PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

Supply Company continued to provide support for the remaining I Corps Marine and ROK Marine units. Major shifts among the officers occurred, with the previous Commanding Officer, Major BJORK, changing jobs with LtCol GILLEN as Battalion S3. Other major shifts were of Major DUNN and CWO2 LOWREY from the Battalion S3 to XO of Supply Company and Assistant Salvage Officer respectively. Shop Stores Platoon moved intact from H&S Company to Supply Company with its one officer and 21 enlisted.

Incoming cargo receipts were still down for another month and the issues of the PURA excesses to the Army Property Disposal Office for the current phase was completed.

The new Retrograde Facility is doing a booming business at its new location on Red Beach, with some rolling stock or other units and AM2 matting being washed down as well as the rolling stock that had to be shipped out.

The opening of the new packing line, known as PP&P Shop #4 on the K Lot has been primarily concerned with a care-in-store type inspection operation of Class 84 (Clothing). The clothing items are inspected and if wet but serviceable are dried, repackaged and repacked. New standard SeaLand compatible boxes are being used in case this materiel eventually becomes retrograde cargo to leave Vietnam.

Shop Stores continued its usual mission assignment of receiving, stocking, and issuing 3d and 4th echelon repair parts (Class IX items) to the Maintenance Battalion and FLSG-Bravo maintenance facilities/shops. There were about 4,000 issues made during the month.

Large quantities of excess medical materiel was received by Medical Supply Platoon from the 26th Marines via 1st Medical Battalion.

The Retail Clothing Outlet (M2410) received and issued individual clothing to Marine, Seabee and ROKMC units within the DaNang TAOR. Training in military subjects and on the job training was conducted.

SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Significant operations conducted.

- a. During the month of April, 7,500 - 9:00X20 Tires were pulled from stock and shipped.
- b. The construction of K-Lot was completed allowing a space for the consolidation of Federal Group 84 which is located throughout the Supply Company Storage complex. All containers are stenciled, banded and have vector control inserted prior to storage.
- c. Over 40 assorted engineer items coded "H" were disposed of this month. This disposal represented the movement of 40,000 lbs and 13,000 cu. ft. of material.
- d. Condition code "H" batteries numbering 24,000 were disposed of this month. This represented 208,355 lbs and 5,000 cu. ft. of unserviceable material.
- e. The Project PURA program (turn-in of excesses to the Army Property Disposal Office) was completed.
- f. Eight (8) ships proposed manifests were completed during the month of April. Processed were the Seatrain Colorado, USNS Provo, Seatrain Florida, SS Transglobe and four (4) LST's.
- g. PP&P opened a new processing area, Shop IV, that deals with drying and repacking of clothing. The first full day of operation was 16 April 1970.
- h. FLSG Bravo and the FLC Engineer Platoon assisted PP&P by cutting 300 sets of cleates and skids. Those units also assisted PP&P by cutting 300 Sealand number 1 and number 3 Boxes.
- i. As of 3 April the new Sealand Family of boxes went into production.
- j. Medical Supply received a large quantity of excess medical materiel from the 26th Marines via the 1st Medical Battalion.
- k. TMO handled 3,040 short tons of incoming cargo during the month of April. Conversely, 3,300 short tons of outgoing cargo were processed.
- l. Receipts processed 7,063 measured tons of materiel to stock consisting of 6,311 documents. 226 USMC trucks, 260 USN trucks, 12 Sealands, vans, and 19 RO/RO Trailers.
- m. Over 16,000 issue documents were processed during this month through Document Control.

n. Company Property Control Unit has now been moved to the PP&P Platoon, since it is the largest customer.

o. A request of 20 additional Local National Civilians has been submitted.

p. Salvage Platoon received 260 items of rolling Stock, shipped 251 and disposed of 176.

q. Shop Stores Issue Points sustained a fill rate of 85% for R0 items and an average of 71% on all items.

r. Over 6,000 M-16 Rifles were sent to 5th RSR from MC100 stock, leaving 2,100 on hand.

s. The mess of the year was the shipment of 279 pallets of asphalt drums (many leaking) and 58 pallets of soil binder.

