On the morning of 13 February 1968 during the battle of HK City, Major THOMAS' Battalion was given the mission of moving by boat to the north edge of the city and to attack west to reduce the southwest corner of the walled city from which the enemy was launching vital installations immediately across the Perfume River and delaying operations in that portion of the city south of the river. Shortly after debarking and deploying in the hilly built up area the battalion came into contact with large enemy forces, well entrenched along the eastern wall of the city which formed the left boundary of the battalion's zone of action. Contact was heavy across the entire front but was particularly stubborn along the wall. The enemy was well entrenched along the base of the wall which provided excellent fields of fire against the attacking Marines while affording maximum protection to a tenacious and determined enemy. As the forward movement of his assaulting companies slowed on the right and all but stopped on the left in the face of the heavy volume of small arms, automatic weapons and rocket fire, Major THOMAS, realizing that units accustomed to fighting in relatively open or jungle

still, Major THOMPSON, recognizing that the enemy would fight more desperately as they were compressed into a smaller and smaller space in the succeeding days realized that eventual success in such close fighting could well hinge on the spirits of the troops at the end of this first and perhaps most critical day of extremely heavy and close fighting where ground gained could only be measured in yards. He therefore deliberately made repeated trips to all points of contact assuring the calm confidence and steady demeanor his men had come to associate with him in previous successful actions. His professional judgement in the impending demands of the battle and his tactical skill in meeting the unforeseen events associated with the will would alone have assured a successful day in the field, however, when combined with his personal examples of courage, confidence and calmness in the face of devastating and determined resistance provided inspiration to all who observed him and reinforced the will and spirit of his entire command fortifying them for the additional days of similar combat which were to follow before the enemy was completely routed from this sector of the city. His actions were instrumental in the successful accomplishment of the Battalion's mission.

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Statement of Major R. T. COOK, Jr. 074338 710

While serving as Commanding Officer of 1st Battalion, 5th Marines during Operation HUE CITY, 1 February 1968 to 2 March 1968, Major Robert THOMPSON guided his battalion in an exceptional manner. Demonstrating a calmness and professional bearing which was an example to all, he lead his unit through the Citadel of the old city of Hue in nine days of bitter and intense fighting with a force of NVA who defended from dug in and fortified positions within the Citadel wall and the city buildings. Hampered by poor weather and limited visibility which restricted the employment of supporting arms throughout most of the operation and, despite heavy casualties caused by close in fighting, Major THOMPSON maintained the highest morale and aggressive spirit expected of Marines. Mainly through his personal efforts the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines gained one of the most hard fought and significant victories of the Vietnamese conflict and demonstrated once again the devastating effectiveness of the Marine Infantry Battalion.

**MEMORANDUM FOR MAJOR HOWARD A. THOMPSON 07433/0001
0005, U. S. MARINE CORPS**

During the period 12 February 1968 through 3 March 1968, the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines participated in Operation IVAN CITY. From 13 February until 26 February 1968, the Battalion was assigned the task of clearing the enemy forest, estimated to be as much as a battalion, from the Southeast quarter of the village of IVAN. On 13 February, the battalion immediately came into heavy contact with a well entrenched enemy force along the eastern wall forming the left boundary of the battalion's zone of action. The enemy wall encompassed along the base of the wall which afforded excellent fields of fire as well as affording excellent protection from supporting arms. Later contact was developed throughout the zone of action with an enemy armed with automatic rifles, machine guns and rockets. The enemy was entrenched in a myriad of individually supporting positions in an extremely dense built-up area which was heavily vegetated throughout. The closeness of the terrain limited the effective utilization of direct fire weapons attached to the battalion. The problem was further compounded by an extremely small zone of action with only large caliber artillery within supporting range and they were positioned in such a manner that they were firing directly toward the attacking companies. Initially the battalion zone was only 700 meters in depth. As the companies advanced their distance was steadily reduced until fires had to be suspended altogether due to danger to advancing friendly forces. Additionally, the weather precluded the use of close air support except for two days.

Despite the limitations of supporting arms, the heavy machine, and the well entrenched enemy determined to fight to the death, the battalion was able to accomplish its assigned mission. This was principally due to Major THOMPSON's acute analysis of the situation, his tactical knowledge, his organizational abilities, and his ability to inspire his commanders and men by his control of the situation. His confidence in the success of the battalion and by his own personal example of fearlessness and calmness despite the gravity of the situation particularly during the first four or five days of the battle.

Major THOMPSON continually located his command group closer to the attacking companies to place himself in a position to better appreciate the situation and to ensure the closest coordination between supporting staff personnel and the attacking companies. Despite the heavy contact which raged almost continually from early morning to after dark for the first ten days, and the danger caused by the proximity of the Command Post to the front line Major THOMPSON continuously demonstrated

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his complete control of the situation. His close coordination of attacking companies, attached direct fire weapons, close air support, when available, and artillery demonstrated his complete mastery of the situation.

Major THOMPSON's personal courage was demonstrated on an almost daily basis as he made every effort to place himself in a position to assist and encourage his subordinate commanders. He visited the Company Commanders at their forward positions where he could gain a better appreciation for the circumstances that confronted them. His courage, confidence and his analytical ability to quickly size up the situation and decisively employ his supporting arms and forces undoubtedly gained him the complete confidence of his commanders, inspiring all down to, and including, the last rifleman, and contributed greatly to the ability of the battalion to accomplish its mission.

Major THOMPSON's performance of duty was only equaled by his genuine concern for his Marines. The initial heavy losses sustained by the attacking companies were clearly most painful to him personally. He quickly took every measure within his control to ensure the closest attention to the safety of his troops. His obvious concern and measures taken to ensure minimum danger to his personnel could not help but to gain him the confidence of every member of his command.

On 28 February, the battalion was again ordered into the attack to the northwest of the city of Rue. Again Major THOMPSON demonstrated his mastery of the situation, and his personal courage. Advancing closely behind or with the attacking companies, he was able to stay on top of the situation at all times. Again and again he placed himself in position to be of assistance to the unit most closely engaged. An example of several instances occurred on 1 March when Lima Company, 3rd Battalion, 9th Marines, OpCon to the 1st Battalion, found themselves heavily engaged with an estimated 50 to 60 enemy forces extensively entrenched near the eastern extremity of the Battalion Zone of Action. Major THOMPSON accompanied the reinforcing company in an effort to block the enemies avenue of retreat from the area of contact. As the blocking force neared its objective area, it received automatic weapons and rocket fire which temporarily halted its advance. The command group, at this time, found itself shelling the enemy trench positions among the attacking elements. Nevertheless, the Battalion Commander coordinated his supporting arms with the advancing units movement to overcome enemy resistance. This conduct of the Battalion Commander was typical of his actions and valor throughout the operation.

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His tactical proficiency, continued efforts to stay personally abreast of the situation and his concern for his men earned him the respect and confidence of his officers and men.

In extremely tense and precarious situations he remained cool and rational. In making vital decisions Major THOMPSON appeared to be alert, unwavering, infused with self-confidence. His aggressive spirit was both inspirational and contagious. Major THOMPSON is an extraordinary leader, and his performance in Hue deserves special recognition. Rarely have I witnessed such courage and depth of character.

During the 12 February 1968 through 3 March 1968 period, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines was engaged in heavy enemy action in Bao City and the surrounding areas against entrenched and heavily armed NVA regulars and hard core V.C.

Major THOMPSON, the Battalion Commanding Officer, during this period displayed extraordinary professional ability in his deployment and combat utilization of his Battalion and attached supporting arms. Under the most adverse of combat situations he maintained outstanding control of the battalion. In order to better appraise the tactical situation he maintained his Battalion Command Post within 200 meters of his forward elements and was subjected to small arms fire and mortars. Vitally concerned with his companies and the personnel within, he made numerous visits to the Company C.P.s to confer and advise the Company Commanders and insure that he was completely aware of the tactical situation in all company areas.

His masterful planning of a night attack and its successful execution during the early morning hours of 21 February 1968 were instrumental in the success of the battalion's mission.

Major THOMPSON's calmness under fire, professional ability and his outstanding personal leadership was an inspiration to all that served with him.

7. Supporting Forces

a. Helicopters. Helicopter support was generally outstanding throughout the operation. The positioning of two CH-46 and two UH-34 aircraft at Ca Lu proved to be a great asset, as these aircraft were able to work in the Ca Lu area long before early morning fog lifted sufficiently to permit aircraft to enter the area from Phu Bai and Huang Tri. These aircraft also proved invaluable on three occasions in retrieving medevacs at night under weather conditions which would have made penetration into the Ca Lu area impossible. Three Marine lives were saved as a direct result of these medevacs. The last

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ACD assigned one UH-1D for the daily use of the Regimental Commander; this aircraft proved to be an outstanding vehicle for C&C and recon purposes, due to its availability, flexibility, communications equipment and passenger visibility. Statistics on helicopter missions flown in support of the 1st Marines are as follows:

b. Fixed Wing. Low, broken overcast cloud ceilings in the area of operations drastically reduced close air support missions. The minimum lead time of 40 hours imposed for preplanned fixed wing missions made these requests impractical in a tactical environment. For example, if special ordnance and fuzing were required for LZ construction on Wednesday, it would have to have been requested on Monday. This lead time proved unrealistic as the tactical situation could change completely based upon Tuesday's movement. In addition, if the weather should prove to be bad at the time the flight was requested for Wednesday, it would then have to be rescheduled for Friday. The following fixed wing sorties were flown:

(1) Close Air Support. Forty-four sorties were flown delivering 121,000 pounds of ordnance.

