1. Enclosure (1) is forwarded in compliance with reference (a) for planning purposes.

2. It is noted that the following units previously requested by this command are not included.

a. Det, FSR, FMF (to provide 3d echelon tank and LVT maintenance for the BLTs and a bulk fuel detachment for BLT 1/1).

b. Det, 7th MT Bn (to provide RLT-1 Headquarters a mobile capability without adversely affecting the BLTs by withholding 1st MT Bn units).

c. Photo Interpreter teams for the BLTs.

d. Interpreter teams for the BLTs.

3. Enclosure (1) provided only two (2) BLTs with shore party teams to operate on new beaches. In addition, the 3d BLT does not have a medical clearing platoon capability. It should also be noted the BLT 3/1 does not include a detachment of the 1st Service Battalion. This deficiency is due to the limited size and indicated capability of the detachment currently planned for assignment to RLT-1.

4. Enclosure (1) is subject to change on receipt of additional guidance, availability of numbers and types of shipping assigned, and attached unit support capabilities.

1. SITUATION.

a. Enemy Forces. INTSUMS, PIRS,b. Friendly Forces.

(1) Commander, Amphibious Squadron One provides required amphibious shipping.

2. MISSION. RLT-1 deploys to WESTPAC with 3 BLTs; BLTs are prepared for amphibious operations.

3. EXECUTION.

a. Concept of Operations. RLT-1 (less BLT 3/1) will embark commencing about 6 August with two combat loaded BLTs prepared to conduct amphibious operations. Infantry elements of BLT 1/1 are prepared to relieve another infantry battalion which could be reembarked. BLT 2/1 is prepared to unload and reembark as a Special Landing Force. BLT 3/1 will embark, combat loaded, commencing about 40 23 AUG September prepared to conduct amphibious operations.

- ✓ (4) Loading Plans: Classify "Confidential modified handling authority down grade to unclas 1 Nov 65." Initial distribution ten copies this Headquarters for distribution Marine channels eleven copies to CO ship for Naval distribution. One corrected copy for this Headquarters to arrive Embarkation Control Office prior to sailing.
- (5) Reports:
- (a) Loading report to RLT Embarkation Control Office and Division Embarkation Office upon commencement of loading. Upon completion of loading and when loading delayed which may prevent completion of schedule.

b. Service

- (1) Units are required to embark with all equipment in operational condition. Unit commanders will take action in the following priority to remove equipment from deadline.
 - (a) Utilize all organizational assets of operational stocks as source of repair parts required.
 - (b) Replace unserviceable with serviceable equipment if assets are available within command for redistribution.
 - (c) Check organizational mount-out assets for repair parts which could be used to remove a vehicle from deadline. Report to this Headquarters end items of equipment that could be removed from deadline by using mount-out stocks.
- (2) All equipment to be deployed will only be used when absolutely required to complete preparations for deployment.

c. Embarkation

 - c. Spot Reports
 - (1) Submit as significant events occur. Such events include, but are not limited to the following:

- (a) Friendly casualties, regardless of cause.
- (b) VC initiated acts against friendly forces or installation.
- (c) Capture of VCC or VCS
- (d) Discovery of Arms or Supply caches
- (e) Any incident which could be detrimental to the USMC/ARVN relationship.
- (f) Any incident likely to result in immediate widespread coverage by news media.
- (g) Enemy casualties.

(2) Format - Enclosure (3). Reports will be submitted in the most expeditious means available. Items which are not certain or confirmed will be reported; however, such reports will be identified as "reported", "unconfirmed", or "suspected."

d. Command Diary.

(1) Submit by 6th of each month. Original with one copy and one copy of any supporting documents are required.

(2) Format - In accordance with reference (a).

e. Weekly Operations Overlay Report

(1) Submit weekly by 1700 local time Saturday. Period covered is 1600 Saturday to 1600 Saturday.

(2) Format - Overlay. Include:

- (a) Boundaries and limiting Points between units.
- (b) Trace of TAORs, boundaries and assigned defensive positions down to company level.
- (c) Location of all CP's down to company level.
- (d) Trace of MSR.
- (e) Patrol Bases, reconnaissance zones or other area assignments.
- (f) Location, scheme of maneuver and summary (showing time) of casualties for each enemy contact occurring during the reporting period.
