NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. Personnel. 2 officers and 34 enlisted members completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. 20 members of this company made use of R&R quotas to OKINAWA, BANGKOK, HONG KONG, TOKYO, MANILA, TAIPEI, SINGAPORE, AND KUALA LUMPUR. One enlisted member extended his overseas tour during September.

2. Combat Operations and Training. Members of this company participated in "Operation SHELBYVILLE" from 22 September to 28 September 1967. Listening posts, ambushes and patrols continue. Indoctrination of personnel on proper handling, cleaning, and FAM firing with the M-16 rifles continues.

3. Logistics

a. Supply. During the month of September this organization submitted 419 requisitions of which 12 were priority 02, 14 on priority 05, 47 on priority 12, and the remaining 246 on priority 17. Quantities of material on hand were sufficient to satisfy 37½% of the recurring demands received. Shortages are on valid priority requisitions.

b. Motor Transport

(1) Motor vehicles suffered no accidents, damage, or pilferage during the month of September.

(2) Motor vehicles traveled a total of 41,543 miles during September.

(3) Five vehicles were deadlined for a total of 25 days during September due to the lack of parts.
