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ENEMY, WEATHER AND TERRAIN

1. Enemy. During the month of April, enemy activity in the 1st Marines TAOR, was sporadic with the heaviest contacts initiated during the first half of the month. The majority of enemy initiated actions were directed against friendly CP's, PPB's, bridge security units, and patrols. Numerous sightings of small groups of 6-10 VC/NVA continued during the month. There were several reported incidents of the enemy being disguised as civilians during the month. Sporadic harassment and sniper fire occurred frequently throughout the TAOR. Enemy propaganda decreased during the month, although there were a few incidents in the form of leaflets and VC flags flying from visible points in the TAOR. Terrorism and assassinations decreased during the month, except for one incident in which a satchel charge was thrown during a village play, resulting in 9 villagers killed and 26 wounded. At 0610 on 15 April, enemy UDT personnel set and detonated charges on 3 supports of the Tu Cam Bridge. The enemy divers are believed to have used a scuba type apparatus to place the charges in position. On 30 April, G Company, 2nd Battalion, observed 16 enemy with weapons, dressed as women, contact was initiated with small arms and air strikes resulting in 2 enemy KIA.

a. Enemy units reported to have been employed in the 1st Marines TAOR include elements of the 36th NVA Regiment, the R-20th Battalion, the V-25th Battalion, the T-89th Battalion, elements of the 3rd Sapper Battalion and the 3rd Quang Da Special Battalion. Enemy local forces units consist of the Q-80th and the Q-82nd Companies.

b. The number of SFD's encountered in the TAOR during April increased from last month and continued to inflict the majority of Marine casualties. 211 SFD's were encountered with 139 found and 72 detonated. Employment of SFD's remained the same, using trip wire and pressure fuses for detonation. SFD's continued to be devised from our own ordnance and homemade type utilizing C-4 with C-ration cans and soft drink cans.

c. There were 3 rocket attacks initiated from the 1st Marines TAOR during April. Counter rocket fire was called on each site. The dates, numbers and points of detonation are listed below.

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2. Volunteer Informant Program (VIP). The VIP reached it's highest peak during April with a total of 561,093\$ VN being paid out for 2,507 pieces of ordnance, approximately 6,588 rounds of s/a ammo and a significant increase in number of SFD's reported by the Vietnamese which accounted for the increase in payments. The majority of ordnance continues to be U.S. made, usually brought in by Vietnamese children.

3. Ground Surveillance. The Ground Surveillance Program increased significantly during April with multiple types of sensors being seeded along infiltration routes and areas of heavy SFD concentration. The sensors now employed include Mini-Sids, G-Sids, Magids, and Pirods. An accurate evaluation of the sensors cannot be determined at this time due to minor problems which still exist in the experimental stage of employment. Fifteen fire missions have been requested upon activation of sensors existed, but due to friendly troops in close proximity of impact areas, only two fire missions were completed, and two others cancelled for time lapse between request and clearance.

4. Weather. The weather during April had little or no effect on friendly or enemy operations. Warm humid weather prevailed throughout the 1st Marines TAOR with an average high temperature of 91 and the average low of 76. The average humidity was 81% and the rainfall was 1.3 inches. Visibility was good to excellent.

5. Terrain. The 1st Marines TAOR consists of fertile rice paddy land, wooded areas, and sand dunes. Scattered throughout the TAOR are many hamlets, rivers, streams, and bamboo hedgerows. Located in or passing through the TAOR are routes 1, 1B, 1C, 12W, 12E, 13C, and 538.

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SECTION C
OPERATIONS

1. Combat Operations

a. Missions of the First Marine Regiment remained unchanged during April 1969. Emphasis was on combat patrolling and ambushes from company and platoon sized patrol bases. Special attention was given to uncovering enemy surprise firing devices (SED's) and road/trail mines. Combat Operations were conducted in cooperation and coordination with RVNAF and ROEMC forces to capture and/or destroy VC, VCI, and NVA forces, and to support Special Pacification and Hamlet upgrading plans.

b. Significant contact during April was highlighted by a deliberate, detailed search operation conducted by the Mobile Battalion (3/1) (three companies) as they launched a helicopter supported attack into northern DODGE CITY.

(1) After establishment of a blocking position by D/1/1 on the North bank of the SONG LA THO, 3/1 moved two companies by CH-46 helicopter and one company on foot and the Mobile Battalion commenced operations south of the LA THO River.

