NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December 1970, Headquarters and Service Battalion provided administrative, motor transport, communications, and general support to Force Logistic Command and numerous other Marine and Allied Units. The Battalion Commander and his staff continued to function in a dual capacity as Camp Books Commander and staff and as such were responsible for the many common usage facilities and functions of Camp Books, i. e. sanitation, police, maintenance, fire protection, utilities, etc.

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## Sequential Listing of Significant Events

1. Administration. The battalion's performance in Manpower Management System for the month of December 1970 indicated an increase in the total number of items reported into the system over the previous month. The previous method of reporting performance in the MMS has changed within the Force Logistics Command. Current procedures for reporting the RUC performance is to utilize the information compiled from the Statistical Transaction Analysis Registers (STARS). For the month of November 1970, this organization totaled a 10% error rate in STARS. There has been a considerable improvement for the month of December, with the error rate being established as 6%. This error rate is below the GMD established goal of 10% and below the December error rate for Force Logistics Command of 7%. 2. Civil Affairs. The Battalion Civil Affairs Section supported agriculture, refugee relief, medical and self-help programs in ten hamlets during the month of December 1970. In the realm of self-help programs, the section, in a joint operation with the International Relief Commission, has continued to develop the program which will relocate seventy refugee families from the hamlet of Da Phuoc to a less densely populated area within the perimeter of that hamlet. The total cost of materials expended to support the hamlets in the battalion's area of responsibility was 63,400\$VN.

The Civil Affairs Section has conducted cultural tours for members of this organization during the month of December. Weekly tours are conducted which permit thirty personnel each week to become more aware of the customs and way of life of the local populace. This program has been received well and it is anticipated that the number of tours will be increased as the need arises.

The table on page III-2 outlines in detail the medical assistance rendered the local populace during the month.

3. **MEDICAL.** The Headquarters and Service Battalion Aid Station for the month of December 1970, rendered routine medical and emergency services to Marine from Headquarters and Service Battalion, Supply Battalion, and to Vietnamese LNC's employed by the camp. This totals well over 3,000 personnel supported. The total visits for the month were 3,264 Marines, 28 Navy personnel and 789 Vietnamese Nationals. Further broken down, these figures reveal 713 Marines from Headquarter and Service Battalion at sick call, 882 from Supply Battalion and 227 Vietnamese LNC's for a total of 1822 sick call visits. This was an increase of 339 sick call visits over November 1970. In addition to sick call, 160 complete physical examinations were conducted, 1164 screening physicals for personnel assigned to mess duty, going on R&R and returning to CONUS. Laboratory examinations were conducted on 857 personnel, X-Rays were taken and developed on 489, and 1775 prescriptions were filled. In addition, a total of 3518 immunizations were administered to personnel of this Command. Instruction in first aid, sanitation and drug abuse was given to 258 Marines from Headquarters and Service Company and Support Company by medical personnel. Technical training was provided to corpsmen, a total of 128 personnel were in attendance. In conjunction with FLC Orders and MCO 6100.3, the weight control program continues for both Headquarters and Service Battalion and Supply Battalion and reports are forwarded routinely. A total of 59 Marines and Navy personnel are presently assigned to weight control, 43 from Headquarters and Service Battalion and 16 from Supply Battalion.

