1. SITUATION:

a. Enemy Forces. See Annex A.

b. Friendly Forces.

- (1) 1st MAW provides 35 UH34D aircraft for helo troop lift. Fixed wing support as required; D-2 commences air prep to include actual/false LZ's.

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- (2) 1st ARVN Div conducts S&D operations in Area I (See Operation Overlay) with 1 ABN Bn conducting heliborne assault vic LZ Buzzard. 1 infantry Bn moves during hours or darkness on D-1 to provide blocking/screening force.
- (3) 1st Bn, 11th Mar (-) (Rein)
 - (a) Provides direct support 1st Marines as requested.
 - (b) Commencing D-1 provides LZ prep and destructive fires to include actual/false LZ's.
- (4) 3rd Engr Bn provides general support and is prepared to provide demolition support on request.
- (5) CTU 70.8.9 provides one 5"/54 DD on request.
- (6) 3rd Recon Bn (-) (Rein) on D-1 provides security screen on right (East) flank of obj area.

c. Attachments. Effective upon receipt of order.

2. MISSION: 1st Mar (-) (Rein) conducts multi-battalion assault operations in coordination/cooperation with elements of 1st ARVN Div, to locate, destroy and capture enemy forces, installations and logistic supplies vic enemy Base Area 101, HAI LANG Forest Reserve. Be prepared on order to conduct screening operations in areas to be designated along axis of Nat'l Route #1 South of QUANG TRI City.

3. EXECUTION:

- a. Concept of Operations. 1st Mar (-) (Rein), conducts search and destroy in area of operations with 2 battalions landing by heliborne assault vic LZ Dove. One battalion provide blocking/screening force in designated areas to NE. Upon completion of S&D operations continue attack NE to vic FCL. Be prepared to conduct screening operations along axis of Route #1 as directed.

b. 2nd Bn, 1st Mar (-) (Rein)

- (1) On D-1 by 0800H provide security for helo landing of BLT 1/3 in designated area.
- (2) At L-Hour, D-Day land vic LZ Dove, secure LZ for subsequent landing of 1st Bn, 1st Mar, conduct S&D operations in Area II SW of IL Flum for period of about 4 days. Seize Regt'l obj in Z/L. Coordinate with ARVN forces vic obj 1.

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- (3) On order be prepared on D+4 to attack in Z/A NE of PL Plum to vic FCL.
- (4) Upon closure FCL by D+7, be prepared to conduct screening operations along Route #1 as directed.

c. 1st Bn, 1st Mar (-) (Rein)

- (1) On order, land vic LZ Dove, pass through 2nd Bn to the SE, conduct S&D operations in area SW of PL Plum (See Opns Overlay) for period of about 4 days to seize Regimental obj in Z/A.
- (2) By D+2 develop Obj 5 as a possible LZ for resupply.
- (3) On order be prepared on D+4 to attack in Z/A NE of PL Plum to vic FCL.

d. BLT 1/7 (Rein)

- (1) Land by helo vic YD 395450 on D-1, move to assigned assembly area.
- (2) During hours of darkness on D-1 move to blocking/screening positions. (See Operation Overlay) and conduct blocking/screening operations.
- (3) Be prepared to attack to the SW.
- (4) Be prepared to provide one rifle company as Regt'l reserve for movement by helo or truck.

e. 1st Bn, 4th Mar (-) Commencing D-Day provide 1 rifle Co and 2 plts for screening/security operations to W and SW of airfield (See Opns Overlay). Return to airfield security each night for duration of operation.

f. Co A (-), 1st AT Bn

- (1) On D-1 provide 1 sec Ontos in direct support of BLT 1/3.
- (2) On D-2 provide 1 sec Ontos in direct support to 1st Bn, 11th Mar (-) (Rein).
- (3) Be prepared on D+7 to provide 1 sec Ontos each in direct support of both of 1st and 2nd Bns, 1st Marines for screening opns vic Nat'l Route #1.

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- (4) Remaining sections continue mission in present positions; be prepared to support screening opns along Nat'l Route #1.
- g. Co A (-), 1st Engr Bn. Attach Engr sqd to 1st and 2nd Bns, 1st Mar to provide demo and clearing opns. Remainder of company be prepared to support screening opns along Nat'l Route #1 as required.
- h. Co B (-), 1st Med Bn. Be prepared to provide medical assistance vic LSA (Upon arrival).
- i. Co B (-), 1st MT Bn
- (1) Provide support for LSA as required.
 - (2) Be prepared to provide troop lift support for screening opns on D+8.
- j. Det. Rad Rel and Const Co. Provide radio relay communications in accordance with para 5.d. (3) of ref (b).
- k. Co A (-), 1st SP Bn
- (1) Establish and control LSA, vic YD 328502.
 - (2) Attach HST to both 1st and 2nd Bn, 1st Mar (-) (Rein).
- l. Reserve Co, 1st Bn, 3rd Marines. Be prepared to move by helo or truck to reinforce Marine or ARVN forces in obj area.
- m. Coordinating Instructions.
- (1) D-Day. 11 Oct 67
 - (2) L-Hour. 0800H
 - (3) Reports
 - (a) Spot reports on Regt'l TAG Overload/Admin Net as incidents occur.
 - (b) Report seizure of assigned objectives.
 - (c) SitRep every 6 hours commencing 111200H.