(2) Company K, blocked along the railroad berm while Companies I and L with Battalion Command Group landed well east of the berm and searched south to north, then east to west where they assembled with Company K near the railroad berm. Action was insignificant up to this point.

(3) However, utilizing maximum deception, Company K swept west and north out of DODGE CITY while Companies I and L counter-swept towards the east. This action caught the elusive enemy unawares. Not expecting continuation of the search, the enemy were out of hiding near the north-east corner of DODGE CITY. Company L engaged the surprised enemy force while Company I and the Battalion Command Group maneuvered north across the LA THO River to get in behind the enemy.

(4) Results, of this action were 73 enemy killed, and six individual weapons captured. Company K was recalled to remain in the area just east of DODGE CITY at BT023605. The remainder of the Mobile Battalion returned to their combat base. As this unit secured their positions, small patrols came under fire from enemy RPG rounds and sniper fire. Reinforcements waited while air and artillery pounded the enemy occupied hedgerows and tree lines. Company K counted 12 enemy dead after this engagement. Continuing further to prep their movement with 90mm gun tanks and additional air and artillery fires, 21 more enemy dead were accounted for.

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(5) Company L relieved Company K for the final mop up, destroying numerous bunkers and salvaging documents and equipment left by the annihilated enemy forces.

(6) Of particular significance in this battle was the composition of the enemy force. These were members of the VC local force designated Q-82 Battalion who are native to the DA NANG Area and provide NVA forces with guides, resupply of ammo, food and intelligence information. Having routed the Q-82 was particularly applauded by the 51st ARVN Regiment and by General LAM, CG I Corps.

c. Operations also concentrated on efforts in coordination and cooperation with RVNAF to pacify hamlets and to capture and/or destroy VCI. Two significant cordon and search operations are reported:

(1) Cordon and Search of the hamlet VIEM TAY (1) was conducted by Co H, 2/1 in conjunction with Provincial Reconnaissance Unit (PRU) from HOI AN. Cordoning the hamlet at 0100 on the 22nd of April, H/2/1 signalled to the PRU advisor that they were set. The PRU's went immediately to work questioning villagers all night long and into the day. By mid-afternoon the PRU's had captured 12 VCI suspects. After thorough investigation seven of the 12 suspects were confirmed as VCI. They are no longer a threat to VIEM TAY (1).

(2) On 28 April 1969 at 2100H NGAN CAU (2) was surrounded by Co H, 2/1 and elements of the newly formed 34th RF Battalion. Maintaining this tight cordon through the night, the Company Commander ordered the search to commence at 200627H April 1969. The search element consisted of a platoon of National Police Field Forces lifted in from HOI AN, Province Headquarters, and elements of Co H, 2/1. The results again proved successful as nearly 4,000 lbs of rice were uncovered from caches and 17 VCI suspects were detained. As interrogation continues at higher levels, it appears that the majority of these detainees are, in fact, VCI. An agent was used to identify the detainees.

d. Land clearing efforts continued throughout the TAOR removing VC/NVA harboring sites in the Eastern TAOR and neutralizing a highly concentrated SFD area in the Western TAOR.

(1) The 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines expended several hundred Bangalore torpedoes in their effective clearing of treelines on "No Name Island" (center mass BT084668). Underneath were found spider holes, and individual fighting holes. Additionally some caches of mortar rounds and RPG rounds continue to turn up in this area which was obviously once a staging/harbor site for enemy forces.

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(2) In the vacated area once known as Cam Lo (1) and (2), land clearing was decided upon due to an excessive number of SFD's which saturated the area. The Mobile Quick Reaction Force, QUANG DA SPECIAL Zone provided the security force as LVTE (1), TD 18 dozer, Tank (Blade) Dozer, and Engineer demolition teams commenced what will be a 30 day effort to level this area. It is anticipated that this hamlet complex, long ago destroyed, will be available as a resettlement area at the conclusion of this 1st Marines effort.

e. On 26 April 1969 at 1200H the Mobile Battalion (3/1) was CHOPPED to the Seventh Marine Regiment to assist in carrying out their missions while elements of the Seventh Marines commenced operations to open Route 4 further west. As the month ended, the Mobile Battalion continued operations in the Seventh Marines TAOR.

f. VIP visits for the month included the CG, FMF Pacific, CG, III Marine Amphibious Force, the Assistant Deputy Commander FMF Pacific, the Commanding General, First Marine Division, and the Assistant Division Commander, First Marine Division.

g. The movement of NVA/VC forces was generally suppressed and the enemy was unable to organize any major efforts in the First Marine Regiment TAOR during April 1969.

