1. In accordance with reference (a), Enclosures (1) through (5) are submitted as the Command Chronology for the 1st Marine Regiment for the period 1-31 Aug 66.

2. The mission remained unchanged. Forces assigned to the 1st Marines were increased to three (3) Battalions during this period. Operations within assigned TAOR required continued emphasis on small unit actions. Significantly, 2,122 small unit actions were conducted. Additionally, one (1) regimental operation, two (2) battalion operations, 18 company and 116 platoon actions, and two (2) COUNTY FAIR operations were conducted during August. Statistically, the total of all these actions in the 1st Marines TAOR resulted in the following:

3. First Marines has all organic battalions for the first time since departure from Camp Pendleton in August of 1965. Colonel Donald L. Mallory, U. S. Marine Corps, relieved Colonel Bryan B. Mitchell, U.S. Marine Corps, as Commanding Officer.

4. Two major operations were conducted during this period.

a. Operation BUCKS was conducted during 022400H-081200H Aug 66 by the 3d Battalion, 1st Marines.

b. Operation SWANTEE, a regimental size operation, was conducted during 140700H-150830H Aug 66. The 1st and 2nd Battalions participated.

5. Logistic support of the regiment during the month of August was adequate for the support of the tactical operations. All organic units of the 1st Marines received the new FM family of radios.

6. During the period, administrative arrangements remained unchanged. The overall personnel situation improved materially. Personnel planning was directed toward making all feasible adjustments within the Regiment in order to best meet the increased rotation losses that will be encountered during the forthcoming month of September and October.

7. Further details and discussion of the above areas of discussion are contained in Enclosures (1) through (5).

SECTION III - INTELLIGENCE

1. GENERAL

a. The collection, processing and dissemination of intelligence information, during the month of August, continued in accordance with established procedure. Contact incident reports, received on an immediate basis from adjacent and subordinate units, remained the primary source of specific intelligence. Agent reports, combined with frequent liaison visits to District and Province headquarters, provided the basis for estimates of enemy capabilities and intentions. Intelligence disseminated by higher headquarters in the forms of INTSUMS, Perintreps, Estimates and Special Intelligence Reports enabled the S-2 Section to remain abreast of the general situation throughout the I Corps Tactical Zone.

b. Although the majority of contact with enemy forces continued to be characterized by harassing and mining incidents, an increase in squad to platoon size ambushes and probes was noted. The number and types of weapons employed, the orderly withdrawal and dispersal tactics taking maximum advantage of friendly boundaries, and the comparative degree of aggressiveness all tend to substantiate the assumption that there is a minimum of three (3) Local Force Companies supporting guerrilla forces within the 1st Marines TAOR.

c. The major enemy effort for the month was directed against the Third Marine Division's "Rear Area", and was once again initiated during the New Moon Period (16 August). Although the attack was accomplished outside of the 1st Marines TAOR, there are strong indications that elements of the attacking force had staged in the northwest portions of the Third Battalion's area of responsibility. Low-level agent and contact incident reports, coupled with ground and aerial reconnaissance conducted by this headquarters, indicate that this area, specifically the Cam Ne Hamlet Complex, centered at (AT 980690), may serve as a staging/harboring area for enemy forces operating between the 1st and 3rd Marine TAORs. The fact that the Cam Ne Hamlet Complex is a pocket of strong anti government sentiment increases the probability that the enemy is capable of operating throughout the area without fear of compromise.

2. Administration and Reports.

a. The monthly Rewards Fund status report was submitted to Staff Counter-Intelligence Section, Third Marine Division on 15 August.

b. The S-2 Section continued to utilize the daily INTSUMS and

Frag Orders as a medium for disseminating intelligence information of other than an immediate value.

c. The processing of Security Clearances was accomplished on a continuing basis throughout the month.

d. A major turnover in personnel assigned to the Regimental Intelligence Sections was carried-out with maximum efficiency. Each new addition was thoroughly screened, briefed, and assigned by the Regimental S-2 Officer and Chief.

e. The S-2 Section compiled an Intelligence Estimate of the area South of the 1st Marines' MAZ for planning purposes in anticipation of future operations in that vicinity.

f. The Regiment continued to receive excellent service from PII/U, III MAF and the Division Map Distribution Section.

## 3. Other.

a. The S-2 Section conducted frequent briefings for newly arrived Staff and Officers to be assigned within the Regiment.

b. In addition to briefing newly assigned personnel, the S-2 participated in briefings of the following visiting Officers:

9 August - Major General A. R. Kior  
23 August - Colonel Thompson, G-2, III MAF

## 4. Weather and Terrain.

a. Weather. During the month of August, weather conditions were influenced by the monsoon transition. Days generally remained hot and humid while the nights occasionally brought rain or thunder-showers. Weather conditions had no influence on friendly or enemy courses of action.

b. Terrain. No significant changes in the influence of the terrain were noted. The enemy continued to make maximum use of cover and concealment with the pre-harvest flooding of rice paddies tended to hamper ground movement. Trafficability on existing roads and trails remained good in spite of enemy attempts to interdict isolated portions with mines and man traps.

SECTION IV OPERATIONS AND TRAINING

I MISSION

The mission of the 1st Marines (Rein) in the DANANG Combat Base is to establish and maintain a reconnaissance screen throughout the assigned TACOR, and in Operating Area (OA) when assigned; conduct unilateral offensive operations within the assigned TACOR and in OA as directed; conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations in the Division Area of Responsibility as directed; be prepared to conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations through the CTZ as directed; occupy and defend the assigned TACOR establishing a mutually supporting rear area defense within the assigned TACOR sector coordinating the resources of all tenant activities therein; be prepared to deploy anywhere in the RVN by the most expeditious means; within indicated time from first warning order, (a) one reinforced rifle company within four (4) hours, (b) one reinforced infantry battalion (less above company) within twelve (12) hours, one regimental Command Group within twelve (12) hours; prepared to establish and operate a Task Force Headquarters by providing organic personnel and equipment augmented by Division Subordinate.