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4. LOGISTICS. The Force Logistic Command Fire Department, operating the Camp Books Fire Department Complex, the 1st Marine Division Fire Department Complex, the Freedom Hill Fire Department Complex, and substations at both ASP #1 and ASP #2 is under the direction of Captain G. W. SMITH, the Fire Marshal, and Staff Sergeant J. W. TIRHEIMER, the Fire Chief. During the month of December a total of 12 fire calls were responded to. These consisted of three vehicle fires; three control burns; head, ~~hubs~~, electrical, and grass fires (one of each); and two false alarms. Nine practice fire drills were conducted for the month. The Battalion Organic Supply section, an integral unit of Headquarters and Service Company, processed 1,925 requisitions amounting to a total monetary obligation of \$94,278.55. In addition 213 line items were processed for excess turn-in; a total value of \$21,257.23. The Battalion Camp Police section was responsible for correction of Camp discrepancies in the Weekly BAS Sanitation Inspections. Much work was undertaken in the policing of Camp Books in preparation for the Commanding General's Inspection. Work was performed in the upkeep of the Camp trash points. In regard to the base sanitation/trash removal, there were 259 barrels of wet garbage and 3,914 meters of dry trash taken off Camp Books during the month of December. Support Company's Engineer Platoon made seven separate issues of materials for various self-help projects. Forty-three electrical repairs and minor installations were performed. Two grading jobs were completed. Two hot water heater repairs were made. Twenty-one carpentry repair jobs were done. Nine plumbing repairs and adjustments were completed. Twenty five ~~carpentry~~ construction jobs were completed. Twenty six boxes were constructed to suit various needs. There were no jobs requiring hauling of sand or gravel carried out during the month because of equipment deadline. Also, no boardwalk was fabricated during the month because of unavailability of lumber.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Truck Company continued to provide administrative and tactical motor transport support to all elements of Force Logistic Command and specified III Marine Amphibious Force units. The Company continued operational control of the Motor Transport Coordination Center and conducted "Rough Rider" tactical convoys in support of 1st Marine Division units.

Truck Company provided vehicles for many extra missions and events during the month of December. Ten (10) M54's, one (1) M543 wrecker and

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one (1) M54, 5 ton gun truck with 50 Caliber machine gun made double runs each day on 4, 5 and 6 December hauling outdated ammunition from ASP#1 to a blow hole in Elephant Valley. Four (4) M54 5 ton trucks, two (2) M151A1 jeeps and one (1) commercial carryall provided transportation for officers and enlisted to the rehearsals and ceremony of the III Marine Amphibious Force Commanding General change of command on 22, 23 and 24 December. On 24 December two (2) M35A2C's provided transportation for sixty (60) children from the Catholic Orphanage to a Christmas party at Camp Books, while three (3) FLTP's and one (1) M54 provided transportation for 230 marines to the Bob Hope Show at Freedom Hill. On 25 December one (1) M35A2C provided transportation for thirty (30) marines to feed children at the children's hospital.

Local commitments included transporting all classes of supplies for battalions and attached units within the Force Logistic Command and 1st Marine Division Headquarters area. Extensive daily support was rendered to the Marine Air Freight, Purchasing and Contracting office, Force Logistic Command and the XXIV Corps R and R Center and the III MAF Transit Facility.

Daily fuel runs were continued to Landing Zone Baldy, Fire Support Base Ross and Hill 37. Heavy equipment was transported to Landing Zone Baldy and Fire Support Base Ross by M-172 low beds. Truck Company dispatched eight (8) tactical "Rough Rider" convoys to Landing Zone Baldy during the month of December.

On 24 December a platoon of thirty (30) marines from Truck Company represented Headquarters and Service Battalion at the Commanding General's change of command ceremony of III Marine Amphibious Force. On 30 December two (2) officers and thirty (30) enlisted marines from Truck Company were present as the Commanding Officer of Headquarters and Service Battalion accepted the Commanding General's Sports trophy.

During the month, two (2) marines from Truck Company received undesirable discharges for the good of the Marine Corps. Also in December two (2) marines from Truck Company lost enough weight to be taken off the weight control program.

Truck Company's Maintenance Platoon continued to provide second echelon support for 461 pieces of organic rolling stock. They also provided second echelon support for specified III MAF units. The Maintenance Platoon is continuing its program of supplying three (3) mechanics for the first echelon inspection station. Truck Company has sent 38 vehicles to Motor Transport Maintenance Company, Maintenance Battalion, for third echelon repair, with 32 of these for repairs, two (2) for accident investigation LTI's, one (1) for condition code LII and three (3) for LTI's for vehicles to be excessed. Maintenance Platoon has received 32 antifragmentation kits for 5-Ton and 2½ Ton vehicles and has completed installation on 29 of these vehicles.

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

**PART II****NARRATIVE SUMMARY**

During the month of December 1970, Support Company performed many diversified services for the Force Logistic Command, FVMAF, and other Marine Units. The Laundry Section of Service Platoon, in support of Marine units throughout the Danang area, processed 79,140 pounds of laundry, an average of 2,553 pounds per day. The 1st Medical Battalion and The Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital were the principle users of the Laundry service provided by the Service Platoon...

