SECTION B

ENEMY WEATHER AND TERRAIN

1. Weather. The weather during the month of March was transitional, consisting generally of extended periods of warm, clear weather with occasional periods of Crachin conditions lasting several days. The average high temperature was 78.9 degrees. The average low temperature was 65.4. The mean humidity was 80.96%. The average visibility was 5.4 miles. The total rainfall for the month was 0.54 inches.
2. Terrain. All operations were conducted in the coastal plains around Phu Bai. Terrain proved no obstacle to the employment of infantry or tracked vehicles.
3. Enemy. Operation HUE CITY was completed during March with scattered light to moderate contact South and West of Huo. Operation FORD resulted in moderate to heavy enemy contact in Phu Tu district. Elsewhere in the AC, CAP's, bridge security and local forces had occasional light contact. Enemy forces appeared to be recruiting, retraining and resupplying for the most part, and generally avoided contact when possible. The enemy, however, appeared well-supplied with small arms, mortar and B-40 ammunition. Enemy morale, as evidenced by prisoner interrogation, was somewhat lowered, particularly among those engaged in Operation FORD where his forces were surprised and unable to break off contact. The opening days of March saw operations South and East of Huo in connection with Operation HUE CITY. On 1 March at 1700H, 1/5 elements ran airstrikes to neutralize

enemy emplacements and bunkers in the vicinity of ID 764230. A search of the area revealed 15 structures destroyed along with a 75 meter trench line and 20 NVA KIA (C). On 2 March at 1530H, units from 2/5 received S/A-A/W and 4 rounds B-40 rocket fire from vicinity ID 803246. Units returned fire and called JANE gunships. A search of the area revealed 6 NVA KIA (C). On 18 March at 1450H, 1/1 units received S/A-A/W fire from vicinity ID 977138. As units advanced they received heavy 82mm and 60mm mortar fire from an estimated battalion size unit. Unit called in arty and gunships. A sweep of the area revealed 45 NVA KIA (C), and 3 individual weapons captured. Also on 18 March at 1430H, 2/3 units made contact with an estimated 250 enemy at ID 947197. The enemy utilized small arms, 60mm mortars and RPG and B-40 rockets. After contact was broken a search of the area revealed 13 NVA KIA (C).

On 27 March at 0355H Phubai Combat Base was mortared and rocketed, receiving approximately 60x122mm rockets and 30x82mm mortar rounds.

At the close of the reporting period this regiment departed Phubai for CaLu.

4. See Tab A to Section B for an enumeration of incidents and enemy losses. All categories show decreases when compared to February since that month's total reflects the intense battle of Hue and the destruction of major enemy forces in the heaviest sustained action of the war. When compared to January, most categories show a decrease because of the enemy's efforts to avoid

contact while regrouping his forces. Because of the highly successful Operation FORC, however, which resulted in the entrapment of a sizable enemy force, the number of enemy killed in March was much greater than January's total and brought the total enemy killed by First Marines in 1968 over 2000. Total incidents (169 in January, 697 in February, 146 in March); VC/NVA INITIATED incidents (74 in January, 417 in February, 61 in March); VC/NVA KIA (183 in January, 1693 in February, 234 in March).

SECTION G
OPERATIONS

1. Mission. During this reporting period, the missions of the 1st Marines (-) (Rein) were changing in nature due to several changes in situation and location of units. These missions are outlined below.

a. During the period 010001H to 101200H March 1968, the basic missions of the 1st Marines (-) (Rein) remained unchanged, as stated in CG, Task Force XRay Operation Order 301-68, as follows: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) maintains responsibility for the Phu Bai TAOR and area of operations as assigned by CG, Task Force XRay, conducts offensive operations within assigned AO as directed, remains prepared to conduct offensive operations exterior to the Task Force AO as directed, remains prepared to conduct offensive operations throughout ICTZ as directed, remains prepared to deploy anywhere in RVN the following, in indicated time frame: one reinforced rifle company within four hours; one reinforced battalion minus above company, within twelve hours; the remainder of 1st Marines (-) (Rein) within an additional twelve hours; supports the Revolutionary Development Program within AO as directed, prepares specific reaction plans for each District Headquarters within assigned AO and for Province Headquarters at Hue, supports the Combined Action Program within AO, occupies specific installations within and participates in the defense of the Phu Bai vital area, provides security for the Col Co/Tan My fuel storage area, MCB operations and contractual dredge operations in the Col Co/Tan My area, provides security for the MCB rock crusher located at Nam Hoa, vicinity YD 743136, provides security for communication relay sites on Hill 180 (YD 855133) and Hill 230 (YD 848086), provides security for that portion of Highway One within AO and for the bridges located at YD 839176, YD 914117, YD 927103 and YD 950069, prepares plans for a one battalion operation in CUMBERLAND area in connection with engineer efforts to upgrade road and perform other engineer tasks, remains prepared to assume OpCon of 2d Battalion, 1st Marines on order. During this period, additional missions were assigned 1st Marines (-) (Rein) as follows:

(1) From 010001H to 022400H March 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducts final stages of Operation HUE CITY, conducting search and destroy operations within assigned AO, north of the Song Van Duong to locate and destroy NVA forces, logistics and weapons caches and return control of the area to the RVN in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 9-68. Area of operations is that area bounded on the west and north by the Song Huong to YD 766250, northeast along the west bank of the stream to YD 774268, then east along the west bank of the stream to YD 798290, on the east by NS Grid Line 81 and on the south by EW Grid Line 22.

(2) During the period 030001H to 101200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) provides security for the Hue LCU Ramp, and National Route 551 from YD 775228 to YD 830195, provides security for the bridge located at YD 752209 and for MCB upgrade operations at YD 781209 and YD 734234, provides security for the Hue Railroad Bridge at YD 775228, provides security for the road, fuel pipe line and Song Haong boat traffic from Hue to Co/ Tan My in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 11-68 (with change one).

(3) Commencing 081340H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) provides one platoon (Rein) as security for Sector C, Phu Bai Vital Area and maintains one Company (Rein) as a "BALD EAGLE" Reaction Force in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 14-68.

b. During the period 101200H to 281200H March 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) were relieved of certain areas and certain responsibilities by the 101st Airborne Division and their missions revised as follows: 1st Marines (-) (Rein) maintains responsibility for the Phu Bai TAOR and area of operations as assigned by CG, Task Force XRay, conducts offensive operations within and exterior to the Task Force AO as directed, remains prepared to conduct offensive operations throughout ICTZ as directed, remains prepared to deploy anywhere in RVN the following, in indicated time frame: one reinforced rifle company within four hours; one reinforced battalion, minus above company, within twelve hours; the remainder of 1st Marines (-) (Rein) within an additional twelve hours; supports the Revolutionary Development Program within AO as directed, prepares specific reaction plans for each District Headquarters within assigned AO, supports the Combined Action Program within AO, occupies specific installations within and participates in the defense of the Phu Bai vital area by providing one reinforced platoon as security for Sector "B", provides security for communication relay sites on Hill 180 and Hill 230, provides security for that portion of National Route One within AO and for bridges at YD 839176, YD 914117 and YD 950069, maintains one reinforced rifle company as a "BALD EAGLE" Reaction Force.

c. During the period 281200H to 312400H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) plans and executes a deployment from the Phu Bai Vital Area to the Ca Lu Combat Base to participate in planned operations in northern ICTZ under OpCon, CG, Provisional Corps Vietnam, and prepares plans for the execution of missions as assigned by the CG, Provisional Corps Vietnam and CG, 1st Air Cav Division. (CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 19-68 refers).

2. Operations. During this reporting period, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) accomplished its assigned missions as follows:

a. During the period 010001H to 022400H March 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) maintained security of the Nam Hoa rock crushing operations with Company C/1/1 maintaining a Company Combat Base vicinity YD 743136; maintained security of communication relay sites and bridges along National Route One with Company D/1/1 providing reinforced squads at the relay sites on Hill 180 and Hill 230 and reinforced squads at the bridges along National Route One at YD 839176, YD 914117, YD 927103 and YD 950069; maintained security in the Col Co/Tan My area with elements of Company E/1/1 providing security for the fuel storage area, MCB operations, and contractual dredge operations. Additionally 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducted the final phase of Operation HUE CITY with 1/1 (-), 2/5 (-) and 1/5 (-) conducting search and destroy operations in assigned AO North of the Song Van Duong to locate and destroy enemy forces, logistic and weapons caches, and return control of the area to the GVN. (CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 9-68 and 1st Marines Operation Order 3-68, with change one, refer). Operation HUE CITY which commenced 011230H February 68 was officially terminated at 022400H March 68 in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 11-68. Cumulative results were as follows:

Throughout this period 1st Marines (-) (Rein) provided security to the Phu Bai Vital Areas with a composite platoon from Headquarters, 1st Marines, 1/1 (-) and 2/1 (Rear) maintaining defensive positions in Sector "C" of the Base Perimeter.

b. Commencing 030001H to 101200H March 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued security for the Nam Hoa rock crushing operations with C/1/1 continuing to maintain a company combat base vicinity YD 743136; continued security for communication relay sites and bridges along National Route One, with Company D/1/1 providing reinforced squads at the relay sites on Hills 180 and 230 and the bridges along Route One at YD 839176, YD 914117, YD 927103 and YD 950069, continued security in the Col Co/Tan My area with elements of Company E/1/1 (-) securing the fuel storage area, MCB operations, and contractual dredge operations.

