NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. ORGANIZATION

- a. CO, HQBn was relieved of III MAF Brig responsibilities on 1 June 1967.
- b. MP Company displaced from III MAF Brig/POW Compound to Headquarters Battalion Command Post on 1 June 1967.
- c. 9th Interpreter/Translator Team detached from 3rd Interpreter/Translator Team on 27 June 1967.
- d. 9th Interpreter/Translator Team assumed OPCOM of 1st and 3d Interpreter/Translator Teams on 30 June 1967.

2. TRAINING

- a. Ten officers and 163 enlisted attended the Battalion Orientation and Indoctrination Presentation.

b. 30 enlisted were trained as vehicle operators and received operators permits.

c. All persons with the rank of captain and below received a minimum of two hours instruction on the M-16 Rifle.

d. One officer and five enlisted attended III MAF Vietnamese Language School.

3. SECURITY

a. Eight security patrols were conducted in area south of the Division Command Post.

b. Extensive work to improve the command post defenses is approximately 90% complete.

4. LOGISTICS

a. Installation of new equipment at 1st MAW water point has resulted in better water service to the Command Post.

b. A larger generator was installed. 1st Dental Company now is being supplied with sufficient electrical power to operate their equipment.

5. CIVIC ACTION

a. Construction of a three room school is continuing favorably and is approximately 80% completed in hamlet of HOA MY.

b. The number of Vietnamese who received weekly medical and dental assistance in the hamlet of HOA MY during June, was 565 and 109 respectively.

c. 80 bars of soap were distributed in the Hamlet of HOA MY during June 1967.

6. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS. During June, the 244th PsyOpsCo showed movies in the hamlet of HOA MY to approximately 1600 Vietnamese. In addition, 400 copies of various PsyOps pamphlets and 100 copies of South Vietnamese News were distributed.

7. LEGAL

a. 12 Battalion Commanders NJP imposed.

b. Three Summary and one Special Courts-Martials awarded.
