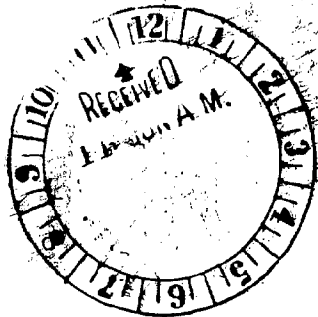



SECTION BEnemy Weather and Terrain

(1) Enemy: The enemy situation within the 1st Marines TAOR continued to be characterized by small unit actions to harass friendly static defenses while mining/booby trap incidents experienced a slight decrease. The mining and booby trap incidents further tend to indicate the 1st Marines theory that the enemy has reverted back to Phase I of guerrilla warfare after suffering heavy defeats by utilizing conventional type warfare. Minings continue to be the major casualty producer in the 1st Marines TAOR. Total incidents and VC initiated incidents increased slightly but not significantly. The saturation patrolling and concentration of ambushes on known VC infiltration and withdrawal routes has continued to keep the VC off balance.

A recon in force by the 1st Battalion indicated that the area just south of Hoi An probably is a staging/training area for a company sized VC unit. Fortifications were extensive, the population was hostile, food seemed to be plentiful and anti U.S. propaganda was in evidence.

Initial interrogation on 31 May at Quang Da Headquarters of a rallier who claimed to be an Inspector Captain with the V-25th confirmed that the V-25th is operating just south of Hoi An.

The Q-12th and R-20th that usually infiltrate inside the TAOR, are apparently still reorganizing from Operations Canyon and Stone. There is slight evidence of any concentrated activity on their part. The major concentration of activity has been along the Song Tam Giap and Song La Tho Rivers from (BT 058591 to AT 986609) between the 1st and 2nd Battalion west to the railroad.

(2) Weather: The weather for the 1st Marines TAOR was characterized by clear skies and a gradual warming trend. The average maximum and minimum temperatures were 90 and 75 degrees respectively while humidity averaged 81 percent. Visibility was marred only by occasional early ground fog and late afternoon showers. Winds were once again predominately from the north-northwesterly direction with an average velocity of 7 knots and gusts up to 10 knots. Increasing temperatures continued to have an adverse effect on helicopter lift capabilities. This was particularly apparent at higher altitudes.

(3) Terrain: Trafficability throughout the 1st Marines TAOR was normal. Small streams and rice paddies continue to dry up making mobility easier throughout the TAOR.

SECTION C

OPERATIONS1. MISSION

The mission of the 1st Marines (Rein in the DA NANG Combat base is to establish and maintain a reconnaissance screen throughout the assigned TAOR, and in Operating Area (OA) when assigned; conduct unilateral offensive operations within the assigned TAOR and in OA as directed; conduct unilateral and/or coordinated offensive operations through the CTZ as directed occupy and defend the assigned TAOR establishing a mutually supporting rear area defense within the assigned TAOR sector coordinating the resources of all tenant activities therein; be prepared to deploy anywhere in the RVN by the most expeditious means; within indicated time from first warning order. (a) one reinforced rifle company within four (4) hours. (b) one reinforced Infantry battalion (less above company) within twelve (12) hours, one regimental Command Group within twelve (12) hours; prepared to establish and operate a Task Force Headquarters by providing organic personnel and equipment augmented by Division Headquarters.

2. OPERATIONS

A. The First Marines continued to accomplish its assigned mission by conducting 7767 fire team and squad size patrols and ambushes, 52 platoon size activities, and 75 company size operations. No Regimental or Battalion operations or county fairs were conducted but 1st Battalion, 1st Marines Command Group with two 1st Battalion Companies and one company from 2nd battalion were employed on Operation UNION under OTCOM of 5th Marines during the period 01 to 05 May 1967. Activities within 1st Marines TAOR resulted in 135 VC KIA (Conf), 118 VC KIA (Prob), 278 Vietnamese civilians detained for processing and 42 VC POWs captured. 2nd and 3rd Battalion continued aggressive patrolling and observation of the critical rocket/mortar belt and security of vital bridges and installations.

3. AIR SUPPORT AND DEFENSE

A. General. Air support requirements diminished during the month of May with the termination of Operation UNION. The extensive pursuit of VC in the TAOR plus various sized units excursions beyond the TAOR claimed the majority of this months air support missions.

(1) Personnel. In May four officers reported for duty as AIO/FAC. This brought the First Marines up to authorized strength.

(a) 11 May Major J. A. RESE replaced Major E. L. SNIDER as Regimental AIO.