(2) TPQ-10. Out of 63 TPQ-10 missions requested, only 13 targets were actually hit by 18 sorties which delivered 29,200 pounds of ordnance.

(4) Special FSCC Arrangements.

(a) During the conduct of Operation PEGASUS, the 1st Marines FSCC operated a station on the 1st Air Cavalry Division Air Advisory (Sav A Plan) net providing artillery warnings to aircraft in the vicinity of landing zones STUD, CA LU, AND JOHN.

(b) During the period 1-12 April, a liaison officer from 1-21 Artillery (DS Bn for 3d Brigade) was present in the 1st Marines FSCC to provide more rapid clearance and coordination across our common boundary.

(5) General Comments on Quality of Artillery Support.

Artillery support was highly effective and instrumental in the success of the operation. Some difficulty was encountered, particularly with danger close missions, in that it was difficult for observers to accurately locate targets in the terrain in the area of operations. The use of frequent marking and orientation rounds was recommended and proved effective. In addition, on all missions with friendlies within 1000 meters of the target, the mission was handled with danger close procedures and initial volley was smoke.

d. Naval Gunfire. No Naval Gunfire was utilized during the operation due to the distance of the Area of Operations from the sea coast.

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8. Intelligence

a. While an estimated enemy strength of 2 Divisions, the 304 and 325C, was anticipated in the general PEGASUS AO, only the 8th Battalion, 29th NVA Regiment was considered to be operating in the area of operations initially assigned to the First Marines. Overall intelligence estimate was based on order of battle information provided by the 1st Air Cavalry Division. The immediate estimate on the probable presence of the 8th Battalion, 29th Regiment was based on the historical presence of that unit as an element force between Cà Lu and Khe Sanh along Route 9.

b. Based on imagery readouts, extensive bunkers and fighting holes were anticipated. Mining along Highway 9 was expected.

c. Extensive bunkers were located, as expected. In addition to fighting positions near hill tops, the NVA had prepared elaborate systems of living bunkers--generally located in the deep ravines and in the proximity of streams. These bunkers showed evidence of recent use, contained large amounts of all types of material, and contained numerous documents connected with the 29th Regiment, and particularly with the 8th Battalion, 29th Regiment. The 8/29 is believed to have withdrawn northwest temporarily.

d. Enemy weapons captured were in serviceable condition, but were considerably more worn than those captured in recent operations by this Regiment. Many brand new uniforms, however, were captured, suggesting either the hasty abandonment of a supply point, or recent resupply of units.

e. Captured material indicated that the enemy was amply supplied with small arms ammo, mortar ammo, and grenades. On the other hand, there was some evidence from documents and interrogation of prisoners that food was scarce. Two POW's also commented on sickness in their ranks, describing symptoms which may possibly have been plague. They did not, however, comment on any deaths from the epidemic.

f. Documents and prisoner interrogation indicated the generally devastating effects of the B-52 strikes and other supporting arms. Letters commented on the fear which the attacks inspired. Prisoners attested to the casualties suffered in their individual units as a

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result of air and artillery. In addition, Montagnard refugees reported extensive enemy casualties from the bombing and artillery. Montagnards also reported a significant reduction in enemy forces in the Khe Sanh area commencing somewhat prior to PEGASUS. This appears consistent with other intelligence indicating that the 325C Division had withdrawn.

g. The only civilians encountered in the AO were Montagnard refugees who walked into friendly lines along Route 9. They were relatively indifferent, but not hostile toward U. S. troops. They wanted to go to Cam Lo virtually without exception, and expected to find a village there for Montagnard refugees. Most were aware that their village or hamlet chiefs had previously taken refuge at Cam Lo.

h. The enemy is believed to have made some efforts to booby trap Landing Zones, and to ambush or harass heliborne troops. Heavy landing zone preparation by artillery and air, however, generally purged the LZ's prior to the landing of troops.

i. Enemy mining activity on Highway 9 was directed primarily to the by-pass areas, and commonly included the emplacement of mines and explosives at varying heights in the same location-- either to cause explosion of increased force, or to result in detection of one mine but detonation of others buried beneath it.

9. Mission. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) displaces to and establishes CP in Ca Lu Base Camp not later than D-1; provides security for LZ STUD (XD 001484) and 1st Air Cavalry Division signal relay site (XD 978480); attacks to west, on D Day from Ca Lu, within assigned area of operations, to locate and destroy enemy forces and open National Route 9, and provides security for engineer upgrade efforts along National Route 9.

10. Concept of Operations. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) with three battalions enters assigned area of operations not later than D-1; secures LZ STUD (XD 001484) and 1st Air Cavalry Division signal relay site (XD 978480), attacks to west from Ca Lu with two battalions to seize critical terrain dominating National Route 9, uncovers Route 9 and continues attack to west, out of area of operations, on order. (Reference (b)).

a. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines.

(i) On arrival in area of operations, establishes CP in

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vicinity of LZ STUD (XD 001484).

(2) On arrival area of operations of combat support and combat service support units, assume opcon HST, 1st SP Battalion.

(3) Effect relief of 2nd Battalion 1st Marines of responsibility for Ca Lu vital area at time mutually agreeable, but not later than D-1.

(4) Provide security for LZ STUD/Ca Lu Combat Base through aggressive day and night patrolling and search and destroy operations within assigned area of operations.

(5) Assume responsibility for security of the 1st Air Cavalry Division signal relay site at XD 978480 not later than darkness, D-1.

(6) Be prepared to assume mission as Regimental Reserve, to reinforce 2nd Bn, 1st Marines and 2nd Bn, 3d Marines, or assume mission of either as directed.

b. 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines.

(1) On arrival of combat support and combat service support units in area of operations, assume opcon one platoon (-), 1st Engr Bn, and HST, 1st SP Bn.

(2) On arrival of 1st Bn, 1st Marines in area of operations, execute relief by that battalion of security responsibility for the Ca Lu vital area not later than darkness, D-1.

(3) Not later than darkness, D-1, effect relief of responsibility for 1st Air Cavalry Division signal relay site by 1st Bn, 1st Marines.

(4) At H Hour on D Day commence attack to west to seize Regimental Objectives 1 (XD 997468), 2 (XD 983462), and 3 (XD 988452).

(5) On order, continue attack to seize Regimental Objectives 10 (XD 966437), 11 (XD 951431), and 12 (XD 945436).

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(6) Be prepared, should enemy situation require, to seize Regimental Objectives 15 (XD 967467), and 16 (XD 954451).

(7) Be prepared to conduct clearing operations on Route 9 within AO.

(8) Be prepared to provide security for engineer upgrade efforts on Route 9 within AO.

c. 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines,

(1) On arrival of combat support and combat service support units in area of operations, assume opcon one platoon (-), 1st Engr Bn, and HST, 1st SP Bn.

(2) On arrival in area of operations and not later than darkness, D-1, execute river crossing vicinity YD 000450 and establish CP south of river.

(3) At H Hour on D Day, commence attack to west within assigned area of operation to seize Regimental Objectives 4 (XD 998442), 5 (XD 015440), 6 (XD 016431), 7 (XD 009428), and 8 (XD 998412).

(4) On order, continue attack to seize Regimental Objectives 9 (XD 988412), 13 (XD 958412) and 14 (XD 948421).

(5) Be prepared to provide flank security to support 2nd Bn, 1st Marines clearing operations on National Route 9.

(6) Be prepared to continue the attack to west, out of presently assigned area of operations, on order.

d. 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines.

(1) Direct support.

(2) On arrival in area of operations establish ~~artillery~~ firing positions capable of providing fire support throughout assigned area.

(3) Be prepared to displace to provide continuous fire support for manoeuvring units.

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(1) On D-1, assume responsibility for close in security for LZ STUD utilizing all tenant units within complex.

e. 3d Platoon, Company C, 3d Tank Battalion.

(1) Direct support.

(2) On arrival in the area of operations, establish CP vicinity Co Lu Base Camp.

f. 1st Platoon (-), AF Company, 1st Tank Battalion.

(1) Direct support.

(2) On arrival in the area of operations, establish CP vicinity LZ STUD.

g. Company A (-), 1st Engr Battalion.

(1) Direct Support.

(2) On arrival in area of operations, chop one platoon (-), each, to 2nd Bn, 1st Marines and 2d Bn, 3d Marines.

h. Company A (-), 1st SP Battalion

(1) Direct support.

(2) On arrival area, of operations, chop HST to each infantry battalion.

(3) Provide sufficient forces to augment 1st Air Cavalry Division FSA (LMA) for purposes of processing and handling 1st Marines (-) (Rein) supplies.

i. Company A (-), 1st MT Battalion.

(1) Direct support.

(2) Execute motor march from Phu Bai Combat Base to Co Lu as directed in 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Admin Order 309-66.

(3) On arrival area of operation, establish CP, vicinity LZ STUD.

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11. Execution.

a. Background.