II OPERATIONS

a. Throughout the month of August the 1st Marines (Rein) continued to accomplish its assigned mission as directed by the Commanding General of the 3rd Marine Division (Rein). During the month one (1) Regt Operation (OPERATION SWANKS), two (2) Battalion operations, eight (8) company, 116 platoon and 1122 individual actions were conducted. The 1st BN conducted two (2) C-119 FLAKS in coordination/cooperation with RVN military units and officials from District/Province Headquarters. The 1st and 3rd Battalions completed plans for five (5) C-119 FLAK operations to be conducted during the first five days of September. The 1st Marines also provided company size security forces for two (2) resupply convoys.

b. The 1st Marines continued to provide security forces for certain key installations and critical areas within the DANANG TACOR I.B. bridges vic AT 998698, AT 998705, BT 072702 and BT 072708, the observation towers vic BT 031713 and BT 054716; ASP vic GS AT 998733, and a nightly river patrol of the Song Cau Do River. The 3rd Battalion conducted a vegetation clearing project in Hou Phong village, in cooperation with RVN officials. When completed surveillance of this critical area will be greatly improved. As of 31 August the project was 65% complete. The 3rd Battalion continued to conduct intensive patrolling activities in Hou Phong and Hou Da villages with emphasis on night activities.

c. On 14 August the 2nd Battalion returned to the 1st Marines. The 2nd Battalion immediately commenced an extensive and aggressive patrolling and ambushing program. Liaison was established with Dien Ban District officials and plans were initiated to establish several CAC UNITS. 2nd Battalion also maintains a sqd with the RF company located, vic BT 045622.

### III TRAINING

a. Training during the month of August consisted mainly of OJT, during the conduct of unit operations.

b. Indoctrination for Officers and enlisted personnel arriving and departing Vietnam was conducted by units in accordance with Regt O 1510.1.

c. School training conducted during August and school quotas requested are listed below:

(1) One hundred five (105) personnel from 1st Bn and one hundred (100) personnel from 2nd Bn attended Mine Warfare School conducted by 3rd Engineer Bn.

(2) Three hundred twenty five (325) personnel from 2nd Bn are scheduled to attend 3rd Engineer Bn Mine Warfare School in September.

(3) On 2 AUG four (4) men were sent to Embarkation School in Okinawa.

(4) On 9 AUG twenty three (23) personnel attended Field Fortification Inspection and Safty Course conducted by 3rd Engineer Bn.

(5) On 9 AUG 1st Marines submitted two (2) nominations for NCO Leadership School in accordance with CG 1st MarDiv 150750Z JUN 66.

(6) On 9 AUG 1st Marines submitted two (2) nominations for in-country Vietnamese Language School in accordance with CG 1st MarDiv 070323Z AUG 66.

(7) On 12 AUG First Marines requested a monthly quota of eighteen (18) for the in-country Vietnamese Language School in accordance with CG 1st MarDiv 070323Z AUG 66.

(8) On 22 AUG 1st Marines submitted three (3) nominations for Basic Legal Clerk School in accordance with Force Logistics Bulletin 1500 Dtd 15 AUG 66.

(9) On 27 AUG 1st Marines submitted ten (10) nominations for in-country Vietnamese Language School in accordance with TeleCon with 1st MarDiv Training NCO on 26 AUG 66.

(10) On 31 AUG 1st Marines submitted eight (8) nominations for in-country Vietnamese Language School convening in October 66.

- A. At 010740H First Marines sent concept of operations and support requirements for Operation BUCKS to the Third Marine Division. Operation BUCKS a battalion size Search and Clear operation to be conducted by 3/1 in the area south of Marble Mountain 2-8 AUG.
- B. At 032015H First Marines sent request to Third Marine Division for permission to allow one company from the First Battalion to conduct an operation south of the Song Thu Bon River vic BT 1153, 1157, 1853, 1857. Operation to be in cooperation and coordination with the 51st ARVN Regt. Period of operation 4-7 AUG 66.
- C. At 042223H 1st Marines received CG, Third Marine Division msg 041428Z directing all alert units for Operation Hastings to stand down from alert. Regimental command group and 1st Battalion notified.

## SECTION VIII AIR SUPPORT AND DEFENSE

### 1. General

a. Air Operations. Operations BUCKS and SWANNEE, COUNTY FAIRS 1-9 and 1-10, and convoy escorts accounted for major air utilization during this reporting period.

b. Personnel. The end of this reporting period saw a change over of the regimental ALO. The First Marine Regiment is at present time short two (2) FAC's, with the Second and Third Battalions each lacking one (1).

c. Air Request Procedure. Due to the large number of helicopters down for repairs and the priority demands placed upon the others by operations in the CHU LAI and PIA BAI areas, the procedure for requesting and using helicopters has been changed. Instead of each regiment having two working helicopters per day, Wing has allotted two helicopters to the Third Marine Division for general support missions. It is expected that two more (bringing the total to four) will be allotted to Division for general support missions.

d. Helo Landing Pads. The First Marine helo pad was vastly improved during this reporting period. The size of the pad was increased to 80'X 100', the area was leveled and rolled, a pink wind sock was erected on top of the north tower, 5'X4' letters "L" and "Z" to mark the center were added, and primary flood lights and secondary blue lights to mark the four corners of the zone were installed. Grass seed was planted to help hold down dust when helicopters land.

Division Air is working on the numerical listing of the helo pads within the DA LANG area, but as yet has not assigned any numbers.

e. SPARROW HAWK. During this reporting period SPARROW HAWK was requested on two occasions, but one request was cancelled. There still seems to be a definite reluctance on the part of the battalions to employ SPARROW HAWK.

f. Because of a large area of particularly active VC movements, tunnel complexes, caves, bunkers, land mines and booby traps, TP-10 was requested for 21 targets. Two of the targets were hit within this reporting period but with bombs smaller than requested.

1. Camp Sanitation

a. A critical evaluation of the Regimental Command Posts housing and sanitation facilities was carried out. Specific recommendations were made for new construction and improvements, including: new galley and messing areas, new trash house and pot house, permanent urinals and three new burnable 4 hole latrines.

b. The sanitary standards of the present facilities are adequate to serve the camp until the new construction is completed.