(b) 24 May, Captain G. C. RUDANO replaced Lt. G. W. HOGIAND (KIA) as 1/1 AIO.

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(c) 24 May, Lt. R. V. SABIA replaced Lt. R.W. BLACK (normal rotation) as 2/1 FAC.

(d) 27 May, Captain S. W. LIND replaced Captain C. H. SLASKI (normal rotation) as 3/1 FAC.

(e) Our next scheduled AIO/FAC departure will be in July 1967.

(2) Helicopters. General availability of helicopters was reduced 12 May by the grounding of the CH-46 for a flight safety inspection after a catastrophic in-flight, undetermined failure. Helicopter availability varied from this low ebb to a relatively high level towards the end of the month. "Direct support" UH-34's were provided to the Regiment for a full or partial day's work 22 times. Direct support aircraft allow for more efficient planning and flexible control at all levels. The chopper pilots assigned have done an admirable job. Four large troop lifts were completed this month: 365 Marines (1/1 "A" & "D", 3/1 "K" and 2/1 "F") were returned to their respective LZs from UNION; 507 Marines (11 and 2/1 "E") were returned to UNION; 440 Marines (1/1 and 2/1 "E") were returned to their respective LZs; 150 Marines (2/5) were lifted from HOI AN to AN HOA.

(3) Fixed Wing. Close air support sorties numbered 107. First Battalion requested and received 83 sorties of which 30 were FAC controlled. Second Battalion received 16 sorties of which 4 were FAC controlled and the Third Battalion received 8 sorties, all FAC (A) controlled. Four TPQ-10 missions were flown against selected targets. Most other categories remained fairly constant or decreased slightly.

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5. FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION (ARTILLERY) AND NAVAL GUNFIRE

A. General. 1st Marines Fire Support during May was concerned primarily with a need for closer coordination between the 1st and 7th Marines FSCC's because of increased activity along their common boundary and the development of Fire Support Coordination procedures in the supplementary area of operations assigned by Division. The increased VC activity along the common boundary of the 1st and 7th Marines created a need for rapid clearance procedures to insure timely fire support. As a result, direct liaison was authorized for the 1st and 2nd Battalion of the 1st Marines to effect clearance directly with adjacent 7th Marines Battalions on priority fire missions. Direct liaison between the affected battalions has reduced considerably the time required to obtain target clearance. The acquisition of a supplementary area of operation necessitated that fire support coordination procedures be established with ARVN forces in that area. No fire/free fire zones were obtained from ARVN representatives at HINH NHON and DUY ZUYEN. Communications channels were agreed upon to facilitate target clearance.

B. UNION. The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued in direct support of the 1st Marines during May. In addition, Battery "L", 4th Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery "B", 1st Battalion, 11th Marines was deployed on Operation UNION when the month began, OPCON to the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery "B" was mortared on 040130H while on UNION with no casualties. Battery "B" displaced to their primary combat position on 101600H and returned to the OPCON of the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Battery "A" was deployed on Operation UNION in conjunction with the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines on 13 May. Battery "A" supported the operation from Grid BT 164416. Incoming mortar rounds were received by Battery "A" on 170420H with no casualties. Battery "A" returned to their primary position in the 1st Marines T&R on 171600H on 18 May. LtCol M. P. FENNER was relieved by Major J. J. MARION as commanding officer of the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. One section of the armored amphibian platoon supported the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines on an operation in the supplementary area of operations on 29-30 May. The section supported the operation in a direct fire role and expended 108 rounds.

C. NAVAL GUNFIRE. During May, three ships supported the 1st Marines. The USS HENDERSON arrived on station on 011635H and fired 319 rounds on H&I missions and departed at 030945H. The USS HENDERSON returned on 081430H and expended 243 rounds in the vicinity of the Junk Fleet until 081810H. The missions were adjusted by a Naval Gunfire Spot Team. The USS JENKINS arrived on station at 240800H and fired 78 rounds on H&I targets and departed at 242300H. The USS TANNER supported the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines on 29-30 May on a operation in the supplementary area of operations and expended 610 rounds. The missions were observed by a Naval Gunfire Spot Team and an

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Anglico Aerial Observer. The advent of additional enlisted naval gunfire personnel (MOS 0849) enabled the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines to organize permanent Naval Gunfire Spot Teams and establish a training program to increase their effectiveness. The new teams were employed by the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines during war for a ten day period. In the absence of ships, the teams were utilized to supplement artillery forward observers with Combined Action Companies and Infantry Platoon Bases with notable success.

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A. Training was conducted within Companies and Battalions on GMS except for the following formal schools.

