




e. PERSONNEL SUMMARY. At the close of the reporting period the personnel strength was as follows: 117 Officers and 2532 Enlisted Marines Personnel, and all Navy Personnel dropped from rolls. Due to standdown of the 1st Marine Regiment, replacement procedures were not in effect. Total redeployment of 1st Battalion was completed on 3 May 1971 and ADCON of 2d Battalion was passed to Commanding General, 3d Marine Amphibious Brigade on 4 May 1971.

OPERATIONS1. GENERAL

a. On 1 May 1971, Headquarters 1st Marines and 3d Battalion 1st Marines entered a standdown status. The only 1st Marine unit operationally committed was 2d Battalion 1st Marines. All operational data concerning 2d Battalion 1st Marines will be found in the Battalion's Command Chronology for May 1971. At 092030H Command Group departed RVN.

2. COMBAT SUPPORT OPERATIONSa. ARTILLERY

(1) On 1 May 1971, the Regimental FSCC was disbanded. All fire support control was directed at the FSCC of 2d Battalion 1st Marines.

b. AIR SUPPORT

(1) All air support was coordinated through the ALCO section at 2d Battalion 1st Marines.

SECTION E
LOGISTICS1. Supply-Logistics

The logistics posture of the 1st Marines declined during the reporting period as a result of the standdown of the Headquarters Company and the 3d Battalion, and the turnover of excess and T/E allowances, to the Republic of Vietnam's Army and Marine Corps.

a. Supply:

(1) Supply point distribution, with Force Logistics Command continued, however with that unit boxing and crating material for redeployment support requirements are minimal. Urgent requirements are being satisfied on a case by case basis.

(2) Resupply to the operational 2d Battalion was performed by helicopters. Sufficient resources were provided as required.

2. Transportation

The Regiment was, as in previous months, augmented during the reporting period by vehicles from Co A 1st Motor Transport Battalion. These trucks were utilized daily to perform supply/resupply, troop movements within the DA NANG secure area and other housekeeping functions. In addition to the augmentation provided by Co A 1st Motor Transport Battalion, CG, 3d MAB provided general motor transport requirements beyond the capability of the Regiment.

3. Maintenance and Engineer Assistance

a. Equipment Maintenance support was suspended during the reporting period with the exception of 1st and 2d echelon. Maintenance Battalion, Force Logistics Command provided contact teams for limited technical inspection of equipment as requested. Maximum use of these teams assisted units in coding excess for return of MCSC, Barstow to preclude unnecessary double handling upon arrival at Camp Pendleton.

b. Co A 1st Engineer Battalion rehabilitated SEA huts beyond the capability of the Headquarters Company prior to Camp PERDUES turn over to the Philco Ford Corporation on 1 May 1971.

4. Embarkation. The 1st Battalion's supplies and equipment were embarked on the USS TULARE on 3 May 1971. The 3d Battalion was assigned as the Embarkation Battalion and a Team Commander from 3d Battalion was assigned the responsibility of loading the U. S. S. OGDEN which is currently scheduled for departure 12/13 May 1971. Preparation for embarkation is proceeding very smoothly and is on schedule.

5. Medical.

a. During the reporting period medical facilities were maintained throughout the Regiment each holding routine sick call daily and giving emergency treatment to those who needed it.

b. The medical facilities were manned by a total of three Medical Officers, five Chaplains, 115 Corpsmen, one Dental Officer and one Dental Technician.

c. The following is a breakdown of the patient load seen during the subject period.