- (5) On order units destroy all equipment/ammunitions which cannot be carried out of operating area.

- (6) Pyrotechnics.

(a) Be prepared to mark LZ's and front lines with air panels and/or colored smoke.

(b) Red star cluster - firing into friendly troops.

- (7) Use WP or HE to determine positions, if required. AO's available to fix positions.

- (8) If helo medevac is not feasible, carry casualties to LZ Dove.

- (9) Authentication and numeral code - KAC-QX. Operation Code - KAC-PX.

- (10) Ref time. 1400H.

- (11) Fire Support.

(a) Direct coordination with adjacent units is authorized.

(b) 1st Mar FSCC insures coordination with ARVN forces.

(c) SAV-A-PLANE requests submitted to 1st Mar FSCC.

(d) FCL will change only on order of 1st Mar FSCC.

(e) Fixed wing support available on request. Units contact Balance 14 on TACP Local Net upon request.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS:

a. Prescribed Loads.

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- (1) All units - 2 DOS all classes except class V. Class V will be basic allowance.
- (2) All units - carry salt tablets and Malazone tablets for 10 days, Malaria pills for 2 weeks.

b. Resupply.

- (1) LSA will be located at YD 328502. Dump level will be 5 DOS class I and V. Class I supplies have been computed on the basis of 2 meals per man per day. Unit Commanders be prepared to sustain operations on this rate of supply. Limited Class II, III and IV will be stocked in the LSA.
- (2) Following troop lift on D-Day and by D+2, 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines be prepared to receive and operate a temporary supply dump in LZ Dove with 2 DOS of Class I and V; assistance will be provided by Shore Party. Prior to final closing of LZ Dove, 2nd Bn, 1st Marines will issue and/or carry all items possible. Report to this Headquarters the weight and cube of each class of supply remaining. Upon approval by this Headquarters be prepared to blow in place all remaining supplies.
- (3) By D+2, 1st Bn, 1st Marines be prepared to receive and operate a temporary supply dump on Regt'l obj 5. Dump level will be 2 DOS of Class I and V; assistance will be provided by Shore Party. Prior to final closing of temporary supply dump issue and/or carry all supplies possible. Report to this Headquarters the weight and cube of each class of supply remaining. Upon approval of this Headquarters be prepared to blow in place all remaining supplies.
- (4) Units operating in the vic of temporary dumps will pick up their supplies. Other units will be resupplied by helicopter and/or truck and Otter from the LSA.
- (5) Battalions being supplied from the LSA will consolidate and submit requests from companies for a 2 day period. Requests will be submitted via the BST Log Net NLT 1700H on the day prior to desired date of resupply.
- (6) No routine resupply is planned prior to D+1.

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- c. Ordnance and Comm/Elect Contact Teams are available through the LSA. Units will specify item and probable cause of failure when requesting assistance from contact teams.
- d. Evacuation and Hospitalization.
 - (1) Medical evacuations via helicopter to central medical facilities as directed by DASC according to existing facilities and availability.
 - (2) Request medical evacuation via HST Log Net.
 - (3) A forward emergency aid station will be established in LZ Dove and at a point selected by CO, 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines. These aid stations will provide medical support for the operational troops in the area in case of nonavailability of helicopters or acute emergency medical situation which may arise in surrounding operational area. This forward aid station in LZ Dove will be comprised of "A" sections of the BAS of the battalions with assistance and control by the Regt'l Medical Staff.
 - (4) Evacuate wounded detainees and POW's to the LSA.
- e. POW's and Detainees. Collection Point at LSA. POW's must be tagged, bound, gagged and accompanied by a guard. Make maximum use of returning resupply helicopters and vehicles for this purpose.
- f. Personnel.
 - (1) A liaison team will be established at D Company, 1st Medical Battalion. The First and Second Battalions, 1st Marines and Headquarters Company, 1st Marines will furnish one (1) Marine each, to establish the liaison team. Personnel to be assigned to Liaison team report to Regt'l S-1 NIT 1300H on D-1.
 - (2) All personnel wear ID Tags.

