PART IINARRATIVE SUMMARY

Supply Company continued to provide support for the Marine units in the ICTZ, DaNang Area, south to Chu-Lai, An Hoa and LZ Baldy and north to several CAG units in the Phu Bai area, and ROK Marine units in the Hoi An area. Receipt and issue business remained relatively stable with Control Platoon processing 3040 receipt documents and making 2,026 issues to using units. Control Platoon forwarded over 41,000 MRO's to Storage Platoon. A good part of these were D7J transactions. Retrograde processed 238 pieces of rolling stock for five ships. TMO handled 3641.6 short tons of incoming cargo and 7313.9 short tons of out going cargo.

The Storage Platoon, through its care-in-storage program, identified 96 tons (69,000 cu ft) of material as Code "H" and disposed of it through MC114 Salvage Platoon. A monsoon block is being put together and it should be completed shortly. These items are being pulled from General Stock. 32,400 square feet of space was acquired in one open storage lot because of a location consolidation effort. A new open storage lot was opened. It will be used for the storage of bulk flammable materiels only. Medical Supply shipped 12,525 lbs with 1670 cu ft of medical supplies to Okinawa, Japan, Hawaii, and Barstow, Calif. The Clothing warehouse was completely rearranged in order to more easily accommodate the materiel brought in from open storage. Shop Stores processed more than 5700 transactions with an over-all fill rate of 66% for all items and 76% for R/O items. 175mm Gun tube support has continued "hand-to-mouth". A school was started by PP&P to give instruction in banding. The program is open to all personnel in Supply Battalion. Project P-2W (Phase II - Philadelphia Want List) was completed.

A fire fighting and prevention program was held for the 144 LNC's who work in the Storage Platoon. Each received a minimum of 3 hours training which entailed lectures, films, demonstrations, and practical application. Plans are now underway for the turn-in of all Class II, IV and IX operating stocks in excess of a sixty days level by 1st Marine Division units. A 24 hour notice will be given to Supply Battalion as to what unit is scheduled and how many documents are involved.

**Care-in-Store Projects:** FG 84, FG00-09/FG75, FG81, and FG83 have approximate completion dates of 19 July, 30 July, 10 August, and 14 August respectively.

The Storage Platoon experienced its first fire which was of unknown origin. The fire was discovered burning in section 02 of "F" lot at approximately 2355 12 June by a member of this Platoon's night crew. The fire was contained by the Camp Fire Department to just one row of the section. The fire consisted of highly flammable materials, eg. Calcium Hypochlorite, Insecticides, Bore Cleaner and paints.

A tour of the industrial area was given to seven ROK Marine Corps Officers.

A study on the possibility of retrieving personnel assigned outside Camp Books or away from Supply Company control was conducted. A report with recommendations was submitted to Battalion. The eight personnel from Salvage Platoon who are assigned to MAG-11 bomb dump should be returning to Camp Books shortly.

Initiated project of reviewing all company operational reports submitted. An attempt will be made to consolidate or eliminate all unnecessary and duplicated reporting.

PART IIISEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS1. Significant Operations Conducted

- a. TMO handled 3641.6 short tons of incoming cargo and 7313.9 short tons of outgoing cargo.
- b. The Storage Platoon through its continuous Care-in-Storage program identified 96 tons (69,000 cu ft) of material as code "H" and disposed of it through MC114, Salvage Platoon.
- c. The Storage Platoon began construction of a Monsoon block consisting of: foxhole covers, rain parkas, rain trousers, sleeping shirts, pistol covers and canvas repair kits. The items are a pull-all from the General Stock. This block should be completed in the very near future.
- d. Through location consolidation, the Storage Platoon achieved a net space gained in S-Lot of 32,400 sq ft.
- e. The Storage Platoon with the cooperation of the Camp Fire Department in the techniques of fighting and preventing fires gave 3 hours of instruction to all 144 local national civilians employed by the platoon. The instruction entailed lectures, film, demonstration, and practical application.
- f. The Storage Platoon established a new flammable materials storage lot in the area. It will be utilized for the storage of bulk flammable materials only.
- g. Medical Supply shipped 12,525 lbs (1620 cu ft) of medical supplies to Japan, Okinawa, Hawaii and Barstow, Calif.
- h. Shop Stores processed approximately 5700 transactions with an overall fill rate of 66% for all items and approximately 76% for R0 items.
- i. The Clothing warehouse was completely rearranged in order to accommodate materiel brought in from outside storage.
- j. Retrograde Platoon processed 238 pieces of Rolling Stock on five ships.
- k. PP&P received, packed and shipped materiel from III MAF Special Services consisting of 10 small sail boats, 6 large sail boats, 2 out boards, 10 items of sound equipment, and a dune buggy.
- l. Packing of Project P2W materiel was completed.
- m. PP&P started a school for the purpose of instructing the art of banding. The class is open to all personnel from Supply Battalion.