(1) Commencing 201800H, March 1968, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducted extensive retraining and rehabilitation operations in preparation for the conduct of Operation PEGASUS. Replacement troops were received, assigned, equipped and trained; organic weapons, equipment and vehicles, were technically inspected and tested, and were repaired or replaced as necessary; 3000 M16A1 rifles with chrome chambers and barrels were received and issued as replacements for earlier model M16A1's on hand within the 1st Marines. Plans for the conduct of the operation were formulated, finalized and orders issued.

(2) At 270800H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of Company A (-) 1st Engineer Battalion, and Company A (-) 1st Shore Party Battalion in accordance with CG Task Force XRay message 261501Z March 1968. At 271600H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of 1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines in accordance with CG Task Force XRay message 260600Z March 68. At 280800H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of Company A (-) 1st ME Battalion, in accordance with CG Task Force XRay message 261501Z Mar 68. At 280945H, 1st Battalion, 5th Marines commenced relief of elements of 1st Battalion, 1st Marines providing security for communications relay site and bridges on National Route 1. The relief was completed at 281200H, and 1st Marines (-) (Rein) was relieved of responsibilities in the Phu Bai TAOR in accordance with CG Task Force XRay Frag Order 19-68.

(3) Commencing 281200H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) executed a deployment from the Phu Bai Vital Area to the Ca Lu Combat Base, to participate in planned operations in northern IOTZ under opcon of CG, Provisional Corps Vietnam, in accordance with CG Task Force XRay Frag Order 19-68. At 281200H, 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines and the advance party from Headquarters, 1st Marines departed the Phu Bai Vital Area via motor vehicle convoy enroute to Ca Lu. The convoy halted at the Dong Ha Combat Base at 281930H, RON, and continued to Ca Lu, arriving at the Combat Base at 291500H. At 291300H, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines departed the Phu Bai Vital Area via motor vehicle convoy enroute to Ca Lu. At 291400H, 1st Marines

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(-) (Rein) closed its CP at Phu Bai and opcon of the Regiment passed to CG, Provisional Corps Vietnam, in accordance with CG, III MAF message 251502Z Mar 68. At 291500H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) opened new CP at the Ca Lu Combat Base and reported opcon to CG, 1st Air Cavalry Division. At 301500H, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines, Co A (-), 1st SP Battalion, Co A (-) 1st Engineer Battalion and Co A (-) 1st MT Battalion arrived at the Ca Lu Combat Base. At 301700H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines from CG, 1st Air Cavalry Division. 2/1 was providing security for LZ STUD (XD 001484) and signal relay site (XD 978480) at this time. At 311400H, 1/1 relieved 2/1 in place and assumed responsibility for the security of LZ STUD and the signal relay site. 2/1 and 2/3 continued plans and preparations for the commencement of the attack in accordance with 1st Marines (-) (Rein) Operation Order 309-68 (Operation PEGASUS).

b. Operations

(1) 01 April 68. Commencing 0001H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) conducted night defensive operations with all units conducting defense of their respective CP's, ambushes, IP's and security patrols. Plans and preparations for commencement of the attack continued. At 0530H, artillery prep fires commenced on objectives 1 (XD 997468) and 6 (XD 016431). Fires were lifted at 0630H and at 0700H, 2/1 and 2/3 commenced Operation PEGASUS, attacking west to seize Regimental objective 1C and 6 respectively. At darkness, objectives 1, 2, 4, 6 and 7 had been secured. At 1500H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of 1st Plat Co A, 3d SP Battalion and at 1800H, assumed opcon of a Detachment, Whiskey Battery, 1st Battalion 12th Marines (2-4.2" mortars). Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

a. 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting night defensive operations until 0700H, at which time the units conducted local security patrols in the vicinity of their respective CP's, Company A at XD 003481, Company B at XD 999494 and Company D at XD 995483.

2 Company C/1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st Air Cav Division signal relay site, conducting night

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defensive operations until 0700H, at which time the company commanded local security patrol activity until darkness.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Commencing at 0700H, Companies E and H/2/1 attacked west to seize Regimental Objective 1 (XD 997468). The objective was secured at 0850H, at which time Company E continued the attack west to Regimental Objective 2, (XD 988462) securing it at 1442H, and consolidated night defensive positions on the objective. Upon the securing of Objective 1, Company H continued the attack to the south until darkness and established night defensive positions vicinity XD 991455.

2 Commencing 0700H, Company F/2/1 deployed along National Route 9 to secure bridge sites and provide security for engineer upgrade efforts along the road and at the bridges. By 1800H, bridges at YD 001452, YD 009451 and XD 994444 had been uncovered and Company F established night defensive positions vicinity XD 999446.

3 Commencing 0700H, Company G/2/1 assumed the mission of Battalion Reserve, moved west in trace of attacking units and provided flank security for the battalion's right flank. At darkness, the Company established night defensive positions vicinity XD 998456 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines.

1 Commencing at 0700H, Companies E and H/2/3 attacked southwest to seize Regimental Objective 6 (YD 016431) securing it at 0720H. Units continued the attack toward objective 7 (YD 009428) until 1500H at which time, company G/2/3 assumed the mission of E/2/3, continued the attack and secured objective 7 (YD 009428) at 1600H, and established night defensive positions thereat. Companies E and H/2/3 established night defensive positions vicinity YD 010424, and YD 014424 respectively. Company E assumed the mission of Battalion Reserve at 1500H.

2 Commencing 0700H, Company F/2/3 attacked west to seize Regimental objective 4 (XD 998442) seizing and securing it at 1100H. Company F continued the attack until

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darkness and established night defensive positions vicinity XD 995442.

(a) Incidents.

1 At 0710H, while attacking West to seize objective 1, Marine from H/2/1 vicinity XD 999468, was wounded by shrapnel from friendly 81MM mortar Prep Fires. Result, one USMC Medevac (NBC).

2 At 0730H, while clearing a trail with a machete vicinity XD 999468 Marine from H/2/1 accidentally suffered a severe cut on his right ankle. One USMC Medevac (NBC).

3 At 0800H, while conducting a stream crossing vicinity XD 998468, Marine from G/2/1 slipped and fell, severely rupturing and damaging loin muscle. One USMC Medevac (NBC).

4 At 1340H, while attacking west toward objective 7, E/2/3 received rocket and machine gun fire from friendly UHLB/C, resulting in one USMC KIA (NBC), eighteen WIA Medevac (NBC), and two USMC WIA Minor (NBC). Unit reverted to Battalion Reserve at completion of Medevacs in order to consolidate and reorganize.

5 At 1700H, vicinity XD 978488, two Marines from C/1/1 were making preparations for night defense and activated a trip flare which accidentally caused an M26 grenade to detonate. Results, two USMC WIA Medevac (NBC).

6 At 2125H, vicinity XD 998431, LP from G/2/3 received an unknown number of hand grenades from an unknown origin. Results, two USMC WIA Medevac and two USMC WIA Minor.

7 At 2130H, vicinity XD 998456, G/2/1, in night defensive perimeter, received 2 rounds 81/82mm mortar fire from unknown origin. Unit increased number and frequency of H and I fires within its assigned sector of the area of operations. Results eight USMC WIA Medevac and three USMC WIA Minor.

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(2) 02 April 68. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to ~~some~~ participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until 0645H at which time 2/1 and 2/3 continued the attack west to seize objectives 3 (AD 988452) and 8 (AD 996427) respectively. 2/3 seized objective 8 at 1015H and continued the attack toward objective 9 (AD 988412). 2/1 seized objective 3 at 1220H. From 1530H to 1725H, 2/1 conducted a heliborne assault into LZ Robin (AD 960445) in preparation for assault on objective 10 (AD 966437). 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and 1st Air Cav Div signal relay site. At 0830H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of 3d Platoon Company C, 3D Tank Battalion. At 1315H, CG, PCV and CG, 1st ACD arrived 1st Marines CP and departed at 1435H. At 1500H, 1st Marines (-) (Rein) assumed opcon of 1st Platoon (-), AT Company 3D Tank Battalion. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting night defensive operations until first light, at which time the companies commenced local security patrolling in the vicinity of their respective CP'S; Company A at AD 003482; Company B at AD 994490 and Company D at AD 995483. Additionally, Company D provided security for engineer minesweep teams along Route 9, west of the Ca Lu Combat Base.

2 Company C/1/1 continued defense of 1st Air Cav signal relay site, conducting night defensive operations until first light, and then conducting local security patrols in the vicinity of its CP at AD 978480.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Commencing at 0645H, Company E/2/1 continued the attack toward Regimental objective 3 (AD 988452), seizing and securing it at 1220H. The Company commenced plans and preparations to execute a heliborne assault into LZ Robin (AD 960445) in conjunction with G/2/1. The lift commenced at 1530H and was completed at 1725H, at which time Companies E and G consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

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2 Company F/2/1 continued to provide security for bridge sites at XD 001452, XD 009451 and XD 994444 and security for engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9.

3 Commencing at 0645H, Company G/2/1 attacked west in trace of Company E, to seize objective 3 (XD 988452). Objective was secured at 1220H, and at 1530H, G/2/1 conducted a heliborne assault into LZ Robin (XD 960445) in trace of Company E. Lift was completed at 1725H and both companies established night defensive positions vicinity of the LZ.

