a. Chaplain Section

COMMAND CHRONOLOGY

INTELLIGENCE

- 1. General. During the period 1-30 September 1966, the G-2 Section continued its assigned functions of collecting, processing and distributing intelligence to the Commanding General, his staff and units in the Division. On 1 September, an intelligence conference was conducted for the benefit of all local Division intelligence personnel. The conference theme was "The Northeast Monsoon Season and Its Effects on 1st Marine Division Operations". The G-2 Section assisted in the planning of the following operations: (1) NAPA, (2) FRESNO, (3) GOLDEN FLEECE 5-1, (4) GOLDEN FLEECE 7-1, and (5) MONTEREY. Individuals, units, and teams accomplished the following:
- a. Colonel J. J. O'DONNELL, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, accompanied by Captain G. E. GAUMONT, Commander of the 9th ITT, represented this Division at the USMC bi-annual Intelligence Symposium which was conducted from 19-24 September at Camp H. M. SMITH, Hawaii. Colonel O'DONNELL was the senior representative from III MAF. He was one of the programmed speakers at the symposium and delivered to the attendees a presentation, subject of which was Long Range Reconnaissance.
- b. The Combat Intelligence Section collected information from USMC, ARVN, and lower case sources, processed and disseminated intelligence by various means including Intelligence Summaries and Periodic Intelligence Reports. The section also prepared and presented the daily morning briefing and manned the COC Watch. A continuous watch also maintained in the COB Section. Combat Intelligence personnel conducted liaison visits with 2d ARVN Division at QUANG NGAI and outlying district towns at THACH TRU, MO DUC, HAU DUC; additionally, liaison visits were paid to US Army Special Forces Camps at BA TO, MINH LONG, HA THANH, TIEN PHUCC, KHAM DUC, 2d ROK Marine Brigade at DONG PHUCC and to the Provincial Capital at TAM KY. Special briefings were prepared and presented to the new Commanding General and to Major General DAVIS and Brigadier General HERBOLD. A special road analysis preparation was directed by Combat Intelligence personnel featuring location of enemy units that were in a position to harass planned movement on roads.
- c. The Aerial Observer Unit flew 171 sorties for a total of 337.1 hours. In addition to normal VR Missions, the following missions were performed:



As a result of the foregoing missions, the G-2 AO Unit claimed 21 VC KIA (confirmed), 49 VC KIA (probable), and 9 VC WIA. A significant event occurred on 23 September when the US Army Ol-D aircraft, in which AO Captain Frank H. ADAMS was airborne, received small arms fire, mortally wounding the pilot. Captain ADAMS took control in his rear air observer's seat and crash landed the aircraft with minor damage at QUANG NGAI.

- e. The Photo/Imagery Interpretation Unit continued its support with aerial and Red Haze photography. Seventeen aerial photo runs and three Red Haze missions were requested in support of Division operations.
- f. The 1st Interpretation Team translated 510 documents in support of Division operations. Interpreter support amounted to 548 hours.
- g. The 9th Interrogation Translation Team processed 215 captives through the Chu Lai Collection Point.
- h. The 7th Counterintelligence Team processed 7 personnel at the Chu Lai Collection Point.




Training Highlights

- 2. A request for 433 quotas to formal schools and 230 quotas for LFTU Water Proofing Contact Teams for the second quarter FY67, was submitted to CG III MAF on 7 September. By 30 September, 252 quotas for 12 courses were allocated by III MAF, with other allocations promised in the succeeding weeks.
- 3. Initial arrangements were made during September for the arrival of seven mobile training teams providing maintenance instructions on wreckers, rough terrain forklifts, engine generators, menon searchlights and water-proofing instruction for communication equipment, wheeled and tracked vehicles. Coordination was effected with cognisent staff sections to provide billeting, messing and training support for the teams.
- 4. Communications security instruction was conducted for battalion and higher units during the month, by an instructor provided by First Radio Bn, FMF. Approximately 200 enlisted Marines and 40 officers attended the 12 hour course which was presented in 17 Bn CPs in the CHU LAI TAOR and at 1st Mar CP in DANANG TAOR.
- 5. In coordination with G-2, the training section is providing four recent vintage VC Booby traps for use in training at Camp Pendleton.

POPULAR FORCE PROGRAM

Combined operations of PF/USMC forces continued throughout the CHU LAI TAOR.

SINGER WRITH

Within the 1st Marine Division area there are now ten fully integrated and organized Combined Action Popular Forces Platoons. Seven of these Combined Action Platoons are under the operational control of the 5th Marines, two under the 7th Marines, and one under the CHU LAI Defense Command. In addition to these ten platoons, two more are operational on a part-time basis and one more is in the formative stage.

Training was conducted on a regular basis throughout the month with all combined action plateons. Attendance was generally good except for the period just prior to and just following the national elections, during which time the majority of PF's were committed to providing local security and related operations in support of election activities.

