SECTION B

ENVY, WEATHER, AND TERRAIN

(1) Enemy: The enemy situation within the 1st Marines TACR continued to be characterized by small unit action to harass friendly static defenses and activities. The only exception to this was the attack on the Danang Air Base on 27 February 1967 and Operation "STONE" in the GO NOI area from 12 February 1967 to 22 February 1967.

(2) Weather: The weather for the month of February was characterized by generally cloudy skies with light scattered rainshowers. The average maximum and minimum temperatures were 77 degrees and 68 degrees respectively while humidity averaged 75 percent. Visibility averaged 5 to 7 miles while winds were predominantly from a northwesterly direction, with an average velocity of 5 knots with gusts up to 10 knots.

(3) Terrain: Trafficability was normal for the month of February. Patrol movement increased throughout the TACR due to the decrease in rainfall and the drying up of previously waterlocked areas.

SECTION C

OPERATIONS1. MISSION

The mission of the 1st Marines (Rein) in the BINHANG Combat Base is to establish and maintain a reconnaissance screen throughout the assigned TAA, and in operating area (OA) when assigned; conduct unilateral offensive operations within the assigned TAA and in OA as directed; conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations through the OTZ as directed occupy and defend the assigned TAA establishing a mutually supporting rear area defense within the assigned TAA sector coordinating the resources of all tenant activities therein; be prepared to deploy anywhere in the RVN by the most expeditious means; within indicated time from first warning order. (a) one reinforced rifle company within four (4) hours. (b) one reinforced artillery battalion (less above company) within twelve (12) hours, one regimental Command group within twelve (12) hours; prepared to establish and operate a Task Force Headquarters by providing organic personnel and equipment augmented by Division Headquarters.

OPERATIONS

A. The 1st Marines continued to accomplish its assigned mission by conducting 1 Regimental size operation, Operation Stone, 4 Battalion size operation, 27 company size, 40 platoon size and 4,316 small unit operations were conducted during normal operations within the 1st Marines TAOR. There was also one County Fair, 1-30, held during the month of February. In addition to these the 1st Marines provided security forces for critical installations and areas within the DaNang TAA i.e. four (4) bridges, two (2) observation towers and one nightly river patrol. The Third Battalion continued its aggressive patrolling and ambushing activities in the critical Mortar Belt area along the Bang Cau Do River.

B. Operation STONE, the first Regimental size operation conducted by 1st Marines since Operation SWANEE, which took place in August 66, was a huge success. The operation which was initially confined to GO NOI Island wound up in the railroad tracks area near the 1st Marines, 9th Marines TAOR boundary. Here the death-knell of the VC 4-20th Battalion was sounded. Final figures for Operation STONE show 291 VC KIA (Conf), 112 VC KIA (Prob), 65 POW and 17 DTHB.

C. Operation SEARCHY was conducted by Third Battalion within their TAOR. Conceived as a clearing operation against local guerrillas, it resulted in 8 VC KIA (Conf), 10 VC KIA (Prob), 17 POW and 9 DTHB.

D. In the one COUNTY FAIR conducted during February, the Third Battalion received excellent support from the 51st AVN Regiment and the JUSPAO. Drama Team. No evidence of a VC infrastructure was uncovered. The results of the COUNTY FAIR were 2 VC KIA (Conf) and 7 DTHB.

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3. AIR SUPPORT AND SERVICES

A. General. Use of air support increased during February, primarily due to Operation STONE (12 Feb - 22 Feb). Improving weather resulted in fewer cancellations. Foxtrot Company, at NUI LAC SON, led the individual battalions in overall air support requirements. Because of their reliance on air support, Foxtrot Company was assigned its own AL. During ST NE helicopters were, for the first time, assigned to the 1st Marines in direct support.

(1) Close Air Support. A total of 58 close air support missions were flown during February. 24 missions were flown in support of ST NE. 13 missions were controlled by FAC only, all of these in support of Foxtrot Company. Flareship support increased during the month, with continuous illumination being provided by 1st M27 transports every night of ST NE.