2. Combat Support Operations

a. Artillery. Throughout the month of April the 1st Battalion, 11th Marines continued assigned mission of providing direct support artillery for Marines and ARVN units operating within the TAOR. These fires were reinforced with fires from the 11th Marines general support batteries.

(1) During the first 11 days of April, Company K, 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines, operating in the Northeastern edge of DODGE CITY, accounted for the majority of the significant observed fire missions fired by 1/11. After the withdrawal of Company K from this area, the overall tempo of artillery support operations remained on a relatively constant level with relatively few observed fire missions. On 26 April concurrently with the passing of OPCON of the 3rd Battalion, 1st Marines to the 7th Marines, Bravo Battery was changed OPCON to the 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines and displaced to Hill 55. On 27 April Danang Ammunition Supply Point #1 was destroyed and the resulting loss of available artillery ammunition dictated a drastic reduction of artillery fire missions for the remainder of the month. In addition to the standard techniques of artillery employment, several new innovations in artillery support were initiated during April with a mixed degree of success. The most successful innovation was the use of artillery spotting rounds to establish initial beacon

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drop points for subsequent utilization of RABFAC/DIANE air support missions (Beacon Hop). Another successful technique was the coordinating of fire planning any patrol operations in which selected patrol routes were prepped and/or reconned by fire prior to the departure of the patrol. This resulted in the disruption and/or destruction of possible enemy ambushes and the detonation of surprise firing devices along the patrol route.

b. Naval Gunfire. Naval Gunfire was not employed in the 1st Marines TACR during the month of April.

c. Air Support

(1) General. The 1st Marines employed its air support assets to the maximum during the month of April. In addition to previous capabilities the Regiment was assigned a radar beacon (RABFAC) which is used in conjunction with the A-6 DIANE System. This system was used during the month and proved to be extremely reliable and a valuable additional asset for CAS/DAS.

3. Psychological Operations

a. PsyOps has shown a marked increase in all phases this past month. A strong emphasis was placed on sanitation and hygiene with the HB team broadcasting in support of over 30 MedCaps and a smaller number of Dentcaps. The entire TAOR has been saturated by distribution of leaflets and handbills concerning Personal Hygiene.

b. Aerial broadcasts were made on a daily basis utilizing a wide variety of themes. In the Mobile Battalion CMAOR specific themes were directed at the insurgent forces that engaged in battle in the DODGE CITY Area. In the Eastern CMAOR Pro-GVN, Chieu Hoi and Rewards themes were mainly used, while Rewards, Personal Hygiene and Sanitation themes were directed at the people in the Western CMAOR.

c. The HB team has been employed to a maximum in a "Circuit Rider" role by broadcasting current events from the Ban Tin and Tu Do newspaper. This has proved very effective since a large portion of the populace was able to keep abreast of the news. It was also possible to distribute approximately 4,000 newspapers to the people.

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d. Personal Response Teams were requested and used numerous times to aid in the indoctrination of Marine units. The behavior of the individual Marine was greatly emphasized to stress the need of establishing a stronger bond and friendlier rapport between Free World Forces and the civilian populace.

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2. Marksmanship Training

a. Ranges utilized by 1st Marine Regiment:

(1) 1st Battalion has a 1000 inch zero and FAM FIRE range located at AT987677. The weapons that can be utilized on this range vary from the M-16 to the 50 caliber machinegun. During the month of April 304 Marines were trained on this range with the M-16 in FAM firing, battlesights and quick fire-quick kill techniques. This totaled 82 range hours utilized.

(2) 2nd Battalion has a 1000 inch zero and FAM Fire range located at BT074657. The range has six firing points and can be used for all types of small arms. During April, 317 Marines were trained on this range, totaling 35 range hours.

(3) 3rd Battalion has a 1000 inch zero and FAM Fire range located at BT015633. This range has six firing points and can be used for various types of small arms. For the month of April 270 Marines were trained utilizing 43 range hours.

b. Battalions continued to show enthusiasm and improvement in their Marksmanship program. With more familiarization in techniques and a strong incentive program, proficiency will continue to increase.