2. Casualties inflicted on the enemy through 7 Logistics/data to report.

8. Civic Action

a. Clothing Section furnished miscellaneous scrap lumber to our civilian workers. This is being used by them in rebuilding their homes.

9. Administration

a. The reinspection of the Files and Publications by the Commanding General's inspection team resulted in a grade of Satisfactory with Major Discrepancies. Considerable improvement had been made and all errors previously uncovered were in the process of being corrected.

b. Major personnel changes among the officers were:

Major BJORK left as Commanding Officer of the Company to Bn S-3.

LtCol GILLEN assumed command of the Company from Bn S-3.

Captain JOHNSTON was transferred from XO to OIC, PP&P Plt.

Major DUNN was transferred from Asst Bn S-3 to Supply Company XO.

Lt FORD was transferred from Storage Platoon to Supply Operations Section.

Lt DeMARS was transferred from OIC, PP&P Platoon to Storage Platoon.

c. Average on board strength for the month was 465 which was a decrease of 10 personnel from the previous month. The actual on board strength as of 30 April 1970 was 460 personnel which is 50 men below manning level of 510.

d. The disciplinary rate remained the same as March with 40 offenses during April.

10. Training.

- a. General Military Subjects attendance increased slightly over last month. During the month of April 532 man-hours were recorded for attendance.
- b. Technical Training remains approximately the same as last month due to the workload. This month the man-hours of attendance were 261.



The dump level at ASP #2 decreased to 12,448 s/tons of which 5,839 s/tons are USMC assets, 6,134 s/tons are U.S. Army assets, 475 s/tons are U.S. Navy assets, and 776 s/tons are Grade III.

EOD Platoon made 103 calls recovering 2,162 U.S. explosive items and 167 VC or ChiCom explosive items. The platoon destroyed 15 tons of unserviceable ammunition from ASP #1.



CIVIL AFFAIRS MEMORANDUM-4-1970

1. April produced some amazing facts, in that it proved that all men have interest in what they want and will work for, one of these is Religion. Civic Action is supporting the building of a Buddish temple in the Hamlet of Hoa My, one of the three hamlets supported by Maintenance Battalion Civic Action. This temple was started the last part of last month, today it is just about completed. Combined efforts of the Hamlet people and your Civic Action team has made this place of worship possible. Going to prove that all men can work together on anything they set their minds too.

2. The housing project going on in the hamlet of Phuoc Nghia is still in full swing and will be for some time in the future. It is assumed that now that we have a good start and have the people going, after we pull out of here, they will keep going at it and keep improving their standards of living and some day this will be a beautiful, peaceful country.

At present there have been around 13 houses completed with the help of Maintenance Battalion. These houses are being built from scrap lumber picked up around the Battalion area. It is then taken to the hamlet and all useable materials are put into building of houses and the other used for fire wood.

It is highly encouraged that personnel of Maintenance Battalion do not make any promise of anything such as scrap boxes or lumber to any of the personnel employed at this Battalion because it causes a hardship of feeling a between personnel. What can be done for one should be done for all and since we can not do the same for all, it is encouraged that this scrap be channeled into the Civic Action program where the best possible use for all concerned can be had. Maintenance Battalion is assigned three Hamlets and most of our workers do not live in these three Hamlets, therefore, we are not helping ourself by going to another assigned Hamlet. It is recommended that we support our own Civic Action program and make best possible use where it will do the most good.

3. MedCap was run as usual last month and seemed very successful. The Hamlet people appreciate the services that our Corpsmans get very little credit for doing. They go right to the people in their hamlet and even to their houses treating the sick that can not come to where MedCap is being held.

Working hand in hand with Civic Action the Corpsmans go where ever they are needed and lend their knowledge and assistance to persons that can neither afford or get this type of medical attention.

The total amount of people treated this month has numbered 413 at MedCap with in the two Hamlets of Phuoc Nghia and Phuoc Ha. The Vietnamese MedCap team is still operating in the Hamlet of Hoa My and is doing a very good job, with very little support from Maintenance Battalion.

4. Donations for the month of April is still far below the previous months. Our total this month was \$224.20 and will be divided between the two orphanage's. This money is first changed into piaster and then split right down the middle and then given to each orphanage. Each month we get a card of thank you from them and can be seen on the bulletin board at the IRO office.
