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2. Sequential Listing of Significant Events as they relate to:

a. Personnel. During the reporting period two enlisted men were on emergency leave. Twenty-two men from the Company made use of R&R Quotas to Okinawa, Hong Kong, Bangkok, Tokyo, Taipei, Manila, Singapore, Hawaii, and Kuala Lumpur. One officer and 20 enlisted completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. One Staff Sergeant was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, two LCpls were promoted to Cpl, 14 PFC's to LCpl and five Pvs to PFC. Three enlisted men were wounded in action. Two were returned to duty and the third was a Medevac to CONUS. Four Summary Court Martials and one Special Court Martial were conducted during August for violations of Articles 80, 81, 107, 108 and 134 of the UCMJ.

b. Combat Operations and Training. During August there were no operations in which Headquarters Company participated. Improvements continued to be made on the CP Perimeter. Additional wire was laid and heavy underbrush and trees were cleared on the east flank. The CP was harassed on five separate occasions by automatic weapons fire and grenades. The ensuing firefights resulted in two Marines WIA and one VC KIA (prob) and one VC WIA (prob). Daily use of patrols and ambushes have been initiated to give added warning to the CP and to discourage future VC probes. Two VCS have been captured on the above mentioned patrols.

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in the month of August Headquarters Company submitted 274 requisitions of which two were priority 02, one a priority 05, and one a priority 12. (2) During the month of August Headquarters Company Vehicles were driven a total of 21,102 miles. Two new AN/MRC-110 vehicles, the radio version of the new M-151A1, were received. These vehicles are scheduled to replace the M42A1 in the near future. The new AN/MRC-110's replaced two AN/MCR-38's. In addition to the above, no difficulties involving maintenance facilities or procurement of parts were experienced.

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1. At 010530H, 1st Marines perimeter received one grenade from unknown number of VC's resulting in one USMC WIA.
2. At 101200H, 1st Marines perimeter received sniper rounds from approximately one VC resulting in no casualties. Fire team sent to check area. Negative results.
3. At 101930H, 1st Marines perimeter received S/A fire from an unknown number of VC's. Condition 1 was set and perimeter was manned by all hands. Patrol was dispatched with negative results. No casualties received.
4. At 102350H, Headquarters Company ambush fired on one VC resulting in one VC WIA (prob).
5. At 221945H, 1st Marines perimeter received S/A fire from unknown number of VC's resulting in one USMC WIA. Returned S/A and MG fire with negative results.
6. At 132050H, 1st Marines perimeter received S/A fire from unknown number of VC's. No casualties received. Returned S/A fire resulting in one VC KIA (prob).
7. At 272145H, 1st Marines perimeter observed man w/flashlight. Delivered S/A fire with negative results.
