#### PART II NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of May 1967 the major effort of the First Field Artillery Group was directed at establishing a Base Camp collocated within the 11th Marines area.

The First Field Artillery Group at Oll800H May displaced from grid BT 512041 and proceeded to the Chu Lai LST ramp for embarkation. Upon arrival the shipping assigned to move the First Field Artillery Group was still unloading. Leading of personnel and equipment commenced at Ol2200H May 1967, and except for 12 vehicles and palletized equipment was completed at 020300H May 1967. The remaining 12 vehicles and palletized equipment were loaded aboard ship on 3 May 1967. The First Field Artillery Group departed Chu Lai at 020630H May 1967, and arrived at DaNang at 021430H May 1967. The LST was unloaded and the First Field Artillery Group motor marched to the 11th Marines Command Post, grid AT957756, arriving at 021630H May 1967. Upon arrival at the Command Post area, vehicles were unloaded and perishable equipment was placed under canvas. The remaining 12 vehicles and palletized equipment arrived at DaNang on 031900H May 1967. By 5 May all vehicles and equipment were located at the First Field Artillery Group Command Post area.

On 15 May elements of the Mobile Construction Battalion began constructing the First Field Artillery Group cantonment. Construction of 12 buildings was completed on 22 May 1967.

The remainder of the month was used to improve office spaces, storage areas, personnel living areas and areas for maintenance of equipment.

Searchlight Platoon. On 9 May 1967 the First Field Artillery Group assumed OPCON of a Searchlight Platoon which consisted of 2 lights and associated equipment and 13 personnel which were attached to this Headquarters.

The searchlight platoon, plus one officer and 2 radio operators from Headquarters Battery, First Field Artillery Group were emplaced on the military crest of hill 327, grid AT971738. The searchlight platoon became operational on the evening of 9 May 1967, and conducted its first illumination mission at 092200H May 1967. The next 5 days, during daylight, was spent on building defensive fortifications, personnel living quarters, and improving the position area.

At 140015H May 1967, hill 327 was infiltrated by approximately 30 VC. The living quarters and a head were destroyed by satchel charges. An adjacent unit, located on the hill was infiltrated and suffered light netwish damage. The enemy was engaged while inside the wire and although no bodies were recovered, there were many heavy blood patches on the ground. Blood trails were traced the next morning to the bottom of the hill where bloody rags and battle dressings were found. It was decided to send an additional 9 personnel for security to the searchlight position each evening at 1800 and have them meturn at 0700 the next morning. No further enemy action has occured.

From 9 May to 31 May there were a total of 15 light missions conducted.

# 2. Administration

- a. Normal administrative functions were accomplished during the month.
- b. One special court martial, one summary court martial and one non-judicial punishment was administered.

#### 3. Organization and Operations

- a. The First Field Artillery Group on 1 May 1967 consisted of a Head-Quarters Battery. All subordinate units were chopped OPCON to the 11th Marines during the month of April 1967 due to Operation Oregon.
- b. Operations. The First Field Artillery Group participated in one operation during the month of May.

Operation Union. Operation Union was a search and destroy operation conducted by units of the 1st Marines, 5th Marines, 11th Marines, Special Landing Force and the 2nd ARVN Bivision. This operation took place in the Lac Son, Que Son, Thang Binh districts of Quang Nam and Quang Tin Provinces. At 060800H May 1967, the Commanding Officer and S-3 of the First Field Artillery Group with 6 enlisted marines departed the CP by helicopter for Operation Union. Their mission was to advise the Commanding Officer, 5th Marines, Gommanding Officer, Special Landing Force and Commanding Officer, 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines on artillery matters. They were instructed to keep the Commanding Officer, 11th Marines informed as to the progress of the operation and of any difficulties encountered that would affect the artillery units mission.

Operation Union was a highly successful and well coordinated operation and there was little need for the Commanding Officer, First Field Artillery Group to remain in the field after the initial phases of the operation.

- 4. Enemy. Weather and Terrain. Nothing significant to enter.
- 5. Training. The first half of the month was used to prepare and improve the CP area and to construct living areas. During the later part of the month a new training syllabus was established and placed into effect which placed the emphasis on formal training both for example Maintant Subjects and Maintant Subjects
- 6. Civic Action. There was no significant civic action.
- 7. Logistics. Nermal logistics support continued for Headquarters Battery, First Field Artillery Group. Subordinate units previously supported by the

First Field Artillery Group were displaced within the DaNang TAOR.

Headquarters Battery, First Field Artillery Group embarked aboard ship on 1 and 2 May and arrived 2 and 3 May at DaNang. Unloading and movement to the 11th Marines Command Post was accomplished by 5 May 1967.

The logistics effort for the remainder of the month consisted of providing necessary support for construction of the position area and storage of equipment and supplies.