6. One officer attended Registered Publications Crse, YOKOSUKA JAPAN.
7. Six personnel attended Vietnamese language course on OKINAWA.
8. A one day school was held at each battalion by Contact Team on Communication Water-proofing.
9. Seven personnel attended Generator school at FLSG -DA NANG.

SECTION E

COMBINED ACTION PROGRAM

During the month of May, the First Marines Combined Action Program was expanded to eight platoons with the formation of CAP D-8 at LO GIANG. This CAP is expected to free more Marine units from static security posts in the northern portion of the 1st Marines TACR. Emphasis by CAP's during the past month by all CAP's has been on IF training and general pacification of the people.

There was a decrease in May as compared with April in the number of enemy contacts made by the CAP's. There were (12) enemy contacts resulting in (10) VC KIA confirmed, (17) VC KIA probable, (14) POW's and (9) weapons captured. Total casualties suffered by the CAP's were (4) USMC KIA, 12 USMC WIA, (1) PF KIA, (1) RF KIA, and (9) PF WIA's. The most significant contact occurred at CAC D-4 when it was attacked by an estimated 40 VC. (See 1st Marines IntSum 15 May).

SECTION F
LOGISTICS

1. Logistics Situation

a. Logistics support for the Regiment was adequate for the support of combat operations.

b. Normal logistical resupply for the Tui Tac Son Complex terminated on 5 May 1967 as F Company has been removed from that position.

2. Fiscal. As of 28 May 1967, \$171,982.15 remained out of 4th quarter authorization of \$525,000.00.

3. Supply. The stocks levels have remained at 65% of operating stocks.

4. Service.

a. Motor Transport support has been adequate. Each Battalion has been furnished five house-keeping trucks daily and augmented by additional trucks by division as required.

b. The landing zones at the Regimental Headquarters and 1st Battalion were completed this month.

c. The FIC furnished the Regiment fresh water contained in pint milk containers and six gallon containers to be used for test and evaluation under field conditions. The pint containers are considered too small, however the six gallon containers are very suitable for field use.

d. The Ha Dong Bridge at grid coordinates AF 990642 was up graded from a class 23 bridge to a class 40 by 7th Engineer Battalion.

e. 7th Engineer Battalion has been repairing National Route 1A from the bridge crossing the Son Cau Do southward.

f. 1st and 2nd Battalions received a 36 KW Navy generator each from the Force Logistics Command on 27 May 1967. The increased power requirements of the canteenments and the need to conserve T/E generators prompted the issue of these generators. With the installation of these generators all T/E generators will be placed on a stand-by status.

g. 7th Engineer Battalion continues the construction of the lateral road from National Route 1 via GC BT 029648 to the 3rd Battalion Command Post. The effort during May was on construction of a bridge across the Nam Bien.

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5. Miscellaneous. Since issue of the M-1 rifles, there have been reports of the weapon malfunctioning. C4, 1st MarDiv msg 270231Z May requested that a test be conducted using 25 weapons at random and firing 100 rounds of ammunition that has been carried in the field. Following results have been passed on to division:

SECTION C

CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. In early May the 1st Marines passed their outpost commitment at NUI LAC SON (South of the TAOR in QUE SON District) to the 5th Marines, in conjunction with Operation UNION. During the occupancy of NUI LAC SON, F Company, 2nd Battalion, exemplified proper civil affairs/civic action techniques. Among the civic action projects instituted were MedCaps, DentCaps, provision of extensive refurbishing commodities for the local 5-classroom school, reestablishing of 250 school children in attendance at the school, conduct of English classes for local PF's, and periodic opening of the road to QUE SON for uninhibited travel by PF's and villagers. Perhaps the most valuable of civil accomplishments was the unique model relationship established with the local village chief and the chief's reciprocal initiative in assisting Marines in locating and ambushing local VC.

2. In mid-May formal approval was rendered and task assignment made to reconstruct the critical H. THANH Dam, the 1st Marines to effect the major portion of coordination between all participating elements. As of this date the access road to the dam site has been completed, and the actual dam construction will immediately follow by elements of the 7th Engineer Battalion. This CA project is one of the most critical undertaken in the I Corps National Priority Area and will directly affect the irrigation and rice crops in Hoa Vang District between the railroad bed on the west, the SONG VINH DIEM on the east, and the SONG CAU DO to the north. Rapid construction and subsequent proper functioning of the dam will be definite, tangible pacification progress, as this will greatly relieve the reduced rice harvests of the past and restore significant, meaningful gain to the individual farmers of this priority area. Attention in this and similar areas is believed to be at the heart of providing/assisting the local populace with their basic needs and aspirations. Every possible attempt is being made to associate this undertaking with the local villagers, the local RD Teams, the 51st ARVN Regiment, and GVN at all levels. If these groups can be assisted to effectively shoulder their respective responsibilities relative to the dam project, solid progress will have been made to establish the true means for conducting future meaningful pacification.

