NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the month of August the 1st Combined Action Group continued deactivation in accordance with CAF OPPLAN 1-70. Maximum emphasis was placed on Psyops using posters, loud speaker, ceremonies, and aerial broadcasts. The Psyops themes stressed confidence in the Government of VN and the ability of the Vietnamese forces to carry on without U. S. help.
2. Enemy activity showed a marked decrease since the last reporting period. The Group had fewer sightings, less contacts and no kills for the reporting period. The reason for this, being the deactivation of all the CAP's by 21 August 1970.
3. During the reporting period, the Americal Division has continued its support operations. The Americal Division has partially extended its areas of operation into the areas left vacant by the deactivation of 1st CAG.

2. All CAP's and CACO's have been withdrawn from the field and deactivated. The Responsible Officer's Accounts have been closed with insignificant loss of government property. From a supply stand point the withdrawal was orderly and well scheduled.

(1) The Group's psychological operations for the month of August were directed towards the deactivation of the Group. Consisting of three separate phases (Predeactivation, deactivation, post deactivation). Aerial broadcasts, leaflets and posters were used for all three phases in which 82,000 leaflets and 12,000 posters were distributed to the Vietnamese people, urging the people to support the Government of Vietnam and stressing the proficiency of the Popular and Regular Forces.