(2) SEAD/WEWE. This quick reaction force was launched only once during February. On the 27th 34 troops were lifted from the 2nd Battalion CB to vicinity BT 054725 to investigate a possible rocket-launching site. Time from request to completion was 40 minutes.

(3) Helicopter. There were a total of 304 helicopter missions completed for the month, 149 of these were flown in support of ST NE. There were 121 medevac missions for the month, 46 of them for ST NE. CH-46's and UH-34's flew to NUI LAC SON almost daily, averaging 15,000 pounds of supplies, equipment and men each day.

(4) Personnel. There were several changes in the personnel status during February. 1st Lt. DUNLAP was transferred from 3rd Battalion to Division. Capt W. W. WILKIN was assigned to the 3rd Battalion AL. 1st Lt. R. H. BLACK was transferred from 1st Battalion to Foxtrot Company as the latter's AL, a unique situation, but one required by the 1st Battalion as AL.

C. Air Defense. Passive Air Defense was in effect throughout this reporting period in accordance with operational SOP.

4. FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION (ARTILLERY) AND NAVAL GUN FIRE

A. General. First Marines Fire Support Coordination Center continued normal TACOR operations during the month of February. At 111300H Major R. G. CORBETT displaced with the forward F300 to BT 105582 for Operation STONE. At the same time the forward command group of 1st Battalion, 11th Marines displaced to the same position. The USS PROVIDENCE (CLG-6) assigned in General Support/Reinforcing for Operation STONE at 120600H. The Forward Command Groups assumed control for Operation STONE at 120700H. At 120700H Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 12th Marines displaced to BT 065584 and at 986645 respectfully. Battery "L" was in position at 120722 and Battery "B" at 120849H. At 120700H the following priority of fires was effected:

At 122220H Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was assigned priority of fires to 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines; Battery "H", 3rd Battalion, 12th Marines in General Support/Reinforcing and USS PROVIDENCE returned to Operational Control of 1st Marine Division. At 171300H Operational Control of Battery "H" was returned to 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines. Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was assigned priority of fires to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines and Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines in General Support/Reinforcing. At 181800H Battery "C", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines entered Operation and assigned priority of fires to 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines and Battery "B" to General Support/Reinforcing. At 191130 H Battery "B" displaced to AT 986645 and was ready to fire at 191430H. At that time Battery "L" displaced to AT 988672 and was ready to fire at 191437H. Battery "B" was assigned priority of fires to 1st Battalion, 1st Marines and Battery "A", 1st Battalion, 13th Marines was returned to Operational Control of 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines. At 191430H the forward F300 and forward Command Group from 1st Battalion, 11th Marines passed control to the rear and displaced to AT 992678 and AT 986674 respectively. No unusual problems were encountered during the month of February 1967.

SECTION E

COMBINED ACTION PROGRAM

During the month of February, the CAC units of the First Marines continued to perform their assigned mission. The most significant event of the month concerned the reestablishment and the reelement of CAC D-3. On 4 February 1967 D-3 commenced operating from the vicinity of coordinates of BT 042578.

Despite the fact that the CAC units continued their aggressive patrolling and ambushing, contacts were negligible and resulted in negative casualties both VC and USMC/IF.

ACTION F
LOGISTICS

1. Logistics Situation.

a. Logistics support for the Regiment was adequate for the support of combat operations.

b. Tempo of road construction and repair increased as the weather improved. Construction of Anderson Trail West (grid coord AT 999634 to BT 020638) continues. Work on Route 14 from GC BT 043578 to BT 013568 began 21 Feb. Republic of Vietnam forces began filling pot holes on National Route #1.