3. During the past month the 1st Marines continued their CA support for the adjacent hamlets of DUONG SON (2) and (3). Attention is being rendered these hamlets as they are not programmed into the ARVN HUNG QUANG I Resettlement Campaign or the GVN RD Team Program for Hoa Vang District. The villagers of Duong Son (3) are currently constructing 5-self-help wells (commodities received as a result of requests submitted through GVN/LACV/CCO/USMC channels in parallel fashion), one of which has been completed. Future projects discussed with Duong Son (2) villagers, coordinated with the 1st Marines, and being requested via GVN/LACV/CCO/USMC channels are construction of a bridge-culvert, pagoda repair, and meeting hall construction.

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4. Constant liaison and contact has been maintained with RD Teams within the TACR and their OCO Advisors in HOI AN. Commodity assistance has been rendered to RD Teams in New Life Hamlets only when not programmed in the local RD Project Program and when strictly cleared with the RD Advisors. RD Teams in receipt of 1st Marines assistance were those in Mhon Tho (2) and Liem Lac (1). In addition, the Province government is being assisted by the 1st Marines in salvage of approximately 1,000,000\$VN worth of large hardwood logs from the VINH DIEM River near Dien Ban. The logs were being floated by VC to a staging point for further transfer and sale in Danang when captured. GVN will utilize the logs for fund-raising purposes.

5. The 1st Shore Party Battalion, recently arrived from CHU LAI, has coordinated its CA program with the 1st Marines because of a lack of a suitable CAACR within the Danang TACR. It has been agreed that initially the Battalion will lend asset support to the 1st Marines CA Program and projects. Initial CA tasks for the Battalion are the filling and leveling of a large cavity area within a refugee camp at Long Chau (3), and the grading, capping, and provision of drainage ditches for the access road to Dien Ban District HQ.

6. Throughout QUANG NAM the two opposing factions of the VNQDD political party continue with renewed emphasis to minimize their differences. Strong emphasis is being placed upon attempting to consolidate and unite the two factions as much as possible prior to the National elections in September in order to effect the best possible effort to gain strength and position nationally. Specifically in Dien Ban District VNQDD political problems continue to plague the functioning of the District HQ. The critical in-fighting and maneuvering for power/leadership between the two factions permeates practically every portion of District activity: administrative officials; census grievance; village cadre; national police; RD Cadre; Popular Forces; PRU elements; and local student - youth groups, since VNQDD membership is the prevalent majority in these organizations. It has been difficult for the District to handle and resolve requests, problems, and disputes of these various groups in a manner non-committal to either faction. As a result of these problems, and having to allocate excessive time to their handling, District Administrative efficiency has been somewhat impaired or reduced. Certain groups such as police, RD Cadre, and PF's have been reluctant upon occasion to effectively carry out orders of the District Chief or his deputies for fear of antagonizing or supporting their opposing faction.

7. The following commodities were distributed during MAY:

- a. To 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines. 4 cases of Kool-Aid.
- b. To 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines. 2,800 pounds of rice, 150 pounds of soap, 55 cases of Kool-Aid, 5 cases of cooking oil, and 4 cases of assorted canned goods.

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- c. To "F" Company, NUI LAC SON. 125 - 1" x 12" x 14 foot boards, 100 - 1" x 6" x 8 foot boards, 10 - 2" x 4" x 14 foot boards, 6 - 2" x 12" x 14 foot boards, 1 door, and 15 shutters.
 - d. To villagers of Duong Son (2). 1,200 pounds of rice and PC truck load of lumber.

2. During the month there were 77 hours of loudspeaker broadcasts of which 33 hours were by teams from the 244th PsyOps Company, 41½ hours by the 9th ACS. In addition there were two performances by the Culture-Drama team from Hoi An.
3. During the month there were 1,568,887 pieces of PsyOps material distributed. Of these, 650,000 were air-dropped by the 9th ACS, 875,000 were air dropped by the Regiment and 43,887 leaflets, posters, magazines, and newspapers were distributed by hand throughout the TAO. 



6. Supporting Forces

a. Air Support. Air support for Operation CANYON was provided by 1st MAF and involved a broad spectrum of support type. The helo-lift of 2/26's 700 troops was accomplished by UH-34's - 24 for the insertion, 20 for the extraction. Both maneuvers were executed with precision, the only problem being a 2 hour delay in the assault due to morning ground fog. Morning fog was a recurring limiting factor throughout the Operation.