4 Commencing at 0645H, Company H/2/1 attacked southwest to effect link up with Company F along Route 9. Link up was effected at 1605H, at XD 989442. H/2/1 assumed mission of Battalion Reserve, established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines.

1 Commencing at 0645H, Company E/2/3 continued mission of Battalion Reserve and moved west in trace of attacking units until darkness, at which time the company consolidated and established night defensive positions vicinity XD 994438 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 0645H, Company F/2/3 attacked west to seize and secure Regimental objective 8 (XD 996427) securing it at 1015H. The Company continued the attack toward objective 9 in trace of Companies G and H, until the hour of darkness, at which time the company established night defensive positions vicinity XD 988427 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at 0645H, Company G/2/3 attacked west toward objective 8 (XD 996427) in trace of company F. Upon the securing of the objective by Company F, Company G continued the attack toward objective 9 (XD 988412) until the hour of darkness at which time the company established night defensive positions vicinity XD 973412 and conducted night defensive operations.

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4 Commencing 0645H, Company H/2/3 attacked west to seize objective 9 (XD 988412); the attack continued until the hour of darkness, at which time the company established night defensive positions vicinity XD 973412 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents.

1 At 0730H, vicinity XD 993457, F/2/1 observed a group of 29 VN, detained same, and returned the group to 1st Marines S-2. Interrogation revealed the VN to be refugees and the group was flown by helicopter to the Cam Lo Refugee Center. Results, 29 refugees.

2 At 1100H, while conducting a heliborne reconnaissance vicinity XD 997444, the Commanding Officer 2/3 observed numerous covered positions. UHIB/C's attacked the position, causing a secondary explosion. Surveillance revealed one NVA KIA. Confirmed.

3 At 1230H, vicinity XD 994445, elements of Company F/2/1 apprehended two unidentified VN, one female, and one male. VN were detained and forwarded to the 1st Marines S-2. Results, two detainees.

4 At 1700H, while securing LZ Robin vicinity XD 960445, Marine from E/2/1 detonated an enemy Claymore mine rigged with trip wire. Results, one USMC WIA Medevac.

5 At 1745H, vicinity XD 960445, Marine from E/2/1 detonated an unknown type explosive device rigged as a mine. Immediately after the explosion, E/2/1 was taken under fire with small arms by an unknown number of NVA/VC located at XD 963448. E/2/1 returned fire immediately with 600 rounds small arms and automatic weapons fire, and 40 M79 rounds. Two UHIB/C from 1st ACD delivered their ordnance with good target coverage. Supporting fires were lifted and unit assaulted the enemy positions. Assessment: one large bunker partially destroyed, two small bunkers totally destroyed. Results, one USMC KIA, five USMC WIA Medevac, three NVA KIA, Confirmed and two VN males apprehended and detained. Unit also recovered four AK47's, one B40 rocket launcher and one Chi Com grenade.

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DECLASSIFIED 6 At 1905H, vicinity XD 995491, platoon 2/1 observed two NVA in open at XD 994490. Unit took NVA under fire with 20 rounds 60mm, 4 rounds 3.5 inch rocket fire and 12 rounds 105MM HE. Results, two NVA KIA Confirmed.

7 At 2305H, vicinity XD 989442, H/2/1 received one incoming small arms round from unknown enemy position. Results, one USMC WIA Medevac.

(3) 03 April 68. 1st Marines (..) (Rein) continued to participate in operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until 0645H, at which time 2/1 and 2/3 continued the attack west to secure objectives 10 (XD 966437) and 9 (XD 988412) respectively. 2/3 seized objective 9 at 1400H and continued the attack northwest until darkness. At 1420H, 2/1 seized objective 11 (XD 951431). At 1450H, 2/1 seized objective 10 (XD 966437) and at 1630H, seized objective 12 (XD 945436) and then established night defensive positions. 1/1 continued to provide defense for LZ STUD and for 1st Air Cav signal relay site. At 031215H, ADC, 1st Air Cav Division visited 1st Marines CP and departed at 1605H. At 1500H, 1st Marines (..) (Rein) assumed command of 2d Platoon, Company B, 3d MT Battalion, 3d Mar Div. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B and D 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting night defensive operations until first light, at which times the companies conducted local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of their respective CP's; Company A at XD 003484 Company B at XD 994490; Company D at XD 995483. Additionally, at 1100H a reinforced platoon from A 1/1 was lifted from LZ STUD by 1st Air Cav Helos, touched down at XD 050442, and conducted search and destroy operation northwest to LZ STUD. D 1/1 provided a reinforced squad as security for engineer mine sweep operations west on Route 9.

2 Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st Air Cav signal relay site, conducting night defensive operations until 0700H, and then conducting local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

3 Commencing at 0750H, company E 2/1 attacked north to search bunker complex at XD 963448, the site of contact on 2 April 1968. Upon completion of the search, company E attacked southwest and at 1420H, seized and secured Regimental objective 11 (XD 951431). The company continued the attack toward objective 12 (XD 945436) securing it at 1630H, and established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

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2 Commencing at first light, company F 2/1 continued to provide security for uncovered bridges and for engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. By 1800H bridges at XD 994445 and XD 974434 had been uncovered. Unit established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at 1000H, Company G 2/1 attacked toward objective 10 (XD 966437) securing it at 1450H. The company consolidated on the objective and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, Company H 2/1, continued mission of Battalion Reserve and at 1000H, displaced from high ground onto Route 9 and moved west in trace of Company F. At darkness, Company H deployed to provide security for bridges located at XD 922443, XD 989442, XD 982441 and XD 994445.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines.

1 Commencing at 0630H, Company E/2/3 followed in trace of attacking units moving toward objective 9 (XD 988412). At darkness, the company consolidated defensive positions at XD 971430 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 1000H, Company F/2/3 attacked southwest, seized an intermediate objective at XD 968472, and continued the attack southwest until darkness at which the company consolidated defensive positions at XD 966921 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at 1000H, company G/2/3 continued the attack west to seize objective 9 (XD 988412), seizing it at 1400H in conjunction with Company H. Company G continued to attack northwest until darkness, established night defensive positions at XD 987461 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 At 0832H, Company H/2/3 was helilifted from XD 995420 to XD 995422, completing the lift at 0915H, and commenced the attack on objective 9 (XD 988412). The objective was secured at 1400H, and Company H continued to attack northwest until darkness, established night defensive positions at XD 989411 and conducted night defensive operations.

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(a) Incidents

1. At 0705H, at XD 936427 F/2/3 requested arty prep fire at XD 880427. Prep was repeat of previously fired mission. 14.2 inch mortar battery fired the mission with two rounds impacting on the F Company CP at XD 986427. Results, 3 USMC KIA (MBO) and 19 USMC WIA Medevac (MBO).

2. At 030750H which searching bunker complex at XD 963448, Company E/2/1 discovered one NVA KIA Confirmed, 14 AK47 magazines, 4 M26 grenades, 15 rounds 50 caliber ammo, 2 NVA packs, 2 first aid packs and miscellaneous items of individual equipment. All items forwarded to 1st Marines S-2.

(4) 24 April 68. 1st Marines (~) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. Commencing 0700H, 2/3 continued the attack to the west, securing objective 13 (XD 950412) at 1215H, and objective 14 (XD 948421) at 1315H. 2/1 conducted patrols 1000-1500 meters from objectives 10, (XD 966437), 11 (XD 951461) and 12 (XD 948436) and maintained security on engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STND and for 1st Air Cav signal relay site. At 1440H, ADC 1st Air Cav Division visited 1st Marines CP, and departed at 1547H. Throughout the day, battalion operations were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1. Companies A, B and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STND, conducting night defensive operations until first light and then conducted local security patrols, OP's, in the vicinity of the respective CP's, Company A at XD 003404, Company B at XD 994490 and Company D at XD 995404. Additionally, at 1144H, Company A/1/1 helilifted one platoon from XD 004482 into LZ at XD 004432, completed the lift at 1220H, and conducted search and destroy back to LZ STND; D/1/1 provided one squad as security for engineer mine sweep operations west on Route 9.

2. Company C/1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st Air Cav signal relay site, conducting night defensive operations until 0700H, and then conducting local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480. Additionally at 1144H, one platoon of C/1/1 was helilifted from XD 979480 to an LZ at XD 979495 and conducted search and

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destroy operations back to the signal relay site.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines.

1 Commencing at 0730H, Company E/2/1 conducted search and destroy operations north and east of objective 12 (ID 945436) until the hour of darkness and then established night defensive positions at ID 951431 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 0711H, Company F/2/1 conducted search and destroy operations north of Route 9 between objectives 3 (ID 988452) and 10 (ID 966437), and continued to provide security for bridge and engineer upgrade efforts west along Route 9 from the Ca Lu Combat Base. At darkness, the unit consolidated at ID 954638, established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at 0700H, Company G/2/1 conducted search and destroy operations from objective 10 (ID 966437) south to Route 9. At darkness the company established night defensive positions.

4 Commencing at 0700H, Company H/2/1 assumed the mission of Battalion Reserve, displaced from bridge site at ID 909452 to high ground at ID 975455, and conducted search and destroy operations in that area. At darkness, the company consolidated at ID 959443, occupied night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion 3d Marines.