At 030700H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) dropped Command Group and Companies A and B (-), 1/1 (-) to 101st Airborne Division for participation in Operation MINGO, in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 11-68 with change one. 2/5 (-) commenced providing security for the Huu LCU Rep, National Route 551 from XD 775223 to XD 810293, the bridge located at XD 752209, for MC3 upgrade operations at XD 781209 and XD 784134, the Huu Railroad bridge at XD 775228 and for the road, fuel pipe line and Song Huong boat traffic from Huu City to Cai So/Tan My.

(1) At 041315H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) dropped 1/5 (-) to 5th Marines. Company L/3/5 remains in the Huu City area in support of 2/5 (-) operations. At 051030H, 1st Marines Forward Command Post returned from Huu City to Phu Bai. Commencing at 060900H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) participated in a 1st ARVN Division search and destroy operation east of Huu City with Company H/2/5 occupying blocking positions along the south bank of the Song Le Nong from XD 813197 to XD 858193. At 070700H, Company E/2/5 in support of 1st ARVN Division search and destroy operation, shifted its block positions to the north, vicinity XD 783230 to XD 783338. At 072400H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed OpCon Command Group and Companies A and B (-), 1/1 (-) from 101st Airborne Division in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay message 071427Z March 68.

(2) Commencing 0750H, 1/1 (-) with companies A and B (-), conducted a search and destroy operation from the Nam Hoa area to Huu City in accordance with 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Frag Order 45-68. The operation terminated at 081800H with 1/1 (-) establishing a defensive perimeter vicinity XD 776250. The operation succeeded in verifying the absence of enemy forces between Nam Hoa and Huu City.

(3) At 081030H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) dropped Company E/2/5 to 5th Marines and moved the unit to Phu Bai via motor vehicle convoy. At 081200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) dropped Company L/3/5 to 5th Marines and arranged transportation for the Company to proceed to 5th Marines Forward Command Post in the Cau Doi area. At 081200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed OpCon of Company E/2/3 and at 081340H assigned the company the missions of providing one platoon (Rein) as security for Sector "C", of the Phu Bai Vital Area perimeter, and maintaining the Company (-) as a "BALD EAGLE" Reaction Force. CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 14-68 and 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Frag Order 45-68 refer.

(4) Commencing 090700H, Company B/1/1 (-) replaced Company H/2/5 as block force for 1st ARVN Division search and destroy operation east of Hue City, maintaining blocking positions from YD 783230 to YD 783338. At 091345H, B/1/1 (-) was secured by the 1st ARVN Division and returned to the 1/1 (-) CP in Hue City. At 091345H, Company C/1/1 was relieved of security responsibility of the Nam Hoa rock crushing operations by elements of the 101st Airborne Division (USA) and returned by motor vehicle to Phu Bai Vital Area in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 16-68. At 091700H, elements of Company B/1/1 (-) were relieved of security responsibilities in the Col Co/Tan My area by elements of the 101st Airborne Division and joined the 1/1 (-) CP in Hue City, in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 16-68. 1/1 (-) and 2/5 (-) remained in Hue City, awaiting relief in place by elements of the 101st Airborne Division.

(5) At 100900H, 1/1 (-) and 2/5 (-) were relieved in place in Hue City and relinquished security responsibilities to elements of the 101st Airborne Division. 1/1 (-) returned to Phu Bai Vital Area at 1200H via motor vehicle convoy. At 1400H, 2/5 (-) departed Hue City via motor vehicle convoy, enroute to the 5th Marines Forward CP at Cau Doi. 2/5 (-) was chopped to the 5th Marines at 101530H. CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 17-68 refers.

c. Commencing 101200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued security of communication relay sites on Hills 180 and 230 and bridges along National Route One at YD 839176, YD 914117 and YD 950069 with Company D/1/1 providing reinforced squads at each of the locations, and maintained security of Sector C, Phu Bai Vital Area and maintained a "BALD E/GLE" reaction force with E/2/3 fulfilling these responsibilities. At 111200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed OpCon and AdCon of 2/3 (-) and chopped E/2/3 to 2/3 (-) at the same time. At 111810H, the displacement of 2/3 (-) from the Phu Loc area was completed. Command Group and Companies E, F and G located at Phu Bai. E/2/3 continued missions as assigned. 1/1 and 2/3 (-) commenced preparations to conduct offensive operations within and exterior to the Phu Bai TAD, as directed; specifically, both battalions commenced plans and preparations for participation in Operation FORD, in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 18-68 and 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Operation Order 308-68.

