PART II Nerrative Summary

- 1. Personnel. Thirteen enlisted members completed overseas tours and rotated to CONUS. Six officers and eighteen enlasted members made use of R&R quotas to Okinawa, Kuala Lumpur, Bangkok, Hawaii, Taipei, Hong King, Tokyo, Singapore, Australia, Penang, and Manila. Twelve enlisted replacements were joined into this company during March. One officer and two enlisted extended their overseas tours during the month of March.
- 2. Combat Operations and Training. Merch 2, 1968, elements of Headquerters Company returned from Operation HUE CHY. For the remainder of the month, the company performed maintenance, care and cleaning of used equipment. During the latter portion of the month, Headquarters Company moved to Ca Lu, RVN, to participate in operations against North Victnamese forces, as well as maintaining a rear CP.
