuoc District Headquarters (BT 1014) or any GVN or US military unit. Broadcasts also warned of continued bombing and artillery fire, and inquired of enemy unit leaders why they continued to pit their men against the might of allied aircraft.
- 3. Operation OAKLAND (7th Marines 29 June 1 July): Operation OAKLAND was supported by leaflet drops of Chieu Hoi appeals and warnings to civilians that continued fire received by aircraft from their hamlets would result in destruction of hamlets by bombs and artillery. A liaision officer from Detachment 2, 244th Psychological Operations Company was assigned to the Seventh Marine Regiment for the operation to coordinate psychological operations in support of US and EVN units.
- 4. Prisoner Collection Point: One thousand copies of a letter written to be given to Vietnamese who have been interrogated and subsequently cleared of suspicion were placed at the Prisoner Collection Point. Copies will be provided on a continuing basis to each person as he is cleared. The letter expresses regret for the inconvenience imposed on suspects, places the blame for such hardships on the VC, and thanks the people for their cooperation. Copies of "Free World" magazine continued to be distributed to all persons at the collection point after completion of interrogation.
- 5. First Medical Battalion Ward: Reading material was placed in the ward at the First Medical Battalion for the benefit of Vietnamese patients. Publications included "Huong Que" farm magazine, "Progress of a Nation" (Vietnam), "History of America", "A Walk in Space", and "An Cutline of American Government."
- 6. <u>Bulletin Boards:</u> Seven bulletin boards obtained from JUSPAO were placed in Binh Son District. This brought the total of large size bulletin boards




placed in the TAOR to nineteen.

- 7. <u>Instructions to Civilians:</u> Psychological operations media were used throughout the TAOR to issue instructions to civilians in order to minimize casualties among non-combatants.
- a. Ly Tin District: Instructions were prepared for Ly Tin District under the auspices of the District Chief. The people were instructed to take cover when friendly troops attack VC, to obey all instructions and come out of holes when troops commence searching, not to run from troops, and not to harbor VC. District Vietnamese Information Service personnel recorded this on First Marine Division equipment, and the instructions were then broadcast throughout the district. A leaflet bearing the same instructions was printed by the Division Reproduction Section. A tape recording was made and broadcast throughout Ly Tin District warming the people that they place their lives in jeopardy if they do not obey the curfew established by their local government. A leaflet devised by First Battalion Fifth Marines, bearing the signature of the battalion commander, explained that Marines came as friends of the Vietnamese people and stated that cash rewards would be paid to people volunteering information concerning the Viet Cong.
- b. Binh Son District: A broadcast was recorded at district headquarters explaining the purpose of Marine presence, appealing for civilian cooperation, and warning of the necessity to obey local curfew regulations. This was broadcast over the 1st Battalion, 7th Marines sector, east of the Song Tra Bong. In conjunction with this broadcast, leaflets offering cash rewards to persons who show Marines the locations of mines and booby traps were dropped.
- 8. The Chieu Hoi Program: During the month of June, the rate of Chieu Hoi returnees from the TAOR took a sudden and substantial upswing. Thirty-one returnees came in from Ly Tin and Binh Son Districts as compared with five the month before. Twenty of the returnees were from Ky Chanh Village, Ly Tin District. Interviews with returnees revealed that the primary reasons for rallying were: increased Marine activity in the area, lack of food and medicine, letters from home and from the Ky Chanh Village Chief urging them to return, and information obtained from leaflets and broadcasts. An intensive Chieu Hoi propaganda campaign was conducted in the Ky Chanh area during June. A Chieu Hoi leaflet written by the Ly Tin Vietnamese Information Service Chief was printed by the Division Reproduction Section and dropped over the area. Photos were taken of Chieu Hoi returnees and reproduced on leaflets which were dropped. The voices of three returnees were recorded on tape and broadcast over the area. Numerous general Chieu Hoi leaflets and broadcasts were employed in the area.

- 3. The RVN Special Forces chain of command parallels that shown in the paragraph above.
- 4. The Special Forces "A" Team is an advisory group to the Vietnamese Special Forces (LLDB-Luc Long Dac Biet). The senior LLDB officer is the camp commander. An additional Special Forces mission is to act as an advisory group to the local sector/sub-sector commander.
- 5. The LIDB hire civilians (CIDG Civil Irregular Defense Group) who are trained for six weeks at Kham Duc CIDG camp and then perform duty in the I Corps Tactical Zone.
- 6. Some of the CIDG camps host small tenant units which have separate and distinct missions in or near their area.