The Company's Material Handling Equipment Platoon licensed 34 equipment operators during the month. Of this total, 30 operators received licenses for the RKF 6000 pound forklift, and 4 for the GYP 4000 pound forklift. The Platoon's equipment repair shop completed 122 work orders during the month of December. To date, 48,520 tons of supplies have been moved utilizing Material Handling Equipment.

During the month of December, Communication Platoon provided communication support to all Marine Corps, Army, and Navy units in the Danang North-Red Beach area. The Communication Center processed a total of 25,329 messages during December. This represents a decrease of 869 messages from the previous month. Within the Wire Section, the Dial Central Exchange (AN/TTC-28) processed 734,874 calls and in addition, a total of 20,647 operator assisted calls were handled. The Wire Section further completed 9 new installations, 41 telephone work orders and cleared 158 trouble calls. The Maintenance Section completed 190 work orders and 198 trouble calls. The Radio Section provided and maintained required radio communications.



## PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of December Bulk Fuel Platoon manned and operated seven (7) fuel sites (LZ Baldy, LZ Ross, Hoi An, Hill 37, Hill 34, 1st Motors, Red Beach) dispensing 170,883 gallons of bulk motor gasoline and 250,470 gallons of bulk diesel fuel to Marine, Army and ROK Forces. Also during December 1970, 594 drums of fuel and 3515 gallons of assorted POL package products were issued.

During the month of December Ammunition Platoon handled 13264 s/tons of Class V(W) ammunition and 4588 s/tons of Class V(A) ammunition. The daily average for receipts and issues was ~~475.6~~ 460.4 s/tons.

Issues of "A" Rations during the month of December 1970 totaled 2,100,000 lbs of meat, fish, butter, and produce. Issues of "B" and "C" Rations totaled 8,600,000 lbs of RCI's and canned goods. Total issues for the month of December 1970 totaled \$2,100,000.

LSU #3 is located at LZ Baldy. The LSU provides Class I and V supply support, 3rd echelon maintenance in Engineer, Motor Transport, Ordnance and Electrode commodity areas. Forklift, laundry, RUC line, and ice machine services are also provided the supported units.

LSU #5 is located at Hill 37. The LSU provides Class I and V supply support as well as forklift and laundry service to the 1st Marine Regiment.

During the month of December, the following Civic Action projects were completed: Three (3) home constructions at Phuoc Thanh. During this period approximately 56 MedCaps were held, with a total of 2610 patients being treated. Psyops leaflets were distributed at all MedCaps held in Supply Battalion. Approximately 2610 leaflets were distributed in this manner.

During the month the inventory of all R/O items was completed and Supply Company returned to normal business by 12 December 1970. Both the location verification held by the Storage Platoon and the inventory conducted by the Inventory Section appear to have achieved the desired results as many dead items are beginning to move. Most of this months activity was centered around programs to retrograde cargo out of country. With the receipt of command policy concerning retrograde cargo last month the TMO has seen a vast increase in the cargo shipped out of country.

The supply support provided to operating Marine and ROK units during the month was confined almost entirely to local units. The flow of materiel between the supply point and supported units has been reversed as all units are preparing for redeployment and are turning in all excess items. To avert a major problem in this area through mis-identification of roll back, unserviceable materiel being returned to stock, etc., is scrutinized by receipts personnel to ensure that only serviceable and properly identified roll back materiel is placed into stock. To point out the command attention paid to this area it was noted that the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the Receipts Pad almost daily during the month.

e. Supply Company

(1) The highlight of the month was the opening of self service type store which will be open to using units and will stock items normally obtained from the Army Self-service Store, DaNang. Since the Army took control of supporting functions from the Naval Support Activity in July 1970 the total line items stocked by the Self-Service store has dropped from 2,900 to 900. The store opened by Force Logistic Command under the cognizance of Supply Company will simply be another warehouse location where units can pick up needed items on a walk thru basis and hopefully will fill the void left by the depleted stock in the Army Self-Service store.

(2) There was an internal realignment of function in Supply Company when IF&P Platoon assumed the responsibility for packing materiel at the Issue Pad which had formally been the responsibility of the Storage Platoon. This change brings into line all packing and crating requirements as it puts them all under one platoon. This will in effect allow easier control and provide a more uniform flow of materiel.