2. Medical Civilian Aid Program

a. An average of approximately one-hundred patients daily were seen and treated during this month. Treatment consists primarily of care of skin infections. Soap is given each patient and he is instructed to use it. Worm prophylaxis is being administered to those children requiring it and vitamins are given each child.

b. A Vietnamese girl has been employed in the MDCAP program. She is being given on the job training in minor medical treatments and assists in the care and treatment of the patients. Clothing is now available in the "MDCAP STORE". This is distributed to those people demonstrating a definite need.

3. Medical Care Provided

a. Approximately 10 patients were seen daily in the regimental aid station.

b. Six hundred and sixty-eight immunizations were given. This brings up to date the immunizations of all personnel due to rotate to COMUSMACV this month and next.

c. Five cases of urethritis were treated.

d. Japanese B encephalitis is still being reported in the DaYang area. There have been no cases of this disease in the regimental headquarters during the past month.

e. Six patients underwent immunization for rabies.

f. The medical section gave direct supervision and assistance in emergency treatment and directed evacuation in two mass casualty situations.

1. 8 August. Approximately 20 Vietnamese children were injured in the 12th Marines area when a truck detonated a 105 shell mine.

2. 21 August. Approximately 10 Marines of the 11th Marines were treated and evacuated for injuries when the truck in which they were riding overturned about 1/2 mile North of the Regimental C.P.

Section II - Civil Affairs

1. Significant Events

a. The Quang Nam Province Chief established temporary headquarters in the Ngu Hanh Son Campaign, Phase I Area on 8 August, (see enclosure (2) and (3) for a complete report and analysis of the Province Chief's visit).

b. On 14 August the Commanding General of I Corps and the Commanding Officer, 1st Marines were briefed by the Quang Nam Province Chief and the Hoa Vang District Chief on a proposed population resettlement and hamlet cleaning operation to be conducted in Cam Ho Hamlet, Hoa Thai Village.

c. The 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines began a pacification program on 16 August which involved a close working arrangement with the Vietnamese government officials.

d. The people of Phong Nam decided to accept the responsibility for paying labor costs in order that a one room addition could be made to their school. The decision was made at a general hamlet meeting.

e. Rice harvesting was noted in isolated areas along Route 14 between Dien Ban District Headquarters and Hoi An, despite urging by 1st Marines. No harvest security plan has yet been devised.

2. Amplifying Information. The month of August was characterized by great leaps forward in the adoption of pacification techniques, by changes in Marine leadership, by the introduction of new concepts, and by the increase in areas of responsibility. The 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines became completely involved upon their arrival in Da Nang in a pacification program the key to which was absolute cooperation with GVN officials and a posture of approachability. The appointment of a new G-5 of the 3rd Division, the visitation of the area by prominent Marine, GVN, and civilian agency officials, and the change in the Regimental Command forced an extensive and concentrated review of earlier conceived pacification theories. The school construction program and the problems which accompanied it forced the hamlet and village government to work out solutions at the local level on their own. This process is expected in time to develop their administrative abilities and to teach them to accept the responsibility which accompany their offices. The most significant and far reaching event of the month was the visit of the Province Chief to the Phase I Campaign Area (see enclosure (2) and (3) to this chronology). His visit is expected to accomplish the following three objectives: (1) to build the morale of the Revolutionary Development Cadre, (2) to familiarize the Province Staff with the problems of the people and with their daily routine of living, and (3) to present a picture of province government working at and for the well-being of the people and on their level. The concept of resettling hamlets, which in their present location provide harboring sites for Viet Cong activity, received much discussion this month and, in the end, was generally accepted as a valid counter-insurgency technique by most GVN and military leaders. Our tactical area grew by one third this month. The increase in administrative functions have reduced the coverage of the CAMRI previously possible by the Regimental S-5. The assistant

## Detailed Chronology of Events

- 2 August - Revolutionary Development Team Leaders from the teams located in the hamlets of An Trach (1), Bo Hung (1), and Yen Ho (3) were interviewed to discuss the mission, composition, and employment of their teams.
- 3 August - Revolutionary Development Team Leaders from the teams located in the hamlets of Phong Nam, Lo Giang Trung, and Lien Lac were interviewed to discuss the mission, composition, and employment of their teams. The Assistant Province USAID Representative for Revolutionary Development Cadre was also interviewed concerning the same general subject.
- 4 August - The G-5, III MAF and the I Corps G-5 traveled to Hoa Phong Village to survey the site of proposed brush clearing operation in order to improve visibility in Avenue of Approach. The Hoa Vang District Chief requested assistance from the 1st Marines to deliver 730 bags of corn to the Village of Hoa Chau.
- 6 August - The CAO and the Platoon Leader, 2nd A1 Platoon, 29th Civil Affairs Company briefed the G-5, III MAF, and the G-5, 3d Marine Division on Civic Action objectives and operations within the 1st Marines TADR. Detail information on the organization, missions, and performance of Revolutionary Development Teams was also presented with emphasis on pacification efforts of these teams in the Ngu Hanh Son Campaign, Phase I Area. The I Corps Commanding General requested that the people from Hoa Phong Village be allowed to cut bamboo and foliage for a ten day period.
- 7 August - It was learned that the Quang Nam Province Chief would establish a temporary headquarters in the Phase I Area for a period of one week beginning 8 August.
- 9 August - Dispatched 2nd Lieutenant FICKLE and the 1st Marines Liaison Officer to Ngu Hanh Son Campaign field headquarters in Mieu Bong (1) to report the developments of the Province Chief's visit as they occur and to assist Dr. CHI when requested. Two members of the Revolutionary Development Team located at Yen Ho (3) were wounded in a fight with the Viet Cong on the morning of 9 August.
- 10 August - Major General KIER, Deputy Commander, FMF Pac briefed.
- 11 August - School construction projects, their commodities and attendant labor costs were discussed with the hamlet chiefs of Mieu Bong (1) and Phong Nam. The Village Chief of Hoa Phuoc agreed to underwrite labor costs for the Mieu Bong (1) two classroom construction.
- 11 August - An anti-communist meeting was held in Duong Son (2). The Staff of Headquarters Company attended on invitation.
- 12 August - Province Chief visited CO, 1st Marines at Regimental CP. The one classroom originally programmed for An Trach has been moved to Anh My. It was learned that the Sub-Sector Advisor's revolving fund had been discontinued.

