

### PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Parring the month the major artillery effort continued to be directed at providing supporting fires for the defense of the Chu Lai TACR, support of Infantry operations in and around the TACR and support of Operation DeSoto in the Duc Pho area of Quang Ngai Province. Additionally, supporting fires were prescribed for the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion elements inserted in Viet Cong controlled territory, CIDG/Special Forces Camps, Government of Vietnam Armed Forces Units (GVNAF), and units of the Republic of South Korea (ROKMC). One Task Force XRay search and destroy operation (DeSoto) begun in January 1967 has continued through March. Two search and destroy operations were conducted by 5th and 7th Marine units. All operations were supported by units of the First Field Artillery Group.

Operation DeSoto. Operation DeSoto is a Task Force XRay search and destroy operation which began 27 January and has continued through the end of the reporting period. This operation provided for the relief of the 2nd ARVN Division forces in the Duc Pho area of Quang Ngai Province. Additional artillery support was heli lifted into the area with significant accomplishments on 25 March 1967. See Part III for additional detail.

Operation Tippecanoe. A search and destroy operation conducted by the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines within their TAOR/RAOR was supported by Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines from its primary position within the TAOR. The operation began on 13 March and was terminated 18 March 1967.

Operation Perry. A search and destroy operation was conducted by the

2nd Battalion, 7th Marines in coordination with the 2nd ROBMC Erigade during the period 25-27 March 1967. The 3nd Battalion, 11th Marines supported the operation from primary positions within the 3502. In addition, the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines deployed four (4) howears to grid BS57409215 in direct support of the operation and the 3nd Platoon, 3nd 8" Howitzer Battery, (SP) FMF displaced to the vicinity of grid BS572964 to provide General Support artillery fires,

Roving Guns. On 24 Merch 1967, the First Field Artillery Group amounted an accollerated roving gun program within the TAOR and in support of the six (5) CTDC/Special Forces Camps which Task Force XRay is charged with supporting. Initial roving gun nevements within the TAOR commenced on 241015H March 1967 with the movement of a platoon of 105mm Howitzers from 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines to a position within the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marines CP (EP458075). The platoon fixed in support of 5th Marines long range patrols for a six (6) hour pented, returning to its parent unit prior to darkness. On 24 March 1967, the 3rd Flatoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) FMF displaced to a position area within the First Field Artillery Group CP (BT51150400). The platoon fixed from that position until 250630H March when it displaced to the vicinity of grid BS572964 in support of Operation Perry.

The Ath Battalion, 11th Marines at 280845H helilified two (2) 155mm
Howitzers (FD) from Quang Ngai airfield (B8604722) to Minh Long CIDG/Special
Forces Carp (B6535552), from where it provided long range artillery support
to the local Mich Long CIDG operations and also supported a 1st Reconnaissance
Bettalion, lasers team. The life, which included an additional
45,600 pounds of amounition and cargo, was accomplished by two (2) CH-53
helicopters from EMH453. This marked the second successful single helicopter
lift of a 155mm Howitzer (TD) by a Marine unit; the first lift being in suppost of Operation Defoto (see Part III). The platoon completed a successful
return hift on 30 March 1967.

jud Platoon, 3rd 155mm Gun Battery (SF) FMF, First Field Artillery Group on 29 March 1967 displaced from its primary position area (BT437096) and occupied a position within the First Field Artillery Group CP (BT511040). The platoon reinforced fires of 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and attacked numerous deep targets in the vicinity of the First Field Artillery Group CP at In Noa (BS474863). On 31 March 1967, the platoon returned to its immary position (B1437096).

Continuing Support. The requirements to maintain Battery "F"(-), 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines at Tien Phuoc (BT106142) and observation posts at An Hoa (h9474863) and Nai Tron (BS515780) continued throughout the period.

Battery "F", 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines remains OPCON 11th Marines as does one phatoon (personnel only) of the 107mm Mortar Battery, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. ADCON for both elements remains with the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines.