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

1. Summary of Enemy Situation. The enemy utilizes the HAI LANG National Forest for base camps from which he launches his operations into the lowlands and around the city of QUANG TRI. The forest is Base Area 101, center of operations for command and control, infiltration terminus, training ground, and rest area for the 9th NVA Regiment and the 808th Main Force Battalion.

a. Order of Battle

- (1) General. There are three confirmed units presently operating within or near the objective area. They are elements of the 9th (AKA 5th NVA) Regiment, the 808th Main Force Battalion, and the Trieu Phong Local Force Company.
- (2) Organization and Composition. The 9th Regiment is composed of three battalions and five separate companies. The three battalions consist of the 3rd (AKA 416th), 814th, and 31st (AKA T-2 Sapper Bn). The five companies consist of the 11th Engineer Co, 12th AA Co, 13th Mortar Co, 14th RR Co, and the C-15th Co.
- (3) Disposition. The separate companies of the 9th Regt are reported in close proximity to the regimental headquarters.
- (4) Strength

(6) Tactics. Enemy units in the area have conducted operations ranging in size from squad size to regimental attacks.

(7) Training. The 9th Regiment is NVA unit; personnel are trained in NVN prior to infiltration. Besides normal infantry skills the units of the regiment are proficient in using supporting arms against troops, installations, and headquarters. 808th Battalion was a likewise highly trained organization, however recent captives from this unit indicate the replacement personnel receive less training.

(8) Combat Efficiency. The enemy organization and training together with his knowledge of the objective area enhance his ability to counter operations in the area.

2. Characteristics of the Area of Operations

a. Weather

(1) Temperature. Temperatures in October range from a high mean of 85 degrees to a low mean of 70 degrees.

(2) Precipitation. Precipitation will occur approximately 15 days during the month of October. The mean precipitation in the area is 20 inches for October.

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- (3) Thunderstorms. These storms normally occur during the late afternoon and generally last only a few hours. They are seldom violent, however strong surface winds do occur.
- (4) Visibility. Showers and thunderstorms reduce visibility to less than five miles for a brief period, and in more intense storms, to less than one mile. Visibility greater than 12 miles is not common.

b. Terrain

- (1) General. The area is located approximately nine miles south of QUANG TRI City. Foothills, hills and low mountains constitute the topography of the objective area.
- (2) Relief. The foothills extend inland from National Route #1, for an average distance of four miles, characterized by mild slopes and low rolling hills forming numerous complex compartments. Ground elevation averages from sea level at Route #1 to 50 meters at the base of the foothills. The transition to hills is moderate. Ridgelines of the mountains generally lie on a SW-NE axis. Progressing toward the SW terrain becomes increasingly dissected and rough. Small intermittent and perennial streams abound in narrow valleys and ravines.

c. Drainage. The drainage network features three river systems flowing northeast.

- (1) The SONG TRACH HAN is the northernmost river and the predominate waterway. This river enters from the west (YD 1840) drains the northern part of the area and continues northeast.
- (2) The SONG NHUNG is created by rainfall and feeder streams in the western highlands of the area.
- (3) The SONG THAC LA (Rach My Chanh) enters from the southwest and drains the southern part of the area.

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d. Vegetation

- (1) The Piedmont vegetation is characteristically paddyland with rolling hills covered by brush and shifting cultivation. Numerous open areas are caused by moderate erosion. Thickly vegetated brush and wet growth are often encountered in draws and the lower areas. Vegetation on the low ridges and hills varies from light brush to thickets with scattered clearings.
- (2) Progressing into the foothills, vegetation shows a moderate transition culminating in evergreen forest in the higher levels. Trees are commonly closely spaced and interspread with areas of dense brush. Canopy averages 30 feet in height. Grassland is in evidence in the valleys and frequently ranges up to 10 feet in height. The areas contiguous to streams and rivers are more thickly vegetated and are predominately forests of broad leaf evergreen trees, and grassland with scattered thickets of bamboo and brush.

- e. Surface Material. The soil is a fine grained clayey silt of shallow depth over a base of shale, sandstone, and conglomerate limestone. It is commonly firm; but briefly miry following rains.

f. Cover and Concealment

- (1) Some cover from direct fire weapons is obtained from the low rolling hills. However, the N. E. - S. W. axis of the predominate ridgeline and the relatively few significant land forms along avenues of approach cause cover from direct fire weapons to be considered poor to fair throughout most of the area.
- (2) Concealment is limited by low brush in the Piedmont and rated as poor for troops and vehicles. Progressing into the higher areas concealment of troops is considered good and is afforded by higher grasslands and more abundant vegetation.

g. Observation and Fields of Fire

- (1) The piedmont offers excellent observation and fields of fire occasionally restricted by thickets of low brush. The foothills afford good short range observation

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restricted only in areas of elephant grass and brush. Long range observation is generally poor due to the thickly forested terrain.

- (2) Fields of fire for indirect fire weapons are excellent throughout the lowlands and generally good in the foothills. The primary restriction is for short range indirect fire weapons to attain mask clearance in the canopy.

h. Obstacles.