- 14 August - The TRO of the 1st Marines increased to include all of Dien Ban District. Cam He Hamlet leveling operation was proposed by the Province Chief. Phong Nam decided to go ahead with classroom construction.
- 15 August - Cam He operation called off for lack of engineer support. CO, 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines briefed on pacification objectives.
- 16 August - Claims investigation team from 1st Marines CP sent to Hieu Hien District to begin claims processing.
- 17 August - The Chief of State, the Premier, and the LVM Chief of Staff arrived at Thanh Con Dam Hamlet at 0830 to measure first hand the pacification progress within the Phase I Area of the Phu Ninh Son Campaign and to dedicate a four classroom school in the hamlet. The Province Chief requested Marine technical assistance in constructing a 155 meter bridge from Loi An to Cam Nam Village. Captain Alex WETZ has been assigned Hieu Hien District Sub-Sector Advisor.
- 18 August - Mr. Robert SHERROD, LIFE magazine was briefed by 1st Marines CIO.
- 19 August - A four classroom refugee hamlet school completed with Marine Corps commodity assistance was inaugurated in Vinh Dien (2) Hamlet, Dien Ban District.
- 20 August - Top province Revolutionary Development leadership was shuffled. Major WILT and Captain GALT were replaced by Captain HUNG and Mr. TUN, respectively.
- 23 August - Discussed the construction of a pig pen with the Refugee Hamlet Chief. Garbage from 1st Battalion, 1st Marine will be made available. School plans delivered to Phong Nam and Hieu Bong (1).
- 25 August - Hoa Thai Village laundry discussed with Village Chief and Hoa Yang District Chief.
- 26 August - Earth moving to fill the site selected for the construction of the Dien Ban District permanent storage dump commenced. Health and sanitation leaflets were delivered to the battalions today for distribution at HMM's.
- 27 August - The Commanding Officer, 1st Marines met the Hoa Yang District Chief and discussed future pacification plans. At 0600 the Village Chief of Vinh Hien Village, Dien Ban District was assassinated in Loi Ngue Hamlet.
- 28 August - Payday for Tay Ninh Canal workers.
- 30 August - A list of polling sites was procured from the Deputy Province Chief for administration. Construction materials began to be delivered to the Phong Nam and Hieu Bong school sites. Battalion CIOs met at Regiment.

31 August. - It was reported that three companies of government troops from Saigon will be flown to Da Nang as election observers. Digging of the Hieu Bong school foundation began. Solatium payment made to NGUYEN DUC.

FIRST REPORT  
SUMMARY OF PROVINCE CHIEF'S  
VISIT TO PHASE I AREA

9 August 1966

The Quang Nam Province Chief arrived at Mien Dong (1), Hoa Phuoc Village, Hoa Vang District at about 1000 on 8 August. A good part of the day was taken with the administrative details of establishing a headquarters. The Province Chief was accompanied by the Province Deputy Chiefs for Public Works, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Hydraulic, Youth, and Education as well as the Province Chief of Police (Security) and the Chu Hoi Chief. The Province USAID Representative was also present.

At 1700 on 8 August, the first official meeting of the Province Delegation was held at which Major HAU gave a briefing the highlights of which are as follows:

1. Fourteen (14) of the nineteen (19) hamlets within the Phase I Area have been pacified.
2. The remaining five (5) hamlets cannot be pacified because:
  - a. Most of the houses are either burned or destroyed.
  - b. Area is unpopulated.
  - c. Area is well fortified with Viet Cong installations.
3. Seven (7) of the eleven (11) Revolutionary Development Teams are well equipped.
4. There are one (1) battalion of ARVN, one (1) battalion of Regional Forces, and elements of one (1) USMC battalion in the Phase I area.
5. The two Vietnamese battalions are short of men.
6. The 50th RF Battalion often operates outside the Phase I area leaving a "security gap".

As a result of this briefing the Province Chief announced that he intends to propose to the I Corp Commander that the 50th RF Battalion remain in the Phase I area and that one additional battalion be assigned to the Campaign area. The Deputy Province Chief for Interior Security proposed that villagers that sympathized with the Viet Cong be removed from their hamlet and be placed in a special hamlet constructed by the government for the expressed purpose of localizing and controlling the VC sympathizers and isolating them from the Viet Cong. This process is envisioned to require an organized and methodical screening system installed in each hamlet.

At 0800 on 9 August, a second meeting was held at which the Province Chief's staff announced their plans for the Campaign area:

1. The Public Works Chief reported that political troubles had retarded the building and road improvement program.

2. The major projects of the Agricultural Chief is to encourage the planting and kitchen-gardens by every family and to distribute seeds and fertilizer.
3. A hog project is to be encouraged by the Chief of Animal Husbandry who intends also to distribute young ducks and chickens to be raised by the children.
4. The Hydraulic Section intends to construct dams, dikes, and irrigation systems throughout the area and to introduce water pumps into rice irrigation methods.
5. Other proposals were to establish Farmers Associations, Rural and Combat Youth groups and to introduce a sports program into the school system. The Education Department intends to establish tighter control over the school system, to construct new schools and to provide goods and supplies as needed. The Marine Corps school construction project was discussed.
6. A Psychological Warfare program was outlined which included the use of mobile amplifying equipment at night, posted slogans, leaflet and newspaper distribution, movies, organized propaganda meetings, and other standard techniques. Also outlined were programs to educate anti-communist cadre, combine the activities of Armed Propaganda Cadre with the Youth Associations, organize an active Chu Hoi program, and to establish a reporting and control system for these activities. The Province Chief suggested that a grave be dug beside every house in the Phase I area marked with a sign designating the grave for a Viet Cong guerill.
7. The USAID Province Representative, Mr. Jim HEALERT proposed that projects now underway be completed before new ones are begun and pledged more rapid USAID assistance and dependable material delivery with future projects. He further encouraged projects to be initiated in the hamlets of An Trach, Cam Ho, Le Song, Duong Son, La Song and Trung Lam. He encouraged government officials to use the Marine Corps Civic Action capabilities in realizing their goals in the Campaign area.

