PART II

1. Personnel. Two Officers and 12 enlisted personnel completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. Thirty-three members of this Company made use of R&R Quotas to Okinawa, Hawaii, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Tokyo, Manila, Taipei, Singapore, and Kuala Lumpur. Six enlisted members extended overseas tours with two men departing on Special 30 Day Leave in connection with tour extensions. Three members departed on 30 day leave as a result of re-enlisting.

2. Combat Operations & Training. Members of this company participated in "Operation CALHOUN" from 25 June 1967 through 30 June 1967. The command post was harrassed on three separate occasions by small arms fire resulting in no Marine casualties. The outpost, formed by a Marine squad, continues to live and operate in the Duong Son (2) area. Listening posts, ambushes, and patrols continue. Indoctrination was conducted for all personnel joined during report. On 27 June 1967 a special school on handling, setting in, and safety of Claymore Mines was conducted by the Company Armorer. During June the Company established a Security Post at the Duong Son (2) dump.

3. Logistics.

a. Supply. During the month of June, a total of 395 requisitions were submitted. 12 were a priority 02; 50 a priority 6; 202 a priority 12 and the remaining 131 a priority 17. Quantities of material on hand were sufficient to satisfy 68 per cent of the recurring demands received. Shortages are on valid requisitions.

b. Motor Transport.

(1) Motor Transport vehicles suffered no accidents, damage or pilferage during the month of June.

(2) Motor Transport vehicles traveled a total of 18,314 miles during the month of June.

(3) Two vehicles were deadlined during the month of June, both due to the lack of parts.

1. Purpose. To promulgate regulations, instructions and responsibilities concerning Fire Prevention and Fire Protection applicable to sections of the Headquarters Company.

2. General. It is an undisputed fact that fire is as terrible and destructive as any human foe and that it can have an extremely adverse effect upon the capabilities of this Regiment. Further, fires do not just happen. They are, instead, the result of some human failing, i.e. negligence, ignorance or flagrant disregard for regulations. Our present location finds us far removed from sophisticated fire fighting support to which we have grown accustomed and we must now depend entirely upon ourselves to fight, as well as prevent fires. For these reasons it is more important than ever before that this command institute a well planned fire prevention program within this organization. The program must be reinforced by vigorous education and inspection programs whereby everyone is made aware of the dangers involved and the price this Regiment might have to pay because of carelessness on the part of any member of it.

3. Action.

a. The Commanding Officer of Headquarters Company will appoint, in writing, a Fire Security Officer for the Regimental CP area. The Fire Security Officer will be charged with the responsibilities of supervising this CP's Fire Prevention and Protection Program as outlined in enclosure (1).

b. Publish a set of fire regulations for the CP area.

c. The unit fire Security Officer and Section Fire Security HCO's and their area of responsibility in case of fire and for inspectional purposes are as follows;

- (1) Unit Wire Security Officer - Supply Officer
- (2) Communications Area - Radio Chief
- (3) Anti-Tank Area - Supply Chief
- (4) Mess and Club Area - Mess Sergeant
- (5) Administrative and Staff Offices Area - Psy War NCO
- (6) Supply and Motor Transport Area - Supply Chief
- (7) Officer's Country and Club - Supply Officer

d. A fire watch in the area will be provided by the Headquarters Company each night.

FIRE REGULATIONS AND FIRE PREVENTION MEASURES

1. Actions in event of a Fire

a. Individuals discovering a fire will take the following action:

(1) Immediately inform occupants of the structure involved. Make certain that no sleeping person is overlooked. Sound the alarm to areas immediately adjacent so that an adequate amount of assistance will be available to fight the fire.

b. Others arriving on the scene will immediately render all assistance possible, under the supervision of the senior person present, to extinguish the fire. Classified materials and other high value exposed items will be moved and safeguarded.

2. Fire Fighting Equipment

a. In the absence of conventional fire extinguishers, extensive use will be made of containers of sand located at strategic locations as well as fire barrels (covered, with buckets attached) filled with water.

b. Fire fighting equipment will be used only for fighting fires or for organized fire drills and training.

c. Types of fires and basic fire extinguishers to be utilized on them, when available, are as follows:

(1) For Class A fires (Structural fires, wood, paper). The basic fire extinguishers utilized in quarters, offices, warehouses, supply areas and places of public assembly are a 2½ or 4 gallon water pump can.