2. Fiscal. As of 24 Feb 67 \$199,895.46 remained out of a third quarter authorization of \$500,000.00.

3. Supply.

a. The stock level within the Regiment improved to 54%. The average leadtime of 50 days for stock replenishment requisitions is seriously hampering efforts to build up stocks to an acceptable level.

b. Aggressive screening of records for excesses continues. Phase II of the 1st Marines Redistribution and Disposal of Excesses Program was initiated on 3 Feb 67.

4. Service.

a. Motor Transport support has been excellent. Each battalion has been furnished five (5) ton trucks for housekeeping tasks on a continuing basis. These have been supplemented with additional trucks on a daily basis as requested by the battalions.

b. A Water Point was established at 1st Marines Command Post and cleared for use by Preventive Medicine Section on 15 February 1967.

c. Company "A", 1st Shore Party Battalion is providing the Regiment with two helicopter support team (HBT) for the resupply of the Nui Loc Son complex.

5. Equipment Status.

a. Headquarters Company has eight major items of equipment on deadline.

(1) Eighteen Comm/Elect items are on deadline for a percentage of 15%.

(2) There are two Motor Transport items on deadline for a percentage of 8%.

(3) One Ordnance item is on deadline, for a percentage of 7%.

(4) The overall percentage for Headquarters Company, 1st Marines is 3%.

b. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines has twenty-three major items of equipment on deadline.

- (1) Six Comm/Elect items are on deadline for a percentage of 3%.
- (2) Fourteen Motor Transport items are on deadline, six M422A1's, eight M274's for a percentage of 17%.
- (3) Three Ordnance items are on deadline, one M60 Machine Gun, one M19 Mortar and one M29 Mortar for a percentage of 1%.
- (4) The overall percentage for 1st Battalion, 1st Marines is 4%.

c. 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines has twenty major items of equipment on deadline.

- (1) Ten Comm/Elect items are on deadline for a percentage of 7%.
- (2) Seven Motor Transport items are on deadline, six M422A1's, one M274 for a percentage of 8%.
- (3) Three Ordnance items are on deadline, for a percentage of 1%.
- (4) The overall percentage for 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines is 4%.

d. 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines has thirteen major items of equipment on deadline.

- (1) One Comm/Elect item is on deadline for a percentage of 1%.
- (2) Nine Motor Transport items are on deadline, six M274's and three M422A1's for a percentage of 11%.
- (3) Three Ordnance items are on deadline for a percentage of 1%.
- (4) The overall percentage for 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines is 2%.

e. The overall percentage for the 1st Marines is 3%.

SECTION G

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. During Regimental Operation SP-12 400 refugees were transported by Marine Helicopters and trucks to DIEN BAN District Headquarters where they were housed in tents provided by the 1st Marines. Also provided by 1st Marines were cooking pots, rice, food supplies and blankets. 400 refugee representatives from NUI AN were notified and provided certain USAID food commodities such as bulgur wheat, powdered milk, corn and cooking oil. The handling of the refugees ran smoothly and coordination of the effort met with few difficulties. It was evident, however, that without U.S. Marine support, immediate Province refugee handling facilities are totally inadequate.
2. HUNG QUANG I, Phase 2, the ARVN 1967 Pacification Resettlement Project, has been closely monitored by the 1st Marines, since its commencement on 15 February. Progress has been steady, and thus far the objective areas for the first portion have been partially cleared of VC, the people have been initially prepared for relocation into designated PHUOC THUA LAMTS, and construction of the new homes by ARVN forces has begun.
3. Greater flexibility has been gained within the 1st Marines S-5 Section with the addition of a Lieutenant as Psychological Warfare Officer. This allows a greater concentration of effort by the S-5 in the Civil Affairs field, while simultaneous concentration is continually effected in the Psychological Warfare area. Planning, support of operational commitments, coordination of Battalion programs, and liaison with GVN/ARVN officials is now more responsive and immediate.
4. The Pre-TET Elders party held by the 1st Marines S-5 Section embodied the principle of simplicity, informality and lack of the "hard sell." A friendly, compatible atmosphere prevailed, and it was well accepted by the Elders present. It is believed that functions as this should not be overloaded with propaganda, or organized into overbearing, harassing sessions, but on the contrary, should be geared to transmit basic mutual understanding between parties without ulterior overtones.
5. The establishment of the F Company outpost at NUI LAC SON has provided an outstanding opportunity for high impact civic action in an area where Marines have not existed before. Every effort is being made to assist the local village chief. Plans are underway for establishing HELICAPS and DUMTCAPS, and in assisting to get an existing 5 - classroom school refurbished, teachers assigned, and 350 school children back in attendance. The Marines and Village Chief have a unique relationship. The Chief possesses unusual initiative in assisting the Marines to locate VC, and reciprocal initiative is being used by the 1st Marines to assist in bettering the local government and community.
6. Extensive road construction and repair by Marines in the TADA, complemented by ARVN road construction in the HUNG QUANG I, Phase 2, Campaign, is opening up remote areas to normal vehicular traffic. Extension of this for the months ahead will greatly aid the local systems of communications, in addition to being a direct component in increasing the local economy.