At 0900 on 9 August the Province Chief discussed specific aspects of his pacification program within the Ngua Khanh Son, Phase I area with the Commanding Officer, 1st Marine Regiment. The remainder of the day was spent in detailed planning of the activities of the Province Chief and his staff for the next two weeks and in preparing general guidance for conduct of the Pacification Campaign.

#### Amplifying Information and Comments

In order to implement this new push for the rapid and successful achievement of the Ngua Khanh Son pacification objectives, the Province Chief has subdivided the Phase I area into seven sections. He plans to enter each of these seven areas with a team of population control experts whose job it will be to screen the inhabitants and to determine their sympathies. Those who are determined to be Viet Cong supporters will be separated and moved to establish camp sites throughout the area. The first such camp will temporarily be located at Yen Ho (3) Hamlet (AT 987682). The duration of the

internment has not yet been determined. The Province Chief expects to move from one of the seven sections to another only after he is assured that the pacification program there is progressing satisfactorily.

The CG, 3d Marine Division, at the request of the Province Chief, has provided four general purpose tents and concertina wire in order to establish a temporary Phu Hanh Son Campaign Headquarters. The construction of a more permanent headquarters is programmed.

It is the intention of Mr. CHI to spend fifteen days of each month in the Campaign area. Most of this time will be spent in the hamlets overlooking the efforts of the pacification functionaries. The effect his presence will have on the success of the program remains an item of conjecture at this point. There is some doubt that his administrative duties will permit him the time he desires in the Campaign Area.

SECOND REPORT

Summary of Province Chief's  
Visit to Phase I Area

13 August 1966

I. Re-capitulation - The First Report of the Quang Nam Province Chief's visit to the Ngu Manh Son Campaign, Phase I area was submitted on 9 August and outlined the activities of Dr. Chi and his staff in establishing a temporary headquarters and in planning their activities for the first fifteen days in the Campaign area.

II. Activities

A. Wednesday, 10 August 1966. The decision was made to visit Lo Giang (1) Hamlet (BT 025705) and that sector of the Phase I area located in the northeastern part of the Village of Hoa Da. The Phase I area was divided into seven sectors for the purpose of channeling the efforts of the Province team. While the Province Staff prepared for the move to Lo Giang (1) which was accomplished on the morning of 11 August, the Province Chief returned to his office in Hoi An. He returned to Nieu Bong in the evening.

B. Thursday, 11 August 1966. At 0900 Dr. CHI moved with his staff to Lo Giang (1) Hamlet. The Province Chief spent the morning touring the hamlet and talking with the people. The public reaction to his presence in the area was a mixture of reverence, fear, and wonder. The Chief passed out candy, clothes, and toys, distributed special yellow T-shirts with three red stripes across the chest, and talked to the people about their work, their families, and their problems.

At 1300 Dr. CHI visited the Command Post of the 1st Marines to give certain intelligence information to the Commanding Officer concerning a Viet Cong operating base located in GS 0961. Cadre from the villages in that area were brought to the CP and flew a reconnaissance mission with the S-3 to begin operational planning. AUVN support for a search and clear operation was offered by the Province Chief. The rest of the afternoon was spent at agency headquarters in Da Nang City.

An informal meeting of the Province Staff was called by Dr. CHI at 2000, to hear the findings of his staff based on interviews held throughout the hamlet during the day. (The Deputy Chiefs had toured the hamlet performing somewhat the same tasks as is accomplished by the Census Grievance Cadre of the Revolutionary Development Teams). The following problem areas were selected for immediate attention:

a. Culvert construction. Eleven culverts are needed in the hamlet to prevent flooding during the monsoon season. Material assistance from the Marine Corps was requested by the Province Chief in support of this project. (see section III of this report).

b. Fertilizer purchase. The farmers complained that the fertilizer agents were requiring them to buy one bag of "bad" fertilizer with every bag of fertilizer of the type needed for their rice crop. The agent's purpose was to get rid of stock which had either gone bad or for some reason could not be used on rice. The farmers were having to pay twice the government

price in order to get one bag of usable fertilizer. The Deputy Chief for Agriculture promised to investigate this problem.

c. School completion. The self-help school project in the hamlet had stalled because of the lack of supplies. The Province Chief requested Marine Corps assistance to finish this project (see section III 4. of this report for additional information).

d. Popular Forces Recruiting. The Census Grievance Cadre had learned that approximately 60 young men of military age from the hamlet had not yet served their military obligations. Thirty of these men were working in Da Nang. The remainder were living in the hamlet. The Province Chief has made plans to collect these men at the Hoa Vang District Headquarters and to offer them a choice of joining the Popular Forces and serving in the hamlet or being sent off to the ARVN. Those men from families with Viet Cong connections will be drafted into ARVN without choice and sent to one of the other Corps areas to serve their obligations.

e. Many other projects were discussed at the meeting. The four listed above were considered essential for immediate consideration. The concept of Revolutionary Development Teams was discussed with many divergent views being presented. The Province Chief supports the concept fully.

f. Friday, 12 August 1966. The Province Chief, and his staff returned to the Ngã Hinh Son Campaign Headquarters (SF 016630) from Lo Giang (1) hamlet and at 0900 an operational briefing was held.

### III. Amplifying Information and Comments

A. The following commodities were requested by the Province Chief in support of new life development projects in Lo Giang (1) Hamlet.

#### 1. Culverts construction.

60 bags of cement.  
4000 pounds of reinforcing rods.  
6 cubic meters of sand.  
13 cubic meters of gravel.

#### 2. School completion.

5 Blackboards.  
5 Closets to store school supplies.  
5 Teacher's desks.  
20 school desks and benches for students.

No commitment has yet been made to deliver these commodities. The Province Chief told the 1st Marines G4 representative that he was asking for Marine commodity support because the self-help funds available for use in Lo Giang had been used up and that although money was available for self-help projects in general, funding regulations prohibited their use in other than the hamlet for which the funds were programmed. This problem may exist in other hamlets in the Campaign area for which request for assistance may be forthcoming (The Sub-Sector Advisor of Hoa Vang District advised Dr. CHI against requesting Marine Corps commodity support but rather to use the supplies available to him through USAD. This advice is counter to advise

given the Province Chief by the Province USAID Representative recorded in the First Report).

