All Companies had a routine month of operation.

Ration Company's Bread Production was 597,888 pounds with an average daily production of 19,287 pounds. Donut production was 66,100 pounds averaging 2,448 pounds daily. Ice Plant produced 392,840 pounds of ice. Total received from Vietnamese was 162,740 pounds, from B.G.I. 230,100 pounds, from NSA 108,400 pounds of ice. On 15 October 1969 ASP #1 received Ammunition for the first time. The dump level at ASP #1 increased to 4,640 s/tons all of which are USMC assets, 3,904 s/tons are Class V(W) and 736 s/tons are Class V(A). The dump level at ASP #2 decreased to 12,971 s/tons of which 7,078 s/tons are USMC assets, 5,106 s/tons are U. S. Army assets, 385 s/tons are U. S. Navy assets, 326 s/tons are Project 972 and 72 s/tons are Grade III. EOD Platoon made 126 calls recovering 1,570 U. S. explosive items and 73 VC or ChiCom explosive items.

Automated Service Center / Central Control Point processed eighteen daily updates, including three special updated during the month, with a total of 40,387 requisitions, 17,972 receipts and 41,639 shipping documents produced with a total of 129 hours and 50 minutes run time. The total number of transactions processed for the month was 504,161. The fill rate was 58% with the fill rate for RO items being 67%. There were 91,390 personnel changes processed during the month, for entry into the Personnel Accounting System.

The battalion conducted 4 tours of places of interest in the Danang area during the month of October in connection with the Personal Response Program. Approximately 100 Marine from the battalion attended the tours, with the following places visited: Phuoc Xuan Refugee Camp, Phu Thuong Thon Orphanage, Cao Dai Temple, Buddhist Temple and Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital.

Lt Gen BUSE, CG FMFPac visited Supply Battalion 29 October 1969. He was given the initial tour on the new Disneyland Special (Warehouse tractor with seats mounted on warehouse trailers). Retrograde of FLSG-Bravo and Third Marine Division, warehouse consolidation, quarterly inventory and location verification schedules in support of the excess review requirements, warehouse training programs for Marine and Local National Civilians (LNC's) and the Preservation, Packaging and Packing operations related to stock surveillance were discussed.

A new causeway at Red Beach was used for the first time this month. It is a part of the Retrograde Facility which will provide staging and washdown areas for all retrograde cargo, both incoming from FLSG-Bravo and outgoing to CONUS or Okinawa. With a capacity to handle YFU's, LCM's and LST's the causeway is best suited to rolling stock type retrograde. ~~Maneuvering space for forklifts on the cause way make pallet handling unfeasible due to the time required for loading and unloading the trucks. Request will be made for Roll-On-Roll-Off (Ro-Ro) trailer loading of all palletized cargo. Feasibility of conveyerizing the deck of trailers to permit end loading and unloading will be explored, since it would reduce the forklift travel distance when palletized loads are received that are not trailer mounted.~~ When the surf exceeds three feet high the causeways are considered unsafe for use and are disconnected by the Navy and anchored further out in the bay. *R*

MEMORANDUM 10 - 69

1. The policy of helping the Vietnamese people of our hamlets help themselves was continued for the month of October. The names of the three hamlets are Hoa-My, Trung Phuoc, and Phuoc Ha. The project currently underway in the hamlets is a temple in Phuoc Ha. WE would like to thank the chaplain for visiting our hamlets. His presents was greatly appreciated. The projects planned for the hamlets are wells, head facilities, a market, and a MedCAP building. The S-5 section cleaned and painted the MedCAP building of Trung Phuoc and it is now suitable for treatment of the patients. The amount of material distributed in the hamlets for the month of October is as follows; ten truck loads of fire wood, 45 bags of cement, two loads of used tin, three loads of building material, one physical education kit, and 250 school kits.
2. The BAS MedCAP team treated over 650 people in the hamlets for the month of October. We would like to thank the doctor for joining our MedCAP this month. There was approximately 3800 loaves of bread from FLC bakery delivered to the China Beach and Sacred Heart Orphanage. There were clothes sent from the U.S. that will also be distributed at the orphanages.
3. The Personal Response Program is still giving its tours of the DaNang area twice a month. The tours will be given on the second and fourth Saturday of each month unless weather conditions prohibit it, in which case it will be held the following Saturday. In the future the S-5 will be requesting volunteers to work in the hamlets and the orphanages. By doing this, we hope to achieve a better relationship between the Vietnamese people and the American people.
4. The response to the memorandum put out on October 20, 1969, concerning the orphan sponsorship program was outstanding. There were fourteen men from the battalion that sponsored orphans; eight of which were from MTM Co. and six from HES Co. The concern of these men is greatly appreciated by the children at the orphanage, the orphanage personnel, and the personal response NCOIC. If any man is interested in the sponsorship program contact the S-5 office by phoning 2547.