(3) The Retrograde Facility is preparing for an anticipated huge workload involving sundry items that are going to be retrograded and re-distributed in connection with the redeployment of Marine units. As a result of this anticipated workload a newly arrived officer was assigned to the Retrograde Facility to ensure there will be continuity during this period.

After civic action people secured enough lumber, it took Khanh and the 75-year-old man who lives with him only a week to build a new house, much sturdier than the one destroyed by fire.



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## Join Our Efforts

FLC -- Hundreds of bars of soap and numerous non-prescription medicines are being distributed by a hospital corpsman to inhabitants throughout the 10 hamlets of Hoa Khanh village, eight miles northwest of Da Nang.

The goods are a gift from the people of Sweetwater, Tex., hometown of Hospital Corpsman Third Class Joe D. Jeffrey.

Jeffrey is assigned to the civil affairs office of Supply Battalion, which is the Marine Corps' huge supply outfit supporting Marines and allied forces in RVN's Military Region I.

Recently, Jeffrey sent a letter to his mother requesting that she ask people to save used bars of soap they would normally

discard and send them to him. He also asked his mother to let people know non-prescription medicines such as cough drops, cough syrup and antiseptic ointments were needed.

The response was astounding. Soap and medicines began to pour into Mrs. Jeffrey's home. From there they were packaged and sent to Jeffrey to distribute to the people of Hoa Khanh village as he conducts MEDCAPs (Medical Civic Action Patrol).

Jeffrey's first shipment included 450 new bars of soap and four boxes of non-prescription medicines. "And more are on the way," he said.

The project, fittingly for Joe Jeffrey, has been named J. O. E. -- (Join Our Efforts).



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PART II  
NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The highlight of the month was the opening of self service type store which will be open to using units and will stock items normally obtained from the Army Self-Service Store, DaNang. Since the Army took control of supporting functions from the Naval Support Activity in July 1970 the total line items stocked by the Self-Service store has dropped from 2,900 to 900. The store opened by Force Logistic Command under the cogizance of Supply Company will simply be another warehouse location where unit can pick up needed items on a walk thru basis and hopefully will fill the void left by the depleted stock in the Army Self Service Store.

During the month the inventory of all R/O items was completed and Supply Company returned to normal business by 12 December 1970. Both the location verification held by the Storage Platoon and the inventory conducted by the Inventory Section appears to have achieved the desired results as many dead items are begining to move. Most of this months activity was centered around programs to retrograde cargo out of country. With the receipt of command policy concerning retrograde cargo last month the TMO has seen a vast increase in the cargo shipped out of country.

The supply support provided to operating Marine and ROK units during the month was confined almost entirely to local units. The flow of materiel between the supply point and supported units has been reversed as all units are preparing for redeployment and are turning in all excess items. To advert a major problem in this area through mis-identification of roll back, unserviceable materiel being returned to stock, etc., is scrutinized by receipts personnel to ensure that only serviceable and properly identified roll back materiel is placed into stock. To point out the command attention paid to this area it was noted that the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the Receipts Pad almost daily during the month.

There was an internal realignment of function in Supply Company when PP&P Platoon assumed the responsibility for packing materiel at the Issue Pad which had formally been the responsibility of the Storage Platoon. This change brings into line all packing and crating requirements as it puts them all under one platoon. This will in effect allow easier control and provide a more uniform flow of materiel.

The Retrograde Facility is preparing for an anticipated huge workload involving sundry items that are going to be retrograded and redistributed in connection with the redeployment of Marine units. As a result of this anticipated workload a newly arrived officer was assigned to the Retrograde Facility to ensure there will be continuity during this period.

As the month closed Supply Company slowed pace and joined in the festivities associated with Christmas and New Years. During the Christmas period gifts were given to the Local National Civilians and a holiday routine was enjoyed by all hands on 25 December 1970. A few fortunate in-

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dividuals were the recipients of tickets for the annual Bob Hope show which was viewed on 24 Dec.

The outlook for our SNCO supervisory capabilities is bleak as we enter into a new year. Already understrength in this area there is no relief in sight as we prepare to lose several SNCO during the month of January 1971.