Numerous combined action patrols and ambushes were conducted. Contacts with the enemy on these operations was relatively heavy for the month with the greatest number of contacts occurring in the 7th Marines sector. PF reaction during the majority of these contacts was greatly improved over previous response on the part of PF's. PF leadership although still generally medicore does appear to be improving.

VC initiated action against Combined Action Platoons increased greatly during the month as USMC/PF combat base areas in both the 5th and 7th Marine areas came under attack. An enemy attack on CAC L-1 combat base the night of 14-15 Sept resulted in four USMC, one Navy, and five PF KIA. One USMC, five PF's and the Hamlet Chief were wounded in this action. Despite the adverse results of the attack the platoon was reconstituted the next day and active patrolling and ambushes commenced the following night.

During the month, staff visits were made to the RF/PF Training Center at QUANG NGAI by the Division G-3, Division Air Officer, Division PF Officer, and S-3 of the 7th Marines. A staff visit was made to the RF/PF Training Center at TAM KY by the Executive Officer and S-3 of the CHU LAI Defense Command and the Division PF Officer.

Conduct of the PF program and progress made for the month is regarded as satisfactory. Two additional Combined Action Platoons became operational on a full time basis and progress was made toward the eventual integration of more platoons. The beneficial effect of Marines working closely with the PF's is definitely notables. Continued improvement and empansion is expected in the future.

LOGISTICS

1. Significant Events

- a. The major logistic activity during this reporting period was directed toward the support of combat operations, completion of the movement of the 2nd Brigade, ROKMC into the I Corps Area through the Chu Lai Combat Base, and the introduction of MAG-13 into the Chu Lai Combat Base.
- b. Support provided to the 2nd Brigade, ROKMC consisted of the following:
 - (1) Supervision of offloading one AKA, two APAs and three LSTs.
- (2) Coordination of forty-one C-130 aircraft sorties during 1-3 September from Tuy Hoa to Chu Lai.
- (3) Coordination of helicopter lift of 681 replacement personnel from Chu Lai Airfield to 2nd Brigade, ROKMC CP on 11 September 1966.
- (4) Supervision of movement of other personnel and equipment from Chu Lai Airfield and Cus Ho Sand Ramp to 2nd Brigade, ROKMC CP during this reporting period.
- (5) Engineer support for cantonment construction, road preparation and well drilling.
 - (6) Training of cooks.
- c. A team from MCSC Albany and MCSC Barstow inspected equipment that this Division nominated for the Fiscal Year 1967 R&E Program. The team, headed by Major DRESELY and Mr. COATES, arrived 3 September and departed 8 September.
- d. The Chu Lai Installation Food Services Coordinator held a meeting of all Mess Chiefs in the Chu Lai Installation on 27 September 1966. Field messing equipment, delivery of subsistence supplies, and related food service matters were discussed.
- e. The 1st and 7th Motor Transport Battalions combined carried 14,880 people and 6,376 tons of cargo a total of 234,583 miles during September 1966. Eighty-three tactical convoys were conducted.
- f. Division Embarkation coordinated the offloading of MABS-13 and MAG-13 elements from seven LSTs. Additionally, coordination for the following air movements was provided:

(1) Unloading of six C-130 aircraft carrying 1st ANGLICO to Chu Lai during the period 2-7 September.

- (2) Twenty-two C-130 aircraft sorties carrying a detachment of 1st Reconnaissance Battalion and Battery H, 11th Marines from Chu Lai to Kham Duc during the period 6-10 September.
- (3) Eleven C-130 aircraft sorties returning the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion detachment and Battery H, 11th Marines to Chu Lai on 16 and 17 September.
- (4) Ten C-130 aircraft sorties carrying 3rd Battalion, 7th Marines (minus) from Chu Lai to Dong Ha; and returning 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines (minus) from Dong Ha to Chu Lai on 29 and 30 September.
- (5) Nine C-130 aircraft sorties carrying 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines (minus) from Chu Lai to Dong Ha on 30 September.
- g. Division Embarkation conducted embarkation readiness inspections of Headquarters Battery, 11th Marines; 1st Shore Party Battalion; 1st Reconnaissance Battalion; 3rd AmTrac Battalion; 7th Motor Transport Battalion; 1st Motor Transport Battalion; 1st Tank Battalion; 1st Antitank Battalion; 1st Engineer Battalion; Headquarters Battalion; and 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines during September 1966.
- h. Construction of 1st Hospital Company's hospital facilities commenced 5 September on a limited scale due to construction personnel being diverted to work on higher priority projects.


