## 5. Special Operations

a. The Provisional Rifle Company conducted 31 night patrols (Ambush and Combat) and 17 day patrols during the month of November. A platoon sized operation was conducted on 27-28 November

1. On 2 November a Provisional Rifle night patrol in ambush site at AT 922814 received approximately 15 rounds of small arms fire from AT 921815. Patrol returned 100 rounds of M-60 MG and 60 rounds of small arms fire.

2. On 4 November a Provisional Rifle night patrol detonated 1 unknown type booby trap AT 922816. One Marine was medevaced.

3. On 5 November a Provisional Rifle day patrol found on M-26 booby trap at AT 922816. EOD disarmed the grenade.

4. On 15 November two VN children lead a Provisional Rifle patrol to four buried Chi Com grenades at AT 932805. Children had found the grenades two weeks earlier and had buried them in sand. The grenades were blown in place.

5. On 27-28 November Provisional Rifle First Platoon conducted a two day operation in Mieu Na Islands, resulting in several detainees who were interrogated by 5th CIT and released.

6. On 28 November a Provisional Rifle night patrol found one M-26 grenade rigged as booby trap at AT 934797. Booby trap was blown in place.

7. A Provisional Rifle day patrol found a suspected booby trap on 29 November, type unknown, at AT 933798. Fired an M-79 round at booby trap to detonate it and one Marine had shrapnel come back and hit his hand. EOD was called to detonate booby trap, had trouble with fuse and had to use M-26 grenades.

8. On 30 November a Provisional Rifle night patrol setting in ambush position spotted rockets coming towards FLC from the west.

b. 5 November: Brigadier General FEELY and Major HALL from Hoa Vang District dedicated the the Sergeant John PREZIOSI School in Xuan Duong Hamlet.

c. 11 November: Corporal Tom BUCK captured a water buffalo inside the perimeter. The animal was led out gate #5 and returned to its owners.

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d. 14 November: Showed 2 hours of propaganda movies to 300 persons in Nam-O Hamlet. Distributed reward leaflets and information on reporting Viet Cong Infastructure.

e. 21 November: Distributed 69 sheets of tin, 2600 pounds of cement, and plywood and scrap lumber among the victims of an Army rocket attack on Xuan Thieu on 24 Sep 1968. Material is to be used in the partial reconstruction of their homes.

f. 22 November: Paid General WALT Scholarships to 35 students in our TOAR for the month of November.

g. 25 November: Pre-recorded propaganda tape broadcast to Hoa Heip Village.

h. 26 November: Leaflets dropped on Hoa Heip village.

i. 27 November: Distributed 54 gallons of milk in Truong Phuoc area in connection with MedCap.

j. 28 November: Distributed 200 pounds of paper to schools in Xuan Thieu and Truong Phuoc.

k. During the month of November the Hoa Khanh Childrens Hospital had an average of 141 patients on ward and 689 were treated as out patients. A total 4,691 Vietnamese were treated under MedCap II and 381 persons under the DentCap program. 17 persons were evacuated from 3 Hamlets for medical treatment.

l. Six construction projects are in progress. A total of 25 truck loads of material were delivered to the Children Hospital and 20 truck loads to the other 5 projects.