(1) At 140700H, Company A/1/1 assumed the mission as "BALD EAGLE" Reaction Force relieving B/2/3, in accordance with 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Operation Order 308-68. At 140730H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) commenced Operation FORD in accordance with CG, Task Force XRay Frag Order 18-68 and 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Operation Order 308-68. From 0730H to 0836H, 2/3 (-) helilifted from the Phu Bai Vital Area to LZ Penguin, secured the LZ and prepared to commence the attack on order. From 0730H to 1128H, AT Company (-), 1st Tank Battalion and Platoon (-), Company A, 3d Amtrac Battalion moved by armored convoy from Gia Le to a ferry crossing site at YD 898184, completed a river crossing, and linked up with 2/3 (-). 4. Fire Support Coordination (Artillery and Naval Gunfire)

a. General. The primary efforts during the month were devoted to preparation and conduct of Operations FORD and PEGASUS.

(1) In preparation for Operation FORD, liaison visits were made with the PBR unit at CALCO Beach and 1st Inf Division (AVN), to coordinate fire support with elements of those units participating in the operation.

(2) In preparation for Operation PEGASUS, liaison was made with 1st Air Cavalry Division Artillery and the Division FSCC to ensure preparedness to meet 1st Air Cavalry Division requirements in fire support coordination.

b. Operation HUE CITY. On 10 March, concurrent with the displacement of final elements of 1st Marines from Hue, Btry "A" return to its position in Phu Bai at YD 884127. The detachment of Mortar Btry (2-4.2" mortars) also returned to Phu Bai and were then displaced to Phu Loc under operational control of 2d Bn, 11th Marines. Mortar Btry (155 How) displaced to its primary position in Phu Bai (YD 888127) on 10 March. Btry "B" displaced from Nam Hoa to a position at YD 889128 on 9 March.

c. Operation FORD. 1st Bn (-), 11th Marines supported the operation from primary positions in Phu Bai. 1st Bn (-), 11th Marines received operational control of Btry "B", 1st Bn, 12th Marines which was emplaced at YD 891152. General support was provided by 1st Field Artillery Group with a platoon of 8" howitzers at ZD 012024 and the 1st 155 Gun Btry in Phu Bai. Detachment, Mortar Btry (2-4.2" Mortars) were attached to 2d Bn (-), 3d Marines for the operation.

d. Operation PEGASUS. In preparation for the operation 1st Bn (-) (Rein), 11th Marines, displaced by motor march to the vicinity of Ca Lu on 28 March, arriving there on 29 March and occupying firing positions as follows:

o. Naval Gunfire. For the final days of Operation HUE City in early March, USS JOHNSTON (DD 821) continued to provide naval gunfire support to the 1st Marines. For Operation FORD, Shore Fire Control Parties were provided for each participating battalion. Naval gunfire was primarily employed for preparations and harrassing and interdiction fires. A total of 792 rounds of 5"/38 were fired by USS James C OWENS (DD-776) in support of the 1st Marines during the Operation. From 20 March to 26 March, the OWENS continued support of the 1st Marines firing harrassing and interdiction fires along the coastal portions of the area of operations. USS HULL (DD 945) provided the same type of support on 26 and 27 March, at which time it was released to 5th Marines when 1st Marines commenced displacement for Operation NEGATIVE.



CIVIL AFFAIRS/CIVIC ACTION

1. During the month of March, Civil Affairs activities were limited due to the reluctance of the Vietnamese to cooperate fully with our Civic Action Program. This lack of cooperation was a direct result of the TET Offensive and the fact that the Vietnamese were afraid of reprisals from the NVA/VC if they cooperated with friendly forces. However, towards the end of the month the situation was starting to improve.
2. A Medoap program was started in two different locations, coordinates YD 914117 and YD 933085. Towards the end of the month both Medoaps were experiencing an increase in the number of people attending the Medcaps. Soap, toothbrushes, and toothpaste were also handed out at the Medcaps. A Dentcap was held at coordinates YD 933085 with moderate success.
3. Eleven houses were moved away from three bridges (coordinates YD 838176, YD 914117 and YD 933085), for security reasons, during the month. A large amount of scrap lumber was given to the families to assist them in building new homes. One-hundred bags of cement and one-hundred sheets of tin have been requested and will be distributed to the families involved as soon as the commodities arrive from Da Nang.
4. Several children's toys were received from a club in Vandergrift, Pennsylvania which is sponsoring a drive to collect toys for Vietnamese orphans. The toys were given to the S-5 of 5th Marines for distribution since the S-5 section of 1st Marines will not be in the Phu Bai area during April.