2. New Developments

- a. A major change in the expenditure rate for C-444 (105mm) ammunition was announced during this reporting period. The ammunition supply rate was increased to 27 rounds per weapon per day from 16.5 rounds per weapon per day.
- b. This Division began testing and evaluating seventeen Combat Map Lights and five Map Case Lights. These are non-standard items derived from unsolicited proposals; the lights are designed to replace or supplement flashlights on the small unit leader level.

3. Problems

a. Response to tracers on requisitions submitted by this Division to Third FSR has been less than satisfactory. In most instances, no replies have been received. This matter was presented at the logistic conference held on Okinawa 28-29 September.

covered storage of construction materials is hindering erection of covered storage and maintenance facilities for this Division. Many structures programmed for completion prior to the onset of the monsoon season will not be completed before the rains arrive. Sufficient covered facilities will not be available to provide adequate protection from inclement weather for maintenance personnel and sensitive supplies during the period of heavy rains.

- c. A large number of Code X General Purpose Tents presently being utilized for billeting of personnel, mess halls, office spaces and storage facilities are not expected to withstand the winds and heavy rains which the monsoon season will bring. The light rains received to date have shown that these Code X tents will be totally unusable after being subjected to prolonged periods of inclement weather. This Division was directed to withhold routine requisitioning of General Purpose Tents by CMC message 111902Z MAR 66 and ADMINO FMFPac message 161833Z MAR 66. Unless serviceable tentage assets are received in the near future, Division personnel will be subject to extreme discomfort and hardship imposed by inadequate shelter.
- d. This Division is experiencing a shortage of ice for mess hall purposes; one-quarter pound per man is received approximately every sixth day. Thus, ice used for cooling drinks in mess halls is not available for long periods of time. Cool drinks are considered to be an important factor in keeping morale high. More frequent deliveries of ice to all messes are considered a necessity.
- e. Hydraulic couplings on the ART-030 Forklift presently deadline 85 per cent of this Division's 3000 pound forklifts. The recurring nature of this problem indicates a possible design deficiency. 1st Shore Party Battalion UFR 4-66 submitted 12 August 1966 discusses this matter in detail.
- f. A shortage of LVT suspension system repair parts continues to cause tractors to remain on deadline for extended periods of time. This shortage of track and suspension parts results in a 25 per cent deadline rate for LVTs. CG, 1st Marine Division message 070810Z (C) SEP 66 listed the urgently needed parts.
- g. Ten of eighteen, or 56 per cent, of this Division's M109 155mm Howitzers (SP) are deadlined. A shortage of 3rd and 4th echelon ordnance repair parts is the primary reason these vehicles remain deadlined for long periods of time. The required parts are on priority 02 requisition, and those meeting the criteria are on Red Ball.
- h. A shortage of 155mm gun tubes and cannon assemblies for the M53 155mm Gun (SP) is causing a 50 per cent deadline for this weapon. FLSG-B

155mm gun to be stocks have been depleted, and a lack of replacement tubes and cannons will cause M53 vehicles to remain on deadline for long periods of time. A significant factor is that the entire cannon assembly must be replaced after tube replacement has been effected four times. Information on retubing and present tube life of M53 vehicles:

COMMAND CHRONOLOGY CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. Narmative Summary

a. 1-30 September 1966

The 12th DTA Joint Coordinating Councils held a joint meeting on 27 September. The meeting was chaired by the ADC. Attendees included the fellowing: Province Chiefs of Quang Ngai and Quang Tin; their senior military advisors; representatives from the 2d ARVN Div; USAID; Embassy and JUSPAO representatives. The primary purpose of the council is to coordinate the Revolutionary Development Progress in the 12th Division Tactical Area.

The medical and dental civic action program continues to be the one previding the highest impact on the civilian populace. A total of 23,203 medical and 483 dental treatments were rendered during September.

Construction of additional classrooms is receiving emphasis and a total of 16 classrooms are currently under construction under the III MAF self-help program.

The Vietnamese Children's Mid-October Festival was conducted in the area on 29 September. Assistance in the form of providing teys, school supplies, candy and bakery items was provided to approximately 3,000 children.

The ACofS G-5 visited a Revolutionary Development Team in operation in Thang Binh Village, Quang Tin Prevince for the purpose of obtaining first hand information as to the capabilities of these teams.

VIP visits to the G-5 section included: Ambassador KOREN; BGen CRITTENBERGER U. S. Army; Mr. J. O. HOLT, USAID Advisor; Mr. STUBBS, U. S. Embassy Official; Mr. MAY, Senior USAID Representative, Quang Ngai; Mr. THOMAS, JUSPAO Representative, 12th Division Tactical Area.



COMMAND CHRONOLOGY/PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

1. Named in Summary Septembe

a. 1-30 September 1966

Leaflet drops and broadcasts - During the month of September there were two million five hundred and ninety five thousand leaflets dropped and forty one hours of broadcasting in support of the 1st Marine Division.