7. The following commodities were distributed during February:

- a. To the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines - 200 lbs soap, 200 lbs rice, 600 - rice bags, 100 lbs - clothing.
- b. To the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines - 4 concrete well sections, 5 bags cement, $1\frac{1}{2}$ cubic yards sand/gravel.
- c. To the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines - 100 toothbrushes, 100 tubes toothpaste, 2 cases powdered milk, 1 case salt, 1 case salad oil, 3600 lbs rice.
- d. To "F" Company, NUI LAC SON - 2 boxes MEDCAP supplies.
- e. To the USMC/AF Unit, DUONG SON (2), Self-Help Well project - 5 truck loads sand, 2 truck loads gravel, 10 bags of cement.
- f. DIEN BAN District Headquarters - 1000 lbs rice, 80 - 15' long 1" x 12" boards.

8. MEDCAP activity for the First Marine Regiment rendered treatments to 8,222 civilians, while DENTCAPS treated 22 persons. The drop from 15,585 and 93 respectively for January was believed due to the short month, the TET holidays, and the Regiment's participation for 1 week in Operation STONE.

SECTION H

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

1. During the month of February the Psychological Operations team dropped 416,000 leaflets throughout the Regimental TACR. Of these 200,000 were in support of Operation STONE and another 200,000 were Post-Operation STONE leaflets. The remaining 16,000 leaflets were dropped in support of the TET campaign. The majority of the TET campaign was carried out by the battalions. Of the total number of leaflets dropped during the month, 135,000 were of a CHIEU HOI theme.
2. There was one serial broadcast in support of Operation STONE. Two other broadcasts had to be cancelled due to adverse weather conditions.
3. A Pre-TET Party was held at the Regimental Officer's Club for a group of Elders from HOA THAI Village. A Culture-Drama team from the HOI AN VIS performed. The entire party was well received by the Elders.
4. There was a noticeable increase in Viet Cong Psychological Operations during the TET Truce. There were several rallies, banners, and a large number of leaflets aimed at Americans. Many of the banners and leaflets were of extremely crude construction and wording.
5. The Psychological Warfare Officer attended the Psychological Operations Course held by the 244th Psychological Warfare Company in DANANG, and the monthly Psychological Operations Conference held at III Marine Amphibious Force.

1. The Regimental Comm Section lifted an AN/PRC-87 via helicopter to Mai Loc Son for back-up HF and UHF communications for the outpost and to provide power for the covered voice circuit.
2. The Regimental Comm Section provided Communication support for a rough rider to Chu Lai and return.
3. Operation Stone employed a command group in the field requiring manning of both a forward and rear communication network throughout eight days of the operation.