Radio Log of 1st Platoon, Company C, 1st Reconnaissance Battalion (Carnival Time) of 16 June 1966

SITUATION:

Eighteen Marines of the 1st Platoon, Co "C" 1st Recon Bn. occupy a position on NUI VU Mountain, overlooking TIEN PHUOC. At about 0230 on the morning of 16 June, they were attacked by an estimated Bn of uniformed North Vietnamese troops. The following transmissions between SSgt HOWARD, the platoon leader, (Carnival Time) and the Forward Air Controller, were copied by monitors during the hours prior to the Recon Teams extraction.

TIME OLOO: Carnival Time "Its getting dark--- the Flares are blowing too far to the South---- you're right above us now, just a little west---- Real good on those flares!!

Klondike:

"Will you give me instructions exactly where bombs are

to be dropped?"

CT:

"Affirmative - I am in the rocks right underneath the top of the Hill-----Right in line with those flares -----up the draw----on that finger---that will get him buddy. ----Its got to be in the draw, not on the





The increased use of non-secure telephone circuits provides enemy intelligence agents with lucrative sources of U. S. classified information. The Chu Lai Combat Base Cable System is unpatrolled and extends to many distant terminals within the TAOR. Wire lines, therefore, are highly susceptible to intercept. Additionally, telephone communications throughout RVN pass through multichannel systems which are not secure. The increasing disclosure of classified information over telephone circuits has necessitated tasking U. S. Communication Security Agencies to monitor telephone conversations and to report by name and instance security breaches.



SECTION I

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF YOUR TELEPHONE

PLACING A CALL

- ... Refer to the telephone directory if at all in doubt about the correct exchange or extension number.
- ... Have an alternate person or extension number handy in case the person you are calling is out or the desired extension is busy.

IF CALLED EXTENSION IS BUSY

- ... Refer to the telephone directory for an alternate extension.
- ... Do not ask the operator to "hold" the line open for you.
- ... Do not ask the operator to call you back when the line is open.

IF CALLED PERSON IS NOT AVAILABLE

- ... Talk to alternate person if possible.
- ... Give answering person necessary information.
- ... Determine when desired party will be available.
- ... Notify answering party that you will call back, or,
- ... Request that your call be returned. Leave your name and number.

TO TRANSFER A CALL

TO SIGNAL THE OPERATOR

FROM A "COMMON BATTERY" TELEPHONE

- ... TP-9 (French cradle type phone) SLOWLY depress and release the plunger.
- ... TA-312 (Field telephone with battery selector at "CB") SLOWLY depress and release the chromed button.
- ... EE-8 (Field telephone with battery selector at "CB") SLOWLY depress and release the bar which cradles handset.
- FROM A "LOCAL BATTERY" TELEPHONE (TA-312 or RE-8 with battery selector on "LB"), briskly turn the signalling crank.

WHEN THE OPERATOR ANSWERS


- ... Identify your switchboard name and extension. Do this anytime you desire additional service from the operator before your call is broken down.
- ... Ask the operator to transfer the incoming call from __(identify)_ to the desired extension.

TO COMPLETE YOUR CALL

- ... From COMMUN BATTERY telephones, merely replace the handset <u>securely</u> on the cradle or bar.
 ... From LOCAL BATTERY telephones, "ring-off" by briskly turning the signaling crank twice. On local battery systems, this is the only means whereby the operator knows you have completed your call. If you do not "ring-off", your extension will be "BUSY" to all callers until the operator has an opportunity to individually "challenge" your extension and release the line for further calls.
- IF YOU REQUIRE ASSISTANCE to place a call or wish to REPORT TROUBLE WITH YOUR TELEPHONE, ask the Operator for extension 31.

IF YOU HAVE A COMPLAINT

- ... DO NOT discuss complaints regarding service with the operator.
- ... Division Headquarters subscribers please register complaints with Communications Company Operations Officer (NOTICE 3). Other units notify the appropriate unit communication officer.



WHEN ANSWERING YOUR TELEPHONE

... Identify yourself by Switchboard Code Name, Extension Number, and, where appropriate, your title, i.e., Clerk, Chief, etc.