Of particular significance was the provision of support by the combined air assets available to both participating forces which resulted in almost constant AO coverage, and the rapid and effective conduct of fixed wing air strikes. Also worthy of note is the fact that during the first two days of the operation 31 VC were killed by air.

(1) The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein), commanded by Lieutenant Colonel JACK P. KENNEDY was assigned in direct support of the 1st Marines. The following priority of fires was assigned in order to support the scheme of maneuver:

(3) The 1st Battalion, 11th Marines Command Group displaced to QUANG DA Special Zone Headquarters cantonment area on the morning of 6 April. Battery Group "A" displaced to coordinates BT 156573 and was laid and ready to fire at 0815. Battery Group "B" displaced to coordinates BT 166413 and was laid and ready to fire at 0940. The 3rd Plt, Armored Amphibian Company displaced to coordinates BT 209571 and was laid and ready to fire at 1115. At 2100 on 09 April, the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines Command Group returned to their permanent location within the TAOR. Battery Group "B" displaced at 1530 and returned to their permanent location within the TAOR at 2000. Battery Group "A" displaced by echelon on 10 April. The first echelon displaced at 1005 and the second echelon at 1135. At 1205 the Provisional 155 Howitzer Battery was deactivated and each element returned to its parent organization.

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(4) The following is a breakdown of missions fired and ammunition expended during the operation:

(5) During the operation 5 VC KIA Confirmed were directly attributed to the results of artillery fire.

(6) Fire support coordination was conducted in accordance with standing procedures. However, the FSCC was co-located with the QUANG DA Special Zone FSCC. By joint agreement between ARVN and 1st Marine Command, Major R. G. CORDETT was designated as the Fire Support Coordinator for both Marine and ARVN forces. This provided continuity of fire support and enhanced clearance procedures, thereby enabling the rapid and effective delivery of supporting fires by all participating fire support agencies.

(7) Throughout the operation emphasis was placed upon the utilization of supporting arms. The timely and efficient utilization of these fires for preparation, reconnaissance, harassment, interdiction, illumination and in the attack of targets of opportunity, contributed markedly to the low rate of friendly casualties which resulted from the operation. All artillery exhibited exemplary response to all calls for fire and exhibited a high degree of professional performance.

c. Naval Gunfire.

(1) The USS PROVIDENCE (CLG-6) was assigned in direct support of the 1st Marines from 060600H until 082000H. During this period, one preparatory fire and 27 H&I missions were fired. A total of 146 rounds of 5"/38 and 281 rounds of 6"/47 were expended.

(2) Naval Gunfire in conjunction with artillery fires and air strikes effectively kept the enemy from organizing attacks and destroyed cover, bunkers, trenches, foxholes, tunnels and several other structures. The PROVIDENCE gave prompt response to all request for fire and exhibited a high degree of professional performance during the operation.

d. Armor:

(1) Antracs: During the operation, Antracs were employed to their fullest capability. Antracs were used to land the First Battalion and were subsequently employed providing direct fire support to the First Battalion and logistical support for the First Battalion and the LVTH-6 battery. In their direct fire support role, each rifle company of the First Battalion was supported by three LVT's two of these mounted .50 and .30 caliber machine guns while the third mounted a 106mm recoilless rifle and a .30 caliber machine gun.

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(2) The Anti-Tank Bn (-) supported the ARVN Ranger Task Force in their attack to the east from the LOD along the SONG TROUNG GIANG. On 9 April the Bn (-) made a mechanized reconnaissance patrol to the Southwest of THANG BINH (BT 1638) to check the area for future utilization of Ontos in that area. This area was determined to be operational for Ontos.

(3) Tanks: In Operation CANYON, tanks were landed in the objective area by ICU's. They were then employed in direct support of the First Battalion.

(4) Trafficability: Trafficability was to some extent restricted by the dense growth around the inhabited areas and the extensive dike and irrigation systems throughout the area. All the dikes have pine trees growing on top making it difficult for tracked vehicles to break down the slopes and climb over. Once passages are cut through the dikes, vehicles remain channelized and subject to mining.

7. Intelligence

a. The 1st Marines S-2 Section working closely with the QUANG DA Special Zone S-2 conducted a thorough systematic collection and analysis of information about the CANYON objective area. Agent reports were collected, recorded and evaluated. Small unit leaders who had worked in the objective area were thoroughly debriefed. Frequent liaison meetings were held to coordinate the collection effort. AO's were tasked to observe and report any unusual activity in this area. PIU furnished a mosaic of the area. Special aerial recons of the objective area were kept to a minimum and strictly controlled by this Headquarters so the unusual activity would not compromise the impending Operation. Strict security of all information covering Operation CANYON was required by this Headquarters. As a result of this combined comprehensive collection effort a detailed categorical history of the objective area was compiled.