- (1) Low areas of cultivation and wetlands will restrict cross country movement of vehicles to rid e lines, but fair to good movement can be obtained by troops on foot. In the higher areas, thick forrestation, severe dissection of terrain, and moderate slopes will negate vehicular traffic and appreciably slow and canalize troop movements.
- (2) The extensive drainage network and river system throughout the area will hinder NW - SE lateral routes of communication.

i. Avenues of Approach.

- (1) The area contains numerous secondary roads, oart tracks, and foot trails throughout the foothills. These features afford good mobility throughout a sector but are compartmentalized by rivers which necessiate access to Route #1 when moving from one sector to another.
- (2) Light duty and unimproved road networks normally run inland from Nat'l Route #1. These roads transit the populated areas bordering the river networks and generally terminate approximately three (3) miles inland of Highway #1.
- (3) Numerous foot trails enter the foothills running along a NE - SW axis. Sufficient information is not available at this time to develop a complete foothill trail camp.

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- j. Routes of Communication. The trails and waterways in the area constitute the principal routes of communication.

3. Essential Elements of Intelligence

- a. Determine if the enemy will employ delaying tactics against friendly forces, if so, where and in what strength.
- b. Determine the location of prepared rocket and artillery positions.
- c. Determine what type of tactical communications the enemy is employing.
- d. Determine the sources and supply points the enemy utilizes in the area.

ENEMY WEATHER AND TERRAIN

1. Weather. The weather was generally warm and humid with the average maximum temperature of 89, the average minimum temperature 67 and the mean temperature 78. The mean humidity was 78%. There was a total of 15.03 inches of precipitation occurring mostly in the afternoon and early evening which at times adversely affected visibility. North by Northeast winds prevailed with an average velocity of approximately 5-6 knots.

2. Terrain. Trafficability on all routes of communication remained good except for two brief periods of time. In one instance the pontoon bridge located at YD 275557 was out of operation for one day for repair and maintenance. On 25 Oct three culverts on route #1 located at YD 433446, YD 434441 and YD 434442 were destroyed making that portion of the road passable by small vehicles only. On 26 Oct, Co A, 1st Engz Bn repaired the culverts. Cross country mobility remained good for foot troops and vehicles except where limited by flooded rice paddies. The Quang Tri airfield was partially completed and handled helicopters and C-130 aircraft.

3. Enemy. Enemy activity in the RACR was limited almost exclusively to mining activity and small arms, sniper/harrassing fire. Notable exceptions were scattered mortar/grenade attacks against Battalion/Company Command Posts and patrol bases. During Operation Medina (11 Oct - 20 Oct) there were (3) major enemy contacts. Extremely heavy volumes of small arms fire and grenades were received. It was estimated that one contact was with a NVA/VC Battalion. The only positive enemy unit identification made during the operation was the 2d Bn, 9th NVA Regt identified by (3) POWs captured by 1st Bn, 3d Marines on 11 Oct 1967. As a result of debriefing units involved in Operation Medina, additional intelligence data about the Hai Lang Forest and Base Area 101 has been assembled. The data received has located many of the enemy's hertofore clandestine base/training areas. A new enemy method of indicating a mined/booby trapped area was discovered. A five pointed star woven from reeds was emplaced by the side of a trail 50M short of a trip wire rigged booby trap.

See Tab A to Section III for an enumeration of incidents and enemy losses during the reporting period. No comparison of enemy initiated incidents can be made since this is the first month in the Quang Tri area.

OPERATIONS

1. MISSION. The mission of the 1st Marines (Rein) in the QUANG TRI Area is to conduct search and destroy missions in the area West and South of QUANG TRI and in Base Area 101; provide for defense and security of vital installations in OA, establish combat base vicinity LA VANG, maintain an active ground surveillance program and conduct spoiling attacks throughout assigned OA to detect and destroy infiltrating NVA Forces. 1st Marines continues coordination with 1st ARVN Division and local GVN Forces in adjustment areas and provides support as approved by CG 3d Mar Div to 1st ARVN Division by conducting unilateral or combined operations; maintains reaction forces up to and including one infantry battalion with Regimental Command Group prepared to establish and operate a task force headquarters to provide assistance to US/GVN forces as directed; provide necessary security for Rough Rider operations in OA; and continue security responsibility for QUANG TRI airfield.

2. OPERATIONS. The First Marines conducts extensive combat patrols/ambushes and search and destroy operations as directed to accomplish its assigned mission within the TAOR. The First Marines conducted/participated in one (1) Battalion sized operation and three (3) Regimental sized operations during October, namely Operation Medina, Operation Liberty II, Operation Osceola. The First Battalion (-) (Rein) conducted a cordon and search operation vicinity THON THUONG XA (GS 3749) in cooperation/coordination with Fires ARVN Regiment on 25 October. During the period 11-20 October, First Marines conducted a search and destroy operation (MEDINA) against elements of the 9th NVA Regiment in Base area 101, HAI LANG National Forest Reserve. At the conclusion of Operation MEDINA, First Marines (-) (Rein) conducted Operation LIBERTY II, in support of the local Vietnamese elections during the period 20-23 October. First Marines (-) (Rein) is presently engaged in Operation OSCEOLA in support of the Regimental Mission within TAOR and surrounding areas. In addition First Marines chopped OPCON 2d Battalion (-) (Rein); First Marines to the Fourth Marines for operation GRANITE from 26-30 Oct 67 for search and destroy operation in Base AREA 114, Thua Thien Province, vicinity Hill 674 (YD 5121).

3. AIR SUPPORT AND DEFENSE.

a. General. Air support requirements were generally at a minimum during the month with the exception of 11-20 October during Operation MEDINA. During Operation MEDINA, air support was used extensively.

(1) Helicopters. There were 214,992 lbs of cargo and 2,587 passengers carried in October. There were no direct support helicopters available to the Regiment, each mission was requested individually, from Landing "B".

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(2) Fixed Wing.

(a) There were 67 close air support sorties during October. All sorties were TAC (A) controlled. Ordinance was dropped in the following amounts during October: 56,000 lbs by close air support aircraft and 46,000 lbs by TFQ 10.

(b) Airborne observers were responsive to requests and coverage was excellent during Operation MEDINA.

TRAINING

1. Quotas for formal schools were filled from within the First Marines. Each Battalion and Headquarters Company conducted their own GMS Training within their respective commands.

- a. Two (2) attended Embarkation School.
- b. Four (4) attended NCO Leadership School.
- c. One (1) attended Basic Ammo Tech School.

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4. FIRE SUPPORT COORDINATION (ARTILLERY AND NAVAL GUNFIRE)

a. Fire support coordination during the month of October was primarily establishment of procedures to be used in the new area of responsibility, QUANG TRI. The FSCC moved in three (3) increments during the re-location. The initial group arrived with the regimental tactical command section on 4 October, while the succeeding elements arrived on 9 and 16 October. Initial liaison was made with ARVN forces in the area, MACV Advisory personnel, and the 3d Marine Division FSCC. Procedures, in line with the policies of the 3d Marine Division, were utilized in setting up the operation of the 1st Marines FSCC. The supporting artillery began to relocate on 3 and 4 October, when the 4.2 Mortar Battery of the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein) moved with the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines to the new 1st Marines TAOR. They relocated in the LA VANG area at YD 337496. On 5 October, the command group of the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein) arrived and relocated at the 1st Marines CP. To provide artillery support until the remaining batteries arrived, coordination was made with "W" Battery (-) 1st Battalion, 13th Marines, located near the newly constructed airstrip at YD 311557. Additional support was obtained when three (3) 105 MM Howitzers (SP) of "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 40th Artillery were displaced from DONG HA to the new airstrip (YD 313552) on 7 October, and placed upon to 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein). Also on 7 October, "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein) arrived by air at DONG HA and moved by motor march into its new position at YD 334504. On 8 and 9 October, "B" Battery, 1st Battalion 11th Marines (-) (Rein) arrived DONG HA and displaced to their initial location at YD 332497. Coordination and liaison with FSCC personnel at both division and battalion level continued during the entire month to insure proper utilization of artillery fires. A continuing program of day and night H&I fires was established within the 1st Marines TAOR, to assist in control of the area. LtCol R. C. V. HUGHES relieved LtCol D. A. RAPP as commanding officer of the 1st Battalion 11th Marines (-) (Rein). "C" Battery remained in direct support of 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines and was placed under control of the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines in Da Nang.

b. MEDINA. In support of the Operation MEDINA the following artillery units were OpCon to the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein) "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marines located at YD 333469, was in direct support of the 1st Battalion, 3rd Marines. Also at the same location was "B" Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein)

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supporting the 1st and 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines. General support/reinforcing fire came from "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein), located at YD 334504; a section of the 1st Provisional 155MM Gun Battery located at YD 306559; and a section 175MM guns from "C" Battery 8th Battalion, 4th Artillery USA, located at YD 314552. Fire support coordination was controlled from the 1st Marines CP, utilizing the FSCC teams operating with the Battalion in the field. To insure positive communication during the operation, an artillery radio relay team was inserted at YD 298256 for the duration of the operation.

c. LIBERTY II. Supporting fire during this operation was provided by the batteries of the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines (-) (Rein), with all batteries located in their cantonment positions.

d. HILL 30. To provide better artillery coverage of the objective area, three (3) 105MM Howitzers from "B" Battery were moved to HILL 22 (YD 294538) on 31 October. "A" Battery continued to support from its cantonment position.

e. NAVAL GUNFIRE. During October, no ships were on station in support of the 1st Marines. NEF liaison was made with the 3d Marine Division to learn their methods of utilizing Naval Gunfire and ways of obtaining support.

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PART II
SECTION E
LOGISTICS

1. Logistic Situation. Logistics support for the Regiment (-) (Rein) has been adequate for the support of combat operations.

2. Supply. The supply situation is fair in view of the fact this Regiment moved from semi-permanent installations to field operations. Supply has depended primarily on FLSU-1 to user operations during the majority of the month. The last rough rider, 28 October 1967, has greatly improved the supply status. Subsequent convoys from Da Nang will bring up remaining supplies for 2nd Battalion. Supplies for all other units are now on position.

3. Maintenance. The maintenance of vehicles has been adequate in view of the movement from our previous command post. Additional 3rd echelon support will be required for this Regiment to support attached units. The number of miles to be traveled has decreased the 3rd echelon repair requirement, thereby compensating for the reduced capability at FLSU-1.

4. Services.

a. Motor transport support has been adequate with the assistance from 9th Motor Transport Battalion during the first two weeks of this month. Company B, 1st Motor Transport Battalion joined the Regiment on 15 October 1967. Additional assistance is given from 9th Motor Transport Battalion for heavy hauling of TD-15's, with tractor trailers.

b. A water point was established at the Regiment CP. This water point supports Headquarters Company, 1st Marines, 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines and 6 attached units. The total amount utilized is approximately 9000 gallons per day. This water point also provides showers. The water point at the new airfield, north of Quang Tri, was established by the MCB unit constructing the base and is utilized by the 1st Battalion 1st Marines and "B" Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. The showers set up by this unit are also utilized by the 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

c. A request for cantonments for each battalion and attached units and 1st Battalion, 11th Marines has been submitted. (CO, 1st Mar ltr 4/MSK/lm 4700 of 22 Oct 1967) This request consisted of tropical huts, bunkers, 3 hole heads, maintenance hard stands and messhalls. Approval has been granted for materials to repair 5 buildings at the Regimental CP by CG, 3rd Mar Div msg 230335Z Oct 67 and materials are being shipped to our CP.

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An additional message, 261230Z Oct 67 has been sent to CG, 3rd Mar Div for approval of the first increment and substitution of 5 tropical huts for the 500 man messhall.

d. Civilian laundry facilities have been established at each position. In addition the laundry at FLSU-1 at Dong Ha is available.

e. Exchange facilities consists of a truck going to each position for 1 day. Items carried are health and comfort items, cigarettes and magazines.

SECTION F
CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. On 3 October, 1967, the 1st Marines commenced displacement to QUANG TRI. The Regimental Headquarters established its CP at LA VANG Village, MAI LINH District vicinity YD 338508. The surrounding area is occupied by ARVN forces who have been conducting civic action projects in support of the GVN pacification plans for the province. Initial civic action projects were restricted to meeting various GVN, military, para military, CORDS, religious and professional personnel in the area in an attempt to determine existing policies and procedures and level of pacification.

2. The attitude of the people is considered more industrious and their aspirations more aggressive than formerly assigned area of civic action responsibilities. By comparison the individual's standard of living is higher; there are more paved roads leading to a larger business establishment within the clean well lighted city of QUANG TRI. The city itself is relatively small and rural oriented, but has many churches (Catholic, Buddhist, and one Protestant), schools, bus terminal, gas station and many merchants. There exist an air of economic business growth.

3. CORDS and MACV Headquarters are located in the city of QUANG TRI. Only one (1) RD team is located in the Regiments TAOR at YD 345496. A joint MEDCAP station supported by Hq. Co, Second Battalion, 1st Marines, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and the 1st ARVN Regiment has been organized, although as yet is not functioning. The surgeons from these units will cooperate together in providing medical assistance to the people of LA VANG Village. (approx 8,000 to 10,000 people)

4. No commodities were distributed during the month of October.

PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATIONS

1. The 1st Marines PsyOps section suspended operations for the duration of the 1st Marines move to QUANG TRI, until relative resettlement took place.
2. Initial liaison contacts were made with CORDS QUANG TRI, MACV Advisors QUANG TRI, and 3d Division PsyOps personnel.

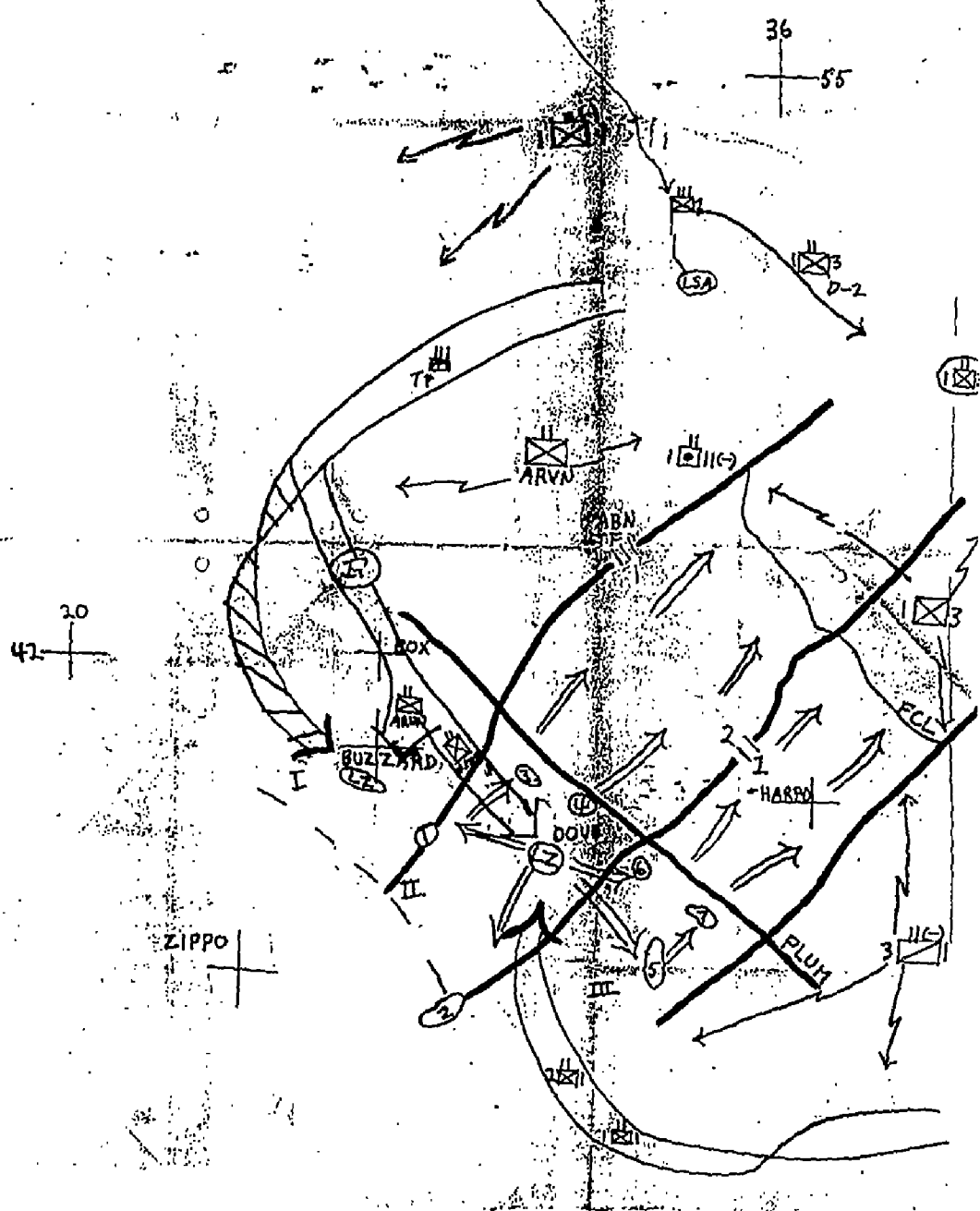

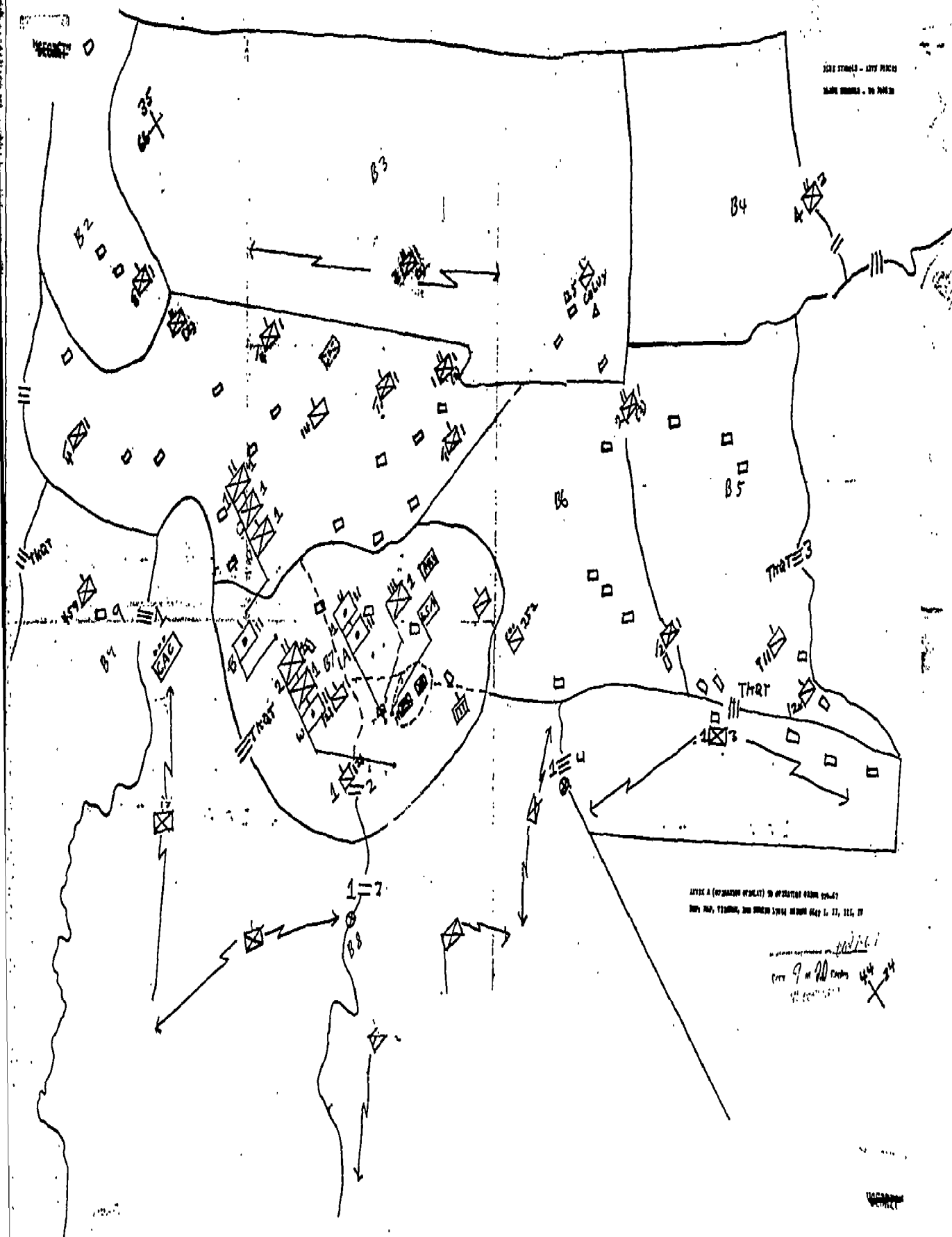

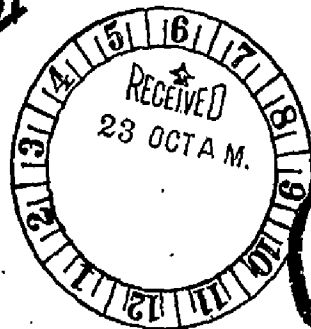

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.

1. Heading:

a. Unit or Section:

- (1) Enter designation of unit if this is a unit journal for regiment, air group, or smaller unit.
- (2) Enter designation of section if this is a section journal maintained by a general staff section.

b. Place: Enter coordinates or name of locality.

c. From: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is opened.

d. To: Enter date, time, and time zone that journal is closed.

2. Body:

a. Time In:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time information is received within unit. In most instances this would be TOR at unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time information is received within section.

b. Time Out:

(1) Unit Journal. Enter time outgoing information is delivered to addressee. In most instances this would be TOD by unit communication center.

(2) Section Journal. Enter time outgoing message is delivered to originator's communication center for transmittal, or time information is transmitted by releasing section.

c. Serial No.: Number each entry consecutively as information is received by keeper of journal.

d. DTG: Enter date/time group of radio message.

e. Incidents, Messages, Orders:

(1) Important incidents, messages and orders are recorded as they are made known.

(2) Although brief, entries must include all vital elements of information, such as what, where, when, how, and who.

(3) Original entries should not be altered, but should be supplemented or corrected by later entries when necessary.

(4) A synopsis of written or oral messages is entered in the journal, leaving the full account for the journal file and other supporting documents.

(5) Oral messages are reduced to writing and processed like written messages.

f. Action Taken: This column is used to indicate administrative action taken, such as, routing to cognizant unit staff officer(s), dissemination of pertinent information and/or filing of message. Some of the more common symbols used to indicate action taken are: "M", posted on situation map; "S", circulated to unit staff; "T", information disseminated to troops or subordinate units; "F", filed in journal file.

3. Ending:

a. Summary: A brief summary of major activities, with reasons underlying decisions, is entered in the journal at the close of each day. This is written in narrative form under the column entitled "Incidents, Messages, Orders."

b. Closing: Journals are closed daily or at the end of periods or phases prescribed by higher authority.

4. Journal File:

Journal file is considered a part of the journal. It contains messages, orders, records of conversation, and other documents supporting journal entries.
