

PART II

- 1. Personnel. Two Officers and 34 enlisted personnel completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. Twenty-two members of this Company made use of RER Quotas to Ckinawa, Hawaii, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Tokyo, Manila, Taipai, Singapore, and Kuala Lumpar. Four enlisted members extended everseas tours with four men departing on Special 30 Day Leave in connection with tour extensions. Two members departed on 30 day leave as a result of re-enlisting.
- 2. Combat Operations & Training. Members of this company participated in "Operation IIIOTT" from 2 July 1967 to 6 July 1967. The command post was harrassed on nine separate occasions by small arms fire resulting in no Marine casualties. The outpost, formed by a Marine squad in Duong Son (2) has been formally deactivated. All bunkers and fighting holes—were torn down and filled in. All squipment has been returned to the Command Post. Listening post, subushes, and patrols continue. Indoctrinations was conducted for all personnel of the rank I-M and above on proper handling and care and cleaning of the N-16 rifle on 25 July 1967.