B. Popular Forces Recruiting has always been reported as a serious problem in the Phase I area. Yet the USAID Assistant Representative/Cadre was able to recruit 80 Revolutionary Development Team members from the same area within a two week period during March. It may be that local manpower is available but no positive method of registering and drafting has been established. Although it is realized that the findings in one hamlet can not at this point support a general statement on manpower availability, still the developments in Lo Giang have raised a question which will be pursued in future visits to other hamlets by the Province Staff.

C. Dr. CHI has an immediate goal the establishment of the presence of the Province Government at the lowest levels. Handled properly, this approach could be an effective tool in reinforcing the hamlet and village governments. He hopes to be able to guide the thinking of his staff toward this goal and eventually to leave Quang Nam Province in the hands of a man who shares his thinking so that he can move to other provinces to spread this approach to government. His visit to the Campaign area is a test of the adaptability of this approach in a country where the government has traditionally been removed from the people.

IV. Summary. Based on remarks made by Dr. CHI during this first week and on observation of him and his response to various situations and problems that developed, it is felt that he is attempting to accomplish the following by his presence in the national priority area:

a. To get the pacification effort in the Phase I area back on its feet after the political unrest which lead to major set backs in the late Spring of this year.

b. To throw the support of the Province Government behind the Revolutionary Development Cadre, to increase their morale and, as a result, their effectiveness.

c. To develop a popular appeal for the Province Government, for himself, and, by association, for the government levels both above and below Province.

SECTION XI - PSYCHOLOGICAL WARFARE

f. During the month of AUGUST the scope of Psychological Warfare operations expanded in two ways. First, with the addition of a ground and an air speaker system, audio broadcasting capabilities expanded and secondly with the return of 2nd Bn the operating area was greatly enlarged.

2. In addition to an increase in the broadcasting media capability and the operational area, GVN officials were contacted directly, for the first time, in an attempt to establish a means of mutual assistance in conducting Psychological Warfare operations within the 1st Marines TACR. Further discussion and liaison with the GVN officials is to be carried out in the months to come, in order to maintain a close working relationship and to ensure the maximum results possible from this relationship.

DETAILED CHRONOLOGY

- a. On 1 AUG 100,000 leaflets 168-66, 171-66, and 288 were requested from the 244th Psy War Co.
- b. On 1 AUG received a request from 3rd Bn for 20,000 leaflets numbered 34-65, 104-66, 114-66, 129-66, 132-66 and 138-66.
- c. On 1 AUG the 1st and 3rd Bn, 1st Marines were sent 40,000 each of leaflet 115-66.
- d. On 1 AUG 3,000 MedCap Health posters and 40,000 of leaflet 44-65 received from 244th Psy War Co.
- e. On 1 AUG arrangements were made for an Audio/Visual Team from the 244th Psy War Co to support 3rd Bn in Operation Bucks during the period 5-11 AUG.
- f. On 2 AUG 20,000 each of leaflets numbered 34-65, 44-65 and 104-66 delivered to 3rd Bn.
- g. On 3 AUG made live Chieu Hoi speaker broadcast utilizing four ralliers from the Da Nang Chieu Hoi Center.
- h. On 3 AUG 100,000 each of the following leaflets were requested from the 244th Psy War Company: 10-65, 25-65, 34-65, 44-65, 51-65, 133-66, 138-66 and 32 893.
- i. On 8 AUG received 100,000 leaflets number 171-66 from 244th Psy War Co.
- j. On 9 AUG received 80,000 leaflets number 180-66 from 244th Psy War Co.
- k. On 9 AUG sent 40,000 leaflets number 171-66 to the 1st and 3rd Bns.
- l. On 10 AUG Psy War Off 1st Marines made liaison visit to Vietnamese Information Service, (VIS) in HUEUDONG (BT 0167) to discuss means of implementing VIS and 1st Marines Psy War programs.
- m. On 11 AUG Psy War Off 1st Marines made liaison visit to HUI AN Psy War Center. Discussed Psy War Operations with Capt COON, USA advisor, and his Vietnamese counterpart on feasibility of conducting combined operations.







b. The only major problem encountered during Operation SWANNEE evolved around the employment of LVT's. Due to insufficient reconnaissance and information on tidal data and sand bar locations, the LVT's experienced difficulties in trafficability. On numerous occasions LVT's bogged down causing delays in the advance. It is recommended that when LVT units are attached to an infantry unit, as in this case, adequate support personnel, repair parts, and equipment accompany the LVT unit. Repair of broken down LVT's caused a two (2) day delay in passing ORCON of all the LVT's to the 9th Marines. Because of disabled LVT's remote location, helicopters were considered the most practical and expeditious means of delivering the repair parts. Helicopter easterity, during the period delayed rapid delivery of the repair parts, resulting in the two (2) day delay.

c. Early during Operation SWANNEE it was apparent that the obstacles in the river would limit employment of the LVT's. A vehicle of lesser draft and lighter ground pressure was required. On request by 1st Marines the Third Marine Division requested that III MAF and I Corps provide elements of the 4th Squadron APC Battalion attached to the 51st Regiment. On 17 August five (5) APC's were obtained and linked up with the Operation SWANNEE forces. These vehicles performed exceptionally well and traversed the land and river areas without difficulty.

d. Operational and logistical flexibility was reduced by the shortage of helicopters. Operations of this nature make it imperative that a means of aerial resupply and reconnaissance be readily available.

e. CTG 116 personnel obtained the desired information. The information was forwarded to CTG 116 Headquarters and it is not included in this report.

b. The LVT's proved unsuitable for operations in the Song Thu Bon River. Because of the numerous sand bars and wide variance in water depth, the LVT's were continually bogging down. Each time a tractor became stuck all forward progress was halted and either the LCM-8 or other tractors had to pull it free. Some mechanical difficulties were also experienced, which slowed progress.

c. The Engineer detachment was not utilized.

d. Artillery and Naval Gunfire not utilized.

e. Fixed wing aircraft were not utilized during operation. Helicopter support was adequate. On 13 Aug CO 1/1 and staff made a helicopter reconnaissance of operation route and on 14 Aug one Helicopter resupply mission was run.

