Projects completed include a hamlet headquarters and two wells in the hamlet of Nam-O; both of which commenced the latter part of 1970. Material costs to support the Civic Action program amounted to 20,820 \$VN during the reporting period.

In cooperation with the International Relief Commission, seventy refugee families are being relocated within the hamlet of Da Phuoc. This program is approximately 75% completed. Nail rings and cement were provided for the construction of five walls to support this project.

The Civil Affairs Section coordinated with the 19th Psyops Bn. for the showing of movies in four different hamlets. Approximately 650 persons attended the showing of these movies.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

Truck Company continued to provide administrative and tactical motor transport support to all elements of Force Logistic Command and specified III Marine Amphibious Force Units. The company continued operational control of the Motor Transport Coordination Center and provided assistance to the 11th Motor Transport Battalion which is conducting "Rough Rider" tactical convoys in support of 1st Marine Division Units. Support was primarily given to the movement of rations, supplies, garrison property, fuel, water, ammunition and retrograde items.

Daily fuel runs continued to Landing Zone Baldy, Fire Support Base Ross and Hill 37.

On 4 January 1971, Truck Company ran a tactical "Rough Rider" convoy while the 11th Motor Transport Battalion was undergoing a Commanding General's Inspection.

Truck Company's Maintenance Platoon continued to provide second echelon repair of 461 pieces of rolling stock. The shop system has been reorganized to separate the preventive maintenance from the general repair and breakdown shops. With the addition of several Staff Noncommissioned Officers and the change in the shop organization the average daily deadline has been reduced by 50% from that of sixty days ago. Forty-three vehicles were sent to Motor Transport Maintenance Company, Maintenance Battalion, for 3rd echelon work. Of these, twenty-three were for repair, four were for accident investigation LTI's, three for condition code LTI's and thirteen for excess equipment LTI's. Two-hundred and fourteen TERO's were opened in January and 197 of them were completed. The installation of thirty-two antifragmentation kits was completed during the first week of the month. During the month of January twelve pieces of rolling stock were prepared for retrograde, no equipment lost to combat. One M35, One M54, Two M127 lost to accidents.

