### 2. Sequential Listing of Significant Events as they Relate to:

a. Personnel. Eighteen men from the company made use of R&R Quotas to Okinawa, Taipei, Hawaii, Kuala Lumpur, Hong Kong, Bangkok, Manila, Singapore, Penang, and Tokyo. Seven officers and 62 enlisted men completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. One Special Court-Martial was completed during September for Violations of Articles 81 and 108 of the UCMJ. Ten Corporal's were promoted to Sergeant, six Privates' First Class were meritoriously promoted to Lance Corporal, and three Privates' were promoted to Privates' First Class.

b. Combat Operations and Training. One officer and 35 enlisted men of the Regimental Security section participated in County Fair 1-17 during the period 7-9 September 1966. No casualties suffered by this unit. During the operation, ARVN units apprehended 11 Viet Cong and 10 Viet Cong suspects.

Improvements continued to be made on the CP Perimeter in the form of additional wire, fighting holes, and the working on the emplacement of pre-fabricated bunkers on nine main defensive positions. Engineers are presently engaged in the project. The CP was harassed on six separate occasions by small arms sniper fire and unknown objects thrown at security positions. No Marine or Viet Cong casualties. Two practice alert drills were held during the reporting period for CP personnel.

Logistics.

(1) Supply.

a. During the month of September, this organization submitted 476 requisitions of which 184 were due to reconciliation of obligation listings received from C-1 and C-2; 98 due to cancellation of accounts held by A-2 and 154 due to normal supply obligations; of the 154, 13 were priority 05, of which five were for batteries, 7 for electron tubes and 1 for insect repellent; 4 were priority 12 and the balance of 137 were priority 17.

b. During the month of September, emphasis has been placed on procurement of Jungle Utilities and Jungle Boots. The supply system can not fill most of the requirements of this organization depending upon the influx of incoming personnel.

c. On 5 September, 58 tents were inspected to determine serviceability. Twenty-six tents were found serviceable and 30 Code X.

d. The operational status of supply is hindered due to the lack of a Supply Officer and a Supply Administrative Chief 3041.

e. Phase I and II of turning in excess property are now completed. However, there are more excesses that will be declared upon recomputation of Requisition Objectives at the end of this quarter. Excesses are being disposed of as quickly as possible.

(2) Motor Transport.

a. During the month of September, vehicles traveled a total amount of 19,810 miles. No new equipment has been added to our T/E. No maintenance or personnel problem in this section.

Subj: Motor Vehicles; reassignment of

Ref: (a) T/O M1096

1. Purpose. To promulgate reassignment of motor vehicles and motor transport drivers.
2. General. At the present time, motor vehicles are being utilized by individual sections. This system, although convenient for the sections which have the allocation of vehicles, does not provide for consolidation of trips, flexibility in having readily available vehicles on standby basis for everyone, or allow for timely vehicle maintenance.
2. Personnel. Those sections which have T/O billets for messenger/driver are not in some cases requiring the assigned personnel to drive, but are utilizing Motor Transport drivers. This practice does not provide effective use of personnel in their assigned billet, either in the section or the Motor Transport Section.
3. Action.
  - a. In accordance with reference (a), effective 26 September 1966, the M422A1 vehicles will be assigned to the following sections. Each section will provide their own drivers.

DETAILED CHRONOLOGY

5Sep66 - 1935 CP received approximately three rounds sniper fire. No casualties. No return fire.

10Sep66 - 2000 One incoming sniper round. No casualties. No return fire.

17Sep66 - 2200 Alert drill sounded.

20Sep66 - 1935 Alert drill sounded.

22Sep66 - 1910 CP received approximately five incoming small arms rounds. No casualties. No return fire.

23Sep66 - 0255 Unknown objects thrown at perimeter. One VCS observed. Two rounds fired by security force. Negative results.

24Sep66 - 2145 CP received one incoming round sniper fire. No casualties. No return fire.

25Sep66 - 2200 CP received unknow number rounds small arms fire. No casualties. No return fire.

27Sep66 - 2230 CP received approximately 12 rounds incoming small arms fire resulting in no Marine casualties. Perimeter security returned fire with negative results.
