NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the first half of the month of April, Headquarters Battalion continued to provide administrative, communications, service and Military Police support to the Division Command Post. The defensive perimeter was manned, and the external security of Sector "B" of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR was coordinated by Headquarters Battalion. Final preparations for embarkation and redeployment to CONUS were made. On 14 April 1971, all functions of Headquarters Battalion were turned over to Headquarters Company, 3rd Marine Amphibious Brigade.

11 April 1971 Deployed 2nd Reaction Platoon (Comm Co) to Da Son village to provide security for U.S. personnel and equipment involved in a minor traffic accident, when an estimated crowd of 200 - 300 Vietnamese threatened them concerning settlement of claim.

14 April 1971 Headquarters Battalion ceased operations in support of its mission.

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