n. The Receipts Section processed 3,040 documents containing 5,380 measured tons of materiel arriving on 83 USMC, 185 USN, 6 Sealand, and 20 R0/R0 trucks.

o. 2,026 customer pick-ups were made at the Issue Pad.

p. Document Control forwarded over 41,000 MRO's to Storage Platoon.

q. Three 175MM, M113E1, Gun Tubes were received and two were issued. Two on hand at the end of June. There were no 175MM, M113, Gun Tube transactions during the month of June leaving a zero on-hand balance. One 175MM, Cannon Assembly was received and three were issued. Zero on-hand at the end of June. One 8" Cannon Assembly was received and one was issued. Two were on-hand at the end of June.

#### 9. Administration

a. Maximum effort is being made to eliminate past discrepancies in all areas of the Company Administration. The Company Office has been both expanded in area and clerks. A Company Admin Action Schedule has been put into effect and the results are favorable. Due to the enormous backlog of Admin work a night and day shift has been effected with progress being made. The Commanding General's reinspection of Files and Publications was passed with a "Satisfactory with minor discrepancies" and the Company Training passed with a "Satisfactory but to an unknown degree at this time."

b. Major personnel changes were:

From Operations Platoon Capt REDICAN was transferred to Bn S-3, Lt FORD rotated home, Lt DUMAS was Operations Officer for the rest of the month with Capt W. H. HARRIS arriving to take over on 1 July 1970.

From TMO Platoon the following rotated: Lt L. P. DODGE, Lt A. H. NIKOLSKY and CWO2 J. L. RANALLA

MGySgt A. B. TORREY was the main loss from Storage Platoon.

On the brighter side the gains for Storage were: CWO2 C. B. KEELING from 3d FSR, Okinawa and 2dLt C. F. EATON, 2dLt A. J. EHRHARDT and MSgt R. A. GALLANT who arrived from the States.

c. Average on board strength for the month was 511 which was an increase of 46 from the previous month.

d. The primary problem still remaining in the personnel living area is the continuing lack of dump trucks to haul sand into the excavations made

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between the huts to fill sand bags for rocket blast walls. The recent influx of new personnel has raised the personnel loading per hut to a very crowded condition with 12 sleeping in some. However with the 60 RTD departures scheduled for July and 86 in August the situation should be somewhat alleviated if the incoming personnel do not continue to come in at the present rate of 5 to 10 per day. The hut lighting project is complete with all walkways well lighted and patrolled.

e. The disciplinary rate dropped slightly from 44 in May to 38 in June with 19 others awaiting some type investigative or administrative action.

f. There were 4 administrative discharges as compared with 7 for May.

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10. Training

a. General Military Subjects dropped a few hours due to the increase of Technical Training. During the month of June there were 530 man-hours recorded.

b. Technical Training has increased over the amount of man-hours recorded from last month. During the month of June there were 772 man-hours recorded.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Central Control Point processed fifteen daily updates during the month of June with a total of 39,115 requisitions, 18,269 receipts and 43,372 mats produced. The total number of transactions processed for the month was 347,677. The fill rate this month was 54% with the rate for R/O items being 57%. The Automated Services Center processed 49,988 personnel changes for entry into the Personnel Accounting System.