(1) Immediately prior to Operation CANYON, the S-2 Section estimated that 300 Main Force and 200 Local Guerrillas were concentrated in the objective area. Agent reports furnished by DIEN BAN, HIEU NHON, HOI AN, Census Grievance, National Police, and Junk Fleet #14 located one (1) Main Force Bn (70th Bn) and two (2) Local Force Companies, the Q-12 and Q-13th in this area. These reports about the Q-12th, Q-13th Local Force Companies were substantiated by the VC captured and killed during the Operation. Reports that there was a Main Force Bn operating in this area proved to be grossly exaggerated and/or completely erroneous. There was no indication of any large Main Force unit operating in this area.

b. Enemy Forces Actually Encountered.

(1) During the initial phase of Operation CANYON, the Allied Forces not only sporadic contact with the enemy trying to withdraw to the Southwest. This scattered resistance appeared to be from local VC guerrillas. Interrogation of all detainees indicated that the Marines engaged an estimated 200 local VC. The PW's reported that they were completely surprised by the unexpected thrust into this heretofore VC safe haven. The indication of contact with a MF unit was the attack of approximately 50 VC on 2/26 (Intsum #293 Para 3 (1), (2)). This unit reportedly wore uniforms and had mortars indicating they were a MF unit.

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(2) Mines and Booby Traps. A total of 11 mines and booby traps were encountered by the USMC/ARVN Forces. One (1) was detonated and ten (10) were discovered and destroyed. The few mines encountered by the combined force indicated that the VC did not expect an attack in this area.

(3) Caves and Tunnels. A total of 17 well constructed and concealed bunkers, caves, tunnels, and trenches were discovered and destroyed. Debriefing indicates that information about fortifications furnished by S-2, 1/1 and IIIU were extremely accurate.

c. Terrain

(1) Cover and Concealment. During the entire operation, numerous built-up areas, bamboo thickets, hedgerows bordering the rice paddies and cultivated areas offered good concealment. Limited cover was provided by topographical irregularities and civilian dwellings.

(2) Critical Terrain Features. None

(3) Observation and Fields of Fire. During the entire operation, observation and fields of fire were generally limited by thick vegetation and built-up areas.

(4) Obstacles. Man made obstacles encountered consisted of well developed trenches, mines, and fences. Natural obstacles were the rivers and mangrove swamps that tended to channelize movement of Allied Forces.

(5) Avenues of Approach. There are 4 main avenues of approach into the objective area. First to land by amphibious vehicles along the beach South of the East/West grid line 55 and drive to the West. Second, to cross the SONG CUI DIAU River, land Bx 215569 and push South. Third, to move down Highway number 1 and then move East across the SONG CUI DIAU River. Fourth, to land by helicopter in the open sand South of the objective area and drive North.

8. Mission

To locate and capture or destroy enemy forces and equipment within the area south of the DA HANG MIAO bounded on the north by the SONG MUI MIAO - SONG CUI DIAU, on the east by the South CHIEU S., on the south by east-west gridline BB-42 and on the west by National Route one.

9. Concept of Operations

a. Maneuver. Commencing H-Hour on D-Day, First Marines (-) (Rein) and III M. D. Special Zone Headquarters conducts a combined operation on Carrier Island southeast of CHIEU.

(1) Two ARVN Battalions supported by Armored Personnel Carriers and one company from 1st Anti-Tank Battalion attack to the east from LOD on Route One to establish blocking positions on the SONG TROUNG GIANG to prevent escape of enemy forces to the west.

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(2) SVN forces establish blocking forces in the islands of the SONG THU BON to prevent escape of enemy forces to the north.

(3) Second Battalion, Twenty Sixth Marines lands by helicopter south of objective area to cut off escape of enemy forces in that direction and, on order, attacks to the north to capture or destroy enemy forces in ZOA.

(4) First Battalion, First Marines lands on northeast corner of objective area by LVT-5 and landing craft and attacks to the west and south to capture or destroy enemy forces in ZOA.

b. Supporting Arms.

(1) First Battalion, Eleventh Marines (-) (Rein) in direct support.

(2) Battery "B", 1/11 moves by motor march in trace of APC's and Ontos south on Route One to THANH BINH. Priority of fires to Second Battalion, Twenty Sixth Marines.