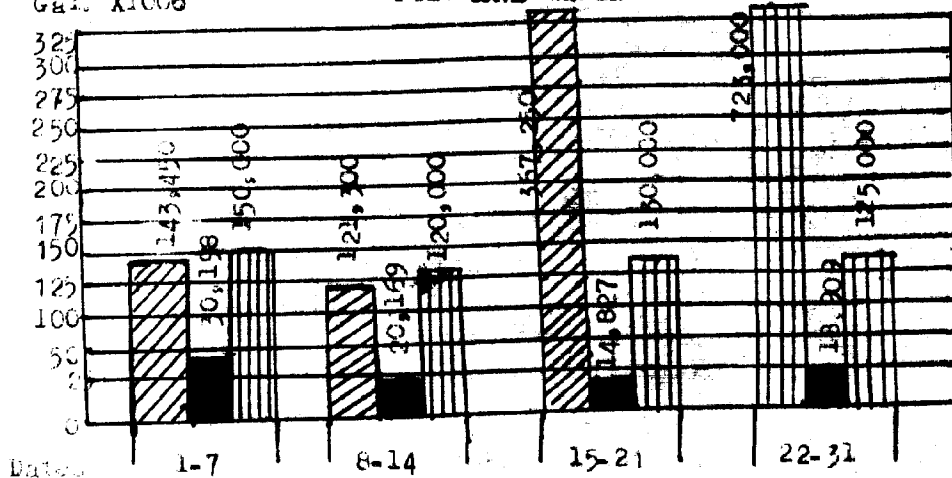
****Passengers****



Total Passengers = 39,443

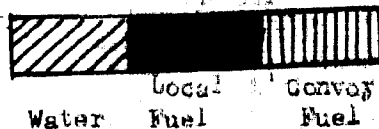
Gal. X1000

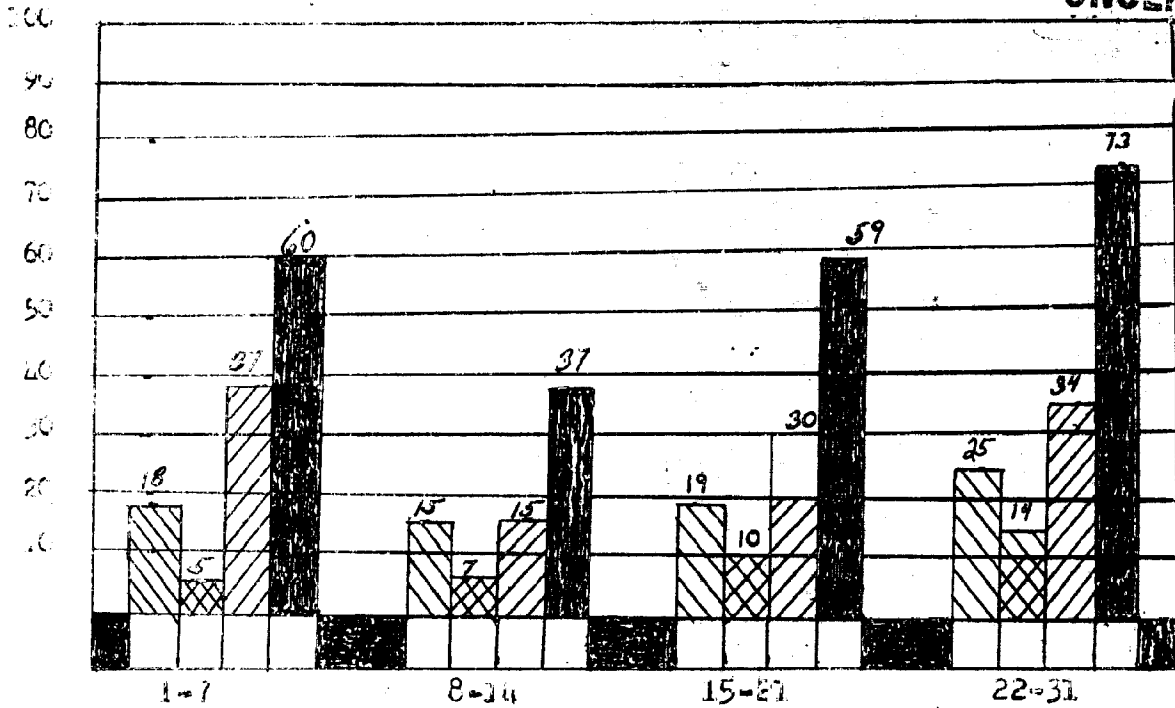

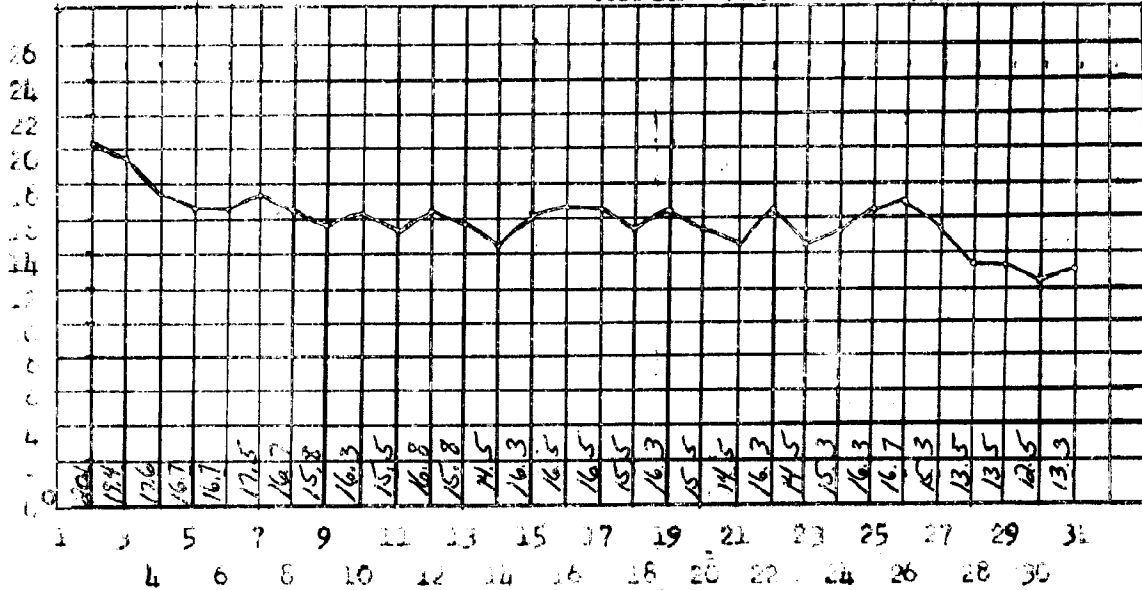

During the reporting period, the Laundry Section, Service Platoon processed a total of 88,820 pounds of laundry for an average of 2,865 pounds per day. This represents an increase of 9,680 pounds over the month of December. Principle users of the laundry include the 1st Marine Division, Force Logistic Command, 1st Medical Battalion, the Hoa Khanh Children's Hospital and the III MAF Transit Facility. Field laundry service was also provided to the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines. A total of 46,070 tons of supplies were moved during the month of January utilizing equipment from the Company's Material Handling Equipment Platoon. This represents a decrease of 2,450 pounds from the previous month. The Communications Platoon processed a total of 22,945 messages during the month. This represents a decrease of 2,384 from the previous month. The Wire Section processed a total of 675,778 calls through the Dial Central exchange during this reporting period. In addition, a total of 33,062 operator assisted calls were handled. The section further completed 8 new installations, 13 telephone work orders and cleared 192 trouble calls. The Maintenance Section completed 145 work orders and 138 trouble calls.



NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of January, Bulk Fuel Platoon manned and operated seven (7) fuel sites (LZ Ross, LZ Baldy, Hoi An, Hill 37, Hill 34, 1st Motors, and Camp Books), dispensing 149,619 gallons of bulk motor gasoline and 215,058 gallons of bulk diesel fuel to Marine, Army, and ROK Forces. Also during January 1971, 278 drums of fuel and 2,676 gallons of assorted POL packaged products were issued.