- (2) Operation Tippecance. A search and destroy operation conducted by 1st Battalion, 5th Marines within their TAOR/RAOR was supported by Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines from its primary position within the TAOR. The operation began on 13 March and was terminated 18 March 1967.
- (3) Operation Perry. A search and destroy operation was conducted by the 2nd Battalion, 7th Marines in coordination with the 2nd ROKMO Bde during the period 25-27 March 1967. The operation took place in the southern area of the 7th Marines TAOR along the Song Tra Bong. The 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines supported the operation from primary position areas and additionally displaced four (4) howters to grid BS57409215 in direct support. The 3rd Platoon, 3rd 8" Howitzer Battery (SP) FMF displaced to vicinity BS57229642 reinforcing fires for the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines for this operation.

#### 4. Enemy, Weather, Terrain

The general support observation posts at N-24 (Nui Tron BS516778) and M-24 (BS474863) continued to report sightings of VC in groups numbering from 3 or 4 to numbers in the hundreds. VC activity between the Song Tra Bong and Song Tra Khuc rivers was continually high during the month of March.

The weather was generally fair and mild with negligible precipitation. Weather did not affect any operational commitments.

5. Training. Normal training on General Military Subjects and technical training was accomplished. The emphasis is being placed on field fortifications, crew served weapons training, mine and booby trap indoctrination, Command Post Defense and patrol action.

### 6. Civic Action

On 6 March 1967, a self-help dispensary was started in Long Phu 2.

Mr. So, the hamlet chief of Long Phu 2 presented a Vietnamese Flag to the First Field Artillery Group on 15 March to fly in the C.P. area.

A laundry co-op was established with the citizens of Long Phu 2 and First Field Artillery Group. Money earned will be used to pay the school teacher.

On 18 March 1967, the Civic Action Officer distributed over 200 pounds of clothing to the children at the school in Long Phu 2. He also gathered information on two Viet Cong that used to live in Long Phu 1 for counterintelligence.

Evacuated one male with a broken hand from Long Phu 2 to 1st Medical Battalion on 23 March 1967.

SEGRET

During March material consisting of cement and wood was delivered to Long Phu 2 for the dispensary.

A letter was prepared on 23 March 1967 by the Civic Action Officer for the chief of Long Phu 2 requesting a road be built to connect Long Phu 2 with Highway 1. The letter will go to the Province Chief for approval of the project.

During the evening of 24 March 1967, the Civic Action Officer and Corpsman treated a Vietnamese woman for shock. Her daughter had been killed by a earth mover from 9th Engineers that day. 9th Engineers completed all reports.

### 7. Logistics

Normal logistics support continued for Battery "I"(Rein), 3rd Battalion, llth Marines positioned at Duc Pho (BS817382) in support of Operation DeSoto with the additional requirement for supporting the platoon of 155mm howitzers (TD) and Howtar Platoon which reinforced Battery "I" on 25 March 1967. Normal support continued for Battery "F"(-), 2nd Battalion, llth Marines at Tien Phuce CIDG/Special Forces Camp (BT106142).

During the reporting period the First Field Artillery Group Direct Support Battalions received Beehive ammunition. 203 rounds were received by Battery "I" (Rein), 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines for support of Operation DeSoto. 61 rounds were distributed to the 105mm howitzers within the Chu Lai Combat Base.

1st Shore Party Battalion, 1st Marine Division constructed slings on a priority basis to allow for the lift of the 155mm howitzers (TD) on 25 March.

Calibration of First Field Artillery Group weapons commenced on 26 March 1967. Battery "F"(-), 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines were calibrated by the end of the reporting period.

2nd Battalion, 11th Marines received 4 M-30 4.2" Mortars on 8 March 1967 and 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines received 5 M-30 4.2" Mortars on 25 March 1967.

- 8. Aerial Observation. During the month of March 1967, the Aerial Observation Section, First Field Artillery Group flew 30 missions for a total of 71.2 hours in support of Task Force XRay (Chu Lai) TAOR/RAOR, Operations DeSoto/Deckhouse VI and Reconnaissance Team Inserts. Aircraft support was provided by Headuqarters and Maintenance Squadron Sixteen based at Da Nang, the 220th Aviation Company (USA), based at Quang Ngai and Marine Observation Squadron Six based at Chu Lai.