EXAMPLES:

USE OF PRESENTACE ON TWOTICAL SWITCHBOARD SYSTEMS

... Normally, all telephone calls placed over Tactical Switchboard systems are handled as "routine" calls. Since the ISMERWOOD Switchboard primarily serves the Division Headquarters, PaloalTY calls are not authorized except by:

> Communding General Assistant Division Commander Chief of Staff Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 Communication Systems Controllers

- ... Anyone reporting a real emergency or other urgent situation, or otherwise requires assistance to complete an important call, should request to be connected to the switchboard supervisor (Extension 31).
- ... These directions in no way restrict the use of appropriate precedence on overseas and Southeast Asia telephone calls as discussed in Sections II and III.


SECTION II

OVERSEAS AND SOUTHEAST ASIA TELEPHONE SERVICE

The Automatic Voice Network (AUTOVON) system in CONUS provides the Department of Defense, Service Commands and other government agencies with rapid telephone service throughout the United States and to distant parts of the world. AUTOVON currently has extended to Okinawa (Joint Switch). The SEASIA Wideband System (SEAWBS) which provides telephone and teletype service throughout RVN also provides overseas telephone sorvice. The lat Marine Division (Rein), FNF interconnects into SEAWBS through the tropospheric scatter (AN/TRC-90) system terminal at Chu Lai, and through organic radio relay circuits to Danang Switch. Routing to the U. S. is accomplished through Danang Switch to Clark AFB, Philippines, to the U. S. AUTOVON entry in Hawaii. Routing to other locations in PACCM is accomplished through many interchanges at such sites as Guam, Okinawa, Japan, etc. Information pertaining to the SEAWBS is contained in the COMUSMACV CEI. A diagram depicting selected terminals and trunks in the SEAWBS follows these instructions.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Subscribers may place official calls to almost any distant location (e.g., Saigon, Bangkok, Okinawa, Philippines, Hawaii, San Francisco, Washington, D. C.) by contacting Danang Switchboard. Danang Switchboard direct long distance connections include Saigon, Bangkok, Clark AFB and Okinawa.
- 2. When placing official calls:
 - a. Determine your routing and ask ISHERWOOD Operator for DANANG SWITCH.
- b. If ISHERWOOD direct line to DANANG SWITCH is busy, ask operator to route you through PARCHMENT.
 - c. Give DANANG SWITCH destination of call, i.e., Saigon, Bangkok, Hawaii, Washington, etc.
- d. Give precedence of call in accordance with Joint Uniform Telephone Communications Precedence System (See Section III). All calls will be processed as ROUTINE unless higher precedence is given.
 - e. Give name, rank and organization.
- f. Give the desired party's rank, name and telephone number (and alternate) if known. If not known, give place of work and location if appropriate, e.g., CINCPAC, FMFPAC, etc.
 - g. State any special instructions.
 - h. Limit call to five minutes.
- 3. Since the system is predicated upon service in accordance with precedence, subscribers are forwarned that higher precedence calls automatically preempt lower precedence calls. Additionally, manual switching through several switchboards necessitates waiting for the call to be rung through to the final switchboard.
- 4. Selected terminals and trunks in the CHU LAI-DANANG area:





JOINT UNIFORM TELEPHONE COMMUNICATION PRECEDENCE SYSTEM

- 1. The precedence indicators listed in the following chart are directed for joint use and specify, by military precedence designator, the relative order in which telephone calls should be handled based on the importance (content) of the call.
- 2. The precedence system is directed for use by all authorized users of the voice communication facilities of the Department of Defense. Since the effectiveness of the system depends upon croperation on the part of persons authorized to employ it, users must be familiar with the purpose to be served by precedence category and the types of calls which may be assigned the respective precedences. Each authorized user should consider whether a call requires special precedence and exercise care not to request or utilize one higher than the circumstances require.
- 3. The AUTOVON system does not make specific provisions for the conduct of test and exercise calls. Those activities or individuals authorized or required to conduct such tests or exercise, and upon contacting the called party will identify the call as a FLASH test call, IMEDDIATE test call, or PRIORITY test call.
- 4. Calls of a given precedence will not normally preempt calls of an equal precedence. However, calls originated by the President of the United States, Secretary of Defense, and Joint Chiefs of Staff can preempt FLASH calls in progress by application of their FLASH OVERRIDE capability. In addition, commanders of unified and specified commands when declaring either Defense Condition ONE or Defense Emergency and ClicknerAD when declaring either Defense Condition ONE or Air Defense Emergency may also preempt FLASH calls in progress by application of the FLASH OVERRIDE capability.

