#### 2. Sequential listing of significant events, as they relate to:

- a. <u>Personnel</u>. During the reporting period 2 enlisted men were on emergency leave. 17 men from the company made use of R&R quotas to Tokyo, Manila, Okinawa, Bangkok, Taipei, Singapore, Hong Kong, and Kuala Lumpar. 2 officers and 5 enlisted completed oversess tours and rotated to CONUS. During June 2 Corporals were promoted to Sergeant and 2 Sergeants were promoted to Staff Sergeant. 4 Court-Martials were awarded members of Headquarters Company during this reporting period. 2 Surmary Courts were for violation of articles 86 and 134; the third, a Special Court, for a violation of article 113, and the fourth, a Summary Court, we for a violation of article 134.
- b. Combat Operations and Trai. i.e. During June Headquarters Company moved from its location in Chu Lei to the the Marble Mountain complex southeast of De Nang. The above move occurred on 11 June 1966. Subsequent to the arrival of the company at Da Nang, heavy patrolling in the form of combat patrols and ambushes were initiated due to sniper fire received from around the perimeter. This activity appears to have discouraged continued enemy contact. Due to the move it was not feasible to conduct training during June.
- c. Logistics. In the logistics field the following was noted relative to Notor Transport and Supply.
- 1. During the month of June Headquarters Company vehicles drove a total of 15,884 miles. Two M422's were involved in accidents, one of which resulted in major damage to the vehicle. No problems were encountered by the motor transport section in connection with the

move from Chu Iai to the Da Nang area of operations, although there was a small amount of time lost in preventive maintenance. All necessary maintenance was back on schedule within one week after this unit's arrival in its present location. The presence of soft sand in the new area has necessitated closer supervision and instructions to all drivers concerning operation and driver maintenance. No major problems regarding parts have arisen during the subject period.

2. In June Headquarters Company submitted 264 requisitions, seven of which were priority 05. Supply Support including maintenance has greatly improved. Pending clothing requisitions at FLSG-B were cancelled. Requests were resubmitted to FLSG-A and the clothing was received the same day. Items of General Supply are repaired within three days; this includes office machines. Ten general purpose tents were damaged beyond second echolon repair due to high winds. Request has been submitted to General Supply Maintenance for limited technical inspection to determine if repair can be accomplished at a higher echelon.

Subj: Transition Firing; information concerning

- 1. Purpose. To set forth instructions regarding the transition firing of weapons at the 1st Marines CP.
- 2. <u>Background</u>. To remain proficient in the use of small arms it is necessary that all Marines practice marksmanship as often as possible. This is especially true now that Marines are fighting in Viet Nam.
- 3. Information. Adjacent to the 1st Marines CP on the south is an area ideally suited for transition firing. Silhouette targets have been erected on the first sand dune in front of Marble Mountain. This provides an excellent safety feature for all small arms firing.

#### 4. Action.

- a. Sections desiring to fire the 1st Marines range are requested to notify the Headquarters Commandant of the following:
  - 1. Day and time section desires to fire
  - Number of men firing
  - Range Officer available or not
  - 4. Type weapons to be fired
- b. Subsequent to receipt of requests to fire the Headquarters Commandant will coordinate the request with the S-3. Upon receipt of permission to fire the section will be so informed.
- c. During actual firing an officer will be present to act as range officer. He will ensure that the range is properly supervised and that no unsafe condition is allowed to exist. All weapons will be cleared and checked before being removed from the firing line.