1 Commencing at 0700H, Company E/2/1 attacked west toward objective 14 (ID 948421) and seized it at 1315H. Upon seizure, the company conducted a thorough search of the objective until darkness, established night defensive positions at ID 948421 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 0700H, Company F/2/3 attacked west toward objective 13 (ID 958412) seizing it at 1215H. Upon seizing the objective, the company conducted a thorough search of same until darkness, established night defensive positions at ID 951415 and conducted night defensive operations.

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3 Commencing at 0700H, Company G/2/3 attacked west in conjunction with Company E to seize objective 14, (XD 948421) seizing an intermediate objective at XD 963412, and the objective itself at 1315H. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 975415, established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at 0700H, Company H/2/3 attacked west toward objective 14 (XD 948421) in trace of company G. Enroute the company seized an intermediate objective at XD 963408. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 975415, established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 0500H, vicinity XD 971436, Marine from 2/3 was bitten by scorpion. Results one USMC Medevac (HBC).

2 At 0800H while conducting search and destroy vicinity XD 986445, 1st platoon F/2/1 discovered an unoccupied bunker complex and recovered 200 rounds 7.62, one gas mask, two holsters for U.S. pistol caliber .45, 6 M-16 rifles, 2 packs, 3 helmets, one 60mm mortar base plate and one shotgun. Equipment returned to the 1st Marines S-2.

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3 At 0805H vicinity XD 967431, elements of F/2/1 encountered 30 VN who requested to go to Cam Lo. The VN stated they had been traveling for four days, moving from the hamlet of Tra-Con. The VN further stated they had seen a small group of NVA on 3 April 68. The VN were escorted out of the area by the 2/1 S-2 for further processing. Results, 30 refugees.

4 At 1000H, vicinity XD 988444, Company H/2/1 discovered one NVA KIA, dead approximately 30 days, one dead body unknown, in clear plastic bag, and three bodies, completely decomposed, wearing USMC flak jackets and helmets bearing markings of K/3/9. Unit also recovered five M16's, one US 12 gauge shotgun, five CS grenades, fifty rounds M60 sixteen rounds 60mm, three laaws, one gas mask with cover, one pack, four cartridge belts, two .45 Holsters five M26 grenades, three M79 rounds, five helmets, three bamboo canteens, twenty rounds for AK47, and one NVA chow can.

5 At 1205H, vicinity XD 965429, mechanical mule, M274, conducting resupply for company F/2/1 detonated a 155mm round rigged under a box type mine. Results, one USMC KIA, one USN WIA Medevac.

6 At 1300H, vicinity XD 977435, bulldozer conducting upgrade operations on Route 9 detonated two T46 French manufactured mines. Right track and right track frame totally destroyed. Bulldozer evacuated to LZ STUD, no casualties.

7 At 1335H, vicinity XD 978416, elements of Company G/2/3 observed seven NVA approximately 100 meters to their front at XD 977416. Unit took enemy under fire with 168 rounds small arms fire, 12 rounds 105MM HE and maneuvered through the enemy position. Results, one NVA KIA confirmed and one AK47 recovered.

8 At 1825H, while replenishing water supply at XD 992445, Marine from H/2/1 fell on a rock and received severe blow to collar bone. Results, one USMC NBC (Medevac).

9 At 2100H, vicinity XD 978432, LP from G/2/1 detected movement near their position. Two NVA were observed on the road, two in the creek bed and two on the river bank. Unit opened fire with 5 rounds M79, and 20 rounds 81mm HE. Results one USMC WII Minor. No enemy assessment.

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(5) 05 April 68 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation MEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. Commencing at first light, 2/1 continued search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 10, (XD 966437), continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 and from 1140H to 1310H, helilifted two companies and a command group to LZ ROBIN (XD 960445) and conducted search and destroy operations in the area; 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objectives 13 (XD 958412) and 14 (XD 940421) and west from XD 974416 and XD 970427. 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUB and for the 1st ACD signal relay site. At 1025H, Maj Gen PEARSON, BGen IRBY and BGen VAN DYKE visited the 1st Marines CP and departed at 1045H. At 1700H, BGen DAVIS visited the 1st Marines CP and departed at 1725H. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B, and D 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUB conducting night defensive operations until first light, and then conducting local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of their respective CP's; Company A at XD 003484, Company B at XD 994490 and Company D at XD 995483.

2 Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for 1st ACD signal relay site, conducting night defensive operations until first light and then conducting local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Commencing at first light Company G/2/1 made preparations to conduct a heliborne assault into LZ ROBIN (XD 966445), and conducted the lift from 1140H to 1310H and then conducted search and destroy operations to the northeast until darkness; at which time night defensive positions were established and night defensive operations conducted.

2 Company E/2/1 continued to provide security for bridges and for engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, west from Ca Lu Combat Base. At darkness, the company consolidated defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at first light, Company G/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 10 (XD 966437) until darkness, at which time the company consolidated defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

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4 Commencing at 1148H, Company H/2/1, in conjunction with Company E and command group, conducted a heliborne assault into LZ ROBIN (XD 9604451), and conducted search and destroy operations to the northwest until darkness at which time the unit consolidated and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1 Commencing at first light, Company E/2/3 conducted search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 14 (XD 948421) until 1715H, at which time the company helilifted to the north side of the river at XD 977435, completing the lift at 1805H. The company established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 13 (XD 958412) until darkness, at which time night defensive positions were established and night defensive operations conducted.

3 Commencing at first light, Company G/2/3 conducted search and destroy operations west from XD 974416 until darkness and then established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, Company H/2/3 conducted search and destroy operations west from XD 970427 until darkness, and then established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 0815H, vicinity XD 956428, Company F/2/1 reported that a group of 57 civilians were approaching their lines. The civilians were determined to be Montagnard refugees and were processed to the 1st Marines S-2. Results 57 Refugees.

2 At 0930H vicinity XD 959437, G/2/1 discovered approximately 75. NVA bunkers, thatched huts, heavily constructed log cabins and a large command bunker. Unit recovered in excess of 100 pounds TNT, several hundred 60mm and 82mm mortar rounds, 100 chi com grenades, 1000 rounds small arms ammunition, documents, maps, packs, 15 directional mines, 25 frag mines and 2000 pounds of rice.

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Continuing the search in the same general area, the company additionally found 6 bunkers with thatched huts constructed on top, a galley combination mess hall, and recovered an additional 131 60mm rounds, 30 rounds 82mm, 100 pounds TNT, 20 directional mines, 30 frag mines, 55 chi con grenades, 100 blasting caps, 6 M1A1-L fuzes, one machine gun barrel and case, 20 AK-47 magazines, 5000 rounds AK-47 ammo, 500 rounds heavy machine gun ammo, 400 feet electrical cord, 400 feet trip wire, assorted pills and medicines, 7 L11WB, 1 M-16, 250 rounds 5.56. Ordnance items were evacuated to 1st Marines, all structures were destroyed.

3. At 1530H, vicinity ID 956428, Company F/2/3 observed 56 refugees approaching their position. Refugees were gathered together and escorted to the Battalion S-2 for further processing. Results 56 refugees.

4. At 1545H, vicinity ID 956428, Marine from E/2/1 fell and broke a bone in his lower right leg. Results, one USMC (NBC) Medevac.

5. At 1730H, vicinity ID 957436, Marine from G/2/1 was clearing an LZ when tree he was cutting fell on his left foot and broke his toe. Result, one NBC Medevac.

(6) On April 66 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and 1st ACD signal relay site, and provided security for engineer roadsweep activities along Route 9. From 1146H to 1332H, 2/1 conducted a heliborne assault from LZ ROBIN (ID 960445) to LZ KIWI (ID 966465), secured objective 19 (ID 970479) at 1600H and made preparations to seize and secure Regimental objectives 17, 18, 20, 21, and 22 in accordance with 1st Marines Frag 0 62-68. 2/3 assumed mission of providing security for bridge sites and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, helilifted E 2/3 from ID 945419 to ID 944424 between 0905H and 0950H, and commencing 0900H, helilifted Company G/2/3 from ID 971412 to ID 994438, completing the lift at 1054H. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows.

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1. Commencing at first light, companies A, B, and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting OP's and local security patrols in the vicinity of their respective CP's, Company A at ID 094404, Company B at ID 994490, Company D at ID 995483. At darkness the units consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

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2. Commencing at first light, Company C/1/1 conducted local security patrols and CP's in defense of 1st ACD signal relay site vicinity XD 978480. At darkness the company consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1. At 1145H, 2/1 conducted a heliborne assault from LZ ROBIN (XD 960445) to LZ KIWI (XD 966465) in accordance with 1st Marines Frag Order 62-68. The lift terminated at 1332H. Company G/2/1 attacked at 1332H to seize "regimental objective 19 (XD 970479)", secured it at 1600H and established night defensive positions on the objective at XD 970480 and conducted night defensive operations. Companies E, F, and H 2/1 established night defensive positions in the vicinity of LZ KIWI and conducted night defensive operations, E 2/1 at XD 964466, F 2/1 at XD 970480 and H 2/1 at XD 968463.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1. Commencing 0905H, E/2/3 conducted a helilift from XD 945419 to XD 944424. The lift was completed at 0950H at which time Company E assumed the mission of providing security for bridges at XD 966431, XD 965429, XD 956428 and XD 942423 and for engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. At darkness, the company established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

2. At first light, E/2/3 established a combat base at XD 960412 and conducted search and destroy operations in the southwest portion of the AO. At darkness, the company consolidated night defensive positions at XD 956428 and conducted night defensive operations.