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SECTION A
Enemy Weather and Terrain

Sequential Listing Of Significant Events

1. The 1st Marines TAOR experienced one significant event:

a. The major event was on 12 February when the First Marines launched Operation Stone. This operation was the result of detailed planning and the compilation of accurate and timely intelligence. The First Marines S-2 Section began a systematic collection and analysis of information about the prospective area of operation, Go Noi Island, three months prior to Operation Stone. Agent reports were collected, recorded and evaluated. Small unit leaders and company commanders, who had worked in the target area, were thoroughly debriefed. Members of the S-2 Section made frequent liaison visits with USMC units, whose TAOR's are adjacent to the Go Noi complex or who were actually involved in operations in close proximity to Go Noi. Helicopter resupply runs to the First Marine outpost at Nui Loc Son were periodically used to make aerial recon of the various hamlets on the island. PIU provided a mosaic of the Go Noi area, G-2 provided interpreters for the operation.

At 120700H units from the First Marines crossed the line of departure. During the first phase of the operation, the 1st Marine forces met with harassing fire and scattered resistance from local guerrillas, VC cadre and elements of the R.20 battalion, apparently holding recruit training at Bao An Dong market place (AT 985535).

Interrogation of detainees, captured during phase one, revealed that the Viet Cong knew that the Marines were about to launch an operation on Go Noi island. They began to leave the area between 9-12 February. Notice was given to the inhabitants by a village chief on 11 February, and indications are that three hundred Main Force VC left the Go Noi complex on 9-10 February.

During Phase One, agent reports from the Dien Ban Intelligence Center indicated that two VC units had withdrawn from Go Noi to the northwest and into the First and Ninth Marines TAOR. Reports from a Kit Carson scout, who had formerly worked in the area and interrogation reports confirmed these reports. Phase II was initiated. Contact was almost immediately established with elements of the R.20 battalion, Q.15 company, possibly elements of the T.89 and according to documents. Exploitation of captured PW's would have been impossible during Operation Stone if G-2 had not furnished interpreters.

By employing all available intelligence agencies, sources and methods, the First Marines were able to rapidly exploit the developing tactical situation. As a result of Operation Stone,

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the First Marines killed 291 VC (CONF), 112 KIA (PROB) and captured 74 PW'S and 86 Civil Defendants.

Although total incidents in the 1st Marines TAOR increased, VC initiated incidents decreased from 49% to 34%.

- a. In the past 5 months the 1st Marines have conducted 3 Operations in the Go Noi complex. The first Operation Cannon, there was very little contact, the VC tried to ambush the 2nd Bn and then withdrew south along the railroad track. The second Operation, Echo company went in with the mission of a recon in force and the VC avoided contact except to fire at the resupply helicopters. The third Operation, Charlie company conducted a helicopter raid in the Go Noi area completely surprised the VC and killed 61.
- b. The 1st Marines have received 52 agent reports about VC units operating in this area with a rating of F-3 in the last three months.
- c. Third CI Team attached to the 1st Bn reported 1000 VC in this area during late December.
- d. KCS Ho Minh stated that Go Noi island is a training area for VC forces.
- e. 28 Jan PW captured by ARVN in 2nd Bn TACR reported that V-25 was located in GS 0154.
- f. 6 Feb Ballier who turned himself in after attack on a PF position near Dien Ban revealed that R-20th located GS 0554.
- g. 7 Feb RDC & CG Agents reported exact location of V-25th, R-20th, and the location of two companies of the 70th Bn. See overlay on appendix 1. They further report that VC units will be there until approximately 15 Feb, but it is their opinion that the best time for an attack is 0700 12 Feb.
- h. FIU readout early in Jan indicates extensive new fortifications in this area (Commanders that have operated in this area report that all fortifications are well dug and camouflaged. Comm wire in many trenches. Reports of tunnels throughout the target area.)