Films - Films have been rotated from unit to unit within the TAOR for use at night in certain hamlets. These films are obtained through the JUSPAO representative in Quang Ngai.

Vietnamese Civilians - Occassionally Vietnamese civilians are apprehended by mistake and interrogated as VCS. Upon clearance these people are given letters of apology and magazines. The magazines are provided by the JUSPAO field representative in Quang Ngai.

Operation FRESNO - Portable speakers were used in UH-34D helicopters for broadcasts in support of the operation. The messages included were the oursew, not to allow VC to fire at aircraft from hamlets, do not run from Marines, and give any information concerning the VC.

Assistance to district VIS - Assistance to district VIS included the amount of paper needed to produce the weekly newspapers, posters for bulletin boards, magazines for reading rooms, and material to aid Chieu Hoi returnees build a roof for his new home.

Evacuation of Hamlet - A message was taped and used for support of the 7th Marines. The message was broadcast to hamlet civilians during the evacuation.

Change to T/O of Psy Ops Section - The Psychological Operations section has been increased to include one LtCol., one Major, one Captain, a Staff NCO and a Sergeant.

Chieu Hoi Program - During the month of September the total number of Chieu Hoi returnees for the provinces of Quang Tin and Quang Mgai respectively were twenty-two and fifty-three.

COMMUNICATION-ELECTRONICS OFFICE CHRONOLOGY

1. 1st Mar. Chu Lei Installation Facilities.

- a. Division Systems Control Center. On 2 September 1966, the Division Systems Control Center was activated. Composed of selected operational communication personnel, under the supervision of a Communication Officer, MOS 2502, the Systems Control Center will operate as a Sub Unit of the Division Communication-Electronics Operations Section. The Sub Unit will be primarily concerned with the continuous evaluation of the Chu Lei Combat Base Communications System, and, through direct liaison with senior and sub-ordinate System Control Centers, effect instantaneous remedial action of circuit outages as they occur.
- b. Chu Lei Instellation Switchboard Facilities. On 5 September 1966, the Chu Lei Switch switchboard was activated. This new exchange will reduce by twenty-five percent line terminations on the existing Division Switchboard (ISHERWOOD), and provide suscribers with a more efficient telephone service.

2. Communication Support Coordination.

- a. <u>Tactical Operations</u>. Operational, material, and personnel support were coordinated for Division units participating in Operations NAPA, FRESNO and ROUGH RIDER, and for long-range reconnaissance operations conducted in the KHAM DUC area.
- b. Communications for Radio Retransmission Sites. During this reporting period, operational, material, and personnel support were coordinated for the transfer of communication retransmission facilities from unsecure battlefield surveillance site to secure locations within the Chu Lai Combat Base. This, in turn, cancels the requirement for infantry security forces, and still provides optimum retransmission service.
- c. Communication Idaison Operations. In early September 1966, a Communication Idaison Unit, composed of officer and enlisted personnel from 7th Communication Battalion, FMF, established communication facilities in the vicinity of the 2d Korean Marine Brigade Command Post. The unit provides radio and telephone, and secure teletype communications, and thus enhances coordination in operations conducted between USMC and ROKMC forces deployed in the CHU LAI-QUANG NGAI area.
- 3. Communication Support for VIP's Visiting Chu Lei Area. Coordination between all Chu Lei Installation Units was effected to ensure that immediate and reliable communications were available to CG, FMFPac during his visit to the Chu Lei area on 4 September 1966.

The non-availability of these three TL-16's requires that other forklifts be utilised to a greater extent that is desirable. The "Get Well" date for this problem will remain in question until the required brake lining is received by FL-30-3.
- (3) A shortage of 155mm Gun tubes and cannon assemblies for the 163 155mm Gun (32) may cause the deadline rate of this vehicle to be extremely high in the near future. 155 mm Gun tube reserves at FL:G-B have been depleted, and a lack of replacement tubes and cannons will cause 163 vehicles to remain on deadline for long periods of time. One 165 has been on deadline since 16 August for replacement of the cannon assembly. It is anticipated that operational commitments will require replacement of one additional 1446 cannon within the next thirty days. 



9. Services Situation. Generally, the overall service situation is adequate; however, the specific problem areas listed in paragraph 10 do exist.

a. Leundry. Although FLSG-B laundry facilities are working to nearly maximum output, FLSG-B is unable to meet the laundry requirements of this Division. Indigenous laundries are utilized to handle the excess laundry at the expense of the individual.

b. Ice. This Division is experiencing a shortage of ice for mess hall purposes; one-quarter pound per man is received approximately every sixth day. Thus, ice used for cooling drinks in mess halls is frequently not available for long periods of time. Cool drinks are considered to be an important factor in keeping morals high. More frequent deliveries of ice to all messes is considered a nacessity. This matter is discussed in further detail in CG, 1st Marine Division message 0307432 Oct 66.