(3) Platoon, Armored Amphibian Tractor Company moves to vicinity Junk Base. Priority of fires to First Battalion, First Marines.

(4) Battery Group "A" (one 105 battery and one 155 battery) moves to vicinity NIEU HON in general support.

- 090915H Co A 1/1 plat sweep, vic BT 194511, sighted 3 VN males running from sweep force. Fired 2 warning shots, which failed to halt VC. Fired 10 rds S/A. Searched area found 1 VC KIA without ID card.
- 091015H Co I 3/1 plat sweep, vic BT 224525, informer and interpreter led patrol to cave. 1 VC ran from cave and attempted to throw a gren. Fired 1 rd S/A killing VC. Informer identified VC as a sqd leader.
- 091125H Co I 3/1 plat sweep, vic BT 225526, sighted 1 VC run from cave. Fired 2 rds S/A killing VC and apprehended 1 VC hiding in cave. Forwarded 1 POW to BN CP.

Searched area, found 5 VC KIA (Conf), (1) M-1 rifle serial number 1951277, 5 Chicom gren and 1 M-26 gren, 1 concussion gren, 1 K-Bar, (1) 40MM Anti-Tank Rkt, 1 M-16 cleaning rod, 1 E-Tool, 20 rds S/A ammo and documents.

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- 091320H Co I 3/1 plat sweep, vic BT 207530, apprehended 4 VC hiding in a cave. 1 VC attempted to escape and was killed by 2 rds S/L. 3 POW fwd to BN CP. Search of cave; resulted in finding 2 ChiCom gren and 1 M-26 gren and 1 cartridge belt.
- 091400H Co A 1/1 plat sweep, vic BT 173519, sighted 12-15 VC, vic BT 168520, with wpns and packs. Snipers fired 2 rds S/L and observed 2 VC fall. Observed thru sniper scope. 2 VC KIA (Conf).

- 091715H Co C 1/1 plat sec force for LVTP-5's observed and challenged 1 VC moving towards them. VC turned and ran, ignored warning shots. Killed VC with 1 rd 106MM, had no ID card.
- 091835H Co A 1/1 with 2 tanks, vic BT 199545, enroute to BN CP with DIME and female POW. Female POW jumped from tank and tried to run into brush, fired 5 rds S/L killing 1 VC.
- 100415H Co C sqd amb, vic BT 198540, saw 1 VC enter killing zone. Fired 20 rds S/L. Searched area found 1 VC KIA.
- 101200H Operation CANYON terminated.

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12. Administration Matters.

a. Administrative Plans were adequate. A logistic support area was established at HOI AN Air Field, Grid coordinates (143577) by Company A, 1st Shore Party Battalion.

b. Supply dumps at the LSA were established with 5 days of supply for classes I, II, III and IV. Two days of class V supplies were staged the first day with plans for raising the level to 4 days on the second day. Due to light contact with enemy forces, no increase in class V levels above 2 days was attempted. Resupply was lifted by helicopter and Amphibious Tractor. Morning ground fog on 8 April prevented resupply 2/26 until the early afternoon. The 21st and 39th Ranger Battalions were resupplied from ARVN sources with Marine helicopters. Combat loads and weapons carried by assault troops were adequate to accomplish the assigned mission.

c. ~~Maintenance~~ presented no unusual problem due to the short duration of the operation. Maintenance Contact Teams provided by Force Logistic Command were available in the LSA.

d. Hospitalization and Evacuation.

(1) Medical support for Operation CANYON was provided in the form of a collecting and clearing center at the Command Post of the First Battalion, First Marines. This site was chosen because of its proximity to the forward Regimental Command Post and the medical facilities of the First Battalion; and because it provided a relatively secure landing zone for the medevac helicopters, which, during the operation, worked directly from this facility. Once the battle casualties were returned to the collecting point, the serious casualties were given supportive care and forwarded to division level hospitals, and the minor casualties were retained, treated, and returned to their respective units.

(2) The medical facility at the First Battalion included three medical officers, a full complement of hospital corpsmen, a 12 bed ward, and available medical equipment for emergency treatment of all types of casualties. There were also two vehicles available which were used to transport patients from the landing zone to the treatment area -- an approximate 30 second ride by jeep. The medical officers worked closely with the Battalion and Regimental Air Liaison Officers in directing the medevac helicopters, and controlling the landing zone teams. As requests for medical supplies were received from the field, the information was transferred to the medical facility, from which the supplies were appropriated, and then sent to the logistics officer for distribution.