LOGISTICS

1. Logistic Situation. During Operation FORD an LSA was established at AGP-1 for class I and V supplies by personnel of "A" Co. 1st Shore Party Bn. Resupply was largely by aerial means, with some utilization made of otters, which were made available by Task Force XRay.
2. Supply. All classes of supply remained adequate. Shortages in replacement parts for Comm and Motor Transport are noticeable.
3. Maintenance. Great effort was made by FLSG-A toward repair of Motor Transport equipment.
4. Services.
 - a. Messing. There has been no improvement in the quantity of "A" rations available. Chicken a'la King remains the standard meal. The serious dust problem created in the contonement #2 messhall has been solved by moving to contonement #5.
 - b. Sanitation and Hygiene. The lack of sufficient water supply is still evident.
 - c. Laundry. Facilities are adequate.
 - d. Exchange. Facilities are adequate.
 - e. Medical and Dental. Facilities are adequate.
 - f. Transportation. Assets remain limited. Resupply efforts are hampered by the limited availability of trucks and air support.

Psychological Warfare Operations

1. During the month of March, 1st Marines (-)(Rein) logged 13 hrs and 25 minutes of aerial broadcasts and dropped 8,100,000 leaflets stressing rewards, Chieu Hoi, and enemy losses during the previous months.
2. Ground distribution of leaflets was negligible because transportation backlog prevented the delivery of leaflets to 1st Marines (-) (Rein). Over 200,000 leaflets on order were left for 5th Marines who relieved 1st Marines (-) (Rein) in the Phu Bai Combat Base area on 28 March 1968.
3. Psychological Warfare Operations were used extensively to support Operation FORD, a 1st Marines (-) (Rein) operation in the Phu Tu District area. Rewards were stressed to motivate an indifferent civilian populace. Other themes were Chieu Hoi, directed towards the NVA, good treatment of prisoners, and enemy losses. Leaflet drops in support of the Operation numbered 2,550,000. Aerial broadcasts of 5 hours 40 minutes, and ground broadcasts of one hour were conducted. One special leaflet was developed and utilized against the K-4B Battalion which was the main unit in contact with 1st Marines (-) (Rein) during the operation. Armed Propaganda teams were used successfully during Operation FORD resulting in the recovery of numerous weapons and two NVA returnees.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. During the first five days in March, the Regimental Communications Platoon remained split with personnel and equipment manning the Regimental and Regimental rear CP's at Hue and Phu Bai. On 5 March the Hue CP was displaced back to Phu Bai, and preparation commenced for Operation FORD.
2. The Second Battalion of the Third Marines changed to 1st Marine Regiment and displaced to the Phu Bai Combat Base. An AN/MRC-62 radio relay link was established between the Regimental Headquarters and the 2/3 CP to provide telephone communications.
3. The Communication Operating Instructions (COI) had become outdated with the move of the Regiment to Phu Bai. A new COI, Regimental Order P02000.1A, was published on 10 March to provide technical direction for Communications within the Regiment while in the Phu Bai area of operations.
4. A generator maintenance class was held at the Task Force XRay Headquarters on 11 March, and personnel who maintain generators within the communications platoon attended.
5. Operation FORD commenced on 14 March, and radio was the sole means of communications with the operating elements of the Regiment. Due to the decision not to displace the Regimental CP from the Phu Bai area, a manual retransmission team was dispatched to Hill 180 in order to provide positive radio contact with the distant units. Radio contact was generally good, except for occasional frequency interference from many organizations operating to the north of the 1st Marines AO. The operation secured on 20 March.
6. Planning commenced for Operation PEGASUS immediately upon the termination of Operation FORD. Verbal requests for equipment augmentation were placed with the 1st Division CEO. The AN/PRC-97 requested to provide communications for administrative, logistics, and air request channels was denied. The AN/FRT-1 multichannel systems (6 each) were provided, together with automatic radio retransmission modules for the AN/PRC-25.
7. The advance party, including almost half of the Regimental communication platoon, departed by truck convoy for Ca Lu on 28 March. The main body with the remainder of the communication platoon departed by truck convoy on 29 March.
8. The advance party arrived at Ca Lu on 29 March, and the main body with the Regimental Headquarters CP group arrived on 30 March. Wire