During the month of January 1971 Ammunition Platoon handled 18,544 s/tons of Class V(W) ammunition and 4,564 s/tons of Class V(W) ammunition. The daily average for receipts and issues was 456 s/tons.

Issues of "A" Rations during the month of January 1971 totaled 2,100,000 lbs of meat, fish, butter, and fresh produce. Issues of "B" Rations and special control items (MCI's, SP's, LRPR's during the month of January totaled 8,600,000 lbs. \$1,900,000 worth of rations were received and issued during the month.

LSU #3 is located at LZ Baldy. The LSU provides Class I, III and V supply support, 3rd echelon maintenance in Engineer, Motor Transport, Ordnance and Electronic commodity areas. Forklift, laundry, RUC line and ice machine services are also provided the supported units.

LSU #5 is located at Hill 37. The LSU provides Class I and V supply support as well as forklift and laundry service to the 1st Marine Regiment.

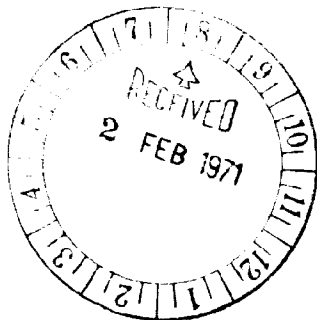

1. The Commanding General, Force Logistic Command visited "T" Lot and Receipts Section on 1 January.

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The first month of the new year brought with it an increase in the daily work load for all sections within the Company. The Clothing Platoon shipped out excess Clothing totaling \$213,049.28 during the month. This leaves Clothing with present inventory of \$74,712.12. The Traffic Management Office and the Retrograde Facility's major tasks during the month were the Call-Forwards for the USS Alamo and USS St. Louis. 