#### 7. Intelligence.

a. Enemy. The estimated strength of the VC in the area of operation is 50-100. The 3-12 Loc-1 Force company is also carried as operating in the area south of the river.

(1) VC contacts consisted of sniper fire from 1 to 3 VC. Contacts were extremely brief with the VC firing a few rounds then breaking contact.

(2) One bunker/trench complex was discovered by AO in vic BT 207561. Complex appeared recently constructed.

b. Terrain. Area of operation characterized by flat delta and numerous rice paddies. River has many sand bars and mangrove swamps along south bank. River also has a tidal variance of 7 ft. Route 14 parallels the river.

8. Mission. 1st Battalion 1st Marines to conduct river survey of Song Thu Bon River and security screening operations by CTF 116 commencing at 140700H Aug 66 along northern and southern banks of Song Thu Bon River from vic BT 210570 to Bridge Route 1 vic BT 092552.

9. Concept of Operation. One company (Rein) operating with LVT-5's and LVT-6's to provide security along north and south banks of Song Thu Bon River. Elements of Co embarked on LVT-5's will leap frog along south bank while elements of Co provide screen on north bank vic BT 0955. LVT-6's to move along south bank to provide direct supporting fire if needed.

6. Supporting Forces.

a. The operation was supported by a reinforced platoon of LVT's (9 LVTP-5, 1 LVT-C-1, and 4 LVT-H6), a LCM-8 with elements of CTF 116 embarked, a troop of ARVN APC's, 1/11 in direct support, and both fixed and rotary wing aircraft.

b. The LVT's proved to be completely unsuitable for an operation of this nature. There was not sufficient water in the river and the vehicles were continually being stuck on the many sandbars. The constant necessity of fixing the vehicles slowed the operation's progress to a "snails pace." On 17 August, when the survey had reached the vicinity BT 035560, it was apparent that the LVT's would experience increasing difficulty should they continue. Therefore, all but the 4 LVTH-6 were brought out of the river at this point and driven along Route 14 to the west and passed on to the 9th Marines. By remaining out of the river as much as possible and traversing the south bank, the LVTH-6's proceeded without too much difficulty on 17 August to the southern boundary vic BT 000546. However, at this point one vehicle experienced mechanical difficulty and could not proceed. A lack of helicopter support made it difficult to deliver the necessary repair kits; however, when the first repair kit was delivered and emplaced, it immediately broke. After a delay of an additional day a second repair kit was delivered and installed. The 4 vehicles proceeded to cross the river from the south bank and the second repair kit broke. The vehicle was taken in tow to get it across; in the process the towing vehicle broke a track. On 21 August 1966 representatives of the AmTrac Bn came to the scene and final repairs to the vehicles were completed.

c. The LCM experienced no difficulty in moving within our TAOR and was instrumental in freeing the LVT's when they went aground.

d. The APC's negotiated the terrain very well and posed no problems what-so-ever.

e. There was no requirement to employ the available artillery support.

f. Due to the general non-availability of helicopters, it was difficult to plan for their use. Helicopter resupply of MOCAS for the LVT's was effected once without great difficulty; however, considerable difficulty was experienced in obtaining helicopters to deliver the needed repair kits. There was no requirement for fixed wing support other than observation craft.

7. Intelligence

a. ENEMY. The estimated strength of the VC in the area of operations is 200 to 400.

(1) The majority of the VC contact consisted of sniper fire from 2-3 VC.

(a) At 162015H tanks attached to Hotel observed 50 armed VC in the vicinity BT 025538 and fired 11 90mm shells with excellent coverage of target.

(b) On 17 August Foxtrot Company received approximately 12 rounds of 60mm mortar fire in the vicinity BT 031556.

(c) Golf/3 made contact with an estimated VC squad vicinity AT 999561 on 18 August 1966.

(2) Mines encountered during the operation were comparatively few. One M16A1 "Tomato Can" mine was found by Foxtrot (vic AT 998546) on 17 August 1966. Hotel/1 located a booby-trapped 155 shell on 13 August in the vicinity BT 023571; it was blown in place.

(3) The VC normally withdrew and apparently left small units with mining and harrassing missions. The VC are capable of massing company size units and defending an area of their own choice. These units can be reinforced by the 70th Battalion which is operating south of the SONG KY IAM River. Estimated VC losses during the operation were 6 (probable) KIA.

b. TERRAIN. The area of operation is characterized by flat delta land with numerous rice paddies. Populated areas are enclosed by thick treelines. Highway 14 paralleling the SONG KY IAM River, runs east and west through the area.

8. Mission. To conduct river survey and security screening operations along SONG KY IAM River commencing 150830H August 1966 from vicinity BT 092552 to vicinity AT 998547 on south bank and vicinity AT 977566 on north bank; on order conduct security for exit of elements of CTF 116 from west to east. Coordinate and effect relief with 9th Marines on 9th Marines boundary south bank (AT 998547) and north bank (AT 977566).

9. Concept of Operation. Two companies from their semi-permanent base camps on north bank of river provide security within zone. One platoon moves by motor convoy to bridge vicinity BT 091555 to provide security for both banks at that location. One company (-) moves by motor convoy to bridge (vic BT 091555) and proceeds to "leap frog" along south bank to provide security to the west.