MILITARY PRECEDENCE DESIGNATORS

FLASH

The military precedence designator "FLASH" is used to denote the highest precedence that may be assigned telephonic communications, and is reserved for alerts, warnings, or other emergency actions having immediate bearing on national, command or area security. Flash precedence calls may be preempted by the application of the "FLASH OVERRIDE" capability available to:
(1) President of the United States, Secretary of Defense, and the Joint Chiefs of Staff; (2) Commanders of Unified and Specified Commands when declaring either Defense Condition One or Defense Emergency;
(3) CINCNORAD when declaring either Defense Condition One or Air Defense Emergency.

IMEDIATE

Preempts all lower precedence calls, and is reserved for vital communications: (1) having incediate operational effect on tactical operations; (2) which directly concern safety or rescue operations; (3) which affect the intelligence community operational role.

PRIORITY

Preempts all lower precedence calls, and is reserved for calls which require prompt completion for national defense and security, the successful conduct of war, or to safeguard life or property, which do not require higher precedence. "Normally, PRIORITY will be the highest precedence which may be assigned to administrative matters for which speed of handling is of paramount importance."

ROUTINE

Has no preemption rights, and is reserved for all other official communications. All routine calls are handled sequentially as placed by the calling party.



SECTION IV TELEPHONE SERVICE AND MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

1. General. The Telephone System is operated to provide the commander with a means of exercising command and control over his units and activities.

2. Maintenance

- a. Communication personnel will periodically perform preventive maintenance checks on your telephone, including general inspection of instrument, batteries, cords and general operating condition. Telephone users can assist in this program by preventing abuse to the instrument, preventing tangling or tension of cords, and by frequently dusting or wiping instruments to remove dirt and dust.
- b. If your telephone is inadvertently damaged, DO NJT attempt to repair it yourself -- use another instrument to report trouble to Telephone Number 31. If you have <u>any</u> difficulty with your telephone -- do not tamper with it -- call 31.
- 3. Requests for Telephone Service. Requests for additional numbers, extensions, relocations or removal of telephone service by subscribers to Division Headquarters or Headquarters Battalion Switchboards will be prepared in the format provided as illustrated below.
- a. Other subscribers will request such service in accordance with instructions promulgated by their organization.
- b. Chu Lai Installation Coordinator Order 02305.1 provides instructions for requesting trunking and other services.

1. <u>LOGISTICAL SITUATION</u>. The overall logistical status of this Division is considered to be good. No inadequacies exist which would prevent this Division from carrying out its assigned mission. The major logistic activity during this reporting period was directed toward the smooth absorption of units into the Chm Lai Combat Rase and the shifting of forces within the Chu Lai Combat Base. Organic supply accounts continued to absorb the supplies and records of subordinate elements which have rejoined their parent organizations. The quarterly reconciliation of outstanding documents held by FSA-A2, C1 and C2 has been completed.



- h. Simificant Froblem Areas. Items in short or limited supply are Truck, Platform, M274, LVT suspension repair parts and M50A1 ONTOS track. Requirements for popular sizes of lightweight utilities and combat tropical boots continue to be greater than assets available. Appropriate priority requisitioning is being conducted and, where applicable, nominations for the RED BALL Program are submitted. Polaroid cameras (T/A number 30265) are preving unsuitable for the climate and patrolling conditions encountered in Vietnam. The 35mm Mikonos, all weather camera, which is available on the open market, has been recommended as a suitable replacement item. This problem is currently under study.

3. MAINTENANCE

a. General Status. The overall maintenance status within this Division is considered to be good. Limited technical inspections of equipment which has been in-country long periods of time continue to reveal that many parts need replacing. Quarterly and annual maintenance services are being performed as rapidly as possible on all equipment in need of such services. The maintenance system has generally been responsive to the demands placed upon it. The arrival of one LVTR1A1 and two LVTP5A1 Amphibian Tractors as part of the FI=66 RAE Program has helped reduce the LVT maintenance problem. Deadline percentages by commodity classification are:
