On 23 January, 1st Battalion (-) (Rein), 11th Marines, assumed OpCon of Mortar Battery, 3d Battalion, 12th Marines. \*806 Bn, although reportedly in Base Area 101 at the commencement of NEOSHO II, has traditionally operated in Thua Thien Province and its early return to this area was expected.

Enemy activities in NEOSHO II area had consisted of light enemy contacts, sniping and harassing in the vicinity of rice transportation routes and approaches to Base Area 114--particularly in the Co Bi Thanh Tan area. Enemy intentions, as ascertained through agent reports and prisoner interrogation suggested that the enemy would attack in force before TET at one or more of the following: Quang Dien District Headquarters, Phong Dien District Headquarters, Phong Dien Resettlement Area, Pho Trach Bridge, An Lo Bridge, PK-17 and Huong Dien District Headquarters. Camp Evans was also occasionally mentioned as a target, presumably for a harassing or diversionary attack. As intelligence developed during NEOSHO II, the probability of ground attack on Quang Dien District Headquarters, with possible mortar attacks on other targets increased. An enemy battalion, probably the 806th was reported in the vicinity of Quang Dien on 21 January, the second day of NEOSHO II.

B. Contact in the objective area was extremely light. Presence of the 800th Bn in Base Area 114 was reconfirmed by POW interrogation. No significant enemy initiated activity occurred in the AO. Enemy efforts to interdict Route #1 were intensified, however, including extensive mining efforts and daylight sniping at small vehicles travelling alone or in pairs.

7. Mission. 11st Marines (-) (Rein) conducts search and destroy operations in Phong Dien District, and conducts patrols and ambush operations to interdict enemy lines of communications, maintains direct liaison with Phong Dien District chief and 1st Infantry Division (ARVN) Forces in adjacent areas, provides support as requested to 1st Division (ARVN) conducting unilateral or combined operations in Phong Dien District and maintains SPARROW HAWK platoon for rapid reaction. In addition, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducts extensive psychological operations, in assigned area of operations.

8. Concept of Operation. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) with one Battalion conducts search and destroy operations throughout NEOSHO II area of operations, conducts patrol and ambush operations to interdict enemy lines of communication, established and maintains company patrol base on Hill 51, YD 550282, and a platoon (Rein) on Hill 674, YD 515219, and maintains SPARROW HAWK at Camp Evans on thirty (30) minute alert.

- (7) Conduct extensive Psychological Operations in assigned sector of area of operation.

b. AT Company, 1st TK Battalion

- (2) Provide one platoon direct support 1st Battalion, 9th Marines.

c. Company A (-), 1st Engineer Battalion

- (1) Direct Support.
- (2) Conduct daily mine sweeps north on National Route 1 from YD 519347 to YD 623303.
- (3) Be prepared to conduct mine sweeps south on National Route 1, as directed.

d. Company A (-), 1st Shore Party Battalion

- (1) Direct Support.
- (2) Establish and maintain LSA at Camp Evans.
- (3) Provide support to detachment, FLSG-A as directed.

e. Company B (-), 1st MT Battalion

- (1) Direct support.

f. Company B (-), 1st Medical Battalion

- (1) Direct support.

- (2) Establish collecting/clearing facility at Camp Evans.

9. EXECUTION

a. 21 January 1968: Commencing 210001H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducted Operation NEOSHO II, in accordance with CG, 3d Marine Division message 180508Z January 1968, maintaining a company patrol base on Hill 51, YD 550223, a reinforced platoon OP on Hill 674, YD 515219, and conducting small unit combat patrols, OP's and LP's and ambushes within the NEOSHO AO.

(1) At 211100H, vic YD 536320, Marine detonated unknown type explosive device. Result, one USMC WIA MedEvac.

(2) At 211400H, Colonel S. S. HUGHES assumed command of the 1st Marines (-) (Rein), from Colonel H. E. ING Jr., Camp Evans, Phong Dien RVN.

b. 22 January 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to conduct Operation NEOSHO II, maintaining a company patrol base on Hill 51, a platoon (Rein) OP on Hill 674, and conducting extensive small unit patrols, OP's, LP's and ambushes within the area of operations.

(1) At 220800H, vic YD 600285, elements of D/1/9 received ten rounds of sniper fire from estimated two VC at YD 602282. Fire returned immediately and enemy position assaulted. Result, one VC KIA Confirmed and miscellaneous documents and individual equipment recovered.

(2) At 221005H, vic YD 601282, Marine detonated unknown type explosive device. Result, three USMC WIA MedEvac and one USMC WIA Minor.

(3) At 221140H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) directed by CG, 3d Marine Division to helolift 1/9 from Camp Evans to Khe Sahn.

(4) At 221447H, commenced lifting 1/9(-) to Khe Sahn. Companies A, B and D making initial lift. Company C/1/9 continues to provide company patrol base on Hill 51 and platoon OP on Hill 674.

(5) At 221541H, BLT-2/4 commenced landing at Camp Evans from amphibious shipping as replacement forces for 1/9.

(6) At 221852H, helolift of Command Group and Companies A, B and D, 1/9 terminated. OpCon 1/9(-) chopped to 26th Marines at 221900H. (1st Marines message 221115Z refers). Helolift of BLT-2/4 continues.

(7) Commencing 221700H, and terminating 221845H, 380 refugees were helolifted from Khe Sahn to Camp Evans. Refugees were billeted the night and fed by 1st Marines.

(8) At 222315H, helolift of BLT-2/4 terminated until first light. Command Group and Companies G and H currently ashore.

c. 23 January 68: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued operation NEOSHOO II with C/1/9 maintaining Company patrol base on Hill 51, and a reinforced platoon OP on Hill 674. C/1/9 awaiting relief of elements of BLT-2/4 at which time the Company will be helolifted to Khe Sahn. Helolift of elements of BLT-2/4 to Camp Evans continued.

(1) At 231105H, Company H/2/4 relieved elements of C/1/9 on Hills 51 and 674 and commenced maintaining Company patrol base on Hill 51 and reinforced platoon on Hill 674.

(2) At 231125H, helolift of BLT-2/4 completed. Company F/2/4 remains aboard amphibious shipping as Fleet Reserve Reaction Force. Assumed OpCon BLT-2/4.

(3) Commencing 231122H, helolifted C/1/9 and elements of H and S Company 1/9 to Khe Sahn. Lift completed 231432H. Chopped OpCon C/1/9 to 26th Marines 231450H.

d. 24 January 68: 1st Marines (-) (Rein), continued to conduct Operation NEOSHOO II, with BLT-2/4 maintaining a company patrol base on Hill 51, a reinforced platoon OP on Hill 674, and conducting small unit combat patrols, OP's and LP's and ambushes within the AO. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued preparations to Chop OpCon to 1st MarDiv/Task Force XRay at 2400H. No significant contacts.

(1) At 242400H, Operation NEOSHOO II terminated in accordance with CG, 3d MarDiv message 240350Z January 1968.

(2) At 250001H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) chopped OpCon to 1st Marines Division/Task Force XRay in accordance with CG, 3d MarDiv message 240350Z January 68 and CG, 1st MarDiv message 241345Z January 1968.

c. No close air support missions were conducted during NEOSHO II. Surveillance was conducted in all observed fire missions during the Operation.

11. Administrative Matters

a. Supply. During this operation, units were sustained through their own assets. No utilization of FLSG-A, Phu Bai was necessary.

b. Maintenance. Only 1st and 2d echelon maintenance programs were conducted when time was available.

c. Communications

(1) The Regimental Communications Platoon displaced into the 4th Marines CP at Camp Evans and assumed guard of all existing radio, radio relay, telephone and teletype circuits. The radio frequencies under regimental control remained at the geographical location for the 1st Marines use while Battalion frequencies remained with the using unit.

(2) During the period of time that the 1st Air Cavakry Division was assuming control of the Evans AO, the Regimental Communications Platoon provided communications support for that unit. Prior to the departure of the final elements of the 1st Marines from Camp Evans to Phu Bai, control of the AN/TRC-97 attached to the 1st Marines was turned over to the 1st Air Cav.

(3) No unusual communications difficulties were encountered during NEOSHO II Operations.

12. Special Equipment And Techniques. Negative.13. Commanders Analysis

a. Comment. Between 221700H and 221845H January 68, 380 refugees were helolifted from Khe Sahn to Camp Evans with virtually no forewarning to the 1st Marines. Although in the midst of lifting out 1/9 to Khe Sahn and receiving BLT-2/4 from amphibious shipping, the 1st Marines S-1, S-4 and S-5 were able to designate an area for the refugees, wire it off, erect sufficient tentage to house them and to obtain sufficient staples to sustain them for the night. Liaison was immediately made with CORDS representatives and arrangements made for transport of the refugees.

to the center at Quang Tri RVN. A Rough Rider convoy was organized and at 230930H, the refugees departed Camp Evans for Quang Tri.

Recommendation. Although this situation was handled expeditiously and efficiently, it was apparent to the 1st Marines that no plan had existed or had been established at any level for such an eventuality. Sufficient staples were not on hand to sustain the refugees for more than 24 hours. Organizations should maintain a contingency plan with the necessary supplies and equipment on hand for the handling and processing of refugees on short notice.

b. Comment. The tenure of 1st Marines (-) (Rein) at Camp Evans lasted from 20-28 January 1968; However, during this short period of time it became evident that with the requirement to conduct tactical operations and at the same time control, maintain and administrate a permanent camp the size of Evans, the ability of the organizations staff to fully plan and support tactical operations would be degraded over a prolonged period of time. The problems of utilities, trash, maintainence of roads and all the facets of running a camp became increasingly evident during the short stay of the 1st Marines.

Recommendation. That in an encampment, such as Camp Evans, a seperate entity be organized to establish, coordinate and operate the camp itself in support of the tactical units aboard, thereby relieving the staffs of tenant units of a great many administrative burdens inherent in the running of a camp which detract from the support troop operations in the field.

c. Comment. Upon arrival at Camp Evans, fire support coordination procedures followed those established by the 4th Marines. Ground clearance from ARVN units for fire missions was obtained by going through the Phi Bai FSCC. This process showed itself to be time consuming and appeared unnecessary. Permission was requested and obtained for 1st Marines to effect direct liaison and direct communications with District and Province Headquarters and ARVN units in the area for purpose of coordinating ground fires and speeding up the time required to clear fires. This procedure was successful.

Recommendation. That other Marine units, when dealing through a "third party" for fire clearance from adjacent ARVN units, give thought to effecting direct liaison as outlined above.

5. Supporting Forces

a. Helicopters. Helicopter support during the operation was minimal because of a general overcommitment of helicopter assets. However, helicopters were available in emergency situations and when dictated by the maneuver scheme.

(1) Supplies. 327,988 lbs of supplies were delivered during the operation.

(2) Troop Movements. A total of 4651 troops were carried by helicopter during Operation OSCEOLA. Of this total, 210 were medevacs.

(3) Medical Evacuations. During the operation, 175 medevac missions were completed and 692 sorties were flown.

b. Fixed Wing

(1) Airborne Observers. Airborne Observers flew a total of 75.3 hours. Coverage was generally responsive to requests.

(2) Close Air Support. During the operation, 53 sorties were flown, all under TAC (A) control. A total of 726,000 lbs of ordinance was expended by close air support and TPG-10 drops.

(3) Other. Flareships and spookies were available but reaction time was generally slow. Thirty minutes to an hour usually elapsed before the aircraft arrived on station.

c. Artillery

(1) Direct support was provided by 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines, with Batteries "A" and "B", and the 4.2 mortar battery. General support artillery was available through the 12th Marine Regiment at Dong Ha.

(2) While ARVN artillery was not utilized, the weapons of the 11th Artillery Battalion was available if required. These consisted of six 1-5 howitzers at La Vang, two 155mm howitzers at Quang Tri Citadel, and two 105mm and two 155mm howitzers at Hai Lang.

(3) The batteries of the 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines, occupied primary positions (cantonment positions) as follows:

On 31 October, three howitzers from Battery "B" were displaced to YD 294538 to support search and destroy operations in the vicinity of Hill 80 (YD 247443) returning to the primary position on 2 November.

On 19 November, 3 howitzers from Battery "A" were displaced to YD 338489 to support helicopter extraction after search and destroy operations in the vicinity of YD 360435, returning to primary position the same day.

On 8 December, Battery "A" displaced to YD 332469 to support a three day search and destroy operation in the vicinity of Hill 80 (YD 247443), returning to primary position on 12 December.

On 29 December, Battery "B" displaced to Camp Evans and was replaced by Battery "I", 3d Battalion, 12th Marines.

On 6 January, Battery "A" and the 4.2 Mortar Battery moved to Camp Evans, with Battery "G", 1st Bn, 12th Marines, occupying Battery "A"'s former position.

On 15 January, two 155 howitzers from 3d Bn, 12th Marines, were in position at YD 335502 and ready to fire.

On 20 January, the final elements of Hq Battery and the 1st Marines FSCC moved to Camp Evans.

(5) Communications were established between the 1st Marines FSCC and the Tactical Operations Center, Quang Tri Sector Headquarters, to provide rapid means of liaison and coordination of fire support.

(6) Artillery support for this operation was considered excellent. Naval gunfire. No naval gunfire support was utilized for the operation because the assigned Area of Operations was out of range for the 5" guns of destroyers, and no targets were encountered to justify use of 8" guns.

At the commencement of Operation OSCHEOLA, the enemy was considered to be reorganizing for a fall offensive aimed at Quang Tri City. His earlier plan for an attack on the city was believed to have been thwarted by Operation MEDINA, ARVN Operations on the "Street Without Joy" and the fact that USMC units were stationed in La Vang and Ai Tu areas in strength unknown at that time to the enemy. Primary source of information was S-2 Advisor to Quang Tri Sector, and MACV and Third Marine Division Area Studies.

b. No contact with the 9th NVA Regiment was made during Operation OSCHEOLA. Continued presence of its command elements deep in Base Area 101 was reported in low-level agent reports which also indicated that the Commander of the 9th NVA served as the military advisor to the Quang Tri-Thua Thien inter-provincial committee. There was no contact with any battalion of the 9th NVA and a possibility of its having combined with the main force battalions to replenish their depleted ranks exists. Contact with main force battalions was limited to the 808 (K-8) Battalion in the vicinity of YD 3742. ARVN operations on the coastal plain and agent reports suggested that the 808 and 416 Battalions alternated operations on the coast for the purpose of impeding RD efforts and gathering supplies.

The 814 Battalion was neither reported nor encountered during Operation OSCEOL. The R99 Company operated in the area indicated and was engaged by ARVN forces in the vicinity during January. The Trieu Phong Company was not encountered during Operation OSCEOL at any point in the Area of Operations. Operations in the area of its accepted location revealed no evidence of its base camp in that area, and the unit is believed to be concentrated in the Trieu Phong Plain where it conducts harassing attacks on the RD Teams, PF's and bridge security elements, and assists main force units when they move out of the Hai Lang Forest.

Low-level agent reports consistently report a build-up of newly infiltrated NVA units in the western section of Base Area 101 and in the Ba Lang Valley. No confirmation of the presence of new units has been obtained, but most frequently mentioned NVA units are the 95C Regiment and the 90th NVA Regiment, together with unidentified NVA artillery units. Elements of the 6th NVA Regiment, normally accepted as being in Thua Thien Province are also mentioned periodically by agents as having moved into the Hai Lang Forest or on the Hai Lang Plains/"Street Without Joy" area. Such reinforcements would be necessary if the enemy is to persist in his often stated intention of military penetration of Quang Tri City.

c. Local VC Actions:

(1) Among hamlets in the AO reported by RVN officials to be VC controlled were the hamlets of Nhu Le (YD 3147), Nhan Bieu (2), (YD 3150) and Thuong Phuoc (YD 3048). These hamlets, lying close to the center of the AO along the Thach Han River were the nearest access for the VC to the City of Quang Tri for political and economic purposes. All three were reported to be way-stations along a VC logistic and liaison route, and Nhan Bieu was in close proximity to the important Quang Tri Bridge on Highway #1, and within mortar range of all USMC fixed positions in the AO. Access routes to all three hamlets were found to be mined. Warning shots normally signalled the movement of friendly troops into the area, and sniping incidents were common.

(2) Nhu Le, focal point of the most serious mining incidents, was cordoned and searched on 27 November 1967. The cordoning company then moved into the hamlet, and a USMC unit remained there continuously since that time. Local governmental structure had become totally inactive, and is being re-introduced. USMC or GVN military forces in the hamlet will be necessary however, until the VC infrastructure has been totally eliminated. Occupation of Nhu Le has, however, resulted in a dramatic reduction in sniping, mining and harassment in that section of the AO. The local VC hamlet defensive platoon has apparently withdrawn from the Nhu Le area after initially attempting harassment of the Marines in the hamlet.

(3) Nhan Bieu, believed to be the hamlet which harbored the enemy forces which mortared Quang Tri Air Base on 15 December, was occupied on 19 December and has been occupied continuously except 30 December to 5 January when forces were not available to leave in the hamlet. Like Nhu Ie, this hamlet appears to have been totally VC controlled, and devoid of even the vestiges of RVN control. The hamlet of Thuong Phuoc, just south of Nhan Bieu is the final remaining VC controlled hamlet in the center of the Area of Operations. A local VC self-defense force platoon provides its defense force. This force apparently operated in both Nhan Bieu and Thuong Phuoc. Although mining in this area is not extensive, sniping is encountered whenever the hamlet is approached. Recent agent reports indicate that the local VC forces are being reinforced and re-organized south of Thuong Phuoc for the purpose of increasing harassment of USMC forces north of the Song Thach Han.

(4) Within the Area of Operations, the hamlets along the Nhung River, the small hamlet of Tan My (YD 2947), and such of the population as remains in the area leased for base development west of Quang Tri Airfield complex remain essentially under VC influence. In addition, VC influence in the area around Phu Long hamlet (YD 3447) is considerable, although RVN government structure has not been eradicated.

d. Increased construction of the Quang Tri Air Base and adjacent base camp construction has increasingly attracted the attention of the VC. Whereas at the commencement of OSCEOLA contacts and reports of enemy north of the Song Thach Han were relatively infrequent except in the vicinity of Mai Cau which was being relocated to make room for construction, it is currently common to encounter fire throughout the area and incidents of automatic weapons fire are increasing. Low-level agent reports confirmed by other sources indicate the presence of NVA reconnaissance elements operating in the vicinity of the abandoned village of Tan Vinh (YD 2354) and reconnaissance inserts in that area have made frequent contact with small units of NVA. The location of an NVA or VC unit of battalion strength in the western portion of the AO, north of the Thach Han River appears increasingly probable.

c. Monsoon weather encountered during OSCEOLA was relatively mild, with 16 inches of rainfall in October as the maximum encountered. No flooding occurred in the AO. Trafficability was as anticipated in the terrain analysis contained in Appendix B to the OSCEOLA Operation Order.

f. The attitude of the population in areas of government control and in contested areas was friendly but essentially passive. No information of significance was volunteered by civilians, with the exception of the Hoi Chonhs. Response to the Rewards Program for ordnance turned in, however, was intense. 370 major items of ordnance were turned in, as well as several thousand rounds of small arms ammunition. Local response to all Civic Action projects was good and no efforts to undermine them was encountered. The Area of Operations has several thousand North Vietnamese Catholic Refugees who relocated here in 1954. These people for the most part are strongly anti-communist. They have little land and rely mostly on trades and crafts for livelihood. Several projects to employ these people were developed and were well-received. Although the area has a large Catholic minority which is extremely influential, Buddhists form the majority of the population. The Buddhist leadership appears to feel somewhat alienated from the government, and may consider that the Americans favor the Christian groups over the Buddhists and, indeed, are hostile to Buddhism because of the religious prejudice. Efforts to counter this attitude have met with some success. Assistance to English Language Classes in Quang Tri City high schools was readily accepted. It is noted that the governments' mobilization program is greatly resented by high school students, but their attitude toward Americans is generally good.

7. Mission. 1st Marines (-) (Rcin) conducts search and destroy operations, provides for defense and security of vital installations, establishes combat base in vicinity of La Vang maintains an active ground surveillance program, and conducts spoiling attacks throughout assigned area of operations to detect and destroy infiltrating NVA forces. 1st Marines continues coordination with 1st ARVN Division and local GVN forces in adjacent areas and provides support as approved by CG, 3d Marine Division to 1st ARVN Division by conducting unilateral or combined operations. Further, 1st Marines remains prepared to provide reaction forces up to and including one infantry battalion with a Regimental Command Group prepared to establish and operate a Task Force Headquarters to provide assistance to US/GVN forces as directed.

8. Concept of Operations. 1st Marines (-) (Rcin) with two infantry Battalions conducts search and destroy operations in assigned area of operations, interdict enemy lines of communications and deprive enemy access to populated area through aggressive patrol activity. Provides defense and security to vital installations and combat bases within area of operations, and supports GVN low level structures (Province, District Headquarters, etc.) by providing reaction force to assist as directed. (See Reference (b)).

- (1) Conduct search and destroy operations in assigned sector to locate and destroy NVA/VC forces.

- (9) Be prepared to provide assistance in defense of Quang Tri Provincial GVN facilities.
- (10) Be prepared to displace one rifle company to southern sector A0 to provide blocking/screening positions at such time as Southern Sector Battalion is committed elsewhere in 3d Marine Division A0.
- (11) Be prepared to conduct such other operations as may be directed.

b. Southern Sector Battalion

- (1) Conduct search and destroy operations in assigned sector to locate and destroy NVA/VC forces.
- (2) Maintain active ground surveillance program and conduct offensive operations in sector to detect and destroy infiltrating forces.

9. Execution

a. 20 Oct 67: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) commenced Operation OSCOLA at 1800H in accordance with CG 3d MarDiv messages 200555Z, 201345Z and 201355Z October 1967, concentrating on extensive combat patrols, search and destroy operations, small unit ambushes, OP's and LP's to accomplish its mission, as outlined in paragraph 7 above. Operation Liberty II, which commenced at 200600H October 67 in accordance with CG 3d MarDiv message 131103Z October 67 and consisted of screening/security activities in support of GVN elections, continued concurrently.

b. 21 October 1967: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued Operation OSCOLA and Liberty II conducting combat patrols and security operations in support of local GVN elections. No significant contacts with VC/NVA forces; however, following contacts resulting in casualties occurred:

f. 25 October 67: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued Operation OSCEOLA. Companies A and B, 1/1, and Company E/2/1 moved into cordon positions around the hamlet of Than Thuong XA, YD 3850, as part of combined ARVN/USMC Cordon search operation. Remainder of 1st Marines continued to conduct extensive combat patrols, ambushes, LP's, OP's and defense of the Quang Tri Combat Base.

(1) At 251215H, vic YD 298489, elements of C/1/1 observed one VC fleeing from their location. Fired S/A, searched area and found one VC KIA confirmed and one carbine.

(2) At 010900H, vic YD 299465, while elements of C/1/1 were moving toward river crossing site, Marine detonated two explosive devices of unknown size and type. Results, one USMC WIA Medevac.

This is designed as a continuing program, meant to be revised and improved as developed. It is accompanied with a more complete troop indoctrination program in the area of mines/explosive devices to further reduce friendly casualties from mines.

(c) In conjunction with the 1st Marines cordon, commencing 270900H, four Regional Force Companies commenced detailed searches of both hamlets, two companies per hamlet. ddd. 20 January 68: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued Operation OSCEOLI, and continued plans and preparations for completion of displacement to Camp Evans and for turnover of the Quang Tri AO to 3d Marines in connection with Operation CHECKERS. 1/1 continued mission of Division Reserve, 2/1 remained OpCon to 9th Marines at Con Thien and 1/3 continued to provide security for the Quang Tri Combat Base. Operation "Mine Find" continued and the tactical/civil action operations in Nhu Le, An Don and Nhan Bieu continued.

(1) At 200940H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) completed displacement from Quang Tri to Camp Evans. Command Post at YD 338508 was closed and new CP at YD 536320 Camp Evans was opened. 1st Marines assumed responsibility for the NEOSHO area of operations from 4th Marines, assumed OpCon of 1/9 and chopped OpCon of 1/1 and 1/3 to 3d Marines at Quang Tri. 3d Marines assumed responsibility for OSCEOLI area of operations.

(2) During the period 200941H to 202400H, 1st Marines conducted operations in the NEOSHO area of operations coordinating with 3d Marines for the conduct and completion of Operation OSCEOLI.

(3) At 202400H, Operation OSCEOLI terminated in accordance with CG, 3d Marine Division message 180508Z Jan 68.

(4) Operation "Mine Find" in the OSCEOLA area of operations commenced with the operation at 202400H. Results of this two pronged program were as follows. 377 pieces of ordnance, rigged as mines, were found by Marines. Ordnance recovered through civilians sources numbered 370 pieces. c. Air Strikes/Artillery Missions. In those instances wherein close air support was utilized by 1st Marines, surveillance of the area was conducted immediately. However, approximately 6 percent of artillery missions were fired without surveillance due primarily to water barriers and the missions of units involved.

11. Administrative Matters

a. Supply. The supply situation during the course of the operation was adequate. FLSG-B, Dong Ha was our source of supply during the operation. The stockpile of Class I and V at the LSA was reduced to a bare minimum and only built up at temporary intervals for the support of helicopterborne operations.

b. Maintenacne. Monsoon rains and the lack of adequate maintenance facilities, ie. hardstands, hampered the 1st and 2d echelon maintenance program. 3d echelon maintenance for motor transport was good because of the cannibalization program at FLSG-B. General supply maintenance was adequate but often equipment evacuated to Da Nang was slow being returned.

c. Casualty Reporting. No problems were encountered in the actual treatment of casualties, their evacuation and/or hospitalization. However, problems were encountered in the reporting of casualties to the 3d Marine Division Casualty Reporting Control Center (CRCC). Failure to submit timely casualty reports and follow up administrative matters was due to the locations of the echelons involved and the overload on telephone communications. This was kept to a minimum by assigning personnel on a temporary duty basis to major points of hospitalization to obtain first hand information and relay it to the administrative echelon responsible for completing casualty reports.

d. Communications

(1) General. Communications for Operation OSCEOLA was controlled at all times from the Regimental Command Post at La Vang. Communications included sufficient redundancy such that communications were always maintained even though a specific circuit was temporarily out. The direction for Regimental Communication for tactical operations was provided by the Regimental COI (Regt 0 02000.1).

(a) Wire and Radio Relay linking telephone subscribers within the 1st Marines (-) (Rein) with each other and with the following trunk circuits available directly from the 1st Marines switchboard:

(b) Message center operations were enhanced by direct 60 wpm half-duplex, teletype circuits to both 1st Marine Division Headquarters and to 3d Marine Division Headquarters. A substantial degradation of service was noted in teletype communications with 3d Marine Division during the period 1 to 29 January, while the Division CP was moving from Phu Bai to Dong Ha. This degradation appeared to be attributable to insufficient teletypewriter assets at Division available to displace the CP, and resulted in several courier pickups of messages, some of which required action by the 1st Marines prior to the time of carrier delivery of the message assigning the task. The regiment provided comm guard for all organic organizations plus five attached companies and the D/S Artillery Battalion, 1/11.

12. Special Equipment and Techniques

a. Operation "Mine Find" as chronicled in paragraph 9, above, was a most effective means of combating a most effective enemy weapon, explosive devices utilized as mines. Combining the full resources of tactical operations as well as civil action and psychological operations provided the desired results of rendering this enemy weapon virtually ineffective and drastically reducing the number of Mine Casualties incurred as a result of mines.

b. The planned and programmed tactical, civil action and psychological operations in the hamlets of Nhu Le, Nhan Bieu and An Don proved the effectiveness of these efforts when combined and coordinated in combatting the insurgent Viet Cong and in accomplishing the desired results of destroying the Viet Cong forces, cutting him off from the people and fostering pro GVN as well as local government attitude among the Vietnamese people.

c. The 1st Marines utilized reconnaissance insert teams to a maximum extent throughout its AO, and found this to be a very effective means of monitoring, intercepting and disrupting enemy movement when organic forces were involved in operations elsewhere within or without the AO. The inserts were also used as flanking screens on battalion and larger size operations and proved effective as screening forces.

d. The 1st Marines insisted on a heavy training program in Counter Mortar firing for its direct support artillery. Constant drills were held both day and night. As a result, when the Lang Tri Combat Base was mortared on the night of 15 December 1967, the one occasion of mortaring during the conduct of OSCEOLA, artillery missions were on the guns, cleared and firing within moments after mortar flashes were observed. The heavy training had accomplished its purpose.

13. Commander's Analysis

a. Comment. As outlined in this report, the combined tactical/civic action and PsyOps operations in Nhu Le, Nhan Bieu and An Don hamlets, pooled the available assets of the command into a concentrated effort to deny the enemy access to these hamlets, or their use as harbor/storage sites, to foster pro-GVN attitudes among the Vietnamese and to further the GVN pacification program in a concrete way. The steps involved in this program are highlighted below.

(1) Troop experience and intelligence garnered from local MACV sources clearly marked the hamlets in question as VC hamlets - rest stations, storage and harbor sites, with strong VC infrastructures.

(2) Based upon this information, coordinated unilateral operations were conducted with 1st ARVN Division and Provincial forces to cordon off and search the hamlets, making maximum utilization of surprise prior to cordon, and maximum use of PsyOps' air leaflet drops and broadcasts prior to search.

(3) Upon completion of the coordinated search operations, Marine units established company patrol bases within the hamlets and conducted extensive search and destroy operations and ambushes within and around the hamlet area. These operations saw a marked decrease in enemy initiated contacts within a very short period of time.

(4) Continuous aerial leaflet drops and broadcasts, coupled with extensive use of Armed Propaganda Teams, made available to the tactical units, were made in an effort to educate the Vietnamese civilians as to the reasons for the presence of Marines, and the benefits of the GVN.

(5) When the point of "no contact" with VC forces was reached, civil affairs and PsyOps personnel, working through Province Headquarters arranged for return of Hamlet chiefs and elders to their respective hamlets. Local government was started, elder meetings held and the civilians became more prone to believe the material being purported by PsyOps personnel.

(6) Civil affairs personnel commenced MedCap and DentCap programs and program of self help for the hamletteers. MedCap response multiplied greatly in the matter of a few days. Marines, hamlet chiefs and elders were accepted by the hamletteers.

Recommendations. The program outlined above proved successful to the 1st Marines in stamping out VC activity and furthering the pacification plans of the GVN in three hamlets that had previously been totally VC dominated. Such a program, simply designed and effectively carried out could be considered by all units facing the same problems as 1st Marines experienced in Quang Tri.

b. Comments

(1) Operation "Mine Find" was initiated by the 1st Marines on 4 November, with the idea in mind that Marines searching only for mines and not conducting concurrent operations to destroy enemy forces, would discover more of these weapons and suffer less casualties as a result. Small areas of 1000 meters square were assigned to one rifle company reinforced with all the Regiment's available engineer mine detector assets. The company established security positions around the "Sweep Area" to allow searching units to operate with full concentration on locating mines.

(2) On 12 November the program was bolstered by a dual incentive program.

(a) Military - An incentive program was established to grant Marines discovering a mine or explosive device four days R&R in country.

(b) Civilian - An extensive PsyOps program was initiated, again in support of tactical operations. In a joint intelligence operations, civil affairs effort a concentrated program of aerial broadcasts, leaflet drops and "advertising" during medevacs was initiated to induce the local populace to turn in explosive devices and ordnance for financial reward.

(3) The program was successful - both from the military and the civilian mine rewards aspects. Combining the full resources of tactical operations and civil affairs/psychological operations provided the desired results of rendering a most effective enemy weapon virtually ineffective and drastically reduced the number of Marine casualties incurred as a result of mines.

Recommendation. That units encountering a large enemy mining effort within their area of operations adopt a program similar to that outlined above.

c. Comment. Upon initially arriving in the Quang Tri area, the 1st Marines encountered very evident dislike from the local Buddhists. The 1st Marines were said to be partial toward Catholics and anti-buddhist, and innumerable problems were foreseen in this area. However, through a continuing, persistent program of being firm, fair, courteous and impartial. 1st Marines were able to win over the Buddhists - even in the face of two serious incidents caused by Marines desecrating Buddhist temples. We were accepted as friends both of the Buddhists and Catholics - and were not labeled as being for one and against the other. It took an all hands effort but paid off in our relationships with the Buddhists.

Recommendation. That other Marine units encountering Buddhist opposition/dislike in their areas of operation, utilize a program similar to that outlined above - persistently and consistently being firm, fair courteous and impartial.

d. Comment. Upon initial arrival in Quang Tri, Fire Support Coordination Personnel made initial liaison with the Quang Tri MACV TOC, established no fire zones and free fire zones, as well as land line and radio communication and encountered no problem as far as ground clearance of fire missions was concerned. However, as time passed, and construction began on the Li Tu (Quang Tri) Airfield, it was discovered that, with the increase of aircraft traffic within the AO, 1st Marines never knew where the ARVN artillery units were shooting and thus could not advise friendly air of SAV-A-PLANES.

To counter this problem, liaison personnel were assigned to the ARVN firing batteries, and "hot line" communications established, thereby allowing 1st Marines an opportunity to get immediate information on ARVN Fire Missions and H and I fires in order to broadcast the SAV-K-PLINE information. This system of "hot lines" and liaison officers at the firing batteries and the 1st ARVN Regimental Headquarters also cut down the time required to obtain ground clearance for fire missions.

Recommendations. That Marine Units encountering the same problem as 1st Marines, ie, not knowing where adjacent ARVN artillery units are firing, establish liaison procedures similar to those outlined above.