3. Between 0900H and 1045H, Company G/2/3 helilifted from XD 971412 to XD 994438, established a patrol base at XD 995427 and conducted search and destroy operations until darkness at which time the company consolidated at XD 999432 and conducted night defensive operations.

4. Commencing at first light, H/2/3 conducted search and destroy operations in the eastern sector of the Battalion AO, vicinity XD 966465. At darkness, the unit consolidated defensive positions on bridges at XD 001452, XD 009451, XD 994444, XD 990443, XD 986439, XD 981437 and XD 974434, and conducted night defensive operations.

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(d) Incidents

1. At 1110H, vicinity ID 950427, Company F/2/3 reported that nineteen refugees were entering their perimeter. The refugees were escorted to the Battalion S-2 for further processing.

(7) 02 April 68. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and for the 1st ACD signal relay site and provided security for engineer road sweep activities along Route 9, 2/1 continued its attack in accordance with 1st Marines Frag Order 62-68, continuing search and destroy operations on objective 19, and seizing objectives 17, 18, and 21 by 1510H. 2/3 continued patrol activities within its assigned AO and continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1. Companies A, B and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting night defensive operations until first light, and then conducting local security patrols and OP's in the vicinity of their respective CP's, Company A at ID 003484 Company B at ID 994490, Company D at ID 995483. At darkness, units established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

2. Company C/1/1 continued to provide security for 1st ACD signal relay site, conducting night defensive operations until first light, then conducting CP's and security patrols in the vicinity of its CP at ID 978480. At darkness night defensive positions were consolidated and night defensive operations conducted.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1. Commencing at 1440H, Company E/2/1 was helilifted from LZ KIWI (ID 966465) onto objective 21 (ID 947444). Lift completed and objective secured at 1510H. Company E established a company patrol base on the objective and conducted search and destroy operations until darkness, at which time defensive positions were consolidated at ID 947494 and night defensive operations conducted.

2. Commencing at 0615H, Company F/2/1 attacked objective 18 (ID 976458) seized it at 1205H, established a company patrol base at ID 971461 and conducted search and destroy operations in the area

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until darkness, at which time defensive positions were established and night defensive operations conducted.

3 Commencing at first light, company G/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations on objective 19 (XD 970479) until darkness, at which time defensive positions were established at XD 970480 and night defensive operations conducted.

4 Commencing at 0815H, Company H/2/1 attacked objective 17 (XD 969458) seized it at 0937H, established a patrol base at XD 963466 and conducted search and destroy operations in the objective area until darkness, at which time defensive positions were consolidated and night defensive operations conducted.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1 Commencing at first light Company E/2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, west of grid XD 976434. At darkness the unit consolidated at XD 956428 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southwest sector of the Battalion AO until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 962418 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at first light, Company G/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southeast sector of the Battalion AO until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 999431 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, Company H/2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, east of grid XD 976434. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 978438 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 1615H, vicinity XD 955493, E/2/1 requested 15mm fire mission on suspected enemy routes of withdrawal at XD 944487. WP marking round was on target. Unit requested fire for effect (FE). Rounds impacted on friendly unit at XD 955493, resulting in 3 KIA NBC and one WIA EVAC, NBC.

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(8) 08 April 68 1st Marines (-) (Rain) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and 1st ACD signal relay site, provided security for engineer road sweep activities along Route 9, and also maintained one platoon, A 1/1, on 15 minute alert and the remainder of A 1/1, on 30 minute alert as reaction force for elements of 1/9 USA extracting remains from downed helo in the 9452 grid; 2/1 continued search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objectives 17 (XD 969458), 19 (XD 970479) and 21 (XD 947496) seized objective 22 (XD 961497) at 1600H, and conducted heliborne assault to objective 20, (XD 951480) securing it at 1026H. 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations within assigned sector of the AO and to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. At 1830H B Gen DAVIS visited the 1st Marines CP and departed at 1843H. Throughout the day battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B and D 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting OP's and security patrols in the vicinity of their CP's; Company A at XD 003483, Company B at XD 994490 and Company D at XD 995483. Additionally Company A maintained one platoon on a 15 minute alert status and the remainder of the company on a 30 minute alert status as reaction force for elements of 1/9 USA extracting remains from a downed helo in the 9452 grid.

2 Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st Air Cav signal relay site, conducting OP's and security patrols in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480 until darkness, at which time night defensive positions were established and night defensive operations conducted.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Commencing at first light, Company E 2/1 continued search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 21. (XD 947496.) Concurrently, one platoon attacked objective 22 (XD 961497), seizing it at 1600H. At darkness the unit consolidated at XD 946495 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 1010H, Company F 2/1 conducted heliborne assault from LZ KIWI to objective 20 (XD 951480), completing the lift at 1026H. The company established a perimeter base and conducted search and destroy operations. **DECLASSIFIED**

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area until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 952482 and conducted night defensive operations.

3. Commencing at first light, company G 2/1 maintained its positions on objective 19 (XD 970479) and continued search and destroy operations in the objective area. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 970480 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, company H 2/1 maintained its position on objective 17, (XD 9694581), conducting search and destroy operations in the objective area until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 968465 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2d Battalion, 3d Marines

1. Commencing first light, company E 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade operations along Route 9 west of grid XD 976434 and also conducted search and destroy operations north of Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 956428 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southwest sector of the Battalion AO. At darkness, the unit consolidated at XD 962418 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at first light, company G 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the south-east sector of the Battalion 40 until darkness, at which time the unit consolidated at XD 979431 and conducted night defensive operations.

4. Commencing at first light, Company H 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 east of grid XD 976434. At darkness, the unit consolidated defensive positions at XD 978438 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 1045H, vicinity XD 954481, F 2/1 while conducting search and destroy of objective 20, made contact with an estimated NVA squad, receiving heavy automatic weapons and small arms fire, and grenades, from positions ~~E/W~~ N/W.

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at XD 951482. Unit returned fire with automatic weapons, small arm and machine gun fire, 60mm mortars, M-79's and UH1E gunships, and swept area. Results, two USMC KIA, ten USMC WIA Medevac, one USMC WIA Minor, and seven NVA KIA. Confirmed.

2 At 1430H, vicinity XD 978480, C 1/1 reported that while an Army officer was removing his equipment from a helicopter, an M-26 grenade accidentally detonated. Results, two USMC NBC Medevac. Six USA personnel were also wounded, Medevac.

(9) 09 April 68. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and for 1st ACD signal relay site, and also helilifted B 1/1 from YD 003497 to XD 994515 and conducted search and destroy back to LZ STUD; 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objectives 17, 19, 20, 21, and 22; at 1330H helilifted F 2/1 from XD 950482 to LZ KIWI; 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations, provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 within AO. At 1650H B Gm DAVIS visited the 1st Marines CP, departing at 1710H. At 1720H, Maj Gen TOLSON visited the 1st Marines CP, departing at 1730H. Throughout the day, battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Companies A, B, and D 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD with companies A and D conducting OP and patrol activity in the vicinity of their respective CP's at YD 003484, and XD 995483. At 1225H Company B conducted a heliborne assault from YD 003497 to LZ at XD 994515 completing the assault at 1306H. The company conducted a search and destroy operation from the LZ to LZ Stud, completing it at 2030H. The unit consolidated defensive positions at XD 996483 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st ACD signal relay site, conducting OP's and security patrols in the vicinity of its CP, XD 978490. At darkness, the company established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(b) 2d Battalion, 1st Marines

L Commencing at 0725H, company E 2/1

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search and destroy operations from objective 21 (XD 947496) to objective 22 (XD 961497). At 1718H, the company was helilifted from objective 22 to LZ STUD and at darkness consolidated defensive positions at XD 997482 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F 2/1 continued search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 20 (XD 951480) until 1330H, at which time the company was helilifted from the objective to LZ KIWI (XD 966465). The lift was completed at 1435H. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 965468 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 At first light, company G 2/1 maintained its patrol base on objective 19 (XD 970479) and continued search and destroy operations in the objective area. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 970480 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, Company H 2/1 maintained its patrol base and continued search and destroy operations on objective 17 (XD 969458) until 1330H, at which time the company was helilifted from LZ KIWI (XD 966465) to LZ at XD 950483. The lift was completed at 1435H and Company H commenced search and destroy operations until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 950483 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2d Battalion, 3d Marines

1 Commencing at first light, Company E 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts west of grid XD 976434 and conducted search and destroy operations north of Route 9 within assigned area. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 956428 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southwestern sector of the Battalion AO until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 015444 and conducted night defensive operations.

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3 Commencing at first light, company G 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southeastern portion of the Battalion AO, until darkness at which time the company consolidated at YD 015444 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 At first light, company H 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 east of grid XD 976434. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 978438 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 1640H, while moving toward hill at XD 967500, E 2/1 at XD 966500 suffered several heat casualties, some requiring Medevac. Casualties were carried to suitable LZ and Medevac completed at 1700H. Results, one KIA NBC, two NBC Medevac.

2 At 2245H, vicinity YD 015475, LP from A 1/1 received 2 incoming grenades from unknown enemy position. Returned fire with 6 M-26 grenades and area of suspected enemy position searched with negative evidence of enemy casualties. Results, one USMC WIA Medevac.

(10) 10 April 68 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS conducting night defensive operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and 1st ACD signal relay site; 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objectives 19 (XD 970479) and 20 (XD 951480) and in the vicinity of LZ KIWI (XD 966465). 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in its assigned AO and continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9. At 1800H, the 1st Marines 10 was extended west along Route 9, and south, in accordance with 1st Marines Fwd 0 63-68. At 1155H, B Gen IRBY visited 1st Marines CP, departed at 1220H. Throughout the day battalion activities were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

(1) Commencing at first light, Companies A, B and D 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting OP's and local security patrols in the vicinity of their respective CP's, Company A at YD 003482, Company B at XD 998483, and Company D at XD 995483. Additionally, Company B 1/1 provided

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one platoon (-) in support of engineer minesweep operations along Route 9, and at 1247H, 2nd platoon D 1/1 conducted a heliborne assault from LZ STUD to LZ at XD 028503. The platoon completed the lift at 1324H, and swept back to LZ STUD. At darkness, the companies consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st ACD signal relay site, conducting OP's and local security patrols in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480. At darkness the unit established night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Commencing at first light, Company E 2/1 remained in the vicinity of LZ STUD. At darkness, the company established defensive positions at XD 998480 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 965468. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 965468 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 At first light, G 2/1 continued to maintain its patrol base on objective 19, (XD 970479), conducting search and destroy operations in the objective area. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 970479 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 At first light, Company H 2/1 continued to maintain its patrol base on objective 20, (XD 951480), conducting search and destroy operations in the objective area. At darkness, the unit consolidated night defensive positions at XD 950484 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1 At first light, Company E 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, west of grid XD 976434. At dark, night defensive positions were established, and night defensive operations conducted.

2 At first light, Company F 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southwest sector of the Battalion AO. At darkness the unit consolidated at XD 947427 and conducted night defensive operations.

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3. At first light, Company G 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southeast sector of the Battalion AO. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 993438 and conducted night defensive operations.

4. At first light, Company H 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts on Route 9 east of grid XD 976434 and to conduct search and destroy operations on the high ground north of Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 990443 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents There were no significant contacts during 10 April 1968, no casualties incurred and no casualties inflicted on the enemy.

(11) 11 April 68 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defense operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ SWUD and for the 1st ACD signal relay site; 2/1 continued search and destroy operations at LZ KIWI (XD 966465) and in the vicinity of objectives 19 (XD 970479) and 20 (XD 951480); 2/3 continued to provide security for the bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, and to conduct search and destroy operations in assigned sector of the AO. At 1640H B Gen DAVIS visited the 1st Marines CP, departing at 1659H. Throughout the day, battalion operations were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1. Companies A, B and D 1/1, continued to provide security for LZ SWUD, conducting OP's and local security patrols within the vicinity of their respective CP's, Company A at XD 093482, Company B at XD 998483 and Company D at XD 995483. Additionally, Company B 1/1 provided a platoon (-) as security for engineer minesweep operations on Route 9. At darkness, the companies consolidated and conducted night defensive operations.

2. Company C 1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st ACD signal relay site conducting OP's and local patrols in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480. At darkness, the company consolidated and conducted night defensive operations.

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1 Company E/2/1 continued to provide security for the 2/1 rear at LZ STUD until 1430H, at which time the company was helilifted from LZ STUD to objective 19 (XD 970479) to effect relief of lines with Company G. Lift was completed at 1613H. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 970479, and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing first light, company F/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of LZ KIWI until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 965468 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at first light, company G/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 19 (XD 970479) until 1430H, when relieved in place by Company E. By 1613H, Company G was helilifted to LZ STUD to provide security for 2/1 (Rear). At darkness the company consolidated at XD 998400 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, Company H/2/1, continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of objective 20 XD 951400. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 950404 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines.

1 Commencing at first light, company E/2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 west of grid XD 976434 and to conduct search and destroy operations on the high ground north of Route 9. At darkness, the unit consolidated at XD 924421 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at first light, Company F/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southwest sector of the Battalion AO. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 969423 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Commencing at first light, company G/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the southeast sector of the Battalion AO. At darkness the company consolidated at XD 993437 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at first light, company H/2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, east of grid XD 976434, and to conduct search and destroy

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operations on the high ground north of Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 987442 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 1655H, vicinity XD 971479 Company E/2/1 received five rounds small/medium artillery. Rounds came from unknown enemy position. Counter battery fires directed at suspected sites. Results, one USMC KIA.

(12) 12 April 68 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and the 1st ACD signal relay site; 2/1 adjusted forces in accordance with 1st Marines Frag Order 64-68, displacing companies E, F and H by helicopter into adjusted Battalion AO. 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations within AO and to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9, and also displaced companies F, G and H by helicopter in accordance with 1st Marines Frag Order 64-68. At 0855H, BGon GLICK USMC visited the 1st Marines CP and departed at 1000H. Throughout the day, battalion operations were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Company A/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD, conducting OP's and local patrols in the vicinity of its CP at YD 003482. Additionally, commencing at 1000H, A/1/1 displaced one platoon by helicopter from LZ STUD to LZ at YD 029502. Lift completed at 1020H. Upon touchdown, the platoon established a patrol base at YD 029502 and commenced search and destroy operations in accordance with 1st Marines Frag Order 64-68. At darkness A/1/1 (-) consolidated at YD 003482 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Companies B and D/1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD conducting OP's and local patrols in the vicinity of their CP's, Company B at XD 995492 and Company D at XD 995483. Additionally, Company D provided security for engineer minesweep operations along Route 9. At darkness, the companies consolidated and conducted night defensive operations.

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3 Company C/1/1 continued to provide security for the 1st ACD Signal Relay Site, conducting OP's and local security patrols in the vicinity of its CP at XD 978480. At 1410H, Company C displaced one platoon to LZ STUD by helicopter. At darkness, Company C(-) consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines.

1 Commencing at 1138H, Company E/2/1 displaced via helicopter from XD 970479 to LZ at XD 997428, completing the lift at 1230H. The company established a patrol base and commenced search and destroy operations along Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 998432 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Company F/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in vicinity of LZ KIWI. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 965467 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Company G/2/1 displaced from LZ STUD by foot to XD 987441, assumed responsibility for providing security for bridges and engineer upgrade operations along Route 9 within Battalion 40. At dark, the company consolidated at XD 987441 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Commencing at 1325H, Company H/2/1 displaced via helicopter from XD 950462 to LZ at XD 970420, completing the lift at 1400H. The company established a patrol base at the LZ and commenced search and destroy operations along Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 969423 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines.

1 Company, E/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the adjusted Battalion 40, south of Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 915380 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Commencing at 1440H, Company F/2/3 conducted a helicopter displacement from XD 969422 to LZ at XD 897402, completing the lift at 1515H. The company established a combat base and commenced providing security for bridges along Route 9 in the western sector of the Battalion 40.

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At darkness the company consolidated at XD 895426 and conducted night defensive operations.

4. Commencing at 1508H, company H/2/3 conducted a helicopter displacement from XD 987442 to LZ at XD 893425, completing the lift at 1548H. The company established a patrol base and conducted search and destroy operations in the vicinity of the LZ until darkness, and then consolidated at XD 893425 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents. There were no significant contacts during 12 April 68. No casualties were incurred, no casualties were inflicted upon the enemy.

(13) 13 April 68. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS conducting night defensive operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 continued to provide security for LZ STUD and for the 1st ACD signal relay site, and continued to maintain a platoon patrol base at YD 029502. 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations along Route 9 and at LZ KIWI and continued to provide security for bridge and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO; 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations within its AO and to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO. At 0945H, Provisional Battery, 1/11 (155's) displaced from XD 998483 to YD 014454. Throughout the day, battalion operations were as follows:

2 Company F/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of LZ KIWI until darkness, at which time the unit consolidated at XD 964467 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Company G/2/1 continued to provide security for the bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO and conducted waterborne boat patrols along the river adjacent to Route 9. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 987441 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Company H/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 969423 until darkness at which time the company consolidated at XD 969423 and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1 Company E/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations adjacent to Route 9 in the vicinity of XD 922377 until darkness at which time the company consolidated at XD 922377 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Company F/2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO. At darkness, the company consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Company G/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 927437 until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 927437 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Company H/2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 885425 and XD 875425 until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 891425 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

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1 At 1100H, elements 11th Engr Bn apprehended two VN males, suspected NVA, at XD 873396. Results two detainees.

2 At 1400H, G/2/1 sighted 14 civilians crossing river at XD 943423. Evacuated to 1st Marines S-2. Results, 14 refugees.

(14) 14 April 68. 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until first light. At first light, 1/1 provided security for LZ STUD and 1st ACD signal relay site, continued to maintain platoon patrol base at YD 029502, 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations along Route 9 and vicinity of LZ KIWI, continued to maintain security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 within the Battalion AO; 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations within BN AO and continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along Route 9 within BN AO. At 1120H, BGen GLICK USMC visited 1st Marines CP, departing, 1200H. Throughout the day, battalion operations were as follows:

(a) 1st Battalion, 1st Marines

The company continued to provide one platoon as a security element for LZ STUD. At darkness, Company C(-) consolidated at XD 978480 and conducted night defensive operations.

(b) 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines

1 Company E/2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 998432 until darkness, at which time, the company consolidated at XD 999431 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Company F/2/1 continued to maintain a patrol base and conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of LZ KIWI. At darkness the company consolidated at XD 964467 and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Company G/2/1 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO, and continued to conduct waterborne boat patrols along the river adjacent to Route 9..

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4 Company H 2/1 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 962411. At darkness, the company consolidated and conducted night defensive operations.

(c) 2nd Battalion, 3d Marines

1 Company E 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 922377. At darkness, the company consolidated at XD 922377 and conducted night defensive operations.

2 Company F 2/3 continued to provide security for bridges and engineer upgrade efforts along that portion of Route 9 within the Battalion AO. At darkness, the company consolidated night defensive positions and conducted night defensive operations.

3 Company G 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 927438 until darkness, at which time the company consolidated at XD 927438 and conducted night defensive operations.

4 Company H 2/3 continued to conduct search and destroy operations in the vicinity of XD 891425. At darkness the company consolidated at XD 873428 and conducted night defensive operations.

(d) Incidents

1 At 1305H, vicinity XD 964429, Marine from G 2/1 tripped on unknown type explosive device rigged as a mine. Results, two USMC WIA Medevac.

(15) 15 April 1968 1st Marines (-) (Rein) continued to participate in Operation PEGASUS, conducting night defensive operations until 0800H, at which time Operation PEGASUS was officially terminated. There were no contacts during the period 150001H to 230800H.

13. Administrative Mattersa. Supply

(1) All units left Phu Bai with 3 days class I and B1 of ammunition and required class II.

(2) Resupply, as outlined in the operation order was to be supply point distribution from a joint RLA/LSA and unit distribution to maneuver elements from a 1st Marines LSA by either helicopter or motor vehicle. The concept worked initially as envisioned with the exception of certain Marine Corps peculiar class V items. A list of these items had been given to the G-4 1st Air Cavalry Division on 23 March 68, detailing a 5 days supply to be stocked at LZ STUD. Unfortunately no action resulted from the subsequent message sent by 1st Air Cav to PCV requesting that these items be stockpiled. This resulted in 1st Marines having to draw these items from Dong Ha until approximately 10 April 68.

b. Maintenance Units performed 1st and 2nd echelon maintenance in the Ca Lu Combat Base. Higher maintenance required was accomplished by evacuating the item to Dong Ha or by contact team from FLSG-B.

c. Communications. Communication from the Regimental Headquarters to the battalions was provided by tactical radios, wire, and radio relay equipment. Communication from the Regimental Headquarters to the senior tactical command (1st Air Cav Division) was provided by radio, radio relay and teletypewriter. Additionally, communication from the Regiment to the senior administrative command (1st Marine Division) and to the Regiment's rear, were maintained by radio relay through 1st Air Cav Division and a teletype circuit to Task Force XRay.

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(1) Radio. Tactical communication to the battalions was primarily radio (FM). During certain phases of the operation, terrain prevented the use of radio vehicles by the battalions, hence a covered voice capability (KY-8) to the battalions was non-existent. The use of a log periodic directional antenna with a PRC-25 permitted FM communication with fixed units which could not be reached with the RC-292 antenna. High Frequency (HF) voice communication was established between the Regimental Headquarters at Ca Lu and Task Force XRay at Phu Bai by utilizing a MRC-83 radio jeep. This HF circuit provided the only communications with Phu Bai when the Army circuits were down. A similar HF configuration was also used to establish a radio teletype circuit to Task Force XRay which proved very reliable for the duration of the operation.

(2) Wire and Radio Relay. Wire was utilized as the primary means of communications within the CP area. Radio Relay was utilized to communicate to each of the battalions. The new PCC-1 radio relay equipment provided communications to 2d Bn, 3d Marines and 2d Bn, 1st Marines. Radio relay was also used to communicate with 1st Air Cav Division which, in turn, provided radio relay to the Phu Bai and Dong Ha. An AN/MRC-62 radio relay "shot" was established from the Regimental Headquarters to 3d Mar Div with the aid of a relay station located at the "Rockpile".

(3) Teletype. Teletypewriter communication was established with the 1st Air Cav Division and maintained throughout the operation via Army radio relay circuit. Another teletype circuit was established linking the Regiment with Task Force XRay. This circuit was established by utilizing the radio teletype capability of the MRC-83 radio jeep.

(4) New Equipment. The AN/PCC-1 radio relay equipment was used for the first time on a tactical operation in RVN. This light-weight equipment proved an invaluable asset in maintaining radio relay contact to the battalions. During the operation, the AN/PCC-1 was utilized between the Regiment and the 2d Bn, 3d Marines, as well as the 2d Bn, 1st Marines. An attempt was made at superimposing teletype over the AN/PCC-1. However, technical difficulties with the teletypewriter equipment made this attempt unsuccessful.

(5) Problem Areas. The voice communication circuits from Regiment to Dong Ha and Phu Bai were routed via Army radio relay links. Circuit cutages and system interconnect problems negated the usefulness of these circuits over fifty percent of the time. This experience reaffirms the need for a Regiment, when operating away from its parent command, to have separate communication facilities to maintain communication with the administrative and supporting headquarters.

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Extreme difficulty was also experienced due to radio frequency interference. The abundance of helicopters utilizing high power FM radios caused considerable interference on Marine Corps ground radio communication.

14. Special Equipment and Techniques.

a. Background. The AN/PCC-1 radio relay equipment is currently being introduced to selected FM units in Viet Nam. The PCC-1 lends itself to short range and intermediate range radio relay. At present short and intermediate range radio relay is provided by the AN/PRC-27 and the AN/MRC-62. Thus, for the purpose of comparison the PCC-1 can be evaluated with respect to these two radio relay systems.

b. Equipment/Operation. The AN/PCC-1 is a man packed unit having four major components - two modified PRC-25 radios, multiplexer, control unit and antenna assembly. The PCC-1 may be powered by batteries (BA-386 or BB-451), vehicle power or 60 cycle AC. The frequency spectrum utilized is the same as that for a PRC-25 (30.0 to 75.95 MC) The antenna assembly used for the PCC-1 is a log periodic directional antenna.

(1) Operation of the PCC-1 requires the use of two frequencies, one transmit and one receive. Once communication is established between two terminals the multiplexer permits four voice channels (plus four teletype channels if desired) to be carried on each transmit and receive frequency. With four voice channels established, four land lines can then be run from the PCC-1 to be terminated at a phone or in a switchboard.

c. Field test. The AN/PCC-1 was utilized by the 1st Marine Regiment during Operation EUGENUS. Throughout the operation two PCC-1 circuits were maintained; One PCC-1 radio relay circuit was established between the Regiment and 2nd Bn, 3d Marines; the other circuit was established between Regiment and 2nd Bn 1st Marines. The distance between these terminals varied since both battalions changed locations. The minimum distance maintained between terminals was 2 kilometers while the maximum distance was 12 kilometers. Terrain in the operating area was hilly and covered with canopy, generally considered difficult for FM radio operation. Power for the PCC-1 terminals at the Regiment was 60 cycle AC. The PCC-1 equipment at the battalions was powered by both BB-451's and 60 cycle AC. Initially each of the terminals was manned by three Marines; however, as the operation progressed it was determined that two operators per terminal would suffice.

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d. Evaluation. Based on ten days of continuous use during a combat operation the PCC-1 proved to be a highly reliable manpacked short range radio relay system. Relative to other comparable radio relay equipment the following can be determined:

- (1) The PCC-1 enhances mobility and offers extreme ease in installation.
- (2) Simplicity of operation permits the equipment to be manned by personnel with little formal training.
- (3) The varied sources of power input permit greater flexibility in a tactical situation (e. g. battery operation eliminates generator noise in the battalion CP).
- (4) Because of the varied sources of power input the PCC-1 is easier to logistically support than comparable radio relay equipment.
- (5) The PCC-1 is subject to the same frequency interference and or jamming as may be experienced with normal FM radio communications.

15. Commanders Analysis. Operation REGASUS presented another entirely different terrain situation for the 1st Marines and required both a continuation of normal tactics as well as the use of some relatively uncommon to the 1st Marines. 1st Marines area of operations assigned was characterized by a river running east west generally in the middle and steeply rising high ground on both sides. The attack through this ground was conducted by a series of successive helicopter-borne attacks from high ground to high ground capitalizing on the continuous availability of helicopter support from MAG 36. In the fifteen days of the operation, twenty eight tactical troop lifts were executed with units varying in size from battalion to platoon seizing critical terrain features and attacking down hill. Relying on heavy preattack air and artillery preparation of landing zones and objectives, casualties were kept at a minimum and objectives generally seized with out heavy contact. In terrain of the type encountered in Operation REGASUS it is considered this method of attack is far superior to a ground attack up hill.

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