3. Reciprocal Training

a. Liaison with the 51st Regiment (ARVN) continues on a close, continuous basis. During April a meeting between the S-3 of the 51st and the S-3 of the 1st Marines resulted in a renewal of effort in the area of reciprocal training. 1. SUPPLY. Normal supply point distribution was used through the month. HHC provided all classes of supplies. Headquarters Company and each battalion were inspected in early April, as part of the quarterly financial technical inspection with satisfactory results. The quarterly G&I scheduled for the 3d Battalion was rescheduled for 28 May 1969 due to tactical operational commitments during the period of the originally scheduled date. The field supply analysis team visit scheduled for the 1st Marines from 17-23 April 1969 was rescheduled for 8-16 May 1969. After a review of the 4th quarter financial requirements \$42,679.00 was returned to Division Comptroller as excess in early April.

2. TRANSPORTATION. Transportation support was excellent during the month of April. A 5-ton truck and trailer provided by 11th Motors three days a week has enhanced the pick up and delivery of supplies and equipment. Additional 5-ton trucks provided by 11th Motors to deploy and relocate units from the 3d Battalion greatly facilitated operations. The eighteen 2½ ton trucks from 1st Motors in daily support of the 1st Marines were utilized to their maximum.

3. MAINTENANCE AND ENGINEER ASSISTANCE.

a. The engineering effort and assistance of the engineers and Seabees during April was excellent. Four new towers have been incorporated into the Regimental TACK. Major construction at all combat bases is progressing. A new well was sunk in the Regimental Command post and a request for the construction of a water tower to support three (3) new shower buildings has been approved. The Tu Cam Bridge (Cooper Bridge), was repaired by the 4th Naval Construction Battalion, subsequent to a pontoon bridge being erected for temporary use. The culverts/bridges on Route 1C were inspected and plans for repairs and reconditioning have been initiated by priority means.

b. All equipment maintenance was provided by 1st FSK. The table depicts the number of Tactical Equipment Repair Orders submitted during April and the number completed.

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4. BLANK MOUTHS. All units have updated their mess cards. The 1st Battalion has received new packing crates for immersion burners and other items of mess hall gear. Preparations were made for the 3rd Battalion's Command Material Management Inspection in late May.

5. SANITIZATION. The Regimental Command Post was inspected by a Preventive Medicine Team with satisfactory results. Possible sanitation problems at 1st Marine combat bases are being checked by the continual supervision of medical personnel.

6. MEDICAL. During the month of April, medical facilities were maintained throughout the Regimental TAOs, each holding routine sick call twice daily and providing emergency treatment for those needing it. The medical facilities were manned by total of 7 Medical Officers and 173 Corpsman. The following is a breakdown of the patient load seen during the month of April 1969:

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SECTION F

CIVIL AFFAIRS-CIVIC ACTION

1. During this reporting period the Regimental S-5 completed a detailed Civic Action Plan for the months of May, June, and July. This plan places upon each Battalion Civil Affairs Team requirements which will make important contributions to the civilians in the First Marines T.A.O.R. These contributions will be varied and cover all major areas of civil affairs work.

2. Western Battalion Civil Affairs Team initiated a generator repair and rewiring project on Christmas Island (AT 997670). This project consisted of Western Battalion communication personnel improving and overhauling existing facilities in that hamlet. About 10% (approx. 70 homes) of the homes in QUANG CHAU (AT 998689) have been repaired and work is continuing to repair the remainder of the damaged homes in that hamlet. Work is also continuing on the rebuilding of the schoolhouse in MIEU DONG (BT 016678).

3. Eastern Battalion Civil Affairs Team spent the vast majority of its time in coordination with various military and civilian agencies, insuring that the New Life Hamlet at XUAN TRA (BT 064676) is supplied on a daily basis with adequate building material and enough food to cover subsistence. At this time the New Life Hamlet is approximately a quarter finished (16 two family homes are erected and being occupied). Conditions at the hamlet are rather overcrowded but tolerable considering all 143 families have now taken up permanent residence at the hamlet site. Projects which already have been or will be implemented within the hamlet are as follows:

- (1) 16 wells equipped with pumps.
- (2) 16 pig pens for an expanded pig project.
- (3) 16 outhouses in conjunction with an active sanitation and personal hygiene program.
- (4) A fish pond.
- (5) Various experimental test plots utilizing IR-8 rice, and assorted vegetables.
- (6) School-house.
- (7) Peoples Self Defense Force is now in the process of being organized, trained, and equipped for internal security of the hamlet.
- (8) Numerous specialized kits have been distributed to individual families on the basis of needs and skills.

TAM AN (BT 090689) under the close supervision of the 3rd RD Team is developing into a productive hamlet. An educational program has already been implemented for 95 school age children. Although a private home is being used as a classroom, plans are in the making for a project submittal sheet to be channeled through HOA VANG District. An immunization program is also being initiated at TAM AN (BT 090689) along with one at BINH KY (BT 050697).

4. The Mobile Battalion Civil Affairs Team supplied the Bo De School of VIEM TAY (BT 034640) with cement, sand, wood, and carpenter kits to help in construction of an addition to that school. The school is now awaiting roofing tin, but, will soon be completed and ready for operation. Other projects that are in the planning stage are a pig breeding project to be located within the Battalion Area to ensure the proper care of the pigs and the resettlement of BICH NAM (AT 996635).

5. In the Medical field during the month of April over 4000 people were treated under the MedCap Program in the C.A.A.O.R. both at Battalion Areas and on Mobile MedCaps. The DentCap Program treated 141 persons and distributed 100 tubes of toothpaste with toothbrushes and directions on preventative dentistry. Transportation of families to visit relatives in the hospital has been provided numerous times during this reporting period. In the Western Battalion two RF Corpsmen are being further trained and are used at MedCaps in conjunction with Navy Corpsmen. Also plans for more detailed training of Vietnamese Corpsmen by a Navy doctor are underway.

6. During the month of April 1969 the Civil Affairs Teams of the Western Battalion and Mobile Battalions gave 69,500 piasters through the General Walt Scholarship Fund to 137 students in the C.A.A.O.R. This project is part of a continuing effort by the First Marines to develop the human resources within its Tactical Area of Responsibility.

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1. During the month of April 1969, 1st Marine Communication Platoon continued to provide radio, telephone (integrated landline and radio relay), and teletype circuits from the Duong Son (2) Combat Base to the 1st Marine Division, 2nd Battalion, and the 3rd Battalion. The Communication Center maintained Comm/Crypto Guard for the 1st Battalion. Telephone circuits were maintained to the 7th Marines, 1/11, and its Alpha, Bravo, and Charlie Batteries, 1st Tanks, Alpha/1st Engineers and Cap 2-5-4, Hoa Vang Sub-District Headquarters, and 1/51.
2. Emphasis during April was placed upon improvement of communications facilities within the CP. A new tower was placed in the CP which will improve radio relay reliability. It is much sturdier than the old tower. Work progressed rapidly during April on the new Communications Center bunker, and it is anticipated that it will be operational late in May.
3. The main problem encountered during April continued to be providing 400 cycle power for the radio relay equipment. The PU-270 generator is unsatisfactory for the job, but other 400 cycle generators or convertors are difficult to obtain.

- 13 April 69 - A possible compromise of Battalion, Regiment, and Division call signs and frequencies exist because a platoon sergeant from 2nd Battalion lost these extracts in the field.
- 16 April 69 - At 160001H many of the call signs and frequencies were changed in the Division as a result of the possible compromise on 13 April 69.
- 17 April 69 - The internal water jacket on one of the 150 KW camp power generators ruptured. A new generator was brought out from NSA Public Works to replace the bad one. These generators weigh five tons apiece and require a wrecker for movement and installation.
- Early in the morning friendly 90mm fire hit the Combat Base. One round severed all four cables carrying the camp power, causing an immediate and total power failure. The back-up generator and power system provided the necessary power in crucial areas until the four power cables were repaired late in the morning.
- 18 April 69 - After initial trouble with the PRC-47, 1st Marines came up on the HF Tac Net with a TRC-75.
- 19 April 69 - A new 33-foot tower was brought into the 1st Marines CP by an Army CH-54 for use by the radio relay section. The tower will provide improved communications links with 2/1 and 3/1 since the increased height of the new tower greatly improves the reliability of the TRC-27B. The new tower also has more working area and is much more stable than the old one.
- Pu-278, MC Serial Number 15, was stolen from beneath the radio relay tower where it was used to power the TRC-27B. All connections had been severed with the radio relay equipment. A search of the base was conducted and all vehicles leaving the gates were searched with negative results. The Regimental S-4 and company supply were notified, and an investigation was initiated.
- 27 April 69 - The movement of the radio relay shots to 2/1, 3/1, and 1/11 to the new tower was completed.
- Explosions at ASP #1 have knocked out all landline communication with Division, including all dial trunks.