Bulk Fuel Company continued to support U. S. and Korean Marine Corps units in I Corps with POL products. During this period the company issued 524, 802 gallons of diesel fuel, 275,906 gallons of mogas, and 839 drums of POL products. In addition to its normal mission the company provided pumps for water supply points and wash down facilities. Included in the wash down was 1700 short tons of retrograde ammunition. During the first week in June four fuel systems, M-64 were boxed and embarked for shipment to CONUS.

During the month of June Ammunition Company handled 38,319 short tons of Class V(W) ammunition and 8,290 short tons of Class V(A) ammunition. The daily average for receipts and issues was 1,136 short tons. EOD Platoon made 171 calls recovering 780 US Explosive items and 159 VC or ChiCom explosive items. The platoon destroyed 10 tons of ammunition that was unserviceable from ASP #1.

Civil Affairs Section reported the average on board strength of Local National Civilians at 542 for the month of June. During the reporting period, approximately 24,000\$VN was expended from military resources for Civic Action Projects. During the reporting period, the following major Civic Action projects were completed, a Market Fence was put up at Hoa Khanh and a Brick Factory at Chieu Hoi #3. Psyops leaflets were distributed at all MedCaps held by Supply Battalion. Approximately 3,900 leaflets were distributed in this manner. During this reporting period, approximately 55 MedCaps were held. A total of 3,887 patients were treated.

Supply Company continued to provide support for the Marine units in the IOTZ, DaNang Area, south to Chu-Lai, An Hoa and LZ Baldy and north to several CAG units in the Phu Bai area, and ROK Marine units in the Hoi An area. 

CIVIC ACTION MEMORANDUM JUNE 1970

1. In the Hamlet of Phuoc Ha this month, a total of 96 Refugee's came down from the District of Thuong Duc to seek refuge in Phuoc Ha. The area of Thuong Duc was, at that time under heavy Viet Cong rocket and mortar attack. The people of Phuoc Ha were also originally from the Thuong Duc District, but fled to Hoa Khanh to escape the V.C. terrorist 2 years ago, so these 96 people, mostly women and children, sought help from their friends and relatives in Phuoc Ha. However, Phuoc Ha, being a refugee camp, is now on rice rations. The Hamlet Chief, Nguyen Nhung, asked for our assistance in obtaining food for the new refugees. Our Civic Action Team went to work obtaining food for the new refugees. With the great help from the International Rescue Committie, in Danang, and the excess food from messhalls, we were able to keep the people well feed.

On the 23rd of June, five days prior to the Provincial election, it was then safe for them to return home. All except three people returned to their homes.

2. The hamlet of Phuoc Nghia has now completed the construction of 17 new homes, and the bell tower for the church. Still in the construction stage are the bunkers for the Popular Forces to use for guard watch. Each bunker, 4 of them, are stratigically located throughout the hamlet. As soon as enough materials are obtained, a security fence will be constructed around the entire hamlet. This project has been discussed with the Hamlet Chief, security Chief, and our Civic Action Team. This project was requested by the Hamlet Chief, to insure the safety of this hamlet, after the U.S. troops in this area pull out.

Our Battalion MedCap Team treated a total of 602 people both in our Hamlets and our LNC's aboard Maintenance Battalion. A total of four people were taken to hospitals this month. One nine year old girl was taken to Childrens Hospital for the treatment of plague, one 11 year old girl taken to Childrens Hospital for the treatment of dysentery, one nine year old boy to Childrens Hospital for treatment of a broken arm, and a 72 year old man taken to the German Hospital Ship for an examination of his tracheotomy and throat cancer.

3. The Industrial Relations Department in Danang has come out with a reduction in force for all LNC's working aboard U.S. Military installations. Maintenance Battalion was reduced from 67 to 63 LNC's (one mechanic helper and 2 janitors). One messhall employee was fired, and his job position will be abolished.

4. Contributions from the Companies for support of the Orphanages totaled \$63.60.