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e. Transportation into the objective area of First Battalion, First Marines and Second Battalion, Twenty-Sixth Marines was by Amphibious Tractor and helicopter respectively. Transportation within the objective area was via tracked vehicle or boat.

f. Communications

(1) The communications organization for Operation CANYON was routing for field operations. Regimental control was exercised from HOI AN through two FM tactical radio nets. Four channel relay radio was established to First Marine Division Headquarters.

(2) Since CANYON was a combined operation, USMC control headquarters was co-located with the ARVN Headquarters making coordination and lateral communications between units especially successful.

(3) In the case of the Fire Support coordinators where co-ordination was required on an instant and continuing basis, the communications personnel and equipment were located in the same room. Thus both US and ARVN artillery fired missions for the entire operation.

g. Medical Evaluation

(1) In terms of providing the best medical care available, it is felt that the concept utilized in this operation proved to be sound. Since the area of operation was at an increased distance from the division definite-care hospitals, the facility for close medical support offered life-saving care by medical officers within ten minutes from the time the casualties were taken aboard the helicopters, provided opportunity to sort out the minor casualties -- thus relieving an unnecessary burden on the larger hospitals, and reduced the amount of required flying time of the medevac helicopters. It is felt that as regimental-size operations move further away from the division level hospitals and helicopter bases, this general scheme of a collecting and clearing facility positioned at or near the regimental forward command post is medically and logistically warranted. It should be noted that no unique medical problems were encountered during this particular operation.

13. Civil Affairs and Psychological Warfare Operations

a. Civil affairs

(1) The First Battalion directly assisted in the evacuation of approximately 1000 refugees desirous of leaving the operational area on 10 April. These refugees were transported by the JUNK FLEET to the Junk Base at BT 205570. The First Marines S-5 Section coordinated with Sector, Province, and OCO refugee personnel for providing support upon landing at the Junk Base. Commodity support was provided by OCO via Province refugee channels.

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(2) 1000 pounds of rice was provided the First Battalion for the feeding of 200 detainees/POWs housed at the First Battalion POW Compound and taken from the Operation CANYON area.

(3) QUANG NAM Province National Police and Civil Affairs personnel were on the scene of Operation CANYON handling detainees. A team from QUANG TIN Province was also present in that Province's portion of the operational area. It is considered significant that GVN officials were in the operational area to handle any problems arising with local villagers. A specific attempt had been made to encourage GVN/ARVN responsibility and action for civil affairs problems associated with the operation, utilizing USMC support in this area only when necessary.

b. Psychological Warfare Operations

(1) During Operation CANYON there was an aerial leaflet drop and broadcast by the 5th Air Commando Squadron, USAF and 5 hours of broadcasts from U.S. NAVY Swift Boats. The themes were CHIEU HOI Appeals and instruction to the people. One CHIEU HOI turned himself into Company G 2/26.

(2) As a follow up to the operation aerial broadcast, of CHIEU HOI Appeals and lists of high ranking POWs are to be made. In addition there were aerial leaflet drops along the CHIEU HOI theme and "the VC force the people to labor" and "the VC presence in your hamlet will bring death" themes.

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14. No special equipment or techniques were employed. Much of the credit for the success of Operation CANYON must be attributed to optimum utilization of standard equipment and the highly professional application of existing tactics and techniques.

15. Commanders Analysis. CANYON was conceived, planned and executed as a combined operation. Foremost among the factors contributing to its success was the rapport existing between the participating commanders and their staffs which resulted in a close working command/staff relationship, rapid resolution of matters requiring mutual agreement; expeditious provision of fire support; and complementary maneuver of forces.

Establishment of the 1st Marines Command Post at the QDSZ Headquarters permitted a free and timely exchange of information and intentions during every phase of the operation. Integration of the Fire Support Coordination Centers permitted the most effective application of supporting arms and minimized these potential dangers of conflict of effort which exists when a combined force maneuvers under supporting fires of more than one fire support source. It should also be pointed out that under the FSCC as established the combined fires of both ARVN and Marine artillery in support of either ground maneuver force were frequently used with excellent results.

The close spirit of cooperation which prevailed during CANYON was further exemplified by the performance of the ARVN Ranger Task Force and the 1st Anti-Tank Bn which supported it. These two units operated and maneuvered together throughout the operation with excellent results.

Operation CANYON did more than inflict serious damage to the Q-12th Local Force Camp and guerrillas in the objective area. It also demonstrated the capabilities of a combined force in ranging wide and swiftly over an area previously controlled only by the Viet Cong.

16. Recommendations. No specific recommendations are forthcoming from Operation CANYON.

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

Officers in command of platoons and companies, and all personnel assigned as Artillery Forward Observers and Forward Air Controllers, will be reinducted monthly on the Rules of Engagement.
