2. Combat Operations & Training. Members of this company participated in "Operation Lafayette" during the period of 2-7 March 1967. The Command Post was harassed on five separate occasions by small arms fire, resulting in one Marine Casualty. (Gunshot wound on left arm, not of serious nature.) The use of the Sensor Device incorporated in the Command Post Perimeter defense system. Improvements continued to be made on the Command Post in the form of additional wire, fighting and anti-mortar holes. The Combined Action Unit continued to live and operate in the Duong Son (2) area. Listening post, ambushes, and patrols continue. Indoctrination was conducted for all personnel joined during report.

3. Logistics.

a. Supply. During the month of March, a total of 374 requisitions were submitted. Twenty-four were a priority 04; 194 a priority 12 and the remaining 156 a priority 17.



1. An Officer will be present when live firing is being conducted.
2. The Officer in charge will report to the S-3 Duty Officer prior to going to the range.
3. There will be no automatic or rapid fire conducted on this range.
4. All firing will be done in the prone position.
5. Weapons will be cleared and bolts opened at all times when not on the firing line.
6. There are no accidental discharges on this range.
7. The range will be properly policed upon completion of firing.
8. The range flag will be displayed while firing is in progress.
9. The Range Officer will be responsible to see that all rules of safety are enforced and that each shooter is instructed on all safety precautions prior to firing.
10. Prior to commencing fire and at the time the range flag is displayed, a range guard will be placed as to ensure no one enters the area of firing.
11. All units adjacent to the range will be notified before firing commences.
12. Notify the Regimental S-3 Watch Officer that firing is completed.


