# 2. Sequential listing of significant events, as they relate to:

- a. Personnel. 1 enlisted man'was on emergency leave during this reporting period. Disciplinary problems diminished considerably as compared to previous months. There were no incidents of individuals sleeping on post, the most prevalent of offensives seen during January and Pebruary. This is attributed to the corrective action initiated at the end of February, as noted in that month's chronology.
- b. Combat Operations and Training. During the month of March the two provisional platoons were again utilized in the combat role of occupying defensive positions within the 1st Marines TAOR. Individual and crew served weapons instruction received the greatest emphasis in the time devoted to training. Aside from classes on nomenclature and functioning, actual firing of the M-72, M-60, K-14, and .45 Cal pistol was accomplished. In addition to weapons training, land mine warfare, fire discipline and command post security were also stressed.
- c. <u>logistics</u>. In the logistics field the following were noted relative to motor transport and supply:
- 1. During the month of March Headquarters Company vehicles drove a total of 11,431 accident free miles. At the end of March two(2) M422's were turned into FLSG for 3rd Echelon repairs. One M422 has been requisitioned. The other M422 is on deadline for transfer case repairs. It should be noted that all the utility trucks, presently on hand in the authorized TE for this Headquarters are the M422 type. This organization is presently

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awaiting the delivery of the M422A1 type vehicles. An advice card has been received by this organization showing that the M422A1's have been shipped. No vehicles are on deadline at the end of March for 1st or 2nd echelon repairs. This organization has been in Viet Nam for approximately 2½ months and as of this date has experienced no major problems in respect to the availability of Organizational Spare Parts.

2. During the month of March Headquarters Company submitted a total of 776 requisitions, 25% of which were for Company "A", 1st Engineer Battalion. A 37% fill rate was realized from FLSG "B" on all priority 12 and "? regulations. One priority 05 and no priority 02 were a submitted. A shipment of garrisch property was necessed from Camp Butler, Okinawa. Consisting of motal backs and treases, pillows, linea, desks, fans. These items had been requested from Camp Butler, via Commading General 1st Marine Division, during December 1965. The heat and humidity are beginning to monder space parts, especially those with rubber, unserviceable. Mater damage has not been excessive due to the fact that all outside storage is covered with canvas.