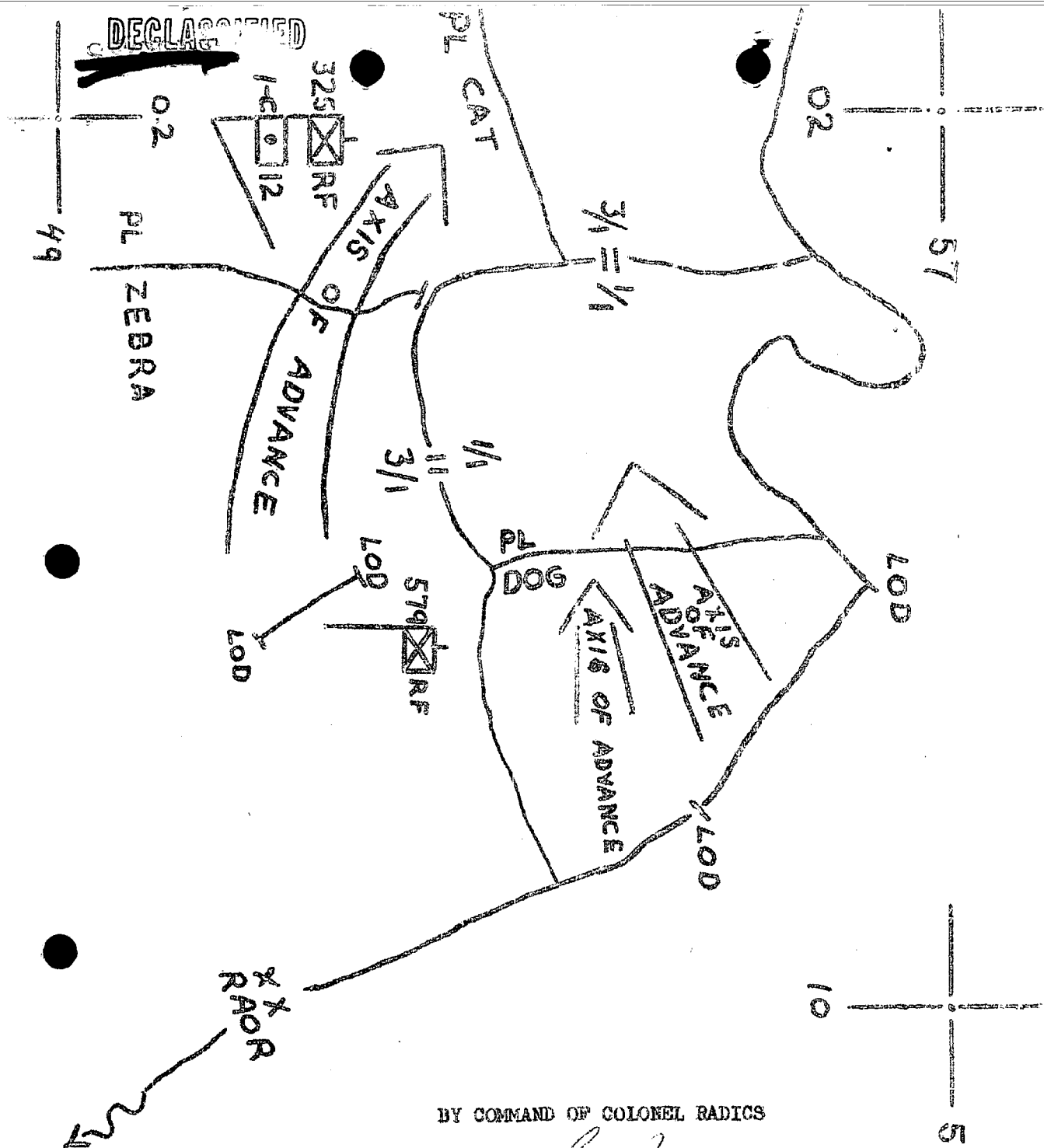



INSTRUCTIONS FOR KEEPING JOURNAL

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

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(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