(2) For Class B fires (liquid fuels, paint storage and inflammable liquids and gases.)

The basic fire extinguishers utilized are a 2½ gallon foam fire extinguisher, CO2 or 20 pound dry chemical extinguisher.

(3) For Class C fire (Electrical) The basic fire extinguisher used is a 15 pound CO2 extinguisher.

d. Fire extinguishers will not be painted. Underwriters Laboratories, Inc., label will not be obliterated.

e. Fire barrels, sand containers, and fire buckets will be painted red. Fire barrels will not be used for any purpose other than water supply for fire fighting. Units will insure that all fire barrels and sand containers are full at all times. To aid in mosquito control, fire barrels will be covered and the surface of the water in the barrel

will be covered by a thin film of oil. Fire buckets used with the barrels will not be used for other purposes and will be lightly secured to the cover of the barrel.

3. Housekeeping

a. Oil and paint soaked rags or waste will not be permitted to accumulate. Special metal containers with tightly fitting covers will be provided for this type of material, and these containers will be emptied at the close of each working day.

b. Waste paper, trash, and other debris will be burned only in approved locations. Burning operations will be continuously attended.

c. Combustible waste receptacles will not be used.

4. Smoking

a. Smoking, striking matches, or the use of mechanical lighters is prohibited within areas where "No Smoking" signs are posted. "No Smoking" signs will be posted as directed.

b. Smoking is prohibited within fifty feet of spray painting, gasoline storage or dispensing vehicles, repair shops where oils or cleaning solvents are present or similar activities of hazardous nature.

c. Smoking in bed is prohibited.

d. Smoking or carrying lighters, matches, welder's lighters, etc., is forbidden in fuel trucks or vehicles carrying explosives.

e. Suitable non-combustible receptacles for discarded smoking materials will be provided in all interior areas where smoking is permitted. Receptacles will be provided at the entrances to structures or areas where smoking is prohibited.

5. Hot Plates

a. Hot plates or coffee makers will not be put into operation until inspected by the Unit Fire Security Officer for proper installation and a certificate of approval is issued.

b. Hot plates will be set on a non-combustible surface.

c. Hot plates will be unplugged when not in use.

d. Hot plates will not be used with other than a wall receptacle.

6. Electrical Circuits

a. In those structures where branch circuits are protected by fuses, fuses will not exceed the approved rated capacity of the circuit which will be stenciled on or near the fuse box. Adjustment or maintenance of a circuit breaker will be conducted by qualified Engineer personnel only.

b. The use of any means of holding the circuit breaker switch in the "on" position is prohibited.

c. The use of improvised, combustible shades on lights is prohibited.

7. Recreation Buildings, Messes and Clubs

a. The Officer or Noncommissioned Officer in Charge of recreation buildings, messes and clubs, or his appointed representatives, will perform a complete inspection in his assigned area at closing time to include, but not limited to the following:

(1) Determine that the contents of all trash containers, ash trays and other combustible receptacles have been disposed of in a safe manner outside of the building.

(2) Determine that all electrical appliances that are connected to the fixed electrical circuit by means of extension cords are disconnected. (Refrigerators are an exception).

b. Draperies and decorations installed in places of public assembly will be flame proofed. Places of public assembly are defined as recreation buildings, messes, clubs, and chapels.

8. Vehicle Fire Safety

a. Drivers will inspect their vehicles after each trip to determine the presence of fire or potential fire.

b. Drivers will be instructed on the use of fire extinguishers carried in their vehicles.

c. Drivers will not use flammable liquids to wash down vehicle engines.

d. Vehicles will not be refueled while the motor is running.

9. Flammable Liquids and Explosive Materials

a. Ammunition and/or flammable materials when authorized to be stored in troop areas will be identified by appropriate signs indicating the nature of such storage.

b. Storage, handling, or use of flammable liquids and/or explosive materials will be under the supervision of qualified personnel.

c. Bungs, caps or stoppers will not be left out of filled or empty flammable liquid containers such as drums and barrels.

d. No one will be permitted to handle or use flammable liquids and/or explosive material until he has been informed of the danger connected with their use and instructed in methods of safe handling.

e. All tanks, hoses and containers will be kept in metallic contact to a grounding device while flammable liquids are being poured or transferred.

f. Handling, storage or use of flammable liquids in open containers is prohibited.

g. Where practicable, outside storage tanks of flammable liquids will be located at least fifty feet from buildings or structures.

h. Storage of varnishes, lacquers or other flammable liquids will be kept in separate buildings located at least fifty feet from adjoining buildings or structures.

i. All sources of ignition will be prohibited in areas where flammable and/or explosive materials are stored, handled and/or processed.

j. Rubbish, brush, grass and other combustible material will be placed a minimum distance of twenty-five, and preferably fifty feet from immediate areas where flammable and/or explosive materials are stored, handled, or processed.

k. All spills of flammable liquids will be immediately cleaned, covered with earth or washed away.

l. Gasoline field ranges will be placed at least 10' apart and if practicable, will be fitted with metal hoods vented to outer air.

m. Battery shops will be adequately ventilated to dispel accumulated gases. Air inlet openings at or below the level of the batteries are essential to provide circulation of air.

n. Welding and cutting operations will be conducted at locations that have been specifically designated for the purpose. Other locations may be used if those locations are free from fire welding or cutting operations. A fire watch must be posted and equipped with necessary extinguishers.

10. Refueling of Generating Units.

a. Generating units will not be operated when being refueled. Protection against spillage of fuel on hot surfaces will be guarded against by the use of fuel containers with pouring spouts in serviceable condition.

INSPECTION CHECK OFF LIST FOR UNIT FILE SECURITY OFFICERS

1. "Housekeeping" check.

- a. Insure that waste, paper, trash and other debris is ~~burned~~ only at authorized locations.
- b. Check water barrels, buckets and containers of sand to insure that they are ready for use.
- c. Insure that proper instructions concerning fire prevention are given to all hands on a regularly established basis.
- d. Check hot plates and coffee-makers for proper locations and for the presence of approval certificates.
- e. Insure that fire bills are posted.
- f. Inspect for proper metal containers with tight covers for the storage of oil/paint soaked rags, steel wool, etc.

2. Electrical Circuits/Wiring Check.

- a. Insure that fuses used are of the approved rate and capacity. Proper values should be posted on or near fuse box.
- b. Inspect for evidence of frayed or taped extension cords. Only permanent and secured wiring may be taped.
- c. Check for overloading of extension cords or convenience outlets.
- d. Check for any "circuit wiring".
- e. Inspect installed electric light bulbs to insure that they are placed at least two (2) inches away from combustible materials.

3. General Area Check.

- a. Check grounds around structures to insure that they are free of wood, dry grass and other fire hazards.
- b. Check for accumulation of rubbish.

Subj: Financial Transactions with Vietnamese

Ref: (a) Division Order 7220.33

1. Purpose. To publish instructions in accordance with reference (a).
2. Information. Reference (a) and enclosure (1) thereto gave instructions concerning currency control regulations and restrictions which have been set forth by higher headquarters.
3. Action.
 - a. Information Program. Each member of this command will be acquainted with monetary controls, procedures, restrictions and obligations within 48 hours of the time he joins the Company. This information will include a lecture based on enclosure (1) of reference (a).
 - b. Piaster Control. Piasters (dong) are the official currency of RVN. The exchange rate is 118 VND to 1.00 US currency. You must use piasters to conduct your personal financial transactions with Vietnamese firms, merchants, nationals, etc. It is illegal to conduct such transactions in IPC. It is illegal to purchase Piasters from such sources or to redeem IPC with Piasters from such sources. Follow these simple rules to insure all regulations are observed:
 - (1) Buy the piasters you require at conversion facilities located at military establishments, including USO, and Officer and Enlisted Clubs and Messes where such conversion is authorized. In this company the Regimental Adjutant is the authorized agent to convert IPC to Piasters. You may convert your IPC to Piasters at the S-1 Office at any time during normal working hours.
 - (2) Use Piasters in all your financial dealings with Vietnamese firms, merchants, nationals, etc. DO NOT ACCEPT CHANGE IN IPC. All transactions must be conducted entirely in Piasters.
 - (3) Limit the IPC you exchange for Piasters to your actual requirements for the immediate future. Piasters are readily available at the S-1 office.