10. Execution

a. 15 August - At 150830H Operation SANNIE commenced. At 0625H F Company commenced movement from their CP (AT 999620) to Bn CP and arrived at 0705H. At 0635H H/1 and H/2 commenced movement from Company CP (BT 025567) to vicinity BT 070550 to provide north bank security in

their zone and were in position at 1010H. At 0700H E/1 and one squad of E/2 departed Bn CP by motorized convoy to vicinity BT 091555. They arrived at 0830H and relieved 1st Bn, 1st Marines. E/1 provided security on both sides of river west of the bridge to line BT 075543-081553. At 0707H G Company commenced movement by foot to new PEB's located at BT 005560, AT 990545, and AT 980560. The platoons arrived at their positions at 0850H and commenced providing security for the north bank of river from AT 977568 to BT 014559. At 0910H F Company departed Bn CP by motorized convoy to assume command of the river survey at bridge (AT 091552); they arrived at 0945H. At 0911H E/1 at bridge (BT 091552) informed 2/1 that the LCI would be delayed for approximately 1 hour due to difficulties in loading. At 1145H G/1 at AT 990546 received sniper fire from across the river via AT 995539. Platoon returned fire with small arms and 81mm mortar fire; the sniper fire ceased. At 1205H G/1 sighted the VC sniper in a tree vicinity AT 985539 and immediately took him under fire; patrol saw the sniper fall out of the tree. Results: 1 VC KIA (confirmed). At 1236H F Company C.O. at bridge (BT 091553) was directed by the Hydrographic Survey Team Commander to postpone river sweep until 160625H. At 1300H G/1 patrol began shifting to new positions in vicinity AT 985554 and were in position at 1705H. At 1930H G/2 in PEB (BT 005560) received approximately 20 rounds of sniper fire from vicinity BT 006565; an artillery mission on the suspected position (via BT 013572) was called and the firing ceased. At 2245H FRAG ORDER issued to E, F, G, and H Companies: Continue assigned mission. Hourly position reports and 6-hour SITREP's were submitted throughout the period.

b. 16 August - At 0755H G Company CP security sentry at BT 011624 sighted 4 unidentified men running from rock to rock in the vicinity of BT 015627. Sentry fired 1 warning round into the air; the men continued to conceal their movements. The sentry fired 2 rounds in their vicinity and they disappeared through the treeline. At 0853H all units were in position for security/screening of the river survey. At 0835H F Company and LVT's commenced the river survey. At 1217H an Amtrac was stuck in the middle of river at BT 043554. At 1310H F Company reported being held up for an indefinite period of time at vicinity BT 046556 to due mechanical problems and one LVT stuck on a sand bar. At 1915H H/2 with tanks attached (via BT 025538) observed 50 VC wearing mixed uniforms and helmets in the vicinity BT 025588. Tanks fired 11 90mm rounds with good coverage of target area. A sweep of the area was not conducted due to the distance involved. At 1941H FRAG ORDER for 17 August was issued: All units continue assigned security missions. At 1945H F/2 patrol (via BT 041549) sighted 1 VC in tree line and opened fire; area was searched and patrol found 1 shower shoe with blood on it; however, no body was located. At 2100H H/2 patrol (via BT 002558) received 10-12 carbine rounds from vicinity BT 021562. Tanks returned fire and the sniping ceased. At 2130H G/2 at BT 002565 received 20 rounds of small arms and 1 60mm mortar round (dud) from vicinity BT 006563. At 2150H H Company at BT 023575 received numerous sniper rounds from an unknown direction; fire was returned with small arms and 10 60mm mortar rounds; sniper fire ceased. Hourly position reports and 6-hour SITREP's were submitted throughout entire reporting period.

c. 17 August - At 0030H F Company at BT 037555 and BT 045549 received 12 rounds of 60mm mortars from vicinity BT 031556; muzzle flashes were seen and fire was returned with approximately 280 rounds of .50 Cal fire; enemy

mortaring ceased. At 0630H a helo was sent to pick up a generator for the inoperable AmTrac. At 0700H H/2/B commenced sweep of Route #14 to Route #1 to rendezvous with the APC's. LCH began moving and F Company provided security for downed AmTrac. At 0800H units in position: H/1 at BT 042554; H/2 at BT 025558; H/3 at BT 045553; F/1 at BT 043560; F/3 at BT 043554; LCM at BT 042552. At 0900H units still in the same positions due to mechanical problems with one LVT. At 0822H H/2/B linked up with APC's and led them to F Company's position, arriving at 1215H. Foxtrot personnel were transferred to the APC's from the LVT's which crossed the river and proceeded to Route #14. They then followed the road west toward 1/9 TAOR. However, at 1600H in the vicinity of AT 992578 one LVT lost a track when it struck a mine. No personnel casualties. At 1105H F/1 and F/3 were located in the vicinity BT 035559 and H/1 and H/3 were on the north bank (BT 032560). The LCM was at vicinity BT 030557 and LVT's at BT 035559. Located at 1700H: LCM at AT 998546. LVT's at AT 997550; and APC's at BT 006556. At 1730H one man from F Company patrol vicinity AT 999546 stepped on a punji trap and was med-evacuated at 1830H. At 1805H the med-evac helo received sniper fire from BT 024579; helo returned fire with M-60 M.C. fire. Two tanks with H/3/A were dispatched to suspected area of the sniping. Two buildings suspected of harboring the snipers were destroyed by 99mm cannons. H/3/A swept the area with negative results. At 2000H FRAG ORDER for 18 August issued: F and G Companies continue with Operation SWANNEE until relieved. At 1800H F Company located 1 M16A1 "Tomato Can" anti-personnel mine in the vicinity AT 998546; mine was disarmed and forwarded to S-2. At 2210H G Company heard noises in the vicinity AT 999561 and dispatched a squad to investigate. G/2/A sighted a VC squad, called 81mm illumination and assaulted the VC with small arms. VC retreated into dense tree line. G/2/A swept area with negative results due to dense foliage. Hourly position reports and 6-hour SITREP's were throughout the period.

d. 18 August - At 0804H operational control of the LCM and the operation was passed to 9th Marines.

(1) The personnel strength of participating units during the operation was as follows: 9 Officers, 490 Enlisted USMC; 2 Officers - 15 Enlisted USN.

(6) No excessive quantities of equipment were lost.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

### 1. Heading:

#### a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

#### b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

#### c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

#### d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

### 2. Body:

#### a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

#### b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

#### c. Serial No: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

#### d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

#### e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced in writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

### 3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

### 4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

### 1. Heading:

#### a. Unit or Section:

(1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.

(2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

#### b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

#### c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

#### d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

### 2. Body:

#### a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

#### b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

#### c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

#### d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

#### e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

### 3. Endings:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

### 4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