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## PART III

Sequential Listing of Significant Events

1. On 1 Dec the TMO received 12,000 green "T" shirts an item that is in very short supply in RVN.
2. On 2 Dec the last of the location verification cards were loaded on the computer which ended the Storage Platoon location verification in preparation for the R/O item inventory.
3. The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the Battery Reefers, the Bravo warehouses, and the Retrograde Facility on 3 Dec.
4. All receipts have been frozen on the Receipts Pad except for HOT ITEMS which will be individually handled as a result of the R/O item inventory.
5. On 4 December the Clothing Warehouse was broken into and \$48.30 taken from a field safe.
6. The inventory of R/O items began at 0800 on 4 Dec and is expected to last at least 7 days.
7. The Medical Supply wall to wall inventory commenced on 5 Dec and is expected to be completed by 12 Dec.
8. Brigadier General JOSLYN Chief of Staff III MAF, toured the Supply Company Area in the afternoon of 6 Dec and the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the Issue Pad during the evening.
9. Plans were formulated to open a self service center in Supply Company which would stock items in short supply which are not carried by the U.S. Army Self Service and items which can be substituted for preferred items that are in short supply.
10. The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the Receipts Pad, TMO Pad and B-6 Warehouse on 7 Dec.
11. Brigadier General SWEENEY, USA toured the Supply Company area on 8 Dec.
12. Camp Books conducted a defense drill on 10 Dec with all personnel within Supply Company either in bunkers, part of the Reaction Platoon or deployed to medical aid stations. The defense drill lasted for approximately one half hour.
13. On 12 Dec the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited several activities in Supply Company.
14. Due to the problems encountered by units utilizing the BA4386 Batteries and the requirement to test these batteries prior to use a quantity of Battery Test Sets AN/PSM 13 were air lifted to RVN. On 13 Dec all test sets were in the hand of using units.

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15. On 14 Dec the company had the first results of the special care in storage project. Motor Transport personnel LTI'ed 44 line items and 10 of these were condition coded "H".
16. The TMO received 277,200 Heat Tabs, which are in short supply, and turned them over to Rations Platoon on 14 Dec and on 15 Dec received a shipment of BA4386 Batteries, also in short supply.
17. On 22 December the Retrograde Facility completed a call forward involving 57 pieces of rolling stock for the commerial ship AMERICAN RACER.
18. The Medical Supply personnel sponsored a Christmas party for 40 orphan children located in an orphanage in Elephant Valley.
19. The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited the newly stocked MC100 Retail Store on 24 Dec. The store is scheduled to open 26 Dec 1970.
20. Holiday routine was observed by all hands on 25 Dec.
21. The MC100 Retail Store opened on 26 Dec as scheduled and appeared to be an immediate success as several truck loads of materiel was hauled away before noon. A total of 201 line items were available with stocks for 3 line items being exhausted within an hour of opening.
22. The Commanding General, III MAF toured the Supply Company industrial area on 27 Dec 1970 accompanied by the Commanding General, Force Logistic Command.
23. A one day school was held by the PMU personnel on 30 Dec in connection with inspection procedures. Seven personnel from Supply Company attended.
24. On 31 Dec a holiday routine was observed by Supply Company personnel begining at 1630.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. The primary mission of Maintenance Battalion remained unchanged during the month of December 1970.
2. The Civic Action Program continued to be active. Battalion personnel donated for the support of the Sacred Heart and China Beach Orphanages, additionally hosting a Christmas party for 150 Orphans.
3. The Battalion conducted sixteen MEDCAPS at the various village aid stations.
4. Cultural tours of the Danang area were conducted weekly for Marines of the Battalion. These tours provide the Marines with a better understanding of the civilian community and have proven to be an asset toward the establishment of a good community relations program.
5. 



1. This month there were 179 items screunged (the majority of these items were assemblies/subassemblies) enabling this unit to keep the deadline rate to a minimum. There were 359 demands with 91 fills for a 25% fill rate. For the period 1 December - 31 December 1970 there were 604 TERO'S opened, and 628 TERO'S completed. Open TERO'S at the beginning of the period totaled 137 and at the end of the period 113.
