## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period covered by this report, Communication Company continued to provide support for the Red Beach Complex and other FLC units not physically located at Red Beach.

2. RADIO PLATOON: During the month of December, Radio Platoon continued operation of three (3) twenty four hour nets: FLC Command, FLC Tactical, and the Logistics Net to LSU An Hoa. A nine man detachment and equipment is provided to the An Hoa LSU. Phone patches via the AN/TSC-15 van were provided between FLC and 3rd FSR for a total of 144 calls completed. On the 27th the AN/TSC-15 was relocated from behind FLC Headquarters to the Communication Company Compound.

Radio equipment and operators were provided on a continuing basis to CG, FLC, Camp Books C.P. Bunker, Supply Battalion Landing Zone Common in addition to over 55 patrols and ambushes plus 25 convoys to Phu Bai and An Hoa.

Instructional assistance is provided weekly to the FLC NCO Leadership School on the operation and first echelon maintenance of the AN/PRC-25 and AN/PRC-10 radios.

3. MAINTENANCE PLATOON: Provided a contact team to Supply Battalion to MFI and condition code eighty (80) radio sets, AN/PRC-10 plus assisting in the MFI's on 41 field phones EE-8. Total work orders processed increased from 169 (Nov) to 265 and trouble calls/on site repairs nearly doubled over last months totals (294 to 554).

4. WIRE PLATOON: The Wire Platoon continued to provide necessary wire service to Camp Books based units and outlying areas. With the move of Ammo Co/ Supply Bn to the Camp Monahan area, service in that area was upgraded and a four man detachment provided to service the installation. A wire detachment at Maintenance Battalion continues to provide telephone/wire service to that area. Relocated were three (3) TOM-20 intercom terminal stations and eight (8) telephones.

TA-312's replaced EE-8's to the limit of our resources and certain subscribers received commercial type telephones to replace field telephones. New telephone service or additional extensions were provided to 12 subscribers. The Construction Section answered 123 trouble calls and the Frame Section made 53 tests on various teletypewriter trunks, Autodin, dial and other long lines. Local tests were made as necessary to support local trouble calls. Four (4) new hot lines and one (1) trunk line were installed. A new section of 25-pair cable was installed in Supply Bn to replace a section which had been damaged by a high load on a truck.

5. COMMUNICATION CENTER PLATOON: Twenty four hour operation of narrative teletype and data circuits continued. Traffic count for December is

Interior work on the new Communication Center is continuing - the asphalt floor tiling has been completed, the interior painted and acoustical tiling is 50% completed. The upgrading of Data circuits to Chu Lai and Phu Bai has been completed. Minor irregularities are being worked out by civilian technicians from NAVSEEPAC. The base power to which we switched on 23 December is a slight problem - four power failures of one hour plus duration in the first four days.

6. OPERATIONS SECTION: Published the Company COMMSOP (CoO 2000.1) plus other directives on Safety, Maintenance and Supply Support. T/E deficiencies and excesses have been reconciled on Company and Platoon level. Preliminary inspection in preparation for CG FLC's inspection on 2-4 January was conducted in areas noted by the FMFPac Inspection in August.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Project "Excess" commenced in November within Supply Company to identify, tag and locate certain items of supply previously unidentified or improperly located. During December more than 5,000 items were researched, identified and processed back to stock. The TAD orders for Project "Excess" personnel from III MAF units were terminated on 21 December. Five personnel from the Receipts Section, Supply Company continue toward completion of the project. Estimated time for completion is 15 January 1968.

During the month of December, fourteen (14) convoys departed Supply Battalion as follows:


